China Sea-Formosu Channel-Pescadores Islands-Sunken Rock westward of North Island.

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 626 of 1897) of the existence of a sunken rock named Oko sho, about a cable in length and three-quarters of a cable broad, with a depth of 2 fathoms on it at low water springs, situated in a position with centre of North Island, bearing E. $\frac{1}{2}$ S., distant $2\frac{9}{10}$ miles, and Nieu point, Pehu island, S. $\frac{1}{3}$ E.

Approximate position : lat. 23° 45′ 55″ N., long. 119° 32′ 30″ E. Variation, nil in 1897.

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Red Sea-Straits of Bab-el-Mandeb-Non-existence of Shoal southward of Ras al Ara.

With reference to Notice to Mariners No. 12, dated January 1, 1897, issued by this Office on the report of the German steamvessel Sophie Rickmers having touched on soft bottom in a position with Ras al Ara, bearing N. $\frac{3}{3}$

E., distant about 8 miles, or approximately in lat. 12° 30' N., long. 43° 54½' E. The British Admiralty has given further notice (No. 627 of 1897) that the locality has since been closely examined by H. M. Shing Marthur and Rubbard examined by H. M. Ships Marathon and Redbreast, with the result that fairly regular soundings of 16 to 20 fathoms were found near the above position, with no indication of a shoal.

The three fathoms shown in that position has consequently been expunged from the Chart.

Note.-Although the soundings obtained prove that the shoal ground of Ras al Ara has not extended to the southward, they do show an extens on to the westward, there being a depth of one fathom, with 9 to 11 fathoms close south-westward, in a position with Ras al Ara, bearing N. 4 W., distant nearly 34 miles, or approximately in lat. 12° 343' N., long. 43° 55' E. Variation, 4° westerly in 1897.


