MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO. .

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held at the Town Hall on Friday, November 13, 1896.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated November 7, 1896.

Present:—Mr. F. H. Price, Chairman; Captain F. Bayley; Hon. W. R. Kynsey, C.M.G.; Mr. R. D. Ormsby; Hon. A. de A. Seneviratne; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. C. Perera; Hon. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. C. P. Dias; Mr. C. M. Fernando, and Mr. A. Alvis.

The Minutes of October 9, 1896, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of October 9, 1896, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. M. Fernando moved "that the opinion of Council in regard to the owner-ship of the rifle parade ground be notified to Government, and that Government be requested to be so good as to take steps to conserve the customary rights of the public over the said ground."

Mr. C. Perera seconded.—Carried unanimously.

- 2. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. M. Fernando moved "that in the opinion of this Council it is at present inexpedient to stop the washing of clothes in the lake in those places where the water is not foul or contaminated. This motion was, by leave of Council, withdrawn.
- 3. The Supplemental Budget No. 2, approved by the Standing Committee on October 23, 1896, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.
 - Mr. Alvis moved that the Supplemental Budget No. 2 of 1896 be sanctioned. Mr. R. D. Ormsby seconded.—Carried unanimously.

4. The following recommendations from the Standing Committee of October 23, 1896, and November 6, 1896, were laid before the Council :-

October 23, 1896.

(8) Revision of assessment for 1897—

To be recommended for adoption, as revised.

November 6, 1896.

(8) Letter from Gas Inspector, regarding pension.

The Council is recommended to increase the salary of the Gas Inspector to Rs. 5,000, on the following conditions :-

1) All fees for analysis to be paid to the Municipal Council.

(2) Any deficiency in the estimated receipts of Rs. 1,750 from this source to be made good out of the salary of the Gas Inspector.

(3) No private work to be undertaken by the Gas Inspector.

Mr. Alvis moved the adoption of both the foregoing recommendations of the Standing Committee. Captain Bayley seconded.—Carried unanimously.

Applications for the post of Inspector of Private Buildings were laid before the Council.

Captain Bayley moved "that the selection of one of the candidates be delegated to the Standing Committee." Hon. W. R. Kynsey seconded.—Carried unanimously.

6. A letter No. 115 of November 2, 1896, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of report furnished by the Director of Public Works with reference to the first resolution of the Council on October 9, 1896, was laid before the Council.

Mr. C. Perera moved "that it be respectfully pointed out to Government that the report of the Director of Public Works, forwarded with Colonial Secretary's letter No. 115 of November 2, 1896, is not a definite reply to the questions embodied in the motion carried on October 9, 1896, and that specific information on the points at issue be again applied for."

Mr. Alvis seconded.—Carried unanimously.

A letter No. 3,221 of October 28, 1896, from the Inspector-General of Police, submitting a scheme for a

Municipal fire brigade, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Hon. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that the matter be referred to a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Captain F. Bayley, Major L. F. Knollys, Mr. R. D. Ormsby, Mr. C. Perera, Mr. C. M. Fernando, and Mr. A. Alvis—three Members to form a quorum."

Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.—Carried unanimously.

8 On the question of a revision of the by-laws. Hop. A. de A. Senevirator "moved that a Special Committee."

Mr. C. M. Fernando seconded.—Carried unanimously.

9. A Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to October 31, 1896, and a Progress Report of Work done during October, 1896, were laid on the table.

10. An application dated November 4, 1896, from Mr. Nelson, Recordkeeper, for extension of his leave, was laid before the Council.

Resolved,—That the leave be extended to November 30, 1896.

- The City Analyst's report on the town water for October, 1896, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on November 14, 1896, at 3.30 p.m.

Present:—The Chairman (H. White, Esq.); Dr. J. Attygalla; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, c.m.g.; H. E. H. Hayes, Esq.; C. P. Hayley, Esq.; W. Abeyesundere, Esq; and W. E. de Vos, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meeting held on October 24 last.

2. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz asked-What steps have been taken by the Municipality to have levels taken from a perennial stream to fill the Bikke reservoir by gravitation, and if any work has been done, and if so, the progress made.

The Provincial Engineer replied that levels have been carried up the Udugama road about 53 miles, and thence about a mile up the Mahadola. The supply of water is pure and plentiful, and the head attained is not sufficient for

3. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz asked-Whether it would not be desirable for the Municipality to give notice to owners of land in China Garden facing the esplanade and the second entrance into the Fort that the houses erected in future should be two stories high and should face the esplanade, and should be built in accordance with a plan to be furnished by the Council showing the height of the ground floor.

The Chairman replied that the law did not give him the power to insist on two-storied buildings being erected, but when he received notice of intention to build, he will put into force the provisions laid down in the Municipal

Councils' Ordinance regarding the erection of new buildings.

4. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz asked—Whether a piece of land on the Wakwella road has been acquired to deposit the sweepings of the town as proposed by the late Chairman.

The Chairman replied that steps are being taken to acquire 5 acres of land at Minuangoda.

5. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz asked—Whether it would not be desirable that the practice followed at the time when Mr. Ievers was Chairman of giving on contract the sweeping and keeping the ramparts free from weeds and brushwood should be again adopted.

The Chairman undertook to have the ramparts cleared.

6. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz asked—What steps have been taken to have the night soil deposited into

the sea outside the harbour at night during the north-east monsoon.

The Chairman replied that he was not aware of the resolution of Council requiring the night soil to be deposited in the sea during the north-east monsoon, and promised to take the necessary steps to give effect to the resolution.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Hayley moved—That as the house at the corner of Lighthouse street and Church Cross street is in a state of ruin, the Council should acquire the property to improve the street and Fort.

Seconded by Mr. W. E. de Vos.—Carried.

Resolved,—That the Government Agent be asked to take steps to acquire the house for the purpose named in the resolution.

8. Pursuant to notice Mr. Hayley moved—That the railing round the pavilion be completed.

Seconded by Mr. H. E. H. Hayes.

Dr. Anthonisz moved the following amendment—That it is undesirable to have a railing round the pavilion, as it would interfere with the public using the grounds as a place of recreation. Should it be desirable, the archways may be closed with gates and railings to prevent houseless labourers and others using it at night and soiling the floor. Seconded by Dr. Attygalla. The Council divided on the amendment.

- 12. Read letters from the Collector of Customs and the Colonial Surgeon in regard to the measures taken to guard against the introduction of the bubonic plague from Bombay.
- 13. Submitted a letter from the Hon, the Colonial Secretary, No. 31 of November 12, on the drainage of the Police Station premises.

 Resolved,—That the Council undertake to pay one-half of the cost of the work, whatever it may be.

- 14. Submitted a letter dated October 27, 1896, from Mr. Edwin Ludovici, expressing his willingness to under take the work of revising the by-laws of this Council.
- 15. Submitted Mr. Edwin Ludovici's report, dated November, 1896, on the revision of the by-laws, with a

fair copy of the by-laws he recommends for adoption by the Council.

Resolved,—That the report and by-laws be circulated among the Members of Council.

16. The Chairman brought up for reconsideration resolution of Council on July 30, 1892, asking Government to fix the stamp duty on taverns within the Galle Municipality at Rs. 250 each, on the ground of the small sale of

arrack in the town.

Resolved,—That application be made to Government that, under the provisions of Ordinance No. 9 of 1892, the stamp duty in respect of arrack taverns within the Galle Municipality be fixed at Rs. 500 on every license issued.
