GALLE MUNICIPALITY.

An annual tax of Rs. 5 on every carriage of whatever description other than a cart, hackery, or jinrickshaw. An annual tax of Rs. 4 on every cart or hackery of whatever description. An annual tax of Rs. 2.50 on every horse, pony, or mule.

An annual tax of Re. 1 on every bullock or ass

Under Section 129 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887.

An annual tax of 75 cents on every dog kept within the Police limits of the Galle Municipality.

Under Section 130 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887.

A tax payable in six days' labour or in a money payment of Re. 1.50 in commutation of such labour.
