MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

KANDY MUNICIPALITY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, December 19, 1896, at 8.45 a.m.

Present:—Hon. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; A. Murray, Esq.; J. B. Siebel, Esq.; Dr. F. Keyt; J. H. Sproule, Esq. ; E. Beven, Esq.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on November 21 were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table:—General Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on 2. The following documents were laid on the table:—teneral Statement of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund, also separate statements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate Accounts from close of 1895 to November 30, 1896; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Report of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of November; and Health Officer's Report.

Resolved,—That the several documents, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary, together with the Health Officer's report, for publication in the Government Gazette.

- 3. The motion standing in Mr. Sproule's name, that steps be taken by the Council to obtain a railway station or siding at a point equidistant between Kandy main station and the New Peradeniya station, for the accommodation of persons residing in Upper Katuketta, Welatte, Getambe, &c., was withdrawn by leave of Council, Mr. Sproule explaining that he was not at present in possession of sufficient statistics.
- 4. Read letter from the Provincial Engineer, Central Province, respecting the conditions of the roads in charge of the Public Works Department within the Municipal limits.
- 5. Pursuant to notice Mr. Sproule put the following question-Whether it is true that reporters or a reporter were or was not given permission to be present at a Meeting of Council for the purpose of reporting the proceedings, and moved for papers.

The Chairman replied that no reporter had ever to his knowledge been refused permission, and that there was no objection to reporters attending at the meetings of Council.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. Sproule asked—Whether the Council have received notice of an intended exhibition of the tooth-relic at the Maligawa to be held this month, and if so, what steps have been taken to conserve the sanitation of the town, in view of the large concourse of people who will be attracted here during such exhibition of the relic.

The Chairman replied that leave had some little time back been granted for the exhibition of the relic, but in consequence of the existence of cholera in Colombo, it had been arranged to postpone the exhibition till the 28th instant. The steps usual on similar occasions would be taken in respect of sanitation and conservancy.
