MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, February 20, 1897; at 8.30 a.m.

Present:—Hon. Aflanson Bailey, Chairman; A. Murray, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; A. Philip, Esq.; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; W. D. Gibbon, Esq.

- 1. The Minutes of the Meeting held on January 22 were read and confirmed.
- 2. The motion standing in the name of Mr. Philip-viz., to invite attention to the Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held on January 22, 1897, as published in the press, and to move that they be amended (a) by inserting verbatim copy of the motions that came before the Council at the said Meeting; (b) by such further additions or alterations as to the Council may seem expedient "—was, by leave of Council,
- 3. The following documents were laid on the table:—General Statements of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund; also separate statements of Receipts and Disbursements in respect of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate accounts from close of 1895 to December 31; and also from close of 1896 to January 31, 1897; Progress Reports of Work done brought up to the same dates; Statement of Work done by the Municipal Magistrate during January, and of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the same month.

 Resolved,—That the general statements of Receipts and Disbursements and Progress Reports of Work done, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, be forwarded to Government for publication in the Gazette as required by section 90 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887.

- The recommendation of the Standing Committee, that a lower rate for the use of the Town Hall should be charged to resident taxpayers than to others, was considered and approved; and upon the motion of Mr. E. Beven, seconded by Mr. C. Vanderwall, it was resolved that the charge to resident tax-payers be reduced to Rs. 10 for use during the day and Rs. 20 for the night.
 - 5. Read Auditor's reports on the accounts for August, September, and October, 1896.
- 6. Health Officer's report on premises Nos. 63, 64, and 65, Penadeniya road, was considered; and upon the motion of Mr. Sproule, seconded by Mr. Vanderwall, it was resolved that the Chairman be specially empowered to act in the matter under section 209 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, as amended by section 33 of Ordinance No. 1
- 7. The application of P. T. Habeboo Lebbe, of Colombo street, to build upon a narrow strip of the pavement giving in exchange for it a portion of his land so as to secure a straight frontage for the new house which he is building, was considered and allowed.
- 8. Mr. Philip moved, pursuant to notice:—(a) "That the side-drains on the left-hand side of the Katugastota road, commencing opposite its junction with Lady Gordon's road, be efficiently attended to, a proper and uniform gradient being made to carry off water; further, that deterrent action be taken to prevent debris and offensive

- gadent being made to carry off water; further, that deterrent action be taken to prevent accors and offensive substances being deposited and kept in the drains.

 (b) "That the water-course (necessary for the effectual drainage of the Municipality) that crosses Katugastota road at the "bridge" or large brick-arched culvert, immediately before the Matale railway viaduct at Mahaiyawa, be straightened and planted up carefully and thickly on both sides with bamboo roots along the banks of the stream, the rank and noisome jungle vegetation being felled, burned, and dug up during the dry season at the beginning of the year.
- (c) "That the bit of road at which carts enter the gravel pits, adjoining the bridge above-mentioned, be widened, and the brick barrel drain lengthened several feet, as at present it is distinctly dangerous and may lead to accidents."

Seconded by Mr. Gibbon.

- Upon the suggestion of the Chairman the motions were withdrawn, and it was resolved that the matters referred to therein be referred to a Special Committee consisting of Mr. Murray, Mr. Philip, and the Chairman
- 9. With the leave of the Council Mr. Philip deferred, until after the matter shall have been considered by the Standing Committee, the motion standing in his name: "That each member of the Municipal Council of Kandy be supplied with a strong serviceable metal box for the purpose of conveniently keeping together Municipal documents and other papers connected with his duties as Councillor, and also with copies of the Municipal Councils' Ordinances, the by-laws of the Municipal Council of Kandy, and specimens of all or any forms as may be applied for from time to time." to time.
- 10. The report of the Special Committee on by-laws relating to bakeries was considered, and the following by-laws were passed :-
- (1) Every bakery shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls thereof plastered with lime mortar

and whitewashed, the floor cemented, and drainage sufficiently provided.

(2) No bakery shall be within 30 ft. of any cesspit, latrine, or sewer, nor in a position where bad odours wafted therefrom shall reach it.

- (3) No place used as a bakery shall be used as a dwelling-place, or for any other purpose whatsoever.
- (4) All utensils, furniture, and other requisities used in or belonging to a bakery shall be kept clean.
 (5) The flour, water, and other materials used in the manufacture of bread shall be good and wholesome. (6) All refuse and dirt in and about the premises of a bakery shall be removed without delay, and the drains well flushed.

(7) No person suffering from any loathsome, contagious, or infectious disease, or who has recently been in attendance on any such person, or who is unwashed or otherwise unclean, shall be employed in a bakery

(8) Every bakery and the management and conduct of the business shall be always open, and subject to examination by the Chairman of the Municipal Council, the Health Officer, and all persons acting under the authority of the said Chairman.

Any person who shall commit a breach of any of the foregoing by-laws shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs. 20.

MUNICIPALITY OF GALLE:

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on February 20, 1897, at 3.30 p.m.

Present:—The Chairman (F. R. Ellis, Esq.); C. P. Hayley, Esq.; Dr. P. D. Anthonisz, C.M.G.; W. Abeyasundera, Esq.; W. E. de Vos, Esq.; C. L. M. Abdul Carim, Esq.; and N. Dias Abeyasinha, Esq.

1. Read and confirmed Minutes of Meeting held on January 9, 1897.

2. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz asked "What steps have been taken with reference to the removal of night soil during the north-east monsoon and casting it into the sea?"

The Chairman replied that plans have been obtained from Walker, Sons & Co. for a boat to be used for the purpose, and an estimate has been called for.

3. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz asked "what steps have been taken to have the new cemetery drained, as the drainage of a portion of it flows into a pool of water in the adjoining garden?"

The Chairman replied that no steps have been taken, as the cemetery has not been handed over to the Council.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Hayley asked "whether the tennis courts in the Victoria park are being

constructed out of public funds, and if so, by whose authority?

The Chairman replied that no extra expenditure was incurred, the work having been done by coolies who were employed in the Park

Resolved,—That tennis courts may be made in the park, provided the work is done by coolies employed there.

5. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved "that it is expedient for the Council to raise the level of China Garden to about two feet to admit of proper drainage, expending a sum of money every year until the work is completed. This could be done if the Council would employ six coolies with two carts for the work, the cost being six coolies at 30 cents a day for 313 days = Rs. 563.40; overseer for twelve months at Rs. 15 per month = Rs. 180; total Rs. 743.40."

Seconded by C. L. M. Abdul Carim.

Resolved,—That as there are no available funds for the work, the consideration of this matter be postponed

6. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved "that land be acquired at China Garden to build shelters for labourers and coolies and those who are unable to provide themselves with rooms to live in, and to prevent overcrowding and living in damp huts. The piece of land between the Wakwella road (Noswatta) and the railway line on one side and the China Garden cross road on the other would be a suitable site."

Seconded by Mr. N. Dias Abeyasinha.

Resolved,—That the consideration of this matter be postponed until funds are available for the work.

7. Pursuant to notice Dr. Anthonisz moved "that a steam roller be procured from England for the construction of the Municipal roads as was approved by the Council.'

Seconded by Mr. W. Abeyasundera.

Resolved,—That the matter will be taken into consideration when the Council can provide funds for the purchase of a steam roller.

- 8. Pursuant to notice Mr. C. P. Hayley moved, "That whilst there is danger of a serious epidemic breaking out amongst us, all available funds be devoted to prepare for and guard against such a calamity. That all works which are not of urgent necessity be stopped for a while for this purpose."

 Seconded by Mr. W. E. de Vos.—Carried.
- 9. Read letter from Mr. J. Mansergh, stating the terms on which he will report on the drainage of the town of Galle.

Resolved,—That the Council is not prepared to pay £750 for such a report.

- 10. The Council resolved to apply to His Excellency the Governor to nominate, in terms of section 116 of 'The Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887," Mr. H. F. Jansz Auditor of the accounts of this Municipality for 1897.
- 11. Submitted letter dated February 11, 1897, with connected papers and a memorandum from the Commission appointed by His Excellency the Governor to consider the question of the bubonic plague.

Resolved,—That the following measures be at once adopted:—

- (1) The Sanitary Officer and the Superintendent of Works and Head Inspector to supply a list of houses in the Fort where it is desirable to substitute the dry earth system for the existing cesspits, and at the same time to report in what houses the drains require repairing or renewing.
- (2) To order householders to whitewash their houses.
- (3) Sewers and covered side drains in the Fort to be uncovered and cleansed, and drains to be properly flushed. Three barrels and carts to be supplied for this purpose.
- (4) A temporary hospital of wattle and daub to be erected in the upper part of the garden of Bathfield House at a cost not exceeding Rs. 300, and another in the extreme eastern portion of the new cemetery, cost not to exceed Rs. 500.
- (5) Inquiry to be made as to the working of the incinerator at the Welikada jail.
- 12. The Commissioners on the Bubonic Plague having condemned Gebbot island as a suitable place for erecting a house of refuge, it was resolved not to take any steps to acquire it.
- 13. The question of carrying into effect the powers conferred on the Council by section 33 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1896 was deferred consideration.
