GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. **Allowances.**—Unless otherwise stated Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. **Conditions of Service.**—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulation made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. **Terms of Engagement.**—The posts specified in the Schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1962.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities the Payment of their pension of ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service in terms of section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945 as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,329 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of two years unless otherwise specified.

(g) Applicants should be prepared to produce their birth certificates or certificates of probable age in lieu thereof when called upon to do so.

4. **New-Entrant Officers.**—(i) The period of probation/trial of "New-Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) "New-Entrant Officers" will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Their confirmation at the expiry of the period of probation/trial will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued but discontinuance may be deferred if the Local Government Service Commission is satisfied that a genuine attempt has been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the Commission if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New-Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Local Government Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note.—The term "New-Entrant Officers" in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Local Government Service in response to advertisements published on or after 29th January, 1960.

5. **Qualifications Required.**—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. **Concessions to Ex-Servicemen.**—(a) Ex-Servicemen will be allowed to deduct their period of service in the Regular Force from their ages, where such deduction will enable them to be brought within the maximum age prescribed in the posts applied for.

(b) Ex-Servicemen will be allowed to reduce the minimum educational standards laid down in the scheme of recruitment to any post in the Service to the next lowest examination.

7. **Age Concession.**—Members of the Local Government Service are eligible to apply irrespective of age for posts advertised in the Local Government Service.

8. **Other Requirements.**—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments; in the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant of selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal after the selection.

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

Examinations, Results of Examinations, &c.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE

Efficiency Bar Examination for Secretaries, Grade IV, of the Local Government Secretarial Service—9.2.1963

APPLICANTS are invited by the Local Government Service Commission for the above examination which will be held in Colombo.

The examination will be conducted by the Commissioner of Examinations.

2. *Applications.*—(i) Applications for admission to the examination must be made on the specimen form given below and must be addressed to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo.

(ii) Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, on or before December 18, 1962. Any application received after that date will be rejected.

(iii) Candidates must forward their applications through the Heads of the Local Authority in which they work. If any candidate fails to do so he will be regarded as disqualified.

(iv) Candidates are requested to forward their applications to Head of the Local Authority in which they work, well in time with a request that they may be transmitted to the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, on or before December 18, 1962.

3. *Admission to the Examination.*—The Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, will issue admission forms to the candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for the examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

Candidates must sit for the examination at the examination hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself at an examination hall other than the one assigned to him, will be refused admittance to the examination.

A copy of the time table and the rules for the guidance of the candidates for the examination will be forwarded together with the admission form. These should be read carefully by candidates. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must give up his admission form to the supervising examiner on the day of the examination.

If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of the examination, he should communicate with the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, informing him that he has not received the admission form and giving the following particulars:—

N.B.—Admission to the Examination does not constitute acceptance of eligibility.

4. If a candidate is found to be ineligible according to the regulations for this examination, his candidature is liable to be cancelled at any stage prior to, during or after the examination.

5. *Leave to Officers to Attend Examination.*—Heads of Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant duty leave to officers serving in their Councils whose applications have been approved by the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, to present themselves at the examination.

6. *Identity Cards.*—Candidates will be required to prove their identity in the Examination Hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor for each subject they offer. For this purpose any one of the following documents will be accepted:—

- (a) Identity Card issued by the Postmaster-General.
- (b) A valid passport issued within three years, preceding the date of this examination.
- (c) Any certificate, licence, or other documents embodying a photograph of the holder and issued within the 3 years preceding the date of this examination, on the authority of a Government Department.

No candidate will be admitted to the examination without one of the documents referred to above in addition to his admission card.

7. The subjects of the examination and marks assigned to each subject are given below:—

	Marks
1 (a) The Two National Languages—Sinhala and Tamil	... 100

This examination will consist of two Parts, namely—

- (i) Conversation and Interpretation.
- (ii) Reading and Writing.

In the examination under Rule 1 (a) (i) above, the candidate will be tested in conversation so as to satisfy the Examiner as to his power of understanding Sinhalese or Tamil of different classes and marking himself understood by them both in common conversation and in the course of official business. He will also be required to act as interpreter between the Examiners and Sinhalese and Tamil entirely ignorant of English the interpretation to be on matters connected with ordinary official business. The candidate will be required in this examination to obtain a minimum of 60 per cent of the total marks.

In the examination under Rule 1 (a) (ii) above, the candidate will be required to write an English translation of two short Sinhala or Tamil reports written in different running hands, to translate an English Order into Sinhala or Tamil and to read and translate an extract from a Sinhala or Tamil notarial deed and from the proceedings of a Rural Court case put into his hands for the first time. The candidate will be required in this examination to obtain a minimum of 60 per cent. of total marks.

(b) The system of Accounts employed in Urban Councils and Town Councils and the Government Financial Regulations, Part II, excluding Chapters XIX and XX—100 Marks.

(c) Local Government Theory and Practice relating to Ceylon (2 hour paper)—100 Marks.
This paper will be divided into two Parts.

Part I—Question on this Part will be based on—Municipal Councils, Urban Councils and Town Councils Ordinance and the Local Government Service Commission Ordinance, Rules, Regulations and By-laws framed thereunder.

Sources of revenue, powers and duties of different types of Local Authorities, financial relations between the Central Government and the Local Authorities, Audit Powers and Central Control.

Part II—Question on this Part will be based on—Other Ordinances pertaining to Local Authorities in the Island.

(ii) All officers will be required to pass in one Language and Accounts and Local Government Theory and Practice relating to Ceylon.

(iii) Candidates for examination under Rule 1 (b) and (c) above, will be required to obtain a minimum of 60 per cent. of the total marks in Accounts and Local Government Theory and Practice relating to Ceylon.

(iv) A candidate may take up the subjects, if he so desires, separately and on different occasions.

8. *Exemption.*—(i) Officers who are over 50 years of age, i.e., on attaining 50 (fiftieth) birthday on the date of the examination are exempted from the examination for promotion over the Efficiency Bar provided their work and conduct warrant this concession and after the Commission has satisfied itself in each case that the officer concerned merits this concession.

(ii) All officers who have passed the Proficiency Examination in Sinhala/Tamil at either the Advanced Level or Ordinary Level, are exempted from the National Languages Paper prescribed for this Examination.

THE VILLAGE COUNCILS ORDINANCE

BY-LAWS under section 42 of the Village Councils Ordinance (Chapter 257), as amended by Act No. 60 of 1961, made by the Village Council of the Pulopallai village area in the Jaffna District, and approved by the Minister of Local Government and Housing by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section.

By-laws relating to the tax on vehicles and animals

1. (1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 39 of the Ordinance, every person who has in his possession, custody or control any vehicle or animal liable to such tax, shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars substantially in the Form set out in Schedule A hereto, which may be obtained from the office of the Council.

(2) The schedule referred to in paragraph (1) shall be filled up and sent to the Chairman on or before the 15th day of March, 1963, in respect of the year 1962, by the person liable to pay the tax under section 37 of the Ordinance, and no such schedule shall be required from such person in respect of any subsequent year during which he is in possession, custody or control of such vehicle or animal.

2. Subject to the provisions of section 39 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall, without further notice, be liable—

(a) for the year 1962, in respect of the vehicles and animals specified in that schedule, to pay the tax on or before the 31st day of March of that year; and

(b) for every subsequent year, in respect of such vehicles and animals specified in that schedule as remain in his possession, custody or control for more than thirty days in such subsequent year to pay the tax on or before the 31st day of March of that year.

3. If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal which is not mentioned in such schedule and which is liable to the tax under the Ordinance, or if any person who has not furnished any schedule under by-law 1, for the first time acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal which is liable to such tax, he shall within seven days from the date on which he acquires or commences to keep or use such vehicle or animal, send a written notice to the Chairman stating the fact of such acquisition, keeping or use, and further furnish forthwith a written statement of particulars substantially in the form set out in Schedule A hereto.

4. Subject to the provisions of section 39 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the written statement referred to in by-law 3, shall be liable to pay the tax, in respect of the year in which such statement is furnished and in respect of every subsequent year, for the vehicles and animals specified in

that statement which are in his possession, custody or control within such time as may be notified to him in that behalf by the Chairman.

5. (1) Every person who, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, or the written statement referred to in by-law 3, claims to be exempt under section 39 (3) of the Ordinance, from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered or referred to in such schedule or statement, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

(2) Every person who, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, or the written statement referred to in by-law 3, ceases to possess, keep or use any vehicle or animal, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman that he has ceased to possess, keep or use such vehicle or animal, and shall, if he has transferred such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the name and address of such transferee.

6. (1) On payment of the tax for any vehicle by any person, the Chairman shall issue to that person, in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with such distinguishing letters for vehicles specified in Schedule B hereto as are appropriate to that vehicle, and with the figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles.

(2) Where any such plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled on making a payment of fifty cents, to receive a fresh plate.

(3) The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise, that any such plate has been lost or stolen, issue to the owner thereof a fresh plate, on the application of the owner and on payment by him of sixty cents.

7. (1) The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate issued in respect of that vehicle under by-law 6 on a conspicuous part of that vehicle.

(2) A plate issued in respect of one vehicle shall not be affixed on any other vehicle.

8. The Chairman or any other person authorised by him in writing in that behalf may with the assistance of a Village Headman or a Police Officer, if necessary, enter any land or building between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any day to ascertain whether any person has in his possession, custody or control any vehicle or animal for which a tax is payable and the person in charge of such land or building shall afford such facilities as may be required by the Chairman or such other person for the exercise of his powers under this by-law.

9. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any other person authorised by him in writing to stop and detain any vehicle proceeding on any road or path for the purpose of inspecting the metal plate required by by-law 7 to be affixed on such vehicle; and the driver or any person in charge of such vehicle shall, on being so requested, stop the vehicle and permit the Chairman or such other person to inspect such plate.

10. The by-laws relating to the tax on vehicles and animals made by certain Village Councils in the Jaffna District and published in *Gazette* No. 8,697 of December 20, 1940, are hereby rescinded in so far as they apply to the Pulopallai village area.

CONSERVANCY AND SCAVENGING

11. (1) For the purpose of by-law 6 of Part VI of the Standard by-laws relating to conservancy and scavenging adopted by the Council, the conservancy fee payable monthly to the Council shall be at the rate of Two rupees and cents fifty per bucket.

(2) For the purpose of by-law 11 of Part VI of the Standard by-laws relating to conservancy and scavenging adopted by the Council, the scavenging fees payable monthly to the Council shall be fifty cents.

OFFENSIVE AND DANGEROUS TRADES

12. The by-laws relating to offensive and dangerous trades published in *Gazette* No. 11,114 of May 3, 1957, is hereby amended in by-law 1 by the addition at the end of paragraph (2) thereof of the following new item.

(d) Storing perishable articles of food and provisions for the purposes of sale by wholesale or retail.

PUBLIC NOTICES

13. (1) No person shall deface or destroy any notice which is exhibited by order of the Council.

(2) No person shall wilfully contravene the directions set out in any notice or remove any Notice Board, fence post or barrier or other thing put up by the authority of the Chairman in the execution of any work commenced under any by-laws of the Council.

UNFENCED PADDY FIELDS AND LANDS

14. (1) Every cultivator residing within the limits of the village area shall erect a fence round his paddy field or other cultivated land so as to prevent the cattle from entering into such paddy field or cultivated land.

(2) 1. Every owner of cattle shall cause his cattle to be kept under the care of some person during day time.

(2) Every owner of cattle shall cause his cattle to be penned or tied during night time so as to prevent them from going astray and entering into cultivated paddy fields or other lands.

MARKETS

15. (1) For the purposes of by-law 1 of Part XXVII of the Standard by-laws relating to Markets and Fairs adopted by the Village Council, the "market area" shall be the area within a circle having a radius of half a mile from the centre of the village market situated at Pallai.

(2) A fee at the following rates shall be levied and paid for the use or occupation of any space in any village market:—

	Per day cts.
(1) For an open space not exceeding eighteen square feet in the vegetable market ...	15
(2) For a covered space not exceeding eighteen square feet in the vegetable market ...	30
(3) For a space not exceeding eighteen square feet in the fish market ...	30

SALE OF PROVISIONS

16. The by-laws relating to the sale of provisions appearing in Part XIII of the Standard by-laws adopted by the Council, are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) in by-laws 1 and 3, by the substitution, for the word "fish" wherever that word appears in those by-laws, of the words "fish, rice, curry stuffs"; and

(2) in by-law 2—

(a) by the substitution, for the words "fish, vegetables" of the words "fish, rice, curry stuffs, vegetables"; and

(b) by the substitution for the words "apart from the vegetables" of the words, "apart from the rice, curry stuffs and vegetables".

STRAY CATTLE

17. The charges payable before the removal of any animal impounded under sub-section (1) of by-law 3 of Part XXIV of the Standard by-laws adopted by the Council shall be calculated and levied at the following rates:—

(a) Two rupees for each animal in the pound.

(b) In addition to the above charge—

(1) One rupee and cents fifty for each animal kept in the pound for each night; and

(2) One rupee for each animal kept in the pound for every eight hours during day time.

17. In these by-laws—

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Council.

"Council" means the Village Council of the village area.

"Ordinance" means the Village Council Ordinance (Chapter 257), as amended by Act No. 60 of 1961; and

"village area" means the Pulmallai village area in the Jafna District.

THE CEMETERIES AND BURIALS ORDINANCE

BY-LAWS for burial grounds within the limits of the Panawal Korale village area in the Kegalle District, made by the proper authority, to wit, the Panawal Korale Village Council under section 38 of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance (Chapter 231) read with section 44 of the Village Councils Ordinance (Chapter 257), as amended by the Village Councils (Amendment) Act. No. 60 of 1961, and confirmed by the Minister of Local Government and Housing by virtue of powers vested in him by section 39 of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance.

By-laws

1. The Chairman shall keep and maintain in the office of the Council a register, in such form as the Council may determine, of all burial grounds which are registered under these by-laws.

2. (1) The owner of every burial ground situated within the village area at the date of publication of these by-laws in the *Gazette* shall, within one month from that date, apply for the registration of that burial ground.

(2) The owner of every burial ground which has been established within the village area on any date after the publication of these by-laws in the *Gazette* shall, within one month from that date, apply for the registration of that burial ground.

(3) Every application for the registration of a burial ground shall be in writing, addressed to the Chairman, and signed by the owner of such burial ground.

3. The owner of a burial ground shall fence it properly and shall maintain such fence in good repair. The distance of a burial ground from any residential building shall not be less than one hundred yards.

4. No grave shall be less than four and a half-feet in depth or at a distance of less than three feet from any other grave.

5. Except on the orders of an authority competent to order the disinterment of a dead body, no person shall open any grave within three years of the burial in that grave of a dead body.

6. (1) No person shall construct, or cause the construction of, any monument in any burial ground except on the authority of a permit issued in that behalf by the Chairman.

(2) The area allowed for the construction of any monument shall not exceed four square feet.

(3) Every permit issued under paragraph (1) shall specify the area allowed for the construction of the monument in respect of which that permit is issued.

7. No person shall bury or cremate a dead body in any place other than a cemetery or a public burial ground without the written permission of the Chairman.

8. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Panawal Korale Village Council;

“owner” means the trustee, manager, proprietor, or other person entitled to the possession of a burial ground;

“Council” means the Village Council of the Panawal Korale village area in the Kegalla District, and

“village area” means the Panawal Korale village area.
