#### THE ENTERTAINMENT TAX ORDINANCE

THE following resolution passed by the Hendala Town Council in the Colombo District under sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Entertainment Tax Ordinance (Chapter 267), has been approved by the Minister of Local Government and Housing and is published in terms of sub-section (2) of that section:—

#### Resolution

"This Council, under sub-section (1) of section 2 of the Entertainment Tax Ordinance (Chapter 267), hereby imposes and levies, with effect from the date on which this resolution is published in the *Gazette*, a tax at the rates set out hereunder on payments for admission to entertainments (as defined in that Ordinance) held in the area within the administrative limits of the Council.

GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

1. Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulation made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. Terms of Engagement.—The posts specified in the Schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1962.

(a), The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities the Payment of their pension of ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service in terms of section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945 as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,329 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.

(d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.

(e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

(f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of two years unless otherwise specified.

(g) Applicants should be prepared to produce their birth certificates or certificates of probable age in lieu thereof when called upon to do so.

4. New-Entrant Officers.—(i) The period of probation/trial of "New-Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) "New-Entrant Officers" will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Their confirmation at the expiry of the period of probation/trial will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued but discontinuance may be deferred if the Local Government Service Commission is satisfied that a genuine attempt has been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the Commission if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New-Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Local Government Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note.—The term "New-Entrant Officers" in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Local Government Service in response to advertisements published on or after 29th January, 1960.

5. Qualifications Required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. Concessions to Ex-Servicemen.—(a) Ex-Servicemen will be allowed to deduct their period of service in the Regular Force from their ages, where such deduction will enable them to be brought within the maximum age prescribed in the posts applied for.

(b) Ex-Servicemen will be allowed to reduce the minimum educational standards laid down in the scheme of recruitment to any post in the Service to the next lowest examination.

7. Age Concession.—Members of the Local Government Service are eligible to apply irrespective of age for posts advertised in the Local Government Service.

8. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

(ii) Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments; in the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Government Service, the Head of the Department concerned should, when forwarding the application, state whether or not he is prepared to release the applicant of selected.

(iii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview or test at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iv) Any person who desires to recommend a candidate may do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of direct or indirect canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of candidates will disqualify such candidates.

(v) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal after the selection.

(vi) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE****Examination (Sinhala) for Recruitment of Stenographers (Lower Grade), Local Government Service—1962**

1. *Date of Examination*.—A competitive examination for male and female candidates wishing to enter the Local Government Service (Sinhalese) Stenographers (Lower Grade) Transferable Service will be held in Colombo.

The date of the examination will be notified later.

*N.B.*—The vacancies exist in Area 'B' and applications will be entertained only from candidates, who are resident in Area 'B'—vide para. 5. (v) below.

2. *Salary*.—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to posts of Stenographer (Sinhala) (Lower Grade) to serve in Local Authorities (other than Village Councils) on the salary scale Rs. 1,740 rising by annual increments of Rs. 120 to Rs. 3,780 per annum. In this scale an Efficiency Bar operates before Rs. 2,940 per annum. Rent allowance in accordance with Government rates and conditions, a temporary cost of living allowance and a special living allowance at Government rates and conditions will be paid.

3. *Conditions of Service*.—(a) Male candidates who are successful in the examination will be appointed on 3 years probation with effect from the date of appointment. Their posts are pensionable. #### Examination (English) for Recruitment to the Local Government Stenographer's Service, (Lower Grade), 1963

1. *Date of Examination.*—A competitive Examination (English) for male and female candidates wishing to enter the Local Government Stenographers' (Lower Grade) Transferable Service will be held in Colombo on 13th March, 1963.

2. (i) *Salary.*—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to posts of English Stenographer (Lower Grade) to serve in Local Authorities (other than Village Councils) on the salary scale Rs. 1,740 rising by annual increments of Rs. 120 to Rs. 3,780 per annum. In this scale an Efficiency Bar operates before Rs. 2,940 per annum. Rent allowance in accordance with Government rates and conditions, a temporary cost of living allowance and a special living allowance at Government rates and conditions will be paid.

(ii) *Conditions of Service.*—(a) Male candidates who are successful in the examination will be appointed on 3 years' probation with effect from the date of appointment. Their posts are pensionable. Female candidates who are successful in the Examination will be appointed on a provident fund basis in the first instance and will be on trial for a period of three years with effect from the date of appointment. They are entitled to opt to come into the pensionable establishment at any time before completing 10 years service. The option once exercised will be irrevocable. These female candidates who exercise this option during the period of trial will be placed on probation thereafter, the period of probation being equivalent to that part of the three years' trial period which they have not served.

- (1) by re-numbering by-law 32 as paragraph (1) of that by-law,

- (2) by the insertion immediately after paragraph (1) of by-law 32, of the following new paragraph:—

"(2) Where water is supplied for an external tap in any premises, a sum of Rs. 15 shall be paid annually in advance to the Council in respect of each such tap."

- (3) in by-law 35, by the substitution for the expression "per 1,000 gallons," of the expression "per 1,000 gallons or part thereof", wherever that expression occurs in that by-law;

- (4) in by-law 45—

(a) in paragraph (d), by the substitution for the "of fire", of the words "of fire or", and

(b) by the addition, immediately after paragraph (d) of the following new paragraphs:—

"(e) that the charges due to the Council for the supply of water have not been paid."

"(f) that an unauthorised extension of the water service has been taken to the premises or another premises."; and

- (5) in by-law 12A, in paragraph (a), by the substitution for the words "the Colombo Municipal Council," of the words "a Municipal Council."

#### BY-LAW

1. (1) These by-laws may be cited as the Talawakelle-Lindula Urban Council Market By-laws, 1962.

- (2) In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires—

"Council" means the Talawakelle-Lindula Urban Council;

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Council;

"market area" means the area declared by by-law 2, to be the market area; and

"public market" means the market established or maintained by the Council.

2. The area within the administrative limits of the Talawakelle-Lindula Urban Council is hereby declared to be the market area assigned to the Talawakelle-Lindula public market.

3. No person shall use or occupy any stall, or space in any public market unless he is the holder or the servant or agent of the holder, of a permit issued by or under the authority of the Chairman, or otherwise than in accordance with the terms and conditions specified in Schedule A hereto, and no such servant or agent shall use or occupy any such stall, or space unless his name has been registered at the office of the Council.

4. (1) The right to occupy any beef, mutton or fish stall in any public market shall be sold by tender and it shall be in the discretion of the Council to reject any tender.

(2) Where tender in respect of any beef, mutton or fish stall in any public market has been accepted by the Council, the tenderer shall be issued a permit substantially in Form A of Schedule B hereto in respect of such stall.

(3) Every permit issued under these by-laws shall be subject to the terms and conditions specified in Schedule A hereto.

5. Every holder of a permit in respect of any beef, mutton or fish stall in any public market shall pay rent at the rates mentioned in his tender. Every holder of a permit in respect of any other stall or space shall pay a fee at the rates specified in Schedule C hereto.

6. The rent in respect of each stall or space shall be paid at the office of the Council—

- (a) either at the time of the issue of the permit in respect of such stall or space;
- (b) or in monthly instalments on the first day of each calendar month of the period for which the permit is issued.

7. (1) No holder of a permit shall, without the written permission of the Chairman—

- (a) transfer such permit to any person; or
- (b) sublet any part of the stall, or space allowed to him; or
- (c) permit any person, other than a servant or agent whose name has been registered at the office of the Council, to use or occupy any part of the stall, or space.

(2) No person shall use or occupy any stall, or space in the public market or any part thereof under any alleged transfer or sub-lease, without the written permission of the Chairman.

(3) Every holder of a permit, shall, when he decides to terminate his tenancy give the Chairman three calendar month's notice of his intention to terminate his tenancy or pay three month's rent in lieu of such notice.

8. Every holder of a permit shall—

- (a) cause every bench, shelf, counter or table, on which articles of food or drink are kept or exposed for sale to be thoroughly cleaned daily, and every board on which meat or fish is kept or exposed for sale to be scraped and washed daily;
- (b) sweep or cause to be swept daily, the stall or space occupied by him and any open space forming the approach to his stall or space; and
- (c) keep near his stall or space a fly-proof receptacle with a close-fitting lid, and place or caused to be placed therein all sweepings, rubbish and refuse matter.

9. No holder of a permit in any public market shall—

- (a) subject any person resorting to the market to any insult, annoyance or delay;
- (b) occupy his stall, seat or space or take part in any sale therein while he is suffering from any cutaneous, contagious or infectious disease, or employ or permit any person suffering from any such disease to occupy the stall, seat or space or to take part in any sale therein;
- (c) enclose any part of his stall, seat or space or erect any screen or awning, or make any alterations whether temporary or permanent in such stall, seat or space, without the written permission of the Chairman;
- (d) bring into or keep in his stall, seat or space any box, table, chair, or other similar article of furniture which is not the property of the Council, or construct any shelves or other fixtures in such stall, seat or space, without the written permission of the Chairman;

(e) expose or keep for sale in his stall, seat or space, any article which is not specified in his permit or which is prohibited by the Council, or which is unwholesome or in any way injurious to public health;

(f) throw any bones, fins, scales of fish, or any refuse, or sweepings, in any drain or on any part of the market premises;

(g) expose the skin or hide of any animal, or fins for the purpose of drying or curing, in any part of the market premises; or

(h) carry on the drying, curing, or icing of fish in any part of the market premises.

10. No person shall, within any public market, or in its premises—

- (a) carry on any cooking;
- (b) be found drunk or behaving in a disorderly manner, or create any noise or disturbance or fight with any other person or use insulting, abusive, or obscene language;

(c) beg; or

(d) loiter without being able to give satisfactory account of himself, or remain after being ordered to leave by an officer of the Council, or headman or police constable, or any person acting under the lawful orders of the Chairman.

11. No person shall—

(a) damage or deface any part of the market building or the furniture, lamps, or other property of the Council in or about the public market;

(b) defile, pollute, or waste the water provided for use in a public market, or wash himself or any animal, clothes, or other article in that water; or

(c) take any dog or vehicle inside the market premises.

12. (1) It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any other officer duly authorised by him in that behalf to inspect the public market and to order any person using or occupying any stall, seat, or space therein to produce for his inspection the permit issued to such person.

(2) It shall be the duty of any holder of a permit to produce his permit for inspection immediately upon demand made by the Chairman or any other officer duly authorised by him in that behalf.

PRIVATE MARKETS AND OTHER AUTHORISED PREMISES

13. (1) Within the market area no person shall sell or offer or expose for sale any meat, poultry, fish, whether fresh, salted or iced, fresh fruit or vegetable except at the public market:

Provided, however, that the preceding provisions of this by-laws shall not apply to—

(a) the sale of poultry, fruit or vegetables by itinerant vendors who do not sell at fixed prices, or do not for the purpose of such sale establish themselves on the public roads or other public places;

(b) the sale of meat or fish within the market area by licensed itinerant vendors;

(c) the sale by the licensee of an eating-house or a tea or coffee boutique, of fruit for consumption on the premises; or

(d) the sale of pork, fruit or vegetables at any authorised premises other than the public market.

In this paragraph "authorised premises" means any premises authorised by a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman.

(2) Every licence referred to in paragraph 1 (d) shall—

(a) be substantially in Form B set out in Schedule B hereto; and

(b) be in force for such period exceeding one month but not exceeding twelve months as may be specified in the licence.

(3) The fee payable for every licence issued under paragraph 1 (d), shall be rupees two and cents fifty for each month for which it is to be in force, and shall be paid in advance to the Chairman or other person appointed by the Council to collect such fee.

(4) Every licensee shall have his name and the names of his salesmen registered at the office of the Council.

(5) No salesman whose name is not registered at the office of the Council shall take part in any sale in any authorised premises.

14. (1) Within any market-area no person shall hawk for sale any meat and no person shall hawk for sale any fish unless he is the holder of a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman. No licence to hawk fish or meat for sale shall be issued to any person who is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.

(2) Every licence referred to in paragraph (1) shall—

- (a) be substantially in Form C set out in Schedule B hereto; and
- (b) be in force for such period not less than one month and not exceeding twelve months as may be specified in the licence.

(3) The fee payable for every licence issued under paragraph (1) shall be rupees two and cents fifty for each month during which it is to be in force, and shall be paid in advance to the Chairman.

15. No person shall be entitled to a licence under by-law 13 (1) (d) unless the premises to be licensed comply with the following conditions:—

- (1) the premises must be in good repair and well ventilated and well lighted;
- (2) the walls of every room in every part must not be less than 8 feet in height and must be built of brick, stone, or cabook, with the inside thereof lime-plastered and limewashed and the lower 4 feet of the internal surface must be covered with glazed tiles or plastered in cement;
- (3) all the eaves must be at least 7 feet from the ground;
- (4) the roof must be made of some permanent material;
- (5) all wood-work must be oil-painted or lime-washed;
- (6) the floor must be cemented throughout;
- (7) the tables and all furniture must be capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floors and walls;
- (8) every table on which meat is kept must be covered with zinc or other impermeable material;
- (9) the premises must be provided with a sanitary dust bin and at least one spitoon and with sufficient latrine accommodation;
- (10) the premises must be at least fifty feet distant from any latrine, cess-pit, manure heap, or open sewer;
- (11) there must be no cess-pit, latrine, or ash pit within or directly communicating with the premises.

16. Every holder of a licence under by-law 13 (1) (d) shall—

- (a) cause every bench, shelf, counter, or table, on which articles of food or drink are kept or exposed for sale to be thoroughly cleaned daily and every board on which meat is kept or exposed for sale to be scraped and washed daily;
- (b) sweep or cause to be swept daily the premises occupied by him and any open space forming the approach or entrance to his premises;
- (c) keep near his premises a fly-proof receptacle with a close fitting lid, and place or cause to be placed all sweepings, rubbish, and refuse matter therein.

#### GENERAL

17. No person shall bring into or expose for sale, or sell at any public market or at any private market or anywhere within the administrative limits of the Council any carcase or meat of any animal not slaughtered at a public slaughter-house:

Provided that the preceding provisions of this by-law shall not apply to the sale of frozen meat imported into the Island or game or pork.

18. (1) It shall be the duty of every holder of a permit in respect of a stall at any public market to keep such stall open to the public for business between the hours 6 a.m. and 7 p.m.

(2) No holder of a permit shall wilfully neglect or refuse to serve the public.

19. (1) It shall be lawful for the Magistrate having local jurisdiction to cancel any permit or licence issued under these by-laws on a second or subsequent conviction of the holder of such permit or licence by such Magistrate, for a breach of any of these by-laws.

(2) The Chairman may refuse to issue a fresh permit or licence to any person whose permit or licence has been cancelled or who has been convicted of any breach of these by-laws.

20. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any officer of the Council acting under the authority of the Chairman at all reasonable times to enter upon and inspect any market or any authorised premises and to inspect any furniture, equipment, vehicle or utensil which is or which appears to be used for a licensed trade and to seize any article of food introduced or exposed for sale therein which appears to him to be unwholesome and to convey such article to the Medical Officer of Health of the area or to the District Medical Officer, Lindula, and if that officer certifies that any article of food so seized is unwholesome, such article may be destroyed without payment of compensation to the person from whose possession it was seized.

21. No person shall resist, obstruct, hinder or molest any market-keeper, or any officer or person appointed by the Council to superintend the market in the execution of his duty.

22. Any contravention of any of these by-laws shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees, and with an additional fine not exceeding ten rupees for each day during which the contravention is continued after a conviction thereof by a court of competent jurisdiction or after written notice from the Chairman directing attention to such contravention.

23. The Talawakelle-Lindula Urban Council Market By-laws, 1953, published in *Gazette* No. 10,521 of May 1, 1953, as amended by by-laws published in *Gazette* No. 10,904 of March 16, 1956, are hereby rescinded.

#### SCHEDULE A

##### Conditions

- (1) The permit holder shall not sell beef, mutton or fish and their by-products at prices above the maximum prices fixed by the Council from time to time.
- (2) The permit holder, in the case of beef or mutton stalls; shall slaughter only healthy animals in the Council's slaughter-house and shall wash out thoroughly at his expense the slaughter-house, immediately after use.
- (3) The permit holder shall not employ any person to assist him unless such person is vaccinated or inoculated as directed by the Medical Officer of Health of the area or by the District Medical Officer, Lindula.
- (4) The permit holder and his employees shall wear clean clothes and be bodily clean while they are engaged in any stall, seat or space in a public market.
- (5) The permit holder in the case of meat stalls, shall not contravene any regulations made under the Butchers Ordinance.
- (6) No pet animal or bird shall be kept or introduced into any stall, seat or space.
- (7) No fires or lights shall be allowed in any stall, seat or space between the hours 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.
- (8) No person shall remain in any stall or market between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.
- (9) Any goods kept in any stall, seat or space between 7 p.m. on any day and 6 a.m. on the following day shall be at the risk of the permit holder.
- (10) A breach of any of these conditions shall, in addition to any other penalty under these by-laws, render the permit-holder liable to a fine or to have his tenancy terminated forthwith, at the discretion of the Chairman.

5. The Council may, in order to meet part of the cost of medicine and drugs supplied, charge a fee of 50 cents from each patient treated at any ayurvedic dispensary. The Chairman or an officer authorised by him in that behalf shall issue forthwith a receipt in respect of every such fee collected from a patient in a form approved by the Council. Every such receipt shall have a carbon duplicate and shall be serially numbered.

1. The ayurvedic dispensary established by the Council under section 36 (c) of the Village Councils Ordinance (Chapter 257), at Kammal Pattu village area, shall be in the charge of an Indigenous medical practitioner registered under the Indigenous Medicine Ordinance (Chapter 106).

2. The indigenous medical practitioner referred to in by-law 1 or any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council, shall maintain such books of accounts and other records relating to the ayurvedic dispensary as may be prescribed by the Council in such form and in such manner as may be approved by the Council.

3. The Council may appropriate annually from the Communal Fund the funds required for the maintenance of the ayurvedic dispensary and provision for such appropriation shall be made in the Annual Budget of the Council or in supplementary estimates passed by the Council from time to time.

4. Subject to the provisions of by-law 5, the treatment of patients at the ayurvedic dispensary shall be free and limited to the residents of the Kammal Pattu village area.

5. The Council may, in order to meet part of the costs of the medicines and drugs supplied, charge a fee of 50 cents from each patient treated at the ayurvedic dispensary. The Chairman or an officer authorized by him in that behalf shall issue forthwith a receipt, in respect of every such fee collected from a patient in a form approved by the Council. Every such receipt shall have a carbon duplicate and shall be serially numbered.

6. The Chairman may, in his discretion, exempt on the ground of poverty, any patient from paying the fee prescribed in by-law 5.

7. At the end of each year ending on December 31, the Chairman shall cause to be prepared a statement showing the receipts and expenses of the ayurvedic dispensary for that year.

8. In these by-laws—

“ayurvedic dispensary” means the ayurvedic dispensary established and maintained by the Council;  
“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council; and  
“Council” means the Village Council of the Kammal Pattu village area in the Chilaw District.

**By-laws**

1. No person shall carry on the business of money lending in the Uda Palata Ganga Ihala Korale village area except on a licence duly obtained from the Chairman in that behalf. Every such licence shall unless cancelled earlier, expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

2. No person shall be entitled to a licence to carry on the business of money lending unless such person submits a properly numbered day book, a ledger book and receipts books to be stamped and signed by the Chairman.

3. Every application for a licence under by-law 1 shall be made in the form provided for the purpose by the Council, and shall be sent to reach the Chairman—

(a) where such application is for a new licence, not less than thirty days before the proposed date of the commencement of the business; and

(b) where such application is for a renewal of an existing licence, on or before the first day of September of the year preceding the year in respect of which the renewal of that licence is required.

4. It shall be the duty of the licensee to send a half yearly return of all moneys lent on mortgage, promote, and loan substantially in the form set out in the Schedule hereto. The half-yearly returns must reach the Council on or before July 15, and January 15 each year.

5. The licensee shall allow the Chairman or any person authorized by him in writing to make periodical checking of the books of accounts and render him all necessary assistance for the purpose by furnishing the necessary information.

6. The annual licence fee in respect of a licence to carry on the business of money lending shall be Rs. 100 which shall be payable before the thirty-first day of March every year.

7. It shall be lawful for the Rural Court in addition to any other punishment that it may impose to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of any breach of these by-laws relating to money lenders and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of the cancellation.

8. In these by-laws unless the context otherwise requires—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council,  
“Council” means the Uda Palata Ganga Ihala Korale Village Council, and  
“Ordinance” means the Village Councils Ordinance (Chapter 257).
