THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE AND THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES ELECTIONS ORDINANCE

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 5, 6 and 14 of the Urban Councils Ordinance (Chapter 255) and section 84 of the Local Authorities Elections Ordinance (Chapter 262), I, Mahanama Samaraweera, Minister of Local Government and Housing, do by this Order

(1) revoke—

- (a) the Proclamation published in *Gazette* No. 8,819 of November 28, 1941, in so far as that Proclamation relates to the limits of the town of Kuliyaipitiya; and

- (b) the Order published in *Gazette* No. 9,066 of January 15, 1943, as amended by the Order published in *Gazette* No. 10,054 of December 16, 1949, relating to the number and limits of the wards (therein called "Electoral Divisions.") of the town of Kuliyaipitiya,

(2) order that—

- (a) the limits of the town of Kuliyaipitiya shall be those defined in the First Schedule hereto;
- (b) the Kuliyaipitiya Urban Council shall consist of nine members and the town of Kuliyaipitiya shall be divided into nine wards with the limits defined in the Second Schedule hereto; and

Krishnan Chettiar; thence southwards along the centre line of the said stream to the northern boundary of Madampe-Narammala road.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the northern boundary of Madampe-Narammala road to the eastern limit of Ward no. 4.

West: By a line drawn from the last mentioned point northwards along the eastern limits of Wards Nos. 4 and 5 to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 7—ASWEDDUMA EAST

CONSTRUCTION OF KITTYAKKARA ROAD, KUPPIYAWATTE EAST

Preliminary Apportionment under Section 26 of Chapter 199 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon

WITH reference to the provisional apportionment of cost published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 12,627 of September 1, 1961, and the notice No. ME/RC 47/54 of September 27, 1961, served on all owners, the Colombo Municipal Council having considered the objections in connection with the construction of Kittyakkara Road, Kuppiyawatte East, under Section 26, Chapter 199 of the Legislative Enactments of Ceylon, approves the revised preliminary apportionment prepared by the Municipal Commissioner, Colombo, and resolves to do some or all of the following works of construction.

- (a) A 4" thick penetration macadam carriageway 18'—0" wide with kerbs and channels on either side and electric street lights ;
- (b) A rainwater sewer ; and
- (c) A soil sewer.

The cost is to be recovered within a period of ten years. This apportionment is based on estimates prepared on current rates for labour and materials but is liable to alteration due to fluctuation of price of materials and rates for labour at the actual time of construction.
