WHITE REFINED SUGAR

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4, read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Satarasinghage Don Sugathadasa, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food) for the Colombo District, do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with immediate effect the Price Order No. FC/V—S. F. 9 (2) dated 29th July, 1961, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 12,568 of August 2, 1961;
- (ii) fix with immediate effect the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight gross and the maximum retail price per pound nett respectively above which White Refined Sugar shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (iii) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of Sugar for the purpose of re-sale or any sale of Sugar in a quantity of one hundred-weight gross or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of Sugar less than one hundredweight gross for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (c) "Sugar" shall exclude all forms of jaggery.
- (iv) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order no person shall sell Sugar which is adulterated with any other article;
- (v) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every trader, who has any Sugar in his possession or under his control at any place or in any vehicle, shall exhibit conspicuously at that place or on that vehicle a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices for Sugar fixed by this Order in that area;
- (vi) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every person who sells any Sugar by wholesale shall, and every person who sells any Sugar by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale;
 - (b) the quantity of Sugar sold (by weight);
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of Sugar sold; and
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

 - (a) any sale of any quantity of Maldivic Fish or Bonito Fish specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto for the purpose of re-sale or any sale of Maldivic Fish or Bonito Fish in a quantity of one hundredweight gross or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of Maldivic Fish or Bonito Fish specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, less than one hundredweight gross for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
- (iv) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, no person shall sell Maldivic Fish or Bonito Fish specified in column 1 of the Schedule which is adulterated with any other article ;
- (v) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader, who has any Maldivic Fish or Bonito Fish specified in column 1 of the Schedule in his possession or under his control at any place or in any vehicle shall exhibit conspicuously at that place or on that vehicle a quantity of Maldivic Fish or Bonito Fish in a suitable container, with the maximum prices for Maldivic Fish or Bonito Fish fixed by this Order displayed in figures not less than one inch in height on price tags or boards attached to such container in such a manner that the Maldivic Fish or Bonito Fish and the maximum prices could be clearly seen by any customer ;
- (vi) direct that for the purpose of this Order " pound " or " lb. " shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight ;
- (vii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every person who sells Maldivic Fish or Bonito Fish specified in column 1 of the Schedule by wholesale shall, and every person who sells Maldivic Fish or Bonito Fish specified in column 1 of the Schedule by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale ;
 - (b) the quantity of Maldivic Fish or Bonito Fish sold (by weight) ;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity sold ; and
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail ;

- (vii) direct that every trader within the area mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule and column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto, sells any sugar of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto, shall on demand give to the purchaser of that article, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale ;
 - (b) the quantity of sugar sold by weight ;
 - (c) the description and grade of sugar sold ;
 - (d) the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold ;
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

- (viii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this order, every person who sells any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule by wholesale shall, and every person who sells any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- (v) direct that for the purpose of this Order " pound " or " lb. " shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight ;
- (vi) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every person who sells any sugar by wholesale shall, and every person who sells sugar by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt, in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale ;
 - (b) the quantity of sugar sold (by weight) ;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold ; and
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail ;
- (vii) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of re-sale or any sale of sugar in a quantity of one hundred-weight gross or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of sugar less than one hundredweight gross for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
 - (c) " Sugar " shall exclude all forms of jaggery ;
- (viii) direct that when White Refined Sugar is sold, the maximum wholesale and retail prices referred to in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule shall include the price of wrapper or container, if any, in which the sugar is sold.
