PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

HEREAS by section 14 (1) of Ordinance No. 15 of 1896 it is enacted that when it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, from time to time, that by reason of the existence or apprehension of crime and outrage in any district it is desirable to quarter police in such district, or should a police force have been already established there to increase the same, he may by Proclamation, which shall be published in the Government Gazette, declare that for the reason aforesaid such district requires police or additional police, and may order police to be quartered in such district or additional police to be employed there:

And whereas it appears to the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage in the district defined in the schedule hereunto annexed it is desirable to quarter police in the said district:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that by reason of the existence of crime and outrage therein, the said district in the Western Province requires police, and do hereby order that a police force consisting of one sergeant and two constables be quartered in the said district in the said Western Province as from and after the First day of August, for a period of six months, and We do further hereby define the limits of the said district to be those set out in the schedule hereunto annexed.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Ninth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-seven.

Boundaries of the District comprising the Villages Nittambuwa and Nambadaluwa.

HEREAS by section 1 of "The Prevention of Crime Ordinance, 1893," it is enacted that the said Ordinance shall come into operation in such Provinces, districts, or places, and at such time as the Government Gazette, provided that at least one month's notice of such time shall be given in the Province, district, or place described in such Proclamation as the Governor shall in each case determine:

And whereas it is expedient to bring the said Ordinance into operation in the village or place called Nittambuwa, in the Western Province, as defined in the schedule hereunto annexed:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor in Executive Council, do hereby appoint that the said Ordinance shall come into operation in the village or place called Nittambuwa, in the Western Province, as defined in the schedule hereunto annexed, as from and after the First day of September next ensuing.
