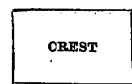

THE Award transmitted to the Commissioner of Labour by the Arbitrator to whom the industrial dispute which had arisen between the Nidahas Karmika Saha Velanda Sevaka Vurthiya Samithiya, No. 129, Kumaran Ratnam Road, Colombo 2, and The Milk Board, Central Dairy, Narahenpita Road, Colombo 5, referred under section 3 (1) (d) of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, No. 25 of 1956, No. 14 of 1957 and No. 62 of 1957, for settlement by arbitration, is hereby published in terms of section 18 (1) of the said Act.

By virtue of the powers vested in him by section 3 (1) (d) of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, the Deputy Commissioner of Labour referred to me on 15th September, 1959, for settlement by arbitration an industrial dispute between the Nidahas Karmika Saha Velanda Sevaka Vurthiya Samithiya, No. 129, Kumaran Ratnam Road, Colombo 2 (hereinafter referred to as the "Samithiya"), and The Milk Board, Central Dairy, Narahenpita, Colombo 5 (hereinafter referred to as the "Board").

2. The matter in dispute between the aforementioned parties as specified in the statement of the Deputy Commissioner of Labour relates to the non-employment of Mr. W. S. Perera, van driver, by the Board.

3. My inquiry commenced on March 22, 1960. I am constrained to place on record that at the time fixed for inquiry neither the petitioner (Mr. W. S. Perera) nor any representative of the Samithiya was present. The representative of the Board and I were kept waiting while the Samithiya was being reminded of the inquiry by telephone. It was only thereafter that Mr. R. A. Saranapala arrived and he was followed later by Mr. W. Mallawaarachchey, an office-bearer of the Samithiya. They jointly represented the Samithiya and the Board was represented by its Secretary, Mr. D. S. Porage. Mr. Mallawa-

arachchey informed me that the Samithiya had not been able to get in touch with the petitioner (Mr. W. S. Perera) although many letters and even telegrams had been despatched to him informing him of the date of the inquiry. He asked for a postponement and undertook to produce Mr. Perera and other witnesses on whom he relied to press his case on the next date. He further stated that should Mr. Perera not be available on the next date he would move to withdraw the case.

4. On the next date fixed for inquiry, 28th March, Mr. Mallawaarachchey sought my permission to withdraw the demand for the re-instatement of Perera in the employment of the Board on the ground that Perera had not given him sufficient assistance and instructions to conduct the case on his behalf, nor to summon the witnesses required for his case and that Perera had made his appearance only a few minutes before my inquiry was scheduled to commence. This loss of interest and the lackadaisical attitude on the part of Perera might well be an indication that he was not the alleged aggrieved party he made himself out to be and that he was inspired, when discontinued by the Board, to prevail on the Samithiya to espouse his cause by way of retaliation and hoping thereby to embarrass his employer (The Milk Board). Obviously the Samithiya had not, at the initial stages, studied the facts of the case very thoroughly. Mr. Saranapala made his opening address in a very unconvincing manner and Mr. Mallawaarachchey who supplemented the opening address pressed that "it would be on the employer to prove before the Arbitrator his charge or charges against Perera and it would be their onus in this instance". This was a point on which I did not agree.

5. This industrial dispute has, as I have shown, unnecessarily taken the time of the Industrial Court and of the Board. It should be a pointer to complainant—Samithiyas or Unions to carefully study and investigate all demands of its members before the assistance of the Industrial Court is sought to settle any matter by arbitration. This would tend to show some consideration due to the employer rather than reflecting anxiety for the employee alone.

**THE AWARD**

6. I make my award granting the application made by the Samithiya to withdraw their demand in this industrial dispute referred to me for settlement by arbitration on the ground that neither the petitioner nor any witnesses have been called to support the Samithiya's case against the Milk Board. It is obvious that the petitioner has lost interest in his claim.

Ceylon Ltd., which were referred by Orders dated 8th July, 1959, and 11th September, 1959, made under section 4 (2) of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, and published in *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 11,810 of July 17, 1959, and No. 11,856 of September 18, 1959, respectively, for settlement by Industrial Courts, is hereby published in terms of section 25 (1) of the said Act.

**THE AWARD**

This is an award under section 24 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended by Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, Nos. 25 of 1956, 14 of 1957 and 62 of 1957.

It relates to an industrial dispute between The Nidahas Karmika Saha Velanda Sewaka Vurthiya Samithiya (hereinafter referred to as the "Union") on the one part, and Messrs. Bousteads (E. & C.) Ceylon Ltd. (hereinafter referred to as the "Company") in voluntary liquidation (and represented by Liquidators Messrs. Clement Blaise Wijeyeratne and John Eustace Dunstan Martin) on the other part.

2. In I. D. 204 the Honourable the Minister of Labour, by Order dated 8th July, 1959, referred to this Court for settlement the following matters in dispute between the parties as set out by the Acting Deputy Commissioner of Labour, to wit:—

- (1) Sunday pay with full allowances to be paid to all workers;
- (2) One month's gross salary for each year of past service to be paid to all employees on termination of their services, and
- (3) The contract system to be abolished.

3. Thereafter, at an extraordinary general meeting of the shareholders of Messrs. Bousteads (E. & C.) Ceylon Limited held on the 17th September, 1959, the following resolution as will appear from the document, L. 9, was passed:—

"Resolved that Bousteads (E. & C.) Ceylon Limited be wound up voluntarily subject to supervision of Court and that Messrs. Clement Blaise Wijeyeratne and John Eustace Dunstan Martin be appointed liquidators jointly and severally."

4. The Honourable Minister of Labour has also by his Order dated 11th September, 1959, referred to this Court for settlement the following matters in dispute between these parties, viz., "what relief should be granted to employees who may be discontinued in the event of Messrs. Bousteads (E. & C.) Ceylon Limited going into liquidation". The matter in dispute, as set out above, forms the subject matter of the proceedings in I. D. 233.

5. When the inquiry into these matters in dispute was commenced on the 29th September, 1959, the representative of the Union, Mr. G. Lanka Perera, withdrew the demands numbered (1) and (3) as set out as matters in dispute in I. D. 204, in view of the fact that the Company had by that time gone into liquidation.

6. On the next date of hearing the Union was represented by Mr. Cecil Gunawardena, Advocate, who agreed that none of the demands referred to us and forming the subject matter of proceedings in I. D. 204 need be adjudicated by us in view of the fact that the Company had gone into voluntary liquidation, and that he would confine his claim only to the demand as set out in I. D. 233. It is, therefore, not necessary for us to make any Award relating to the demands in I. D. 204 and we confine our Award solely to the demand as set out in I. D. 233.

7. The Company, now in liquidation, is represented by the liquidators who occupy a responsible position as trustees on behalf of the creditors of the Company and the shareholders (both preferential and ordinary). The rights and obligations of a liquidator in a voluntary winding up are governed and circumscribed by the Companies Ordinance, No. 51 of 1938, as amended by Ordinance No. 19 of 1942, as regards payments to creditors, collection of debts due to the company and the distribution of the available balance to the shareholders in the order of their priority. The liquidator was, therefore, cautious not to agree to make any payment based solely on the demand now before this Court except strictly in accordance with the duties imposed on him by law.

He accordingly obtained the assistance of Mr. S. J. Kadirgamar, Advocate, who addressed this Court with regard to the legal position of the liquidator and of our powers in regard to any Award that we might make. We wish to express our indebtedness to him for the assistance he has rendered by referring us to the correct legal position in terms of the Companies Ordinance. As stated by Mr. Kadirgamar, the correct legal position would appear to be that, in the event of an Award being made by this Court granting any relief by way of retrenchment compensation or otherwise, the Award would have the force of a decree and will be regarded as a debt admissible to proof against the Company as provided by section 251 of the Companies Ordinance and upon proof thereof the liquidator is bound to make such payments as payment due to a creditor. We have ourselves examined the various provisions of the Companies Ordinance and are satisfied that the Award made by this Court ordering the payment of any sum of money will have the effect of requiring the liquidator to regard this as a debt payable by the Company which will rank for payment along with other debts. We also note that before the resolution for the voluntary winding up was passed the Directors of the Company had filed a declaration of solvency implying thereby that the Company was in a position to pay its creditors in full. The liquidator has himself stated to this Court that, as far as he has been able to ascertain from the books relating to the debts payable to the

Company and its other assets, both movable and immovable, and with reference to the liabilities of the Company, he is in a position to pay in full all the creditors, including any debts payable upon our Award, leaving a balance available for distribution among the shareholders.

8. The above being the legal position, we now proceed to make our Award with regard to the matter in dispute between the parties. Before we proceed to deal with the main question relating to the dispute we wish to advert to certain interim applications made to us by certain employees of the Company who are not members of the Union and who are therefore not represented by the Union. With regard to these workmen belonging to the daily paid and clerical staff of the Company, the liquidator has agreed that in the event of the Court making its Award applicable to them also, he is prepared to make payment to them of such sums as may be awarded. We consider this arrangement satisfactory in order to avoid a multiplicity of several separate disputes.

In the course of the proceedings the Union also requested the Court to take into consideration the period of their services with the Old Company which had gone into liquidation before the present Company was formed in 1955. The liquidator rightly took up the position that the Company of which he is liquidator would not take over the debts and liabilities of the previous Company and that, therefore, no claim could be made against him in respect of the old Company which must be regarded as a separate and distinct dispute. We have not been able to ascertain from the former liquidator the stage he has reached in the process of winding up the old Company. It is not within our powers to add him as a party to these proceedings in terms of Regulation 27 framed under the Industrial Disputes Act, and we cannot, therefore, bind him. It is, however, left to the Union or to any of these other employees, if so advised, to have the matter of their claims against the old Company which is a distinct and separate juristic person referred for settlement by a Court, after taking the necessary preliminary steps before such reference can be made.

9. We would like also to refer to an application made by Mr. Anthony Gardiner, who was the Managing Director of the Company during its latter stages, and who is not a member of the Union, whose dispute was referred to us, to be added as a party and to be granted compensation in consequence of his being thrown out of employment as a result of the winding up of the Company. The liquidator has, through his Counsel Mr. Kadirgamar, raised various objections to the inclusion of Mr. Anthony Gardiner as a party to these proceedings. He stated that the industrial dispute referred to us within the meaning of the definition of the term "industrial dispute" must refer to a dispute between workmen (note the plural) and employer, and that therefore an individual member of the staff, cannot be a party to a dispute between the Union, of which he is not a member, and the Company in liquidation. He stated that the remedy, if any, for such a member is to seek his remedy in appropriate proceedings by making an application to the Labour Tribunal or take such other steps as he may be advised. We have considered these objections and we are of opinion that Mr. Anthony Gardiner cannot be added as a party to these proceedings and that he must seek his remedy, if any, elsewhere. We also note that Mr. Anthony Gardiner has not even filed a statement relating to his claim as directed by the Court.

10. With regard to a similar claim made by Mr. C. A. M. Anthony, who is an Engineer on the executive staff, the above remarks apply to him also, he too not being a member of the Union whose dispute is now before us. Moreover, we have been informed that he had made an application for compensation to the Labour Tribunal which application is now pending before it and he should obtain the decision of that Tribunal.

11. With regard to the claim made by Mr. I. Muthunayagam, Shorthand Typist; we are informed that he was employed on a temporary basis and received a salary rated on a daily basis, and is now being continued in employment as Stenographer by the liquidators during the period of liquidation. He too is not a member of the Union. We do not see that he can ask for any relief in these proceedings.

12. At the inquiry before us on the 4th April, 1960, an agreement was reached between the representative of the Union and the liquidator in our presence that the claims for relief by the persons shown in the lists marked X.1 and X.2 respectively, relating to the daily paid and monthly paid staff, who were in employment on the 30th September, 1959, be considered by us. These lists are annexed to this Award and marked schedule 1 and 2.

13. These workmen received a month's notice that their services would be terminated on 30th September, 1959. They worked till the end of that month and received payment only till the end of September. A few of the employees, whose names are shown in the lists marked X.1 and X.2, are kept on by the liquidator for the period of the liquidation and a few others have been taken over by the firms who have obtained some of the agencies previously operated by the Company. The bulk of the remaining employees have probably not found alternative employment in view of the high level of unemployment now prevailing in our country. The Union which promised to furnish



us with data relating to the number of persons still unemployed has failed to do so. We have given our most earnest consideration to the extent of relief which these employees, in this hapless plight are entitled to. Any relief granted to these workmen will to a very small extent affect the shareholders' equity; The claims of creditors being preferent to those of the shareholders the losses sustained by the Company must necessarily fall on them.

14. From the evidence of Mr. Mervyn Fonseka, the book-keeper of the Company, who has placed before us the Balance Sheets and Profit and Loss Accounts of the Company during the entire period of its existence from 1955, and from the evidence of Mr. Anthony Gardiner who was the Managing Director during the last period of the Company, we find that the main business of the Company, particularly in the Building Department, resulted in trading losses right from the beginning. Nevertheless, during the first two or three years the Company was able to survive because of the large commissions received by this Company for services that were rendered by it to another company. When these commissions dropped the Company got into financial difficulties. As stated by Mr. Anthony Gardiner, the overhead charges always remained high. If the Company had been re-organised or re-constructed when they found that there were trading losses, they might have survived or at any rate cut short their losses. We are referring to this matter of what appeared to have been imprudent management solely for the purpose of indicating that if the shareholders had been more vigilant they might have been able to cut short the losses and to a greater degree saved their share capital.

15. The demand in the form in which it has been placed before us is "what relief should be granted to employees who may be discontinued in the event of Messrs. Bousteads (E. & C.) Ceylon Limited going into liquidation". The earlier demand No. 2, made in I. D. 204, relating to one month's gross salary for each year of past service to be paid to all employees on termination of their services has been dropped.

The demand in the form set out in I. D. 233 is in general terms. It is not related to the payment of a gratuity. It was argued before us that the Company on the eve of its dissolution or the liquidator appointed thereafter is not entitled to make payments of gratuities thereby diminishing the available assets out of which the creditors and shareholders are entitled to be paid. The position would appear to be correct.

16. There is no legislative provision under our Industrial Disputes Act, similar to the provisions contained in Section 25 FFF of the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Act, 1957 of India, whereby legislative provision is made for the payment of retrenchment compensation to employees on the closure of the business on account of unavoidable circumstances beyond the control of the employer in a sum not exceeding three months' pay.

17. We find also on a reference to the Companies' Act of 1948 passed in Great Britain that, under statutory provisions passed from time to time, certain creditors have been given priority in the case of winding up. These provisions as embodied in Section 319 of that Act provide, among other matters, for the preferential payment of any sum under the Reinstatement in Civil Improvement Act of 1944 to be paid by way of compensation. Our legislature, however, has made no provision by law for such compensation to be paid. We are mentioning this purely to show that in advanced industrial countries where the maintenance of good industrial relations was the object of all labour legislation, the legislature thought it fit to provide for the payment of compensation in circumstances such as have arisen in this case and which is entitled to preferential treatment.

18. In the absence of any specific provision in our Act relating to our powers to award retrenchment compensation by way of unemployment relief on the closure of a business we have to act by virtue of the general powers conferred on this Court and make such orders as are deemed just and equitable in all the circumstances for the maintenance of industrial peace and harmonious employer-employee relations.

19. The functions of an Industrial Court while adjudicating upon an industrial dispute referred to it are quite different from those of arbitration Tribunals in commercial matters.

Ludwig Teller in his treatise on Labour Disputes and Collecting Bargaining (Vol. 1, p. 536) makes the following observation, which is apposite to the matter under consideration:

"Industrial Arbitration may involve the extension of an existing agreement or the making of a new one or in general the creation of new obligations or modifications of old ones; while Commercial Arbitration generally concerns itself with interpretation of existing obligations and disputes relating to existing agreements".

The same view was taken by the Privy Council in Labour Relations Boards of Saskatchewan vs. John East Iron Works Limited, while referring to a claim for reinstatement by a Board's employee—1949 Appeal Cases, p. 134.

20. We are therefore not precluded by reason of the absence of specific legislative provision from making an award for relief which we consider just and equitable.

21. This Court has in several cases of Retrenchment on closure of business awarded compensation to its workmen.

In I. D. 154 and 165 this Court recently awarded payment of retrenchment compensation to a large body of workers who were thrown out of employment when the Ceylon Coconut Industries Limited went into voluntary liquidation. Each workman was awarded compensation not exceeding in the aggregate two and a half months gross wages for each year of service.

In I. D. 35 (Nidahas Karmika Saha Velanda Sevaka Vurthiya Samithiya vs. Prakramas Ltd.) on the closure of a part of their business owing to losses sustained, this Court awarded compensation to the workers who were discontinued at the rate of 10 days wages and allowances for each year of service but not exceeding in the aggregate wages and dearness allowance for a period of 52 days.

In I. D. 60 (The Ceylon Workers Congress vs. the Superintendent of Carfax Group, Dickoya) the workers who were discontinued from the estate when a part of it was acquired by Government were paid compensation based on wages for a period of three months.

In I. D. 70 (The Nidahas Karmika Saha Velanda Sevaka Vurthiya Samithiya vs. the Car Mart Ltd.) this Court awarded as compensation two weeks' wages including all allowances for each year of service to the employees whose services were terminated because a section of the business was closed down.

22. We have considered the matter very carefully and in the circumstances that have arisen we consider it reasonable to give compensation at a flat rate to all the employees who have lost their employment irrespective of the period of their services. In the case of the 17 employees employed by this Company who were wrongfully retrenched in terms of the award made in I. D. 161 and who by virtue of the amended award were subsequently reinstated and were in employment on the date of liquidation, we have been informed by the Commissioner of Labour that they have been paid their compensation in full. Therefore they are not entitled to receive any further compensation in these proceedings. As regards all other workmen whose names are included in the lists X.1 and X.2, we consider that the minimum amount of compensation we can award to them, in all the circumstances, should be two months' gross wages on the basis of the wages received by them on 17th September, 1959. The liquidator is required to file in this Court a statement showing the amounts payable to each of these workmen on or before the 25th of April, 1960.

23. The liquidator brought to our notice on the last date of hearing that at present he is paying the creditors 25 per cent of their claims and that he will continue to make payments of the balance amount due as and when further moneys are available. We do not want to fetter the discretion of the liquidator in the matter of making such payment as he is the best judge of the situation in relation to the available finances. He will no doubt pay at least this 25 per cent of the amount payable also to these workmen in terms of our Award at the earliest possible opportunity and make payment of the balance as early as possible.

24. Our Award is that a sum of money, equivalent to two months' gross wages including allowances as at 17th September, 1959, be paid to each of the workmen enumerated in the agreed lists marked X.1 and X.2 relating to the daily paid staff and clerical staff employed by this Company. Let this amount or such portion of it, not below 25 per cent of this amount, be deposited with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Industrial Relations, No. 21, Vauxhall Street, Colombo 2, within a month of the date of the publication of this Award, and the further sums as soon as funds are available thereafter. The Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Industrial Relations, is directed to pay these amounts to the workmen specified in the lists X.1 and X.2 on their being identified by a responsible officer of the Union of which they are members. In the case of the workmen who are not members of the Union some senior employee among the employees working with the liquidator may be a suitable person to identify them.

25. We note that the moneys belonging to the provident fund of the employees of this Company have been invested in preference shares of the Company. The liquidator has informed us that 2/3 of this amount has already been paid to them. The payment of the preference shares, ranking in priority next after the payment of creditors and the amounts awarded under this order will no doubt be paid in the order of its priority.
