GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

1. **Allowances**—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. **Conditions of Service**—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. **Terms of Engagement**—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. **New Entrant Officers**—

(i) The period of probation/trial of “New Entrant Officers” appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) “New Entrant Officers” will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note—The term “New Entrant Officers” in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of sub-paragraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.

5. **Qualifications required**—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. **War Service Concession**—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty’s Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. **Other Requirements**—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

The selected officer will be required to enter into an agreement and bond to serve the Ceylon Government for a period of five years.

3. *Qualifications and Terms of Engagement.*—The Senior Legal Assistant will be recruited from Advocates of at least 15 years experience at the Bar. Judicial experience will be counted as experience at the Bar for this purpose. Experience in Income Tax Law and Practice would be regarded as useful. The officer appointed will be required to serve Government for a period of five years with the option to the Government to extend the period. ROYAL CEYLON AIR FORCE

Officer Vacancies—Secretarial and Equipment Branches

APPLICATIONS are invited for two officer vacancies in the Secretarial and two in the Equipment Branch of the Royal Ceylon Air Force.

2. The selected candidates will be granted regular commissions in the rank of Pilot Officer.

3. The duties of an officer in the Secretarial Branch are (apart from the normal duties of all officers) those connected with Air Force Administration and Accounts.

4. The duties of an officer in the Equipment Branch are (apart from normal Air Force Duties) those connected with the logistic support of the Royal Ceylon

Air Force (i.e., supply movement, estimating, ordering, receipt, storage, &c., of stores, aircraft, vehicles, technical equipment, fuels, explosives, &c.).

5. The selected candidates will be required to undergo training in the United Kingdom or elsewhere at various establishments.

Pay and Allowances.

On completion of two years service, an allowance of Rs. 25 will be paid for maintenance of uniforms.

(d) Other Allowances, &c. (Lodging Allowance minimum of Rs. 5.50), Separation Allowance (minimum of Rs. 2), Assisted Travel, Qualification Pay, &c., will be as detailed in Air Force Regulations.

7. Pensions/Gratuity are payable in terms of the Air Force (Regular and Regular Reserve) Regulations of 1951, as amended. Permanent and pensionable service under the Crown or previous service in the Ceylon Defence Forces or any other armed service of the British Commonwealth will count for pension.

Conditions of Service.

8. The prospects and conditions of service of an officer in the Royal Ceylon Air Force are as published in Ceylon Government Gazette No. 10,240 of April 17, 1951.

9. A single officer lives in the Officers' Mess and is provided with furnished accommodation, his food and batman service.

10. A married officer will be provided with married quarters (if available) and the service of a personal batman.

11. Air Force Officers are liable to be posted for duty or training in any part of the world, at any time.

12. The selected candidate will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the language policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

Basic Requirements.

13. Applicants must possess the following requirements:—

(a) Nationality.—Candidates must be citizens of Ceylon—

(b) Age.—Candidates must not be more than 28 years of age on July 1, 1960.

(c) Candidates must be unmarried and will not be permitted to marry for two years from the date of commission.

(d) Educational/Professional.—Candidates should provide satisfactory proof that they possess one of the following qualifications:—

- (i) A degree in Arts, Science, Economics or Commerce of a recognised University, or (Candidates with at least one of the following requirements may also be considered if they have other exceptional qualifications, e.g., Sports, &c.);
- (ii) Have passed the First Examination (General or Special Arts or Science qualifying) in any of the faculties of the University of Ceylon or University of London; or
- (iii) Have passed the Intermediate Examination of the Institute of Chartered Secretaries, London; or

- (iv) Possess the Ceylon Higher School Certificate;
- (v) Have passed in three subjects on one and the same occasion at the London University, G. C. E. (Advanced Level) Examination together with at least a credit pass in English at the Ceylon G. C. E. (Ordinary Level);
- (vi) Possess any other qualification which in the opinion of the Commander of the Air Force is equivalent to any one of the above clauses—(i to v).
- (e) *Medical Standard.*—Candidates must conform to Air Force Medical Standards (minimum height 5 ft. 4 in.)

- (c) copies of certificates of character obtained from responsible persons who are personally acquainted with the applicant;
- (d) copies of certificates in support of any claim made in the application.

18. Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Head of the Department concerned and bear a certificate to the effect that the officer can be released, if selected.

SUMMARY OF TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

(This summary is for convenient reference and is not an official statement of the employment terms which would be offered in a particular case.)

Duration of Appointment

The initial appointment of internationally recruited personnel is normally for two years, which includes a probationary period of one year. Further appointment at the end of the initial appointment may be on a term basis, or without time limit.

Salary Scales

The salaries of all staff members are subject to a Staff Assessment Plan, on a scale and subject to conditions to be determined from time to time by Council. Set out below are the gross salary scales, and the net salary scales following the Staff Assessment Plan deductions.

Post Adjustment

The above salaries are subject to adjustment, plus or minus, on the basis of classification of the particular duty station to which a staff member is posted. For staff members stationed at Montreal, there is at present a plus adjustment varying from \$650 per annum at P-1 level to \$1,215 per annum at Principal Officer level for those without dependents, and from \$975 per annum at P-1 level to \$1,825 per annum at Principal Officer level for those with dependents. Different adjustments apply at duty stations other than Montreal.

Dependency Allowances

Dependency allowances are granted at the following rates:—

- (a) \$200 per annum for a wife or an incapacitated son or daughter or a dependent husband, parent, brother or sister but not for more than one such dependent;
- (b) \$300 per annum for each dependent child, provided that if the allowance under (a) above is not paid this allowance is increased by \$100 per annum, but only in respect of one child.

Salary Increments

Salary increments within the scales shown above are awarded, after satisfactory service, annually to any salary step below \$15,000 gross, and biennially to any salary step above \$15,000 gross.

Conditions of Resignation

Three months' notice of resignation is normally required.

Leave Provisions

Annual leave on full-pay accrues at the rate of six weeks per year. Travelling expenses on home leave are paid once in two years. There is provision for paid sick leave.

Pension Plan

Staff members of ICAO participate in the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund. This includes pension rights on retirement at age 60, disability benefits, pensions for widows and orphans, and separation benefits before retirement. The staff member's contribution to the Pension Fund is 7% of 105% of his net salary. The Organization contributes 14%.

Group Life, Accidental Death and Dismemberment Insurance

Staff members may participate in an optional joint Group life, Accidental Death and Dismemberment Insurance plan which is entirely staff financed. The amount of insurance coverage permitted under the policy is directly related to the level of remuneration of the staff member.

Group Medical Insurance Plan

Staff members may participate in an optional Group Medical Insurance Plan which is financed by equal contributions by the Organization and the staff member. This plan provides reimbursement within fixed limits for hospital, surgical and ordinary medical expenses. The monthly cost to a staff member with dependents is \$6.43; without dependents \$1.92.

Travel and Removal Expenses

On first appointment, a staff member's travel expenses and those of his wife and dependent children are paid by the Organization from his place of residence. Reasonable removal costs are payable under rules established by the Organization. A staff member whose services are terminated by the Organization, or who resigns after completing at least two years' service, is eligible to receive payment of travel expenses and reasonable removal costs to his original home.

Installation Grant

An installation grant is paid on first appointment of an amount equivalent to the daily subsistence allowance applicable to the staff member's level at the duty station, for a period of 15 calendar days, if the staff member has no dependents. A staff member with dependents is paid, for himself, the equivalent of the daily subsistence allowance for a period of 30 days, and for each dependent the equivalent of half the daily subsistence allowance for the same period.

Education Grant

An education grant is paid of \$400 per annum for each child under 21 in full-time school or university attendance in the staff member's own country, provided this is not the country in which he is stationed. The return travel of each such child is also paid once a year, except in those years in which the staff member travels on home leave.

Under certain conditions an education grant is also paid to a child below 18 years in full-time school attendance in a special national school, international school or another school recognized by the Secretary-General away from the home country, the amount of the grant in such cases being generally limited to half the cost of school attendance, but not exceeding \$400.

Commonwealth Scholarships in Australia, 1961

APPLICATIONS are invited for the award of scholarships offered under the Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Plan and tenable in Australia from March, 1961.

The Scholarships aim at providing opportunities for Ceylonese students to pursue advanced courses or undertake research in Australia. They are intended for men and women of high intellectual promise who may be expected to make a significant contribution to their own country on their return from study abroad. The scholarships will usually be awarded for advanced study or research. In exceptional cases an award may be made to a graduate who wishes to study for another under-graduate degree, if the programme of studies he wishes to follow is not available in Ceylon. Applications are invited for the following courses:—

- Anthropology.
- Languages (including European and some Asian Languages.)
- Chemistry.
- Geology.
- Geophysics.
- Physics.
- Veterinary Physiology.
- Agriculture.
- Architecture.

2. *Tenure.*—Awards will normally be made for a programme of study or research extending over a period of two academic years and leading to a University Degree or similar qualification. Each award will be continued for the period of study or research for which it is granted, provided the student's progress and conduct are satisfactory.

Scholarships are, however, liable to be terminated at any time during the currency of the course at the discretion of the Australian authorities, for misconduct, irregularity in attendance, absence without permission of the authorities concerned from College or Hostel, or unsatisfactory progress in studies or failure to pass examinations. In such an eventuality the scholar might be required to return to Ceylon at his/her own expense.

3. *Eligibility.*—Candidates should—

- (i) be Citizens of Ceylon;
- (ii) be less than 28 years of age on 1st March, 1961. (In special circumstances, this age limit may be raised.)
- (iii) be Graduates of a recognised University or holder of an equivalent qualification;
- (iv) be able to produce satisfactory evidence that they have a sufficient competence in English to profit by a course of study in Australia; and
- (v) possess a good knowledge of Sinhalese.

Eligible candidates will be required to present themselves for an interview to be held in Colombo. No travelling or other expenses in connection with the interview will be paid.

4. *Terms of Award.*—Each award is intended to cover the expenses of travel, living and study during its tenure, as follows:—

- (a) Travel to and from Australia generally by tourist air.
- (b) Fees—all compulsory fees.
- (c) Living Allowances—paid fortnightly at the rate of £A.740 per annum for post-graduate scholars, and £A.600 per annum for undergraduate scholars from the date of arrival in Australia. In special circumstances an undergraduate scholar may receive an allowance at a higher rate. A special supplementary allowance may be paid to meet extraordinary costs of board when an award holder is travelling in Australia in connection with his course or where more expensive temporary accommodation is approved.
- (d) Clothing Allowance—up to a maximum of £A.50 in approved cases.
- (e) Married Scholars—for male married scholars undertaking post-graduate study accompanied by their wives a marriage allowance at the rate of £A.200 per annum in approved cases. This will not be payable in respect of a wife who holds a scholarship herself or who is in paid employment, and will not be payable during the first year of the tenure of a scholarship unless the scholar was married at the time of his application for an award.
- (f) Travel within Australia—up to a maximum of £A.50.
- (g) Other Supplementary Allowances—additional allowances may be made for unusually high costs of essential books and equipment and for extraordinary medical expenses.

(Note.—Benefits payable to students receiving full-time education at a university or college are not taxable in Australia.)

5. *Conditions:*

- (a) The scholar will be expected to return to his/her own country at the end of the scholarship.
- (b) The scholar may not, without receiving special permission, take paid employment during the tenure of his/her scholarship or serve on the staff of his country's official representative in Australia.
- (c) The scholar must follow the approved course of study and abide by the rules of the university or institution in which he/she is placed.
- (d) An award may be terminated at any time for reasons of unsatisfactory conduct, for breaches of the conditions of award or for failure to make satisfactory progress.
- (e) An Australian Scholarship under the Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Plan cannot normally be held in conjunction with any other scholarship award.

6. *Medical Examination.*—Applicants are required to be of sound health and awards are subject to successful applicants satisfying a prescribed medical examination. Selected candidates will also be required to comply with the medical provisions of the normal immigration requirements for entry of students into Australia. Where a wife is to accompany a married scholar, she must also satisfy these requirements.

7. *Agreement.*—A selected candidate should, before his/her departure for Australia, enter into an Agreement with the Government of Ceylon, undertaking, among other things, to pursue diligently the course of studies for which the scholarship is granted, and to pay to the Government of Ceylon all expenses incurred by the Government of Ceylon and the awarding agency in connection with the entire scholarship in the event of his/her failure to comply with the terms and conditions of the award.

Those who are already in the employ of the Government of Ceylon will, in addition, be required to bind themselves to serve the Government of Ceylon, if so required for a specified period (to be determined by the Government) after the completion of the course of studies.

8. *Applications.*—Applications, which should be substantially in the form, a specimen of which is given below, should be sent addressed to the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Education, Malay Street, Colombo 2, to reach him on or before 18th April, 1960.

Any applicants already in Government service should send their applications through the Heads of their Departments. As selections are proposed to be made immediately after the date of closing applications, such applicants are advised to ensure that the Departments concerned forward the applications before the due date.

Note.—Travelling expenses to and from U. K. will not be paid either by the awarding agency or by the Government of Ceylon. They will have to be borne by the candidates themselves.

- (b) undertaking to repay to the Government of Ceylon the full cost of course of training (i.e. all expenses incurred by the Government of Ceylon and the Awarding Agency in connection with the entire scholarship, including, in the case of Government servants, salary, allowances, fees, etc.) in the event of their failure to comply with the terms and conditions of their agreement.

7. *Medical Examination.*—Selected candidates will be required, at very short notice, to produce at their own expense (i) a medical certificate from a qualified medical practitioner, on a special form obtainable from this office; and (ii) a Radiologist's report of a complete X-ray of the chest.

8. *Interview.*—Candidates will be required, at very short notice, to present themselves for an interview to be held at this office at an appointed time. No travelling or other expenses connected therewith will be paid. DEPARTMENT OF NATIONAL HOUSING

Mahaliyadda Housing Scheme, Badulla

APPLICATIONS are invited from citizens of Ceylon by the Commissioner for National Housing for the occupation and eventual ownership of 11 low income group houses constructed at Mahaliyadda, Badulla.

Applications will be considered from—

- (a) persons whose average monthly income together with the income of his/her spouse does not exceed Rs. 200;
 - (b) permanent residents living within a radius of 5 miles from the scheme who do not own a residential house either in their own names or in the names of their spouses.
2. Each house stands on approximately 15 perches of land. The houses have tiled roofs and cement rendered floors; they consist of a verandah, two rooms, a kitchen and a water seal lavatory.
 3. The rentals of the houses will be Rs. 21 per mensem approximately spread over 25 years.
 4. Legal ownership will be transferred to the occupant only after the entirety of the value of the house

has been repaid. If at any stage of tenancy the occupant is able to pay off the entire amount outstanding in a lump sum, ownership will be transferred on such payment. Occupants will, however, be required to maintain the houses themselves and to pay rates and taxes and other dues themselves from the date on which they enter into occupation.

5. The selection of occupants will be made by the Commissioner for National Housing. Any attempt at canvassing will disqualify the applicants. The mode of selection will be by lottery. The date and place of lottery will appear in a subsequent press notification and applicants may be present.

6. Applications should be made on forms obtainable at the Department of National Housing, Colombo, to reach the Commissioner for National Housing on or before April 22, 1960.

7. If no acknowledgment of application is received within 21 days of posting of application, the attention of the Department should be invited by registered letter. Envelopes containing applications should be marked "Application for Houses at Badulla" on the top left-hand corner.
