GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS  
IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE  
“CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

1. Allowances—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. New Entrant Officers—

(i) The period of probation/trial of “New Entrant Officers” appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) “New Entrant Officers” will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note.—The term “New Entrant Officers” in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of sub-paragraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.

5. Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty’s Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

(ii) Overseas candidates may obtain the printed forms of application from the offices of the Ceylon Representatives abroad. They may forward the application, within the prescribed time, if they so desire, to the office of the Ceylon Representative abroad assigned to or nearest to the country of their residence for transmission to the Secretary, Public Service Commission.

(iii) *Medical Examination and Passages.*—Ceylonese officers selected abroad for appointment under the Ceylon Government will be required to present themselves for examination to approved Medical Practitioners with a view to it being ascertained whether they are physically fit for service. The fee for such examination as well as the cost of their passage expenses to Ceylon shall be paid by the officers themselves.

2. *Salary Scale.*—(I) The salary scale attached to the post is as follows:—

- (i) Candidates possessing the A.M.I.C.E., London, A.M.I. Mech. E., London, or A.M.I.E.E., London, or equivalent qualifications and who have been duly elected Corporate Members are eligible for a starting salary of Rs. 5,880 per annum on the scale Rs. 5,160—9 of 360 and 10 of 480—Rs. 13,200 per annum. (Efficiency Bars before Rs. 8,400 and Rs. 11,760 and two years halt on Rs. 11,280.)

(ii) Candidates who have passed—

- (a) Parts 1 and 2 (or Sections A and B under the old regulations) of the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, London; or  
(b) Parts 1, 2 and 3 (or Sections A and B under the old regulations) of the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, London; or  
(c) Sections A and B of the Associate Membership Examination of the Institute of Civil Engineers, London; or  
(d) An examination exempting therefrom, will be placed on the salary scale Rs. 4,080—360—Rs. 6,240 per annum and on confirmation they will be allowed to proceed on the incremental scale Rs. 4,080—12 of 360 and 1 of 480—Rs. 8,880 per annum. On being elected as an A.M.I.C.E., A.M.I. Mech. E. or A.M.I.E.E., London, or as a Corporate Member of any other equivalent Engineering Institution they will be eligible for the scale referred to at (i) above.

*Note.*—A selected candidate may, with Treasury concurrence, be placed at a point in the scale if his qualifications and experience warrant such a concession.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—The posts are permanent and pensionable. The appointments will be on probation for a period of three years.

- (ii) has passed Parts 1 and 2 (sections A and B under old regulations) of the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, London, or Parts 1, 2 and 3 (Sections A and B under the old regulations) of the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Electrical Engineers, London, or Sections A and B of the Associate Membership Examination of the Institution of Civil Engineers, London, or an examination equivalent thereto or exempting therefrom.

5. Applications forwarded through the Heads of Departments and received in this office after the prescribed date will not be entertained, unless the applications were received by the Head of Department before the prescribed date and the Head of Department concerned recommends acceptance, adducing valid reasons for the delay.

**Posts of Assistant Secretary and Research Officer**

THE Asian-African Legal Consultative Committee Secretariat has offered the post of an Assistant Secretary and the post of a Research Officer in the Secretariat to Nationals of the participating countries in the Committee, viz., Burma, Ceylon, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Japan, Pakistan, Sudan and the United Arab Republic and applications are hereby invited for these posts from Ceylonese candidates.

Applications which should be substantially in the form, a specimen of which is given below, should be addressed to the Secretary of the Asian-African Legal Consultative Committee, New Delhi, and forwarded to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Justice, Hultsdorf, Colombo 12, to reach him before April 15, 1960.

The Candidates should possess Academic and Professional Degrees in Law and experience in research will be treated as an added qualification. Candidates for the post of Assistant Secretary should not be less than 32 years of age and the candidates for the post of Research Officer should not be less than 27 years of age.

**Posts of Teachers of Oriental Music and Dancing in Government Schools**

**Scales of Salaries.**—(1) Assistant Secretary: Rs. 800—50—1,150 (Indian Rupees) per month.

(2) Research Officer: Rs. 500—50—800 (Indian Rupees) per month.

**Allowances.**—Persons other than Indian nationals will be paid foreign allowance calculated at the rate of 30 to 50 per cent. of their salary as may be determined by the Secretary in consultation with the Liaison Officers. Indian nationals will receive Dearness Allowance at the rates of Dearness Allowance admissible to employees of the Government of India of equivalent status.

**Income Tax Deductions.**—As the Committee has not finalised the question of its immunities and privileges, officers will be required to pay Indian Income Tax on their salaries and allowances until the question of immunities and privileges is settled.

**Residential Accommodation.**—The Committee undertakes no responsibility for providing residential accommodation to officers.

**Medical Benefit.**—Officers will be reimbursed for expenses incurred by them for medical attendance subject to a maximum of Rs. 300 per annum provided they consult a medical practitioner approved by the Secretary.

**Leave Rules.**—Officers will be entitled subject to exigencies of service to one month's earned leave for each completed year of service. In addition, casual leave for not exceeding 10 days in a year will be admissible.

**Gratuity.**—Subject to the completion of 3 years service Officers will be entitled to receive gratuity at the rate of one month's basic salary for each completed year of service.

**Conditions of Service.**—The posts are at present temporary but are likely to continue. Other conditions of service will be governed by the Committee's Staff Regulations.
