### GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE

- 1. Allowances—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

- (ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.
- (iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

### 4. New Entrant Officers-

- (i) The period of probation/trial of "New Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in
- 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

  (ii) "New Entrant Officers" will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Pclicy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

  (iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

  (b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, inter alia, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/ trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

- (iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Fublic Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

  The term "New Entrant Officers" in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Put lic Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of sub-paragraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957
- 5. Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.
- 6. War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire Air Raid precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.
- 7. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure. P. H. The acceptance of the selected candidates for training is subject to the approval of the Colombo Plan Authorities in Australia.

### Training of a Dental Surgeon in the Teaching of Dental Nurses, in New Zealand, under the Colombo Plan

APPLICATIONS are invited from Dental Surgeons of this Department who are interested in teaching the basic sciences as well as dental subjects to Dental Nurses in training for the award of a tellowship under the Colombo Plan for a period of 6 months for undergoing a course of training in the teaching of Dental Nurses at the School for Dental Nurses, New Zealand.

- 5. The award of the fellowship includes cost of travel to and from country of study, cost of internal travel in New Zealand, and a maintenance grant as may be decided by the Government of New Zealand.
