GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

1. Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. New Entrant Officers—

(i) The period of probation/trial of “New Entrant Officers” appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) “New Entrant Officers” will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note.—The term “New Entrant Officers” in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of sub-paragraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.

5. Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty’s Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

ROYAL CEYLON AIR FORCE

Officer Vacancies—Secretarial and Air Traffic Control Branches

APPLICATIONS are invited for three officer vacancies in the Secretarial and three in the Air Traffic Control Branch of the Royal Ceylon Air Force (one of the Secretarial Branch vacancies is initially for education duties).

2. The selected candidates will be granted regular commissions in the rank of Pilot Officer.

3. The duties of an officer in the Secretarial Branch are (apart from the normal duties of all officers) those connected with Air Force Administration and Accounts (and education initially in the case of officers taken for this purpose).

4. The duties of an officer in the Air Traffic Control Branch are (apart from the normal duties of all air force officers), those concerning the safety of aircraft in flight, on take off and landing, and fighter control which is concerned with Air Defence.

5. The selected candidates will be required to undergo training in the United Kingdom or elsewhere at various establishments.

Pay and Allowances:

6. Pay, Allowances and Pensions are laid down in the Royal Ceylon Air Force (Regular and Regular Reserve) Regulations of 1951 as amended.

(b) Uniform Allowance—on commissioning an allowance of Rs. 650 is granted for tropical outfit. On being posted overseas for service or training purposes, a further outfit allowance of Rs. 1,350 will be granted. On completion of two years service, an allowance of Rs. 25 will be paid for maintenance of uniforms.

(c) Other Allowances, &c. (Lodging Allowance minimum of Rs. 5.50), Separation Allowance (Minimum of Rs. 2), Assisted Travel, Qualification Pay, &c., will be as detailed in Air Force Regulations.

7. Pensions/Gratuity are payable in terms of the Air Force (Regular and Regular Reserve) Regulations of 1951, as amended. Permanent and pensionable service under the Crown or previous service in the Ceylon Defence Forces or any other armed service of the British Commonwealth will count for pension.

Conditions of Service:

8. The prospects and conditions of service of an officer in the Royal Ceylon Air Force are as published in *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,240 of April 17, 1951.

9. A single officer lives in the Officers' Mess and is provided with furnished accommodation, his food and batman service.

10. A married officer will be provided with Married Quarters (if available) and the service of a personal batman.

11. Air Force officers are liable to be posted for duty or training in any part of the world, at any time.

12. The selected candidate will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the language policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

Basic Requirements :

13. Applicants must possess the following requirements :—

- (a) Nationality—Candidates must be citizens of Ceylon—
 - (i) by descent, or
 - (ii) by registration.
- (b) Age—Candidates must not be more than 28 years of age on July 1st, 1960.
- (c) Civilian Status—Candidates must be unmarried and will not be permitted to marry for two years from the date of commission.
- (d) Educational/Professional—Candidates should provide satisfactory proof that they possess one of the following qualifications :—
 - (i) a degree in Arts, Science, Economics or Commerce of a recognised University, OR (Candidates with at least one of the following requirements may also be considered if they have other exceptional qualifications, e.g., Sports, &c.),
 - (ii) have passed the First Examination (General or Special Arts or Science qualifying) in any of the faculties of the University of Ceylon or University of London, OR
 - (iii) have passed the Intermediate Examination of the Institute of Chartered Secretaries, London, OR
 - (iv) possess the Ceylon Higher School Certificate,
 - (v) have passed in three subjects on one and the same occasion at the London University, G. C. E. (Advanced Level) Examination together with at least a credit pass in English at the Ceylon G. C. E. Ordinary Level),
 - (vi) possess any other qualifications which in the opinion of the Commander of the Air Force is equivalent to any one of the above clauses—(i to v).
- (e) Medical Standard—Candidates must conform to Air Force Medical Standards (minimum height 5 ft. 4 in.).

Instructions to Applicants :

14. Applications will be made in the form appearing at para. 22 of this notification. No printed copies of the form of application are available and applicants are

required to prepare their own forms. Applications which are not in accordance with the prescribed form will be rejected.

15. Applications are to be addressed to "The Commander of the Air Force, P. O. Box 594, Colombo, and the envelope is to be marked on the left-hand corner "Application (Secretarial and Air Traffic Control Branches as appropriate or both if so desired)—Officers". Applications will be accepted up to 12 noon on May 20th, 1960.

16. Under no circumstances will applications be considered unless the candidates possess the qualifications as per para. 12 above.

17. Applications should be accompanied by—

- (a) a copy of the applicant's certificate of birth;
- (b) a copy of the certificate of the highest educational/professional qualification obtained;
- (c) copies of certificates of character obtained from responsible persons who are personally acquainted with the applicant;
- (d) copies of certificates in support of any claim made in the application.

18. Applications from officers in the Government Service should be forwarded through the Head of the Department concerned and bear a certificate to the effect that the officer can be released, if selected.

Selection, Interviews, &c.

19. If on receipt of the application a candidate is found to possess the necessary qualifications as at para. 12 and is considered suitable he will be instructed to appear, at his own expense, before a selection board at a specific place, date and time.

20. Those candidates considered suitable by the Preliminary Selection Board will be examined by the Principal Medical Officer of the Air Force prior to presentation to the Final Selection Board.

2. Type of Tender

The tenderers must quote for a complete factory handed over in full working condition including—

- supply and construction of factory buildings,
- supply and installation of the necessary machinery,
- supply and installation of electricity for lighting the factory and running of any machines that are electrically operated,
- supply and installation of a adequate water supply system for the factory including a well, or water intake storage tanks, piping, pumps, &c.,
- construction of ancilliary buildings,
- access road to factory site from main road,
- construction of fencing and gates for factory premises.

3. The Tender Board reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all the tenders received or part of a tender.

The tender should include a general layout drawing of the factory with outline drawings for the buildings and machinery and equipment.

4. General Information

The factory will be sited near Mahendra Estate on the road branching off from the 36th mile of the Galle-Deniyaya Road. A road fit for motor vehicles up to the site will be provided at Government expense. The site will also be levelled at Government expense and handed over ready for start of building operations.

Tenderers should inspect and satisfy themselves as to the safe bearing properties of soil in which the factory is to be located and other local conditions.

6. General

The scheme is for a factory with an annual production of one million pounds of made tea per annum working on a single eight-hour shift per day and 300 days per annum.

Individual capacities of the various units should be such that to permit the co-ordinated operation from the intake of green leaf to the finished product.

All plant and machinery should be complete so as to operate from intake of raw materials to out-turn of made and boxed tea.

Machinery should be complete with all necessary equipment, reduction gear, main shafting, subsidiary shafting, bolting, &c., and inclusive of necessary protective enclosing for machinery to comply with Factories Ordinance. All electrical equipment such as motors, switch gear, cables, &c., should be suitably protected for operation in a damp tropical climate. Machinery should also be complete with all supporting structures, brackets, holding down bolts, &c., necessary for the installation of the plant.

External details of construction including materials of construction and any special design features of the machinery should be stated in tender.

Plans

The General Type Plan for the proposed factory is shown in sketch plans marked A and B but tenderers may modify this somewhat to suit their machinery. The basic design and arrangements should however be unchanged.

After the tender is accepted the successful tenderer shall submit a complete set of detailed drawings and working drawings both for the buildings as well as the installation of machinery, water supply, electricity, &c., to the Land Commissioner for approval before work commences. Tenderers should when tendering submit at their own expense outline drawings of the buildings and general layout drawings of the factory and machinery. - (h) At least 250,000 sq. ft. of withering tat area in standard type jute hessian tat banks to be provided in four lofts. Hessian to be at least 14 oz. quality.
- (i) A standard reversible draught type artificial withering system with a central air bulking chamber and control doors should be incorporated in the design (ventilating fans to be quoted as part of machinery item).
- (j) The steel work of the factory to be given one coat of priming paint and 2 coats of aluminium paint inclusive of roof.
- (k) The size of factory Rolling rooms to be such that it will be possible to add at least two more rollers later if necessary.
- (l) General specifications for materials and labour should be as per annexed P. W. D. No. 182.

8. Machinery and Equipment—(i) Diesel Engine operated (para. 5b).

The Machinery and Equipment of the factory should consist of at least but not limited to the undermentioned items :

12. Spares (para. 5g).

The successful tenderer shall be bound to allow any officer of the Land Commissioner's Department duly authorized to do so by the Land Commissioner to have access to and to inspect his books, checkrolls, muster rolls and other documents relating to labour employed by him in connection with the works tendered for.

17. The successful tenderer will be required to employ only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for.

18. The term "Ceylonese" for purposes of this contract shall mean and include—a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration. The employment of only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for will be made a condition of the contract and the failure on

the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation: Provided, however, that in exceptional circumstances the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Lands, with whom the contract is entered into may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Agriculture and Lands. 20. A sum not exceeding 10 per cent. of the contract amount will be retained by the Land Commissioner, for a period of 3 months after the date of completion of work, to set off against possible defects in construction.

21. If during the continuance of this agreement or at any time after the termination thereof, any difference or dispute shall arise between the parties hereto in regard to the interpretation of any of the provisions herein contained or any act, matter or thing relating to this agreement, such difference or dispute shall be forthwith referred to two (2) arbitrators for arbitration in Ceylon, one to be appointed by each party with liberty to the arbitrators, in case of difference or their failing to reach an agreement within one month of their appointment, to appoint an umpire resident in Ceylon, and the award which shall be made by the two arbitrators or umpire, as the case may be, shall be final, conclusive and binding on the parties hereto. If either party in difference shall neglect to appoint an arbitrator for the space of thirty (30) days after notice in writing to do so has been given by the other party or shall appoint an arbitrator who shall refuse to act, then the arbitrator appointed by the other party shall make final decision alone and the making of any award in such reference shall be a condition precedent to any right of action against any of the parties hereto in respect of any such difference. The party who requests arbitration shall if so required by the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Agriculture and Lands deposit with him prior to the appointment of arbitrators such sum as shall be fixed by him towards the cost of the arbitration.

22. Guarantees

(i) Tenderers should provide guarantees for the plant and buildings supplied by them in respect of—

- (a) Output of finished products.
- (b) Quality of such products.

(ii) Tenderers should guarantee that the plant and machinery supplied are free from defects in design, materials and workmanship and should be prepared to replace free of cost any defective parts.
