THE TOWN COUNCILS ORDINANCE, No. 3 OF 1946 Order under Sections 2, 5, 6 and 15

ORDER made by the Minister of Local Government and Housing, by virtue of the powers vested in him by sections 2, 5, 6 and 15 of the Town Councils Ordinance, No. 3 of 1946, as modified by the Proclamation published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

ORDER

1. The area delimited in the First Schedule hereto shall be a town for the purposes of the Town Councils Ordinance, No. 3 of 1946 (hereinafter referred to as "the Ordinance"), and the administrative limits of that town shall be the limits as set out in that Schedule.

2. The name and designation of the Town Council to be constituted under the Ordinance for the aforesaid town shall be the following:—

"Hendala Town Council"

3. The number of members of whom the Hendala Town Council shall consist shall be six.

4. The town for which the Hendala Town Council is to be constituted shall be divided into the six wards as defined in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. The date on which the term of office of the Hendala Town Council shall commence shall be February 1, 1961.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Limits of the Town of Hendala

All that area of land situated in the villages of Kerawalapitiya, Matagoda, Palliyawatta, Timbirigasyaya, Hendala and Hekitta in Ragam Pattuwa of Alutkuru Korale South in Colombo District, Western Province; and bounded as follows:—

North.—By a line drawn from the low-watermark of the sea at the western extremity of the southern limit of village of Uswetakeiyawa eastwards along the said southern limit to the centre line of the old canal.

East.—From the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre line of the old canal till it meets the northern extremity of the western limit of Wattala-Mabole Urban Council area; thence along the said limit of the Urban Council area it meets the centre line of Kelani Ganga.

South.—From the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre line of Kelani Ganga to its confluence with the sea.

West.—From the last-mentioned point northwards along the low-watermark of the sea to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

SECOND SCHEDULE

Limits of the wards of the Town of Hendala

Ward No. 1—Matagoda

North.—By a line drawn from the western extremity of the northern boundary of the village of Matagoda along the said boundary to the eastern boundary of the village of Matagoda.

East.—From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern boundary of the village of Matagoda to the southern extremity of the said boundary.

South.—From the last-mentioned point westwards along the southern boundary of the village of Matagoda to the western extremity of the said boundary.

West.—From the last-mentioned point northwards along the western boundary of the village of Matagoda to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 2—Kerawalapitiya

North.—From the eastern extremity of the northern limit of Ward No. 1, eastwards along the northern limit of the Town Council area to the eastern extremity of the said limit of the Town Council area.

East.—From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Town Council area till it meets the southern boundary of the village Kerawalapitiya.

South.—From the last-mentioned point westwards along the southern boundary of the village of Kerawalapitiya to the southern extremity of the eastern limit of Ward No. 1.

West.—From the last-mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Ward No. 1 to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 3—Palliyawatta

North.—By a line drawn from the western extremity of the northern limit of the Town Council area along the said limit to the centre line of the Canal to Negombo.

East.—From the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre line of the Canal to Negombo to the centre line of Kelani Ganga.

South.—From the last-mentioned point south-westwards and westwards along the centre line of Kelani Ganga to the western limit of the Town Council area.

West.—From the last-mentioned point northwards along the western limit of the Town Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

Ward No. 4—Timbirigasyaya

North.—By a line drawn from the western extremity of the southern limit of Ward No. 1 along the said limit to the eastern extremity of the said limit.

East.—From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern boundary of the village of Timbirigasyaya to the southern extremity of the said boundary.

South.—From the last-mentioned point westwards along the southern boundary of the village of Timbirigasyaya to the eastern limit of Ward No. 3.

West.—From the last-mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Ward No. 3 to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

Ward No. 5—Hendala

North.—By a line drawn from the western extremity of the southern limit of Ward No. 2 along the said limit to the eastern extremity of the said limit.

East.—From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Town Council area till it meets the northern boundary of the village of Hekitta.

South.—From the last-mentioned point westwards, northwards, westwards and northwards along the northern boundary of the village of Hekitta to the southern extremity of the eastern limit of Ward No. 4.

West.—From the last-mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Ward No. 4 to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

Ward No. 6—Hekitta

North.—By a line drawn from the western extremity of the southern limit of Ward No. 4, along the said limit to the eastern extremity of the said limit; thence along the southern limit of Ward No. 5 to the eastern limit of the Town Council area.

East.—From the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the eastern limit of the Town Council area to the southern extremity of the said limit.

South.—From the last-mentioned point along the southern limit of the Town Council area to the southern extremity of the eastern limit of Ward No. 3.

West.—From the last-mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Ward No. 3 to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

REGULATION

The regulations set out in the Schedule to the Colombo Municipal Council Waterworks Ordinance (Chapter

161), as amended from time to time, are hereby further amended in regulation 32, by the substitution, for paragraph (2) thereof, of the following new paragraph:—

“(2) The price of water supplied by meter for shipping shall be as follows:—

- (a) where the water is supplied to floating craft other than water barges, Rs. 7.50 per 1,000 gallons;
- (b) where the water is supplied to water barges, Rs. 6.00 per 1,000 gallons.”

Resolution

The Village Committee of the Ambagamuwa village area in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Udabulathgama in the Kandy District hereby resolves, under section 47A (2) of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), to impose and levy for the year 1960, within the areas specified in the Schedule hereto, in lieu of the conservancy fee prescribed by by-laws published in *Gazette* No. 8,366 of April 29, 1938 (therein called “Rules”) a conservancy rate of four per centum on the annual value of all buildings and all lands situated within those areas payable in four equal instalments on March 31, June 30, September 30 and December 31, respectively.

SCHEDULE

1. All that area of land known as the Ginigathena Bazaar area, situated in the villages of Kadawala, Thiniyagala and Gonawala in the Ambagamuwa (Udabulathgama) village area in Ambagamuwa Korale in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Udabulathgama in the Kandy District of the Central Province, and bounded as follows:—

North: By a line drawn from a point on the northern boundary of the Public Works Department Road from Colombo to Ginigathena at the 63rd milestone, south-eastwards along the northern boundary of the said road till it meets the centre line of the foot-path (lot 8 in F. V. P. 106 C.P.) near the 63½ milestone on the said road, thence north-eastwards along the centre line of the foot-path (lots 8, 7, and 6 in F. V. P. 106 C.P.) which forms the southern boundary of the Kenilworth Estate to the western boundary of the Public Works Department Road from Nawalapitiya to Hatton; thence northwards along the western boundary of the said road till it meets the 7th milestone on the said road; thence due eastwards along a straight line crossing the said road till it meets the left bank of the Mahaweli Ganga.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the left bank of the Mahaweli Ganga till it meets a point due north-east of the 72½ milestone on the Colombo-Hatton Public Works Department Road.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point due south-westwards along a straight line till it meets the 72½ milestone on the said Colombo-Hatton Public Works Department Road; thence north-westwards along a straight line due east of the centre of culvert No. 3 on the Ginigathena-Arselena Village Committee Road.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along a straight line to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

2. All that area of land known as the Norton Bridge Bazaar area, situated in the villages of Akkarawatta otherwise known as Norton Bridge, and Kalaweldeniya, within the Village Headman's Division of Akkarawatta Wasama, and bounded as follows :—

North : By a straight line drawn from the point 300 yards south-west of and perpendicular to the centre line of the Norton-Bridge-Maskeliya Public Works Department Road at the centre of the Hydro-Electric Scheme Diversion Exist on the said road, north-eastwards, crossing the said road at the said Diversion Exist until it meets the centre line of the Kehelgamuwa Ganga.

East : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the centre line of the Kehelgamuwa Ganga, crossing the Watawala-Dickoya Public Works Department Road at the bridge over the said Kehelgamuwa Ganga until it meets a point to the east of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the said Watawala-Dickoya Public Works Department Road at the centre of culvert No. 6/6.

South : By a straight line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards crossing the Watawala-Dickoya Public Works Department Road at the centre of culvert No. 6/6 to a point 300 yards west of and perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the said culvert.

West : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards parallel to and at a distance of 300 yards from the centre line of the Watawala-Dickoya Public Works Department Road and the Norton Bridge-Maskeliya Public Works Department Road to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

3. All that area of land known as the Maskeliya-Kintyre Bazaar area, situated in the Village Headman's Division of Maskeliya, and bounded as follows :—

North : By a line drawn from a point 100 yards north-west of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the Norwood-Moray Public Works Department Road at the centre of culvert No. 34/9 on the said road north-eastwards south-eastwards and again north-eastwards and eastwards along a line parallel to and 100 yards from the centre line of the said road until it meets the centre line of the stream which flows through culvert No. 33/8 on the said road.

East : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre line of the stream which flows through culvert No. 33/8 on the Norwood Moray Public Works Department Road to the centre line of the said road at the centre of the said culvert; thence south-eastwards along a line perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the centre of the said culvert to a point 100 yards from the centre of the said culvert; thence south-westwards parallel to and at a distance of 100 yards from the centre line of the said road until it meets a point on a line parallel to and 50 yards east of the centre line of the Maskeliya-Upcot Public Works Department Road; thence southwards along a line parallel to and at a distance of 50 yards from the centre line of the Maskeliya-Upcot Public Works Department Road until it meets a point 50 yards east of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the $\frac{1}{4}$ milestone.

South : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along a straight line crossing the Maskeliya-Upcot Public Works Department Road at the $\frac{1}{4}$ milestone to a point 50 yards west of the centre line of the said road at the said milestone; thence northwards along a line parallel to and at a distance of 50 yards from the centre line of the said road until it meets a point on a line parallel to and 100 yards south of the centre line of the Norwood-Moray Public Works Department Road; thence westwards south-westwards, north-westwards and again south-westwards along a line parallel to and at a distance of 100 yards from the centre line of the Norwood-Moray Public Works Department Road until it meets a point 100 yards south-east of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the centre of culvert No. 34/9.

West : By a straight line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards crossing the Norwood-Moray Public Works Department Road at the centre of culvert No. 34/9 to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

4. All that area of land known as the Upcot Bazaar area, situated in the Village Headman's Division of Maskeliya, and bounded as follows :—

North : By a line drawn from a point 50 yards north-east of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the Norwood-Upcot Public Works Department Road at the centre of culvert No. 8/12 on the said road, south-eastwards parallel to and at a distance of 50 yards from the centre line of the said road to a point 50 yards north-east of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the centre of culvert No. 8/14 on the said road.

East : By a straight line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards crossing the Norwood-Upcot Public Works Department Road at the centre of culvert No. 8/14 on the said road to a point 50 yards south-west of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the centre of culvert No. 8/14.

South : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards parallel to and at a distance of 50 yards from the centre line of the said Norwood-Upcot Public Works Department Road to a point 50 yards south-west of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the centre of culvert No. 8/12.

West : By a straight line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastwards crossing the Norwood-Upcot Public Works Department Road at the centre of culvert No. 8/12 on the said road to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

5. All that area of land known as the Norwood Bazaar, situated in the Village Headman's Division of Norwood, and bounded as follows :—

North : By a straight line drawn from a point 200 yards south-west of and perpendicular to the centre line of the Hatton-Maskeliya Public Works Department Road at the centre of culvert No. 7/18 north-eastwards to the centre of the said culvert on the said road; thence north-eastwards along a straight line crossing the Hambantota Oya to the centre line of the said road at the 6th milestone.

East : By a straight line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the centre line of the said road until it meets the centre of the bridge over the said Hambantota Oya; thence south-eastwards along the centre line of the said Hambantota Oya until it meets a point about 275 yards north-east of and perpendicular to the centre line of the Norwood-Bogawantalawa Public Works Department Road at the centre of culvert No. 1/5; thence south-westwards along the said perpendicular line until it meets a point 200 yards north-east of the centre line of the said road at the centre of the said culvert; thence south-eastwards parallel to and 200 yards from the centre line of the said road until it meets a point 200 yards north-east of and perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the centre of culvert No. 1/15.

South : By a straight line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards crossing the Norwood-Bogawantalawa Public Works Department Road at the centre of culvert No. 1/15 to a point 200 yards south-west of and perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the centre line of the said culvert.

West : By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards parallel to and at a distance of 200 yards from the centre line of the Norwood-Bogawantalawa Public Works Department Road and the Hatton-Maskeliya Public Works Department Road until it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

6. All that area of land known as the Bogawantalawa Bazaar area, situated in the Village Headman's Division of Bogawantalawa, and bounded as follows :—

North : By a line drawn from a point 200 yards north of and perpendicular to the centre line of the Norwood-Campion Public Works Department Road at the 7th milestone eastwards and south-eastwards parallel to and at a distance of 200 yards from the centre line of the said road to a point 200 yards north-east of and perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the centre of culvert No. 9/9.

- East:** By a straight line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards crossing the Norwood-Campion Public Works Department Road at the centre of culvert No. 9/9 to a point 200 yards south-west of and perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the centre of the said culvert No. 9/9.
- South:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards and westwards parallel to and at a distance of 200 yards from the centre line of the Norwood-Campion Public Works Department Road to a point 200 yards south of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the 7th milestone.
- West:** By a straight line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards crossing the Norwood-Campion Public Works Department Road at the 7th milestone to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.
7. All that area of land known as the Watawala Bazaar area, situated in the villages of Watawala, Inchyra and Trafalgar, and bounded as follows:—
- North:** By a straight line drawn from a point 200 yards south-west of and perpendicular to the centre line of the Colombo-Hatton Public Works Department Road at the centre of culvert No. 69/18 on the said road north-eastwards crossing the said road at the said culvert to a point 200 yards north-east of and perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the centre of culvert No. 69/18.
- East:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards parallel to and at a distance of 200 yards from the centre line of the Colombo-Hatton Public Works Department Road to a point 200 yards north-east of and on a line perpendicular to the centre line of the said road at the centre of culvert No. 70/4.
- South:** By a straight line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards crossing the Colombo-Hatton Public Works Department Road at the centre of culvert No. 70/4 on the said road to a point 200 yards south-west of and on a line perpendicular to the centre of the said road at the centre of the said culvert No. 70/4.
- West:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards parallel to and at a distance of 200 yards from the centre line of the Colombo-Hatton Public Works Department Road to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

- 1. Allowances.**—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.
- 2. Conditions of Service.**—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulation made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.
 - (a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.
 - (b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service in terms of section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.
 - (c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952, published in the *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 10,329 of July 30, 1952. The Local Authority will contribute 3 per cent. of salary.
 - (d) Appointees may be required to furnish security either in cash or by Fidelity Guarantee Bond through a Guarantee Association approved by the Local Government Service Commission in a sum which may be decided upon by the Local Authority.
 - (e) Appointees not holding scheduled posts in the Local Government Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a duly qualified medical practitioner as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.
 - (f) The appointment will generally be on probation or subject to confirmation after a period of two years unless otherwise specified.
 - (g) Applicants should annex copies of their birth certificates in proof of age. No affidavits will be accepted. If no copies of birth certificates are attached, the applicants will be considered as ineligible.
- 3. Terms of Engagement.**—The posts specified in the Schedule published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.
 - (i) The period of probation/trial of "New Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 2 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.
 - (ii) "New Entrant Officers" will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.
 - (iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.
 - (a) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the Local Government Service Commission is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the Commission if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

 - (iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Local Government Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note.—The term "New Entrant Officers" in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Local Government Service in response to advertisements published on or after 29th January, 1960.
- 4. New Entrant Officers.**—(i) The period of probation/trial of "New Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 2 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.
- (ii) "New Entrant Officers" will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.
- (iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.
 - (a) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the Local Government Service Commission is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the Commission if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

 - (iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Local Government Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note.—The term "New Entrant Officers" in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Local Government Service in response to advertisements published on or after 29th January, 1960.
- 5. Qualifications required.**—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. The term "Ceylonese" for all purposes of recruitment to the Local Government Service is defined as a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord) will be allowed to deduct periods of such service (commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest) from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they have joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. Age Concession.—Members of the Local Government Service are eligible to apply irrespective of age for posts advertised in the Local Government Service.

8. Members of the Local Government Service in the same class and grade as the post advertised are eligible to apply for transfer to the vacancy advertised irrespective of educational qualifications.

9. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from those in a Local Body should be forwarded through the Municipal Commissioner or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

A COMPETITIVE examination for Electrical Superintendents, Grades I and II in the Local Government Service for recruitment to the Non-Professionally qualified Grade of Assistant Engineer will be held in Colombo by the Local Government Service Commission. (1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Ordinance, every person who has in his possession, custody, or control any vehicle or animal liable to such tax, shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars substantially in the form set out in Schedule A hereto, which may be obtained from the office of the Committee.

(2) The schedule referred to in paragraph (1) shall be filled up and sent to the Chairman on or before the thirty-first day of March, 1960, in respect of the year 1960, by the person liable to pay the tax under section 47 of the Ordinance, and no such schedule shall be required from such person in respect of any subsequent year, during which such person has such vehicle or animal in his possession, custody, or control.

2. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall, without further notice, be liable—

- (a) for the year 1960, in respect of the vehicles and animals specified in that schedule, to pay the tax on or before the thirty-first day of May of that year; and
- (b) for every subsequent year, in respect of such vehicles and animals specified in that schedule as remain in his possession, custody, or control for more than thirty days in such subsequent year, to pay the tax on or before the thirty-first day of March of that year.

3. If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps, or uses any vehicle or animal which is not mentioned in such schedule and which is liable to the tax under the Ordinance, or if any person who has not furnished any schedule under by-law 1, for the first time acquires, keeps, or uses any vehicle or animal which is liable to such tax, he shall, within one month from the date on which he acquires or commences to keep or use such vehicle or animal, send a written notice to the Chairman stating the fact of such acquisition, keeping, or use, and further furnish a written statement of particulars substantially in the form set out in Schedule A hereto.

4. Subject to the provisions of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the written statement referred to in by-law 3, shall be liable to pay the tax, in respect of the year in which such statement is furnished and in respect of every subsequent year, for such vehicles and animals specified in the statement as are in his possession, custody, or control, within such time as may be notified to him in that behalf by the Chairman.

5.
