PART I: SECTION (I)—GENERAL

Price Orders

Food Price Order No. MN/4 of 1960.

RICE AND PADDY

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Sanmugam Paramanathan, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), for the Mannar District, do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from this date the Food Price Order No. MN/13 of 1959, dated December 21, 1959, published in *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 12,021 of December 24, 1959, relating to Rice and Paddy;
- (ii) fix with immediate effect the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto to be a wholesale dealer's maximum wholesale price per cwt. nett above which rationed rice and paddy, respectively, shall not be sold by wholesale within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the same Schedule;
- (iii) fix with immediate effect the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be a retail dealer's maximum retail price per pound nett above which rationed rice and paddy, respectively, shall not be sold by retail within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column one of the same Schedule;
- (iv) direct for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of rationed rice or paddy for the purpose of re-sale or any sale of rationed rice or paddy in a quantity of one hundredweight nett or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of rationed rice or paddy less than one hundredweight nett for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (v) direct that no person shall sell any rationed rice or paddy mixed with any other article;
- (vi) direct that when any rationed rice or paddy is sold, the maximum prices fixed by this Order shall include prices of wrapper or container, if any, in which such rationed rice or paddy is sold;
- (vii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader who has any rationed rice or paddy in his possession or under his control at any place or in any vehicle shall exhibit conspicuously at that place or on that vehicle a quantity of rationed rice or paddy, in a suitable container, with the maximum prices for rice and paddy fixed by this Order displayed in figures not less than one inch in height on price tag or board attached to such container in such a manner that the rationed rice or paddy and the maximum prices could be clearly seen by any customer;
- (viii) direct that for the purpose of this Order "pound" or "lb." shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight;
- (ix) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every person who sells any rationed rice or paddy by wholesale, and every person who sells any rationed rice or paddy by retail, on demand give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale;
 - (b) the quantity of rationed rice or paddy sold (by weight);
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of ration rice or paddy sold; and
 - (d) the nature of transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

FOOD CONTROL NOTICE

Validity of Coupons of Rice Ration Books of the 19th Supplementary Series from the 20th week of Rationing commencing from April 25, 1960

REFERENCE Regulation 4 (3), under Head E, Part III of Food Control Regulations 1952, and my Notification dated December 3, 1959, published in *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 12,002 of December 11, 1959.

It is hereby notified for the information of the public that, as from the 20th week of rationing of the 19th Supplementary Series Rice Ration Books, commencing from April 25, 1960, only ONE coupon shall be surrendered for the purchase of the full legal ration of 4 lbs. of rice per person per week. The validity of the coupons (of the 19th Supplementary Series Rice Ration Books) bearing fractions 20/25 to 24/25 and Coupons bearing fractions 20/45 to 24/45, as stated in the Notification referred to above, has, therefore, been changed. The present validity of these coupons is defined in the table given below, and Ration Book Holders should surrender coupons to the Authorised Distributors accordingly, for the purchase of rice under the ration.
