Price Orders

Food Price Order No. MONA/D/7.

RICE AND PADDY

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Tuan Isakeen Cassim, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), for the Moneragala District, do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with immediate effect my Price Order No. MONA/D/4, dated February 19, 1960, published in *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 12,067 of February 24, 1960, in respect of rice and paddy;
- (ii) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the First Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight nett above which rice shall not be sold by wholesale, and fix the prices specified in column 3 of the First Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight nett above which paddy shall not be sold by wholesale in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the same Schedule;
- (iii) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price per two pounds nett above which rice shall not be sold, and fix the prices specified in column 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price per two pounds nett above which paddy shall not be sold within the areas mentioned in column 1 of the same Schedule;
- (iv) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any rice and paddy for the purpose of re-sale or any sale of rice and paddy in a quantity of one hundredweight nett or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any rice and paddy less than one hundredweight for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be sale by retail;
- (v) direct that no person shall sell rice and paddy which is adulterated with any other article;
- (vi) direct that when any rice and paddy is sold the maximum prices fixed by this order shall include the price of wrapper or container, if any, in which such rice and paddy is sold;
- (vii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader who has any rice and paddy in his possession or under his control at any place, shall exhibit conspicuously at that place a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in that area;
- (viii) direct that for the purpose of this Order "pound" shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight; and
- (ix) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every person who sells any rice and paddy by wholesale shall, and every person who sells any rice and paddy by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the quantity sold by weight;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity sold; and
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950.

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Tuan Isakeen Cassim, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food) for the Badulla District, do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with immediate effect my Price Order No. BD/55, dated 9th February, 1960, published in *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 12,062 of February 15, 1960, in respect of rice and paddy;
- (ii) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the First Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight nett above which rice shall not be sold by wholesale, and fix the prices specified in column 3 of the First Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight nett above which paddy shall not be sold by wholesale in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the same Schedule;
- (iii) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price per two pounds nett above which rice shall not be sold, and fix the prices specified in column 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price per two pounds nett above which paddy shall not be sold within the areas mentioned in column 1 of the same Schedule;
- (iv) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any rice and paddy for the purpose of re-sale or any sale of rice and paddy in a quantity of one hundredweight nett or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any rice and paddy less than one hundredweight for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be sale by retail;
- (v) direct that no person shall sell rice and paddy which is adulterated with any other article;
- (vi) direct that when any rice and paddy is sold the maximum prices fixed by this Order shall include the price of wrapper or container, if any, in which such rice and paddy is sold;
- (vii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader who has any rice and paddy in his possession or under his control at any place, shall exhibit conspicuously at that place a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in that area;
- (viii) direct that for the purpose of this Order "pound" shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight; and
- (ix) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every person who sells any rice and paddy by wholesale shall, and every person who sells any rice and paddy by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the quantity sold by weight;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity sold; and
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.
