The Minutes on Pensions dated February 5, 1934, as amended from time to time, are hereby further amended by the insertion, immediately after section 48D, of the following new section:—

"48E. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in these Minutes, where—

- (1) any person who was the holder of a scheduled post within the meaning of the Public Service Provident Fund Ordinance, No. 18 of 1942, and whose service in such scheduled post has been determined under section 13 of that Ordinance, or
- (2) any person who was a contributor to any approved Provident Fund within the meaning of section 48 (5) of these Minutes and who, upon termination of his or her service as a contributor to such Fund, had received any bonus, award or other benefit under the rules of that Fund,

is appointed to a permanent and pensionable office in the public service, then, the period of his or her service (hereinafter referred to as "contributory service") during which he or she contributed to the Public Service Provident Fund or the approved Provident Fund, as the case may be, shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be reckoned as a period of service admissible for the purpose of any pension or gratuity payable under these Minutes, if, but only if,—

- (a) such person refunds to the Government, when required so to do by the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury, a sum equivalent to the bonus or award or other benefit paid to the credit of the account of such person by the Government under section 13 of the aforesaid Ordinance or under the rules of the approved Provident Fund, as the case may be, together with simple interest on such sum at four per centum per annum; and
- (b) the termination of such person's contributory service arose in any of the following circumstances, that is to say,—
  - (i) abolition of office or retirement on grounds of ill-health;
  - (ii) termination of contract by, or with the consent of, the Government for the purpose of transfer or release for other non-pensionable employment under the Government or for employment of a quasi-public character including employment under any Municipal Council, Urban Council, Town Council, Village Committee or under any statutory board or any corporation established under the Industrial Corporations Act, No. 49 of 1957;
  - (iii) termination of contract by, or with the consent of, the Government for the purpose of obtaining higher professional qualifications; or
  - (iv) retirement, in the case of a female employee, with a view to, or in consequence of, marriage after not less than five years' contributory service:

Provided however that such contributory service shall not be reckoned for the purpose of any pension or gratuity payable under these Minutes—

- (1) in a case where termination of contributory service arose in any of the circumstances specified in paragraph (b) (i), if the period intervening between the date of termination of contributory service and the date of entering on the duties of the pensionable office exceeds two and half years, or if the period of contributory service is less than six months;
- (2) in a case where termination of contributory service arose in any of the circumstances specified in paragraph (b) (ii), if there has been a break in such person's service in the employment to which such person was transferred or for which such person was released;
- (3) in a case where termination of contributory service arose in the circumstances specified in paragraph (b) (iii), if a direction under section 20 (2A) of these Minutes that such service shall be admitted for any pension or gratuity payable under these Minutes, has not been given by the Minister of Finance; and
- (4) in a case where termination of contributory service was with a view to marriage, if the marriage had not taken place within three months of the termination of such service."

### THE REGISTERED STOCK AND SECURITIES ORDINANCE

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 of the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance (Chapter 289), as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, I, Junius Richard Jayewardene, Minister of Finance, do by this Order direct that, of the sum of one thousand million rupees for the raising of which by way of loan authority has been given by the Ceylon Development Loans Act, No. 6 of 1954, as amended by the Ceylon Development Loans (Amendment) Act, No. 18 of 1959, the sum specified in the Schedule hereto shall be raised in Ceylon in the mode and upon the terms and conditions specified in that Schedule.

1. The sum of money to be raised shall be twenty million rupees, and it shall be raised by way of a 16/20 year loan issued at par:
2. The loan shall be raised by the creation and issue of registered stock only.
3. The rate of interest payable on the loan shall be  $3\frac{1}{2}$  per centum per annum.
4. The dates in each year, on which the half-yearly interest on the loan shall be payable, shall be the 16th day of June and the 16th day of December.
5. A half-yearly appropriation out of the Consolidated Fund of Ceylon as a contribution to the sinking fund to be established for the purpose of redeeming the loan shall be made at the rate of 4 per centum per annum, and such contribution shall commence on the 16th day of June, 1961.
6. The date of redemption of the registered stock issued for the purpose of raising the loan shall be the 16th day of June, 1980.

Provided, however, that the Government shall have the option of redeeming any such registered stock at par on such date subsequent to the 15th day of June, 1976, as may be appointed by the Minister of Finance by notification published, not less than six months prior to that date, in the *Gazette* and in at least two newspapers circulating in Ceylon.

#### Ceylon Government $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. Loan, 1976/80 "C" Series

*Issued at par—Repayable at par*

THE Central Bank of Ceylon, on behalf of the Government of Ceylon, invites applications for a  $3\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. Loan of Rs. 20 millions. The loan is repayable at par on June 16, 1980, but the Government will have the option of repayment at par on such date subsequent to June 15, 1976, on giving 6 months' notice.

**Authority.**—The loan is raised on the authority of the Ceylon Development Loans Act, No. 6 of 1954, as amended by the Ceylon Development Loans (Amendment) Act, No. 18 of 1959, and under the provisions of the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance, 1937 (Chapter 289).

**Purpose.**—The loan is raised by the Government of Ceylon for expenditure on any work connected with or incidental to the development of Ceylon.

**Form of Issue.**—The loan will be issued in the form of Registered Stock. (Leaflets containing the general conditions applicable to Registered Stock are available on application to the Department of Public Debt, Central Bank of Ceylon.)

**Issue Price.**—The issue price is Rs. 100 per cent. payable in full at the time of application. The minimum holding is Rs. 100.

**Applications.**—Applications will be received by the Registrar from June 27, 1960, and until the list is closed. Applications must be on the proper form and must be accompanied by a remittance in full. Depositors of the Ceylon Savings Bank and Post Office Savings Bank may, by arrangement with these Institutions, forward their applications through these Institutions.

A commission of 1/16 per cent. on the nominal amount of subscription accepted will be allowed to bankers (including the Ceylon Savings Bank and the Post Office Savings Bank), recognised stock-brokers and brokers in respect of applications bearing their stamp. A negotiating fee of the same percentage on the amount of subscription accepted will be allowed to Proctors in respect of applications bearing their stamp.

**Payment for Stock.**—Payment should be made by cheque drawn in favour of the Central Bank of Ceylon and crossed "on account of Ceylon Government Loan".

**Scrip.**—Stock Certificates will be issued after receipt and acceptance of the applications.

**Interest.**—Interest at the rate of  $3\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. per annum will be payable half-yearly on the 16th day of June and the 16th day of December in each year. The first payment of interest will be on the 16th day of December, 1960, and will be for the period commencing on the date on which the application is accepted up to and including the 15th day of December, 1960.

**Taxation:—(i) Stamp Duty.**—All documents used in the issue, transfer or redemption of the loan will be free from stamp duty.

(ii) **Income Tax.**—Interest to resident holders will be paid without deduction of income tax, but resident holders liable to income tax should include such interest in their income tax returns. Deduction of tax at source will be made from holdings of non-residents. (Current rate of income tax is  $33\frac{1}{3}$  per cent. in the case of non-resident individuals,  $39\frac{1}{3}$  per cent. in the case of Hindu undivided families and 62 1/9 per cent. in the case of non-resident companies). Persons who are exempt from Ceylon income tax will be entitled to claim repayment of the tax deducted.

(iii) **Wealth Tax.**—Under Section 6 (1) (g) of the Personal Tax Act, No. 14 of 1959, investments in securities of the Government of Ceylon are excluded from the wealth of a person, and are thus exempt from Wealth Tax.

(iv) **Estate Duty.**—Government accepts in payment of estate duty such Ceylon Government stocks as may be prescribed. In the case of fully paid stock issued and repayable at par, the stock will discharge an amount of estate duty equal to the aggregate of its face value and the accrued interest thereon. In the case of stock not fully paid, or issued below par, or repayable at an amount other than par the amount of estate duty to be discharged per Rs. 100 nominal stock, together with accrued interest thereon, will be announced from time to time in the *Government Gazette*, but the amount to be discharged per Rs. 100 nominal stock will not be less than the amount originally subscribed or the amount repayable on maturity, whichever is less. The acceptance of any stock in lieu of cash for payment of estate duty is conditional on its being either (a) subscribed for by the deceased when first issued, or (b) purchased by the deceased not less than one year prior to date of death.

**Security.**—The loan is secured on the Consolidated Fund of Ceylon. A separate sinking fund will be established towards the redemption of the loan under the management of the Monetary Board of the Central Bank of Ceylon, who are the Trustees of the sinking funds. Half-yearly contributions at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum to the sinking fund will be commenced on June 16, 1961.

**Public Debt.**—The present gross funded public debt of Ceylon is Rs. 1,466,835,930.

The approximate market value of the accumulated sinking funds amounts to Rs. 321,445,082.

The net funded public debt is thus Rs. 1,145,390,848.

### THE TRUSTS ORDINANCE

#### Order under Section 114

WHEREAS the Trustees of the National Council for Child and Youth Welfare (Ceylon); namely:

Sir Albert Peiris,  
Lloyd Oscar Abeyratne,  
Lady Evelyn de Zoysa,  
Sita Seneviratne, and  
Irwin Aloysius Senanayake,

have applied to the Minister of Justice for their incorporation under section 114 of the Trusts Ordinance (Chapter 72):

Now, therefore, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the aforesaid section, I, Edmund Joseph Cooray, Minister of Justice, do by this Order authorise the incorporation of the said Trustees, and direct and declare—

- that the said Trustees and their successors for the time being duly appointed under the rules and regulations of the said National Council for the Child and Youth Welfare (Ceylon) shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal under the name and style of "The Trustees of the National Council for Child and Youth Welfare (Ceylon)";

#### The Award

This is an Award under section 17 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950. It relates to an industrial dispute between the All-Ceylon United Motor Workers' Union, 108, Kew Road, Colombo 2, and Messrs. H. Stephen Fernando and Sons, 101, Fergusons Road, Colombo 14.

2. The Honourable the Minister of Labour, by his Order made under section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act on the 24th February, 1960, referred the dispute to me for settlement by arbitration. The Deputy Commissioner of Labour in his statement of the 21st day of November, 1959, set out the matter in dispute as the non-payment of the sum of Rs. 457.26 to Mr. W. Joseph by Messrs. H. Stephen Fernando & Sons, being the gratuity awarded by Mr. B. D. Fernando in terms of the agreement reached at the conference held at the Labour Office, Colombo Industrial Relations Division, on 3rd February, 1959.

3. Mr. Advocate Prins Rajasooriya, instructed by Mr. Kingsley Wijesinghe, appeared for the All-Ceylon United Motor Workers' Union, assisted by Mr. D. G. William, General Secretary. Mr. Stephen Fernando appeared for Messrs. H. Stephen Fernando & Sons.

4. Mr. H. Stephen Fernando and his sons run the business known as "Messrs. H. Stephen Fernando & Sons". The business consists in procuring and supplying river sand, metal and bricks to builders. The establishment also purchases and sells tiles. The establishment owns a number of lorries and paddy boats and a stone crusher for the purpose of the business. A number of lorry drivers and cleaners and labourers are employed by this establishment. It would appear that in about November, 1958, the services of Mr. W. Joseph referred to in the statement of the Deputy Commissioner of Labour came to an end. According to the statement filed by Mr. Stephen Fernando, he did not dismiss W. Joseph but W. Joseph had a quarrel with one of Mr. Stephen Fernando's sons, garaged the lorry that he used to drive and went away of his own accord. According to the statement filed by the All-Ceylon United Motor Workers' Union, Joseph was dismissed without any just or reasonable cause. Apparently the Union reported the matter to the Department of Labour, and a conference was held on the 3rd of February, 1959. Mr. I. D. L'Brooy presided at that conference and those present included Mr. H. S. Fernando and Mr. W. P. Don Henry, as representatives of Messrs. H. Stephen Fernando & Sons, and Mr. D. G. William, as representative of the Union. The notes of the conference have been produced marked P3. The notes state with regard to the subject of Joseph's termination of services that "it is agreed that a Labour Officer nominated by the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo Industrial Relations, will enquire into the termination of the services of W. Joseph and both parties agree to accept his findings". The notes also state that it was agreed that the issues to be decided were: "(1) Is the termination of the services of W. Joseph by the management justified; (2) if so, what gratuity is he entitled to for services rendered to H. S. Fernando & Sons; (3) if not, what relief he is entitled to." It would appear that at the time of this conference there was a strike of the workers in this establishment and when the matter concerning Joseph and other matters which were discussed at the conference were settled the strike was called off. In furtherance of the agreement entered into at this conference of the 3rd of February, 1959, it would appear that the Assistant Commissioner of Labour nominated Mr. B. D. Fernando, a Labour Officer, to enquire into the matters relating to W. Joseph. Exactly on what date Mr. B. D. Fernando held his inquiry is not clear. A record of his proceedings has not been produced but it is admitted that Mr. B. D. Fernando arrived at the conclusion that Joseph should be paid a gratuity of three months' wages, inclusive of allowances. P2 dated the 27th of May, 1959,

is a copy of a letter sent by the Assistant Commissioner of Labour to the All-Ceylon United Motor Workers' Union which states that the Labour Officer who enquired into the case had recommended that W. Joseph be paid a gratuity of three months' wages, inclusive of allowances. This was followed by a further conference on the 26th of August, 1959. A copy of the notes of this conference has been produced marked Pl. Mr. L'Brooy, who presided at the conference of 3rd February, 1959, also presided at this conference. Mr. H. S. Fernando and Mr. C. W. Fernando were present as representatives of Messrs. H. Stephen Fernando & Sons, while Mr. D. G. William was present as the representative of the All-Ceylon United Motor Workers' Union. At this conference, with regard to the matter of Joseph, Mr. H. S. Fernando stated that he was unable to pay the amount awarded by the Labour Officer, Mr. B. D. Fernando, as he was in financial difficulties and that he was prepared to pay a sum of Rs. 200 in full and final settlement. Mr. William, the representative of the Union, stated that he was unable to accept anything less than the amount awarded by the Labour Officer. It is in consequence of the failure to arrive at an agreement at that conference of the 26th of August, 1959, the industrial dispute arose which has now been referred to me for arbitration.

5. At my proceedings, Mr. Fernando stated that the only matter that arose for consideration was the question of his capacity or incapacity to pay the amount awarded by Mr. B. D. Fernando to W. Joseph as a result of his inquiry. I have not been asked to go into the question as to whether Joseph was dismissed from service or whether he terminated his services of his own accord. I think Mr. Stephen Fernando was quite right in only asking me to go into the question of capacity because the matter referred to me for arbitration is not the question as to whether Joseph was dismissed or whether he left of his own accord or whether if dismissed the dismissal was justifiable. Nor have I been asked to go into the question as to whether the gratuity or compensation payable to Joseph should be, as determined by Mr. B. D. Fernando, three months' wages and allowances or less or more. It would appear that the three months' wages and allowances would amount to the sum of Rs. 457.26 mentioned in the statement of the Deputy Commissioner of Labour.

6. With regard to the question of Mr. Stephen Fernando's capacity or incapacity to pay, it is a matter which would be entirely within the personal knowledge of Mr. Stephen Fernando and the Union would not be in a position to lead any evidence, and none has been led. Mr. Fernando gave evidence and submitted certain documents to which I shall refer in due course. According to the evidence of Mr. Fernando, he was doing a flourishing business for a number of years. The average profits per year came to about Rs. 18,000. Then there was the strike of February, 1959, during which some of his lorries were damaged by the strikers. His stone crusher also met with an unfortunate accident and was damaged. Some of his lorries became unserviceable to be put on the road. On account of these reasons his business has dwindled, and he is now only able to get a net profit of about Rs. 600 a month from his business. He stated that he could not get the licence for a lorry because he could not get the lorry repaired to obtain a fitness certificate, without which the lorry could not be licensed. He produced a copy of a letter written by the Manager of the Bank of Ceylon to the Commissioner of Inland Revenue, dated the 1st February, 1960, stating that the Bank Manager had attached a sum of Rs. 2,393.34 being the entire balance lying to the credit of Mr. Fernando in that Bank. It would appear from this letter B1 that, on instructions from the Commissioner of Inland Revenue, the Bank balance lying to the credit of Mr. Stephen Fernando had been seized for the non-payment of income tax. Mr. Fernando is unable to tell me what is the amount of the income tax involved. After the seizure on the 1st of February, Mr. Fernando had been issuing seven cheques which have been returned with the endorsement "Refer to drawer". The total amount of these seven cheques would aggregate to Rs. 1,617. So that but for his bank balance being frozen these cheques would have been honoured. Mr. Fernando deemed these cheques from the persons to whom he had issued them after paying cash and remitting Money Orders. So that these cheques being dishonoured by the Bank is not an indication of his financial position. He stated that he is indebted on a mortgage bond in a sum of about Rs. 12,000. That mortgage was entered into about five years ago for a sum of Rs. 30,000, of which he has repaid Rs. 18,000. He is paying interest on the balance which he has undertaken to pay by instalments. He said that he is also indebted to some other people, the total amount of such indebtedness being about Rs. 2,000. As against this, he is entitled to recover from people to whom he had supplied building materials about Rs. 7,000. That being so, I am unable to say that his financial position is in a precarious condition; that he is somewhere about the road leading to bankruptcy. His financial position could have been best brought to the knowledge of the Court by the production of his books of accounts and statements of accounts. These he has not chosen to submit for my scrutiny. I think any Court, including an Arbitrator, is entitled to the best evidence available. That best evidence has not been placed before me. The grounds which Mr. Fernando set out for his net profit dropping from Rs. 1,500 to Rs. 600 a month is not sufficiently convincing for me to accept his statement without an examination of his accounts. I am unable to hold that Mr. Fernando's financial position is such that he has not the capacity to pay this sum of Rs. 457.26. The seizure of his Bank balance is due to his

neglect to pay his tax. He stated that he had fixed an appointment to see the Assessor with regard to the amount of the tax. This would indicate that his failure to pay his tax was not due to incapacity, but his neglect to see the Assessor and get the amount properly assessed, if he disputed the quantum.

7. I make award that this sum awarded as gratuity by Mr. B. D. Fernando, in terms of the agreement reached at the conference held at the Labour Office on the 3rd of February, 1959, be paid to Mr. W. Joseph. This amount may be paid through the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Colombo Industrial Relations, 21, Vauxhall Street, Colombo 2, within a month of the publication of this Award.

8. In all the circumstances of this case I make no order as to costs.

#### Award under Section 17 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950

No. A 53

An industrial dispute

between

The United Engineering Workers' Union, 123, Union Place,  
Colombo 2

and

Messrs. Bonars (Ceylon) Limited, 15, Morgan Road, Colombo 2, was referred to me by the Honourable the Minister of Labour by his Order under section 4 (1) dated 13.8.59 for settlement by arbitration.

2. The matter in dispute as set out by the Deputy Commissioner of Labour in his statement dated 11.8.59 is whether the non-employment of Mr. A. L. D. Kathisena is justified, and to what relief he is entitled.

3. Both parties to the dispute submitted their statements and answers as required under Regulation 21 (2). Inquiry commenced on 15.10.59. Mr. Stanley Tillekeratne, President of the Union instructed by Mr. Henry, Assistant Secretary, appeared for the Union, and Mr. Lyn Wirasekera of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon appeared for Messrs. Bonars (Ceylon) Limited.

4. Mr. Stanley Tillekeratne in outlining his case for the Union amplified the Union's statement. The gist of their contention was that Kathisena should not have been retrenched as he was employed by the Firm prior to the inauguration of the Refrigeration Department. It was further alleged that the dismissal of Mr. Kathisena was an act of victimisation by the Management for his union activities as President of the branch union.

5. Mr. Lyn Wirasekera on behalf of Messrs. Bonars (Ceylon) Limited, in his reply denied the averments and reiterated that retrenchment was effected solely because of financial losses incurred by the Company during the previous year. Consequently the Management was obliged to close down the Refrigeration and Electrical Department resulting in five of the employees being retrenched including Mr. Kathisena. He stressed the position of the Management that the decision to retrench the five employees—of whom only Kathisena did not accept retrenchment—was bona fide.

6. During the inquiry, Mr. Tillekeratne for the Union endeavoured to show that Mr. Kathisena was employed as wireman-cum-electrician which was challenged by Mr. Lyn Wirasekera. Evidence was led by both parties in support of their respective contentions. The fundamental issues before the Court are:

- (1) whether Mr. A. L. D. Kathisena was employed by Messrs. Bonars (Ceylon) Limited, as a wireman or general electrician,
- (2) was the retrenchment of Mr. Kathisena bona fide and justified?

7. (1) *Whether Mr. A. L. D. Kathisena was employed by Messrs. Bonars (Ceylon) Limited, as a wireman or general electrician—*

As regards this issue, Mr. Kathisena himself was called in to depose to the type and nature of the various tasks undertaken by him during his tenure of employment in the Firm. Mr. Kathisena gave evidence at length describing the various job-works carried out by him such as repairing ventilators, magnetos, dynamos, and winding and rewinding of armatures. It is strange, however, that all these jobs were done by Mr. Kathisena jointly with Mr. Richard Silva, general electrician. The Counsel for the Union could not, however, produce a single electrical job-work done solely by Kathisena. Mr. Richard Silva, the general electrician with whom Mr. Kathisena was associated in handling certain electrical work, testified to Mr. Kathisena being a good wireman. He further stated that, as a good wireman, Mr. Kathisena could be entrusted with only minor electrical jobs.

8. Job-cards, time cards and harbour permits designating Mr. Kathisena as electrician were produced by Mr. Stanley Tillekeratne for the Union in support of his contention that Mr. Kathisena was more an electrician than a wireman. In a place like Ceylon where social conventions and more usage and practice play a large part in community interests, one wonders whether much credence can be attached to them. There is, for instance, the application and use of the title "Dr." to all those engaged in the use and practice of medicine in Ceylon including apothecaries and dispensers. There is, however, a distinction that may be brought out in contrast in this case, i.e., that these are documents bearing the hall-mark of the Firm's authority.

9. Mr. S. Srinandalochana, the Personnel Manager, who is in charge of the administration of the Firm stated to Court that prior to January, 1958, workmen were styled or named by the Firm in general terms such as Turners, Boilers, Moulders, Tinkers, Electricians and Carpenters. It was only after the Walkers Award that Bonars graded their workmen according to their skill. The list of grades was forwarded to the Firm by the Federation, and he was responsible as the Chief Executive in charge of the administration in the reclassification of workers according to their skill. Consequently Mr. Kathisena, who was styled in general term as electrician in December, 1957, was given his proper classification in accordance with the new grading as a wireman in January, 1958.

10. Job-evaluation and assessment of individual skill are two great factors in the determination of a workman's category and wages. The acid test is the wage paid to him on the basis of his skill and the quality of his output of work. Mr. Kathisena was started on a daily wage of Rs. 2.24 basic, as against Mr. Alexander Perera and Mr. Richard Silva who were started on Rs. 3.94 and Rs. 4.20 respectively. Mr. T. A. Dharmadasa, the Works Manager, who was best qualified, by reason of his office and experience, to assess the individual ability of workmen under him, stated in his evidence that Mr. Kathisena was not capable enough to do a major electrical job. Mr. Richard Silva, a general electrician of the Firm with whom Mr. Kathisena was constantly associated in his work, also testified to the Company entrusting wiring work to Mr. Kathisena, and that the electrical part of the work they jointly did, was entirely his (Mr. Richard Silva's) responsibility.

11. There was on the other hand the evidence of others, namely, Mr. M. Solomon Dias, an electric welder and Mr. E. A. Premadasa, a mechanic who were both fellow-workers in the Firm and members of the branch union of which Mr. Kathisena was the President. Their evidence characterizing Mr. Kathisena as an electrician was a broad-based, generous exposition based on the talk prevailing in the place consequent on the practice followed at Messrs. Bonars (Ceylon) Limited in styling their workmen in general terms, vide my observations in paragraph 8. There is, then, no alternative but to attach greater weight and significance to the evidence of those who were more closely acquainted with Mr. Kathisena and his work. I have no hesitation, therefore, in concluding that Mr. Kathisena was taken on as a wireman, and was functioning in the Firm essentially as a wireman though occasionally he was called upon to tackle minor electrical repairs.

12. (2) *Was the retrenchment of Mr. Kathisena bona fide and justified?*

There are certain aspects of the above issue which need scrutiny and analysis. It was alleged that the dismissal of Mr. Kathisena was an act of victimisation because of his trade union activities. 'Bona fide' i.e. 'good faith' and 'justification' are relative terms and closely linked in the sense that the latter is a sequel to the former. In other words, if good faith is established in any action, the resultant finding invariably is that the decision is justified, but it will still be good faith all the same, even though an employer derives a certain malicious delight and satisfaction that an occasion has arisen to send an undesirable away. I am of opinion that Mr. Kathisena was in this plight where his employers were concerned.

13. In this context, I refer to the strikes organized by Mr. Kathisena, President of the branch union in 1957 and 1958. Industrial strikes are a common feature in democratic countries

today, and they constitute the rightful means by which the workers can manifest and assert their legitimate grievances, and even wrest them from an unsympathetic employer. I would in the same breadth draw a distinction between industrial strikes, and what are termed revolutionary strikes calculated to make in-roads into the rightful domain of the employer. Such activity—to say the least—ruptures the cordial relations between the employers and the employees, for the maintenance of which the machinery under the Industrial Disputes Act was set up. If an industrial strike assumes the character and complexion of a revolutionary one to coerce or dictate to the authorities of an established business concern by displaying such foolish and fantastic slogans like "Alexander 'Apita Epa'", it defeats the ideals and objectives for which the trade union movement was started. Mr. P. D. Alexander was the Director-cum-Secretary of Messrs. Bonars (Ceylon) Limited.

14. When questioned by Court with regard to the advisability of his getting back to work under Messrs. Bonars (Ceylon) Limited, where Mr. Alexander is still a senior Executive, Mr. Kathisena's reply was: "There may be possibilities." "I think I will be able to continue in employment if I cease to criticize my employers, at least reduce my criticism". This is evidence of his compunction with regard to his conduct towards his employers spurred by the glamour of his office as President of the branch union. I make these observations merely to show the extent to which this great world movement started for the benefit of the workers, can be abused by such unscrupulous, unimaginative leaders like Mr. Kathisena. As this was not the cause of dismissal, the incident, however, has no bearing on the present dispute except that it has, as stated by me earlier, strained the employer-employee relations.

15. Mr. Stanley Tillekeratne on behalf of the union stated that they had accepted the position of the Company closing down the Refrigeration and Electrical Department and the retrenchment of the other four employees for reasons stated by the Company. His contention was that there was electrical work involved in the engineering section of the Company, and consequently the need to retrench Mr. Kathisena did not arise. This is, however, a matter that should be left to the Management in the process of the reorganization of their business. It must be admitted that consequent upon the closing down of the Refrigeration and Electrical Department the justification of which was conceded by the Union, the volume of electrical work in the Firm in the Engineering Section must have been considerably less warranting the employment of only one general electrician; perhaps the electrical work in the Engineering Section would be intermittent or casual, and hence the retention of the senior electrician, Mr. Richard Silva, at second thought, by the Management was a judicious move.

16. The reasonable inference then is that the retention of even a second general electrician, not to speak of a wireman with limited scope and usefulness, is an uneconomic superfluity. Document marked R 21 submitted, as directed by the Court, of electrical works undertaken by Messrs. Bonars (Ceylon) Limited—three months before and after 31.7.58, the date of Mr. Kathisena's discontinuance—confirms the view and substantiates the lack of work referred to in their letter R 15 to the Employers' Federation. It is however, irrelevant to seek further proof in view of the Union's acceptance of the closing down of the Refrigeration and Electrical Department, but it disproves the contention alleged by the Union, that the volume of electrical undertaking incidental to the engineering section warranted the continuance of Mr. Kathisena's services. It is, therefore clear that the retrenchment of Mr. Kathisena is bona fide and justified.

17. It now remains for the Court to consider its sequel mentioned in the terms of reference, viz., what relief Mr. Kathisena is entitled to? It would appear that this is a case of retrenchment arising out of the closure of the Refrigeration and Electrical Department of the firm of Messrs. Bonars (Ceylon) Limited. Both parties made their respective submissions on the question of retrenchment relief and cited the decisions in several similar disputes. Mr. Kathisena was retrenched solely on the ground of his being an uneconomic surplus in the rationalisation of the business. While conceding this unquestioned right of the employer, as stated by Mr. Lyn Wirasekera on behalf of the Management, it is clear that the employee was called upon to face this contingency through no fault of his own. It was contended by Mr. Wirasekera that Mr. Kathisena was paid his full Provident Fund benefits besides the month's notice he was given.

18. The payment of full Provident Funds is a statutory obligation in the context of his retrenchment. A month's notice or even a week's notice, being a daily-rated employee, may seem all right from a strictly legal angle, but it defeats the spirit and purpose of the legislature and established conventions in the industrial sphere, if its humanistic and realistic aspect is over-looked. Mr. Kathisena is the sole bread-winner of a family of five dependants—wife and four children—some of whom are of school-going age.

19. Mr. Wirasekera in his submission argued that the question of compensation or retrenchment relief could not be made the subject of an *ad hoc* award in this case. It was also pointed out that a retrenched worker was entitled not so much to compensation as adequate notice implying thereby that the month's notice given to Mr. Kathisena, was adequate. I have already dealt with this aspect of the matter in paragraph 13. The concept of compensation or adequate notice would be to

meet the same purpose of retrenchment relief. Industrial Tribunals in India have laid down certain basic principles of social justice which are worthy of our emulation, if we find ourselves in full accord with the concept. I cite a few of them:—

- (i) Sri Ram Silk Manufacturing Co. Vs. Their workmen (Labour Law Journal, 1953). It was held by the Labour Appellate Tribunal of India that the retrenchment was bona fide and justified because of financial losses incurred. Nevertheless, the retrenched workers were awarded two months' wages as compensation.
- (ii) General Motors Limited Vs. Their Workmen (I. Labour Law Journal, 1953). The retrenched workers were awarded retrenchment relief of one month's basic wage for each year of completed service.
- (iii) Kashi Iron Foundry Vs. Their Workmen (Labour Appeal Cases, 1952). The Tribunal held that even in cases of justifiable retrenchment, the payment of an unemployment bonus to the workers was ordered to sustain them during the period of their unemployment.

20. I would also cite I. D. 60, I. D. 25 and I. D. 258 of this Court:—

- (i) I. D. 60—The Ceylon Workers' Congress Vs. the Superintendent of Carfax Group, Dickoya, where the Court had ordered three months' wages with allowances as compensation to the workers.
- (ii) I. D. 25—The Lanka Weaving Mills Limited Vs. The Ceylon Textile Workers' Union. The Tribunal held that the retrenchment was justified in the circumstances but awarded compensation of two months' wages.
- (iii) I. D. 258—The Ceylon Cold Stores Vs. The Nidahas Karmika Saha Velanda Sevaka Vurthiya Samithiya. The Court had held that retrenchment was justified because of the closure of the Bakery Department, but had awarded compensation of two and a half months' wages in the case of the retrenched bakers and two months wages in the case of other retrenched employees.

21. Mr. Kathisena was testified to by some of the witnesses for the respondent Company as "a very good wireman", so good as to be designated in general terms as electrician by the Management till January, 1958, the date of reclassification of all their employees. It is only fitting that he should seek employment in a place commensurate with his knowledge and skill. It is, however, not an easy proposition to secure a suitable employment in these days when the problem of unemployment has become increasingly acute. He has been without proper employment for almost two years now. The chances of getting himself fixed on a permanent job seem remote in our present industrial and economic set up. He may have to wait long, perhaps indefinitely, till he can fit himself into the pattern of employment he has been accustomed to. In the circumstances he will have to continue to eke out an uncertain existence for himself and his family of five dependants by doing odd jobs, or seek the charity of benevolent relatives and friends for their sustenance—a circumstance which warrants special consideration.

22. It would, of course, be different if Mr. Kathisena was dismissed for misconduct or any other guilt, but this is retrenchment solely on the ground of closure of the Refrigeration and Electrical Department for financial losses incurred. I consider it fair and equitable to order—

- (i) three months gross wages as retrenchment relief to be paid to Mr. Kathisena by Messrs. Bonars (Ceylon) Limited, through the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Industrial Relations, Colombo, within two weeks from the date of the publication of this award in the *Government Gazette*. The aggregate of each month's wages will be based on the average of his earning for the three months prior to his retrenchment.
- (ii) that in the event of Messrs. Bonars (Ceylon) Limited, re-starting an Electrical Department and needing the services of a wireman, Mr. Kathisena should be given priority and first offer of employment.
