GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

1. **Allowances**—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. **Conditions of Service**—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. **Terms of Engagement**—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. **New Entrant Officers**—

(i) The period of probation/trial of “New Entrant Officers” appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) “New Entrant Officers” will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note—The term “New Entrant Officers” in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of sub-paragraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.

5. **Qualifications required**—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. **War Service Concession**—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty’s Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. **Other Requirements**—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

Medical Laboratory Technologists' Examination

APPLICATIONS are invited from males and females for training and appointment as Medical Laboratory Technologists, Grade II, in the Department of Health. Applications which should be made on the form, a specimen of which is given below, should be sent by registered post to reach me on or before the 31st May, 1960, and must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 10. A refund of the value of stamps will not be made under any circumstances.

2. *Salary Scale.*—The salary scale attached to the Medical Laboratory Technologists' Service is as follows :—

Special Grade : Rs. 4,800—3 of 180 and 1 of 240—
Rs. 5,580.

Grade I : Rs. 2,940—8 of 120 and 4 of 180—Rs. 4,620.
Grade II : Rs. 1,020—15 of 120—Rs. 2,820.
(Efficiency bars before Rs. 1,500 and Rs. 2,220 per annum.)

3. *Conditions of Service.*—(i) The posts are permanent and pensionable and the appointment will be on three years' probation.

(ii) The selected female candidates will be required to contribute to the Public Service Provident Fund.

(iii) The selected candidates will be required to undergo a course of training for a period of one year and pass an examination consisting of written papers and practicals at the end of the training. Candidates who fail the examination at the end of the training are liable to discontinuance but may be given a further chance up to a maximum of three attempts in all. Successful candidates will be issued a certificate of competence in Medical Laboratory Technology and they will be appointed Medical Laboratory Technologists, Grade II, on three years probation as vacancies occur.

(iv) The selected candidates will be required to enter into an agreement and bond with sureties to serve the Department for a period of 7 years from the date of admission to the training class failing which they must refund all monies drawn as salaries and allowances during the period of training.

(v) During the period of training an allowance of Rs. 75 per mensem will be paid.

(vi) Candidates selected from Medical Laboratory Technologists, Grade III, and Laboratory Sub-Assistants will be appointed to act during the period of training and confirmed in their appointments from the date of passing the examination specified in paragraph (iii) above. Failure will result in reversion to previous grade.

(vii) Medical Laboratory Technologists are 7-day workers and are expected to be on duty for 7 days in the week including Sundays and Public Holidays. They are also on call at any time of the day or night for 7 days in the week.

(viii) The appointees will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(ix) The appointees should acquire proficiency in Sinhala during the period of probation. Their confirmation at the expiry of the period of probation will depend inter alia on the passing of the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

(x) Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during the period of probation are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt has been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(xi) Officers who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note.—(a) Those who are decreed to be old entrants on appointment to the Medical Laboratory Technologists Service will be exempted from the requirement of subparagraphs (viii), (ix) and (x).

(b) Laboratory Sub-Assistants and Medical Laboratory Technologists, Grade III, holding permanent appointments from a date prior to 24.9.56 if selected for appointment as Medical Laboratory Technologists, Grade II, would be deemed to be old entrants for the purpose of the Official Language Policy.

4. *Qualifications required.*—(i) Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he or she—

(a) is not less than 17 years of age and more than 25 years of age on 31st May, 1960 ;

(b) has passed the Senior School Certificate or equivalent or higher examination with a credit in Chemistry and any one of the following subjects, viz. :—Physics, Zoology, Botany, Biology.

(ii) Laboratory Sub-Assistants and Medical Laboratory Technologists, Grade III, of the Department of Health who have passed the Senior School Certificate Examination and have completed 3 years satisfactory service.

(iii) Medical Laboratory Technologists, Grade III, of the Department of Health who have completed 5 years satisfactory service as a Medical Laboratory Technologist, Grade III.

5. Applicants must attach to their applications COPIES (not originals) of—

- certificate of registration of birth. (N.B.—Baptismal certificates or certificates issued for the purpose of the Code of Regulations for Assisted Schools will not be accepted.);

* General Paper will be set in three parts, i.e., Tots, General Intelligence and General Knowledge.

† General Science Paper will be set to test candidates' knowledge of Chemistry, Physics, Botany, Biology, Zoology. The questions in Chemistry will be compulsory and candidates should also answer optional questions on Physics or Botany or Biology or Zoology and will be set at S. S. C. standard.

Medium of Examination.—Candidates should take the examination in the linguistic medium in which they passed the examination which qualified them for admission to the examination (i.e., in Sinhala or Tamil or English) provided that—

- Candidates who have passed the various subjects at the qualifying examination in different media should take corresponding subjects at this examination in those respective media and the other subjects in the medium in which paper (i) in Language and Composition is taken.
- Candidates already in the Department who are permitted to take this examination irrespective of educational qualifications and who have not passed the qualifying examination prescribed in paragraph 4 must take the examination in the medium in which they had been taught.
- Candidates who have passed the qualifying examination in the Tamil or English medium or candidates who had been taught in the Tamil or English medium, may opt to take this examination in the Sinhala medium.

7. Identity Cards.—Candidates will be required to prove their identity in the examination hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor. For this purpose any one of the following documents will be accepted:—

- identity card issued by the Postmaster-General;
- a valid passport issued within 3 years of the date of this examination;
- any certificates, licence or other documents embodying a photograph of the holder and issued within 3 years of the date of the examination on the authority of a Government Department.

8. Candidates who reach a satisfactory standard in the written examination will be called up for a viva voce on a date and time and place that will be notified later. They will be informed individually regarding the viva voce. The viva voce test will be conducted by a Board appointed by the Director of Health Services. No travelling or other expenses will be paid.
