BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 5, 6 and 30 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939. and section 82 of the Local Authorities Elections Ordinance, No. 53 of 1946, as modified by the Proclamation published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, I, Junius Richard Jayewardene, Minister of Local Government and Housing, do hereby—

(1) revoke-

- (b) the name and designation of the Urban Council to be constituted under the Ordinance for the afore-said town shall be "Peliyagoda Urban Council";
- and
 (c) the Peliyagoda Urban Council shall consist of seven members, and the town for which the Peliyagoda Urban Council is to be constituted shall be divided into seven wards, as defined in the Second Schedule hereto; and
- (3) declare that the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Order shall—

(a) in so far as they relate to any matter connected with the general election of members of the Peliyagoda Urban Council due to be held in 1960, come into effect on the date on which this Order is published in the Gazette; and

(b) in so far as they relate to any other matter come into effect on the day immediately following the date of expiration of the term of office of the members of the Wattala-Mabole-Peliyagoda Urban Council who are in office at the date hereof.

LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF PELIYAGODA

- North: By a line drawn from the western extremity of the southern limit of Wattala-Mabole Urban Council area along the said limits to the divisional boundary between the Divisional Revenue Officer's divisions of Alutkuru Korale South and Siyane Korale West; thence eastwards along the said boundary to the centre line of Colombo-Kadar Bailway. of Colombo-Kandy Railway.

WARD NO. 3-WATTALA SOUTH

North: From the point where the centre line of the Colombo-Negombo Main road meets the centre line of the Hunupitiya Station road, eastwards along the southern limit of the ward No. 2 to its eastern extremity.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the centre line of Averiawatta road where it crosses the said limit of the Urban Council area.

 - 3. The office hours are from 9 a.m. to 4.30 p.m. on week days and 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Saturdays.
 - 4. Cash transactions close at 3.30 p.m. on week days and at 12 noon on Saturdays.
- 5. All Notices and Advertisements must be prepaid. Notices and Advertisements sent direct by post should be accompanied by Money Order, Postal Order or Cheque, made payable to the Government Printer. Postage stamps will not be accepted in payment of advertisements.
- 6. To avoid errors and delay, "copy" should be on one side of the paper only and preferably typewritten.
 - 7. All signatures should be repeated in block letters below the written signature.
