THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE, No. 61 OF 1939, AND THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES ELECTIONS ORDINANCE, No. 52 OF 1946

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 5, 6 and 80 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, and section 82 of the Local Authorities Elections Ordinance, No. 52 of 1946, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, I, Junius Richard Jayewardene, Minister of Local Government and Housing, do hereby—

(1) revoke—

- (a) the Proclamation published in *Gazette* No. 9,041 of November 27, 1942, in so far as that Proclamation relates to the limits of the town of Wattala-Mabole-Peliyagoda; and
- (b) the Order published in *Gazette* No. 9,053 of December 18, 1942, relating to the number and limits of the wards (therein called "electoral divisions") of the town of Wattala-Mabole-Peliyagoda;

(2) order that—

- (a) the area delimited in the First Schedule hereto shall be a town for the purposes of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939 (hereinafter referred to as "the Ordinance"), and the administrative limits of that town shall be the limits set out in that Schedule;
- (b) the name and designation of the Urban Council to be constituted under the Ordinance for the aforesaid town shall be "Peliyagoda Urban Council"; and
- (c) the Peliyagoda Urban Council shall consist of seven members, and the town for which the Peliyagoda Urban Council is to be constituted shall be divided into seven wards, as defined in the Second Schedule hereto; and

(3) declare that the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Order shall—

- (a) in so far as they relate to any matter connected with the general election of members of the Peliyagoda Urban Council due to be held in 1960, come into effect on the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*; and
- (b) in so far as they relate to any other matter come into effect on the day immediately following the date of expiration of the term of office of the members of the Wattala-Mabole-Peliyagoda Urban Council who are in office at the date hereof.

First Schedule

LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF PELIYAGODA

North: By a line drawn from the western extremity of the southern limit of Wattala-Mabole Urban Council area along the said limits to the divisional boundary between the Divisional Revenue Officer's divisions of Alutkuru Korale South and Siyane Korale West; thence eastwards along the said boundary to the centre line of Colombo-Kandy Railway.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the divisional boundary between the Divisional Revenue Officer's divisions of Alutkuru Korale South and Siyane Korale West to the centre line of Kelani Ganga.

South and West: From the last-mentioned point westwards and northwards along the centre line of Kelani Ganga to the starting point of the northern limit of the area

Second Schedule

LIMITS OF THE WARDS OF THE TOWN OF PELIYAGODA

WARD NO. 1—BADAHELAWATTA

North: By a line drawn from the western extremity of the northern limit of the Urban Council area along the said limit to the eastern boundary of the village of Peliyagoda Meegahawatta.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern boundary of the village of Peliyagoda Meegahawatta to the southern extremity of the said boundary.

South: From the last-mentioned point north-westwards and westwards along the southern boundary of the village of Peliyagoda Meegahawatta to the centre line of Kelani Ganga.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre line of Kelani Ganga to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 2—PELIYAGODAWATTA

North: From the western extremity of the southern limit of Ward No. 1 along the said limit to its eastern extremity.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards and south-westwards along the village boundary of Peliyagodawatta to the northern limit of the M. S. P. 24.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards, north-westwards, westwards and north-westwards along the northern limit of M. S. P. 24 to the centre line of Kelani Ganga.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre line of Kelani Ganga to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 3—PELIYAGODA PATTIYA (WEST)

North: By a line drawn from the eastern extremity of the northern limit of Ward No. 1 eastwards along the northern limit of the Urban Council area to the centre line of Colombo-Kandy Railway.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards, south-westwards and southwards along the centre line of Colombo-Kandy Railway to the centre line of Kelani Ganga.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre line of Kelani Ganga to a point in prolongation of the eastern boundary of lot 100 in Sheet No. 8 of T. S. P. 56.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the prolongation of the eastern boundary of lot 100 in Sheet No. 8 of T. S. P. 56 to the south-eastern corner of the said lot 100; thence northwards and westwards along the eastern and northern limits respectively of M. S. P. P. 24 to the eastern limit of Ward No. 2 thence along the eastern limits of Wards 2 and 1 to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 4—PELIYAGODA PATTIYA (EAST)

North: By a line drawn from the eastern extremity of the northern limit of Ward No. 3 along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area to the centre line of Colombo-Kandy Road.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area to the centre line of Kelani Ganga.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre line of Kelani Ganga to a point in prolongation of the eastern boundary of lot 1 in P. P. A. 497.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the prolongation of the eastern boundary of lot 1 in P. P. A. 497 to the south-eastern corner of the said lot; thence northwards along the eastern boundary of the said lot 1 and the eastern boundary of The Red Mills claimed by Messrs. A. Baur & Co. to the centre line of Colombo-Biyagama road; thence northwards along the centre line of Kelaniya Station road to the centre line of the railway; thence north-eastwards and northwards along the centre line of the said railway to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 5—PELIYAGODA PATTIYA (SOUTH)

North: By a line drawn from the point of intersection of the prolongation southwards of the eastern boundary of lot 2 in P. P. A. 1456—W. P. and the centre line of Colombo-Kandy Railway north-eastwards along the centre line of the said Railway to the centre line of Kelaniya Station road.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the western limit of Ward No. 4 to its southern extremity.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre line of Kelani Ganga to the centre of Railway Bridge.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards and north-eastwards along the centre line of Colombo-Kandy Railway to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 6—PELIYAGODA NORTH

North: By a line drawn from the western extremity of the southern limit of Ward No. 2 along the said limit to the north-eastern corner of Title Plan 86669.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the southern limit of Ward No. 2 to the north-eastern corner of Title Plan 86670.

South: From the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the northern and western boundaries of Title Plan 86670 and northern boundaries of Title Plan 78280 and of lot 310 in Preliminary Plan 2569 to the centre line of path; thence westwards along the centre line of the said path to the centre of junction of Colombo-Kandy road and Old Kandy road; thence south-westwards along the centre line of Old Kandy Road to the centre line of Kelani Ganga.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre line of Kelani Ganga to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 7—PELIYAGODA SOUTH

North: By a line drawn from the western extremity of the southern limit of Ward No. 6 along the said limit and the northern limit of M. S. P. P. 24 to the eastern extremity of the northern limit of M. S. P. P. 24.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of M. S. P. P. 24 to the centre line of Kelani Ganga.

South and West: From the last-mentioned point westwards and north-westwards along the centre line of Kelani Ganga to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

South : From the last mentioned point westwards along the centre line of Mudun Ela to a point in prolongation of the north-western boundary of the path to the west of Meegahawatta claimed by R. Allis Fernando, thence south-westwards along the said prolongation and the western boundary of the said path and along the landmarked boundary in Town Survey Preliminary Plan 22 forming the western boundary of Meegahawatta claimed by Walimunidewage Singhoni Fernando and others, and southwards along the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the western boundary of Meegahawatta claimed by Hewadewage Martin Fernando and others till it meets the landmark at the north-eastern corner of Kumbagodadayakumbura claimed by Ranamukadewage Sediris Fernando, thence westwards and south-westwards along the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the northern boundaries of the four allotments of land called Kumbagodadayakumbura claimed by Ranamukadewage Sediris Fernando, Pahindaradewage Engo Fernando and others Mananadewage Mary Fernando and Ranapuradewage Themis Fernando till it meets the landmark on the eastern boundary of Kimbula Ela, thence in a line to the centre of Kimbula Ela thence north-westwards along the centre line of the said Ela till it meets a point in prolongation of the said landmarked Town Survey boundary forming the northern boundary

LIMITS OF THE WARDS OF THE TOWN OF WATTALA-MABOLE

WARD NO. 1—MABOLE

North: From the western extremity of the northern limit of the Urban Council area eastwards along the said limit till it meets its eastern extremity.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets a point in prolongation of the eastern boundary of Title Plan 95259.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the village limit between Wattala and Mabile which runs along the centre line of Kalu-oya, thence north-westwards along the said village limit till it meets the western limit of the Urban Council area.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 2—WATTALA NORTH

North: From the western extremity of the southern limit of ward No. 1 south-eastwards along the said limit till it meets the eastern limit of the Urban Council area.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the centre of the Hunupitiya Station Road.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre line of the said Hunupitiya Station road till it meets the centre line of the Colombo-Negombo Main road thence southwards and south-westwards along the centre line of the said Colombo-Negombo Main road till it meets the centre line of Gonakovila-ela thence westwards along the centre line of the said Gonakovila-ela till it meets the western limit of the Urban Council area.

West: From the last-mentioned point north-eastwards along the said western limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 3—WATTALA SOUTH

North: From the point where the centre line of the Colombo-Negombo Main road meets the centre line of the Hunupitiya Station road, eastwards along the southern limit of the ward No. 2 to its eastern extremity.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the centre line of Averiawatta road where it crosses the said limit of the Urban Council area.

South: From the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of the said Averiawatta road till it meets the centre line of Thaine road, thence northwards and westwards along the centre line of the said Thaine road till it meets the centre line of the Colombo-Negombo Main road.

West: From the last-mentioned point north-eastwards along the centre line of the said Colombo-Negombo Main road and the southern limit of ward No. 2 till it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 4—TELANGAPATHA

North: From the western extremity of the southern limit of ward No. 3, eastwards, southwards and north-eastwards along the said limit to its eastern extremity.

East: From the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets its southern extremity.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards along the southern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the centre line of the Colombo-Negombo Main road.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre line of the Colombo-Negombo Main road till it meets the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

WARD NO. 5—GALWETIYA

North: From the western extremity of the southern limit of the ward No. 2 eastwards along the said limit till it meets the western limit of ward No. 3.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the western limits of the wards Nos. 3 and 4 till it meets the southern limit of the Urban Council area.

South: From the last-mentioned point westwards along the southern limit of the Urban Council area till it meets its western extremity on the centre line of the Kelani-ganga.

West: From the last-mentioned point northwards and north-eastwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area till it meets the starting point of the ward.
