Price Orders

AMENDMENT OF PRICE ORDER

DELETE the existing paras 2, 3 and 4 of my Food Price Order No. KU/5/60 of April 19, 1960, published in an *Extraordinary Gazette* No. 12,112 of April 22, 1960, and substitute the following paras therefor:—

- (2) fix with immediate effect the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto, to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per cwt. nett and the maximum retail price per pound nett, above which rice shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (3) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, no person shall sell rice which is adulterated with any other article;
- (4) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader, who has rice in his possession or under his control at any place or in any vehicle, shall exhibit conspicuously at that place or on that vehicle a quantity of such article in a suitable container, with the maximum prices for such article fixed by this Order displayed in figures not less than one inch in height on price tags or boards attached to such container in such a manner that the article and the maximum prices could be clearly seen by any customer.

Food Price Order No. MT/7/60.

RICE

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4, read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Hettige Don Tudor Bodidasa, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food); Matara District, do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from April 11, 1960, the Food Price Order No. MT/5/59 dated June 22, 1959, and published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 11,790 of June 26, 1959;
- (ii) fix with effect from April 11, 1960, the prices specified in column 2 of the First Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale prices per hundredweight nett above which all varieties of rice shall not be sold by wholesale in the areas mentioned in corresponding entries in column 1 of the same Schedule;
- (iii) fix with effect from April 11, 1960, the prices specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail prices per pound nett above which all varieties of rice shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in corresponding entries in column 1 of the same Schedule;

(iv) direct that for the purpose of this Order—

- (a) any sale of any quantity of any rice for the purpose of re-sale or any sale of rice in a quantity of one hundredweight nett or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
- (b) any sale of any quantity of any rice less than one hundredweight nett for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

(v) direct that no person shall sell rice which is adulterated with any other article;

(vi) direct that when any rice is sold the maximum prices fixed by this Order shall include the price of the wrapper or container if any in which such rice is sold;

(vii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader who has any rice in his possession or under his control, at any place shall exhibit conspicuously at that place a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in that area;

(viii) direct that for the purpose of this Order "pound" shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight;

(ix) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every person who sells any rice by wholesale shall and every person who sells rice by retail shall, on demand give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- (a) the date of sale ;
- (b) the quantity of rice sold ;
- (c) the price paid for the quantity of rice sold ; and
- (d) the nature of the transaction i.e., whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

RICE (WHOLESALE AND RETAIL)

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4, read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Sylvester Justin Wijesekera, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food) of the Nuwara Eliya District, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date the Food Price Order No. NE/49, dated June 15, 1959, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 11,782 of June 24, 1959, relating to rice ;

- (2) fix with immediate effect the prices specified in column 2 of the First Schedule hereto to be the wholesale dealers maximum wholesale price per hundredweight nett above which rationed rice should not be sold by wholesale within the area mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the same Schedule ;

- (3) fix with immediate effect the prices specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto to be the retail dealers maximum retail price per two pounds nett above which rationed rice shall not be sold by retail within the area mentioned in the corresponding entries in clause 1 of the same Schedule ;

(4) direct for the purpose of this Order—

(a) any sale of any quantity of rationed rice for the purpose of re-sale or any sale of rationed rice in a quantity of hundredweight nett or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;

(b) any sale of any quantity of rationed rice less than one hundredweight nett for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

(5) direct that no person shall sell any rationed rice mixed with any other articles;

(6) direct that when any rationed rice is sold the maximum prices fixed by this Order shall include prices of wrapper or container if any, in which such rationed rice is sold;

(7) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every trader who has any rationed rice in his possession or under his control at any place or in any vehicle shall exhibit conspicuously at that place or on that vehicle a quantity of rationed rice in a suitable container, with the maximum prices for rice fixed by this Order displayed in figures not less than one inch in height on price tag or board attached to such container in such a manner that the rationed rice and the maximum prices could be clearly seen by any consumer;

(8) direct that for the purpose of this Order "pound" or "lb." shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight;

(9) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every person who sells any rationed rice by wholesale and every person who sells any rationed rice by retail, on demand give the purchaser thereof, a receipt in which there shall be set out—

(a) the date of sale;

(b) the quantity of rationed rice sold (by weight);

(c) the price paid for the quantity of ration rice sold; and

(d) the nature of transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.
