AWARD

This is an award under section 24 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, No. 25 of 1956, Nos. 14 and 62 of 1957. It is in regard to an industrial dispute between the Eksath Engineru Saha Samanya Kamkaru Samithiya, 267 1/1, Union Place, Colombo 2, and the Municipal Council, Nuwara Eliya.

- 2. The Honourable The Minister of Labour, by his Order dated 19th June, 1959, has referred the said dispute for settlement to this Court. The matters in dispute between the Eksath Engineru Saha Samanya Kamkaru Samithiya (hereinafter called the "Union") and the Municipal Council, Nuwara Eliya (hereinafter called the "Council") are the following demands made by the aforesaid Union:—
 - 1. Increase in the initial basic salary.
 - 2. Temporary workers to be made permanent.
- 3. Gratuity and pension to be paid to workers who leave or retire.
- 4. Uniforms to be provided to suit the climatic conditions.

To these demands a fifth demand was added, viz. reinstatement of all workers who had been refused work from 9th June, 1959, and subsequently alleged to have been dismissed from service. This dispute arose prior to the date of the Minister's Order given to us to constitute a Court, and under section 23 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, the Court is empowered to consider and decide any other matter in dispute between the parties prior to the date of the aforesaid Order of the Minister.

3. Proceedings commenced on 22nd September, 1959, and Mr. Advocate Stanley Perera, instructed by Mr. Boleju appeared for the Union. Mr. Tilaka Kulasekera, the President of the Union, was also present, while the Council was represented by Mr. Advocate R. A. Kannangara instructed by Mr. C. M. A. de Silva. Much evidence was led by both the Union and the Council on subsequent dates and proceedings terminated on 25th June, 1960.

Demand No. 1.-Increase in the initial basic salary

4. The initial basic salary at present is Rs. 120 per mensem. We have compared this salary with the salaries paid to similar workers in other Municipal Councils. After due consideration we consider the payment made by the Council too low and order that the Council should pay on the same scale as that allotted to the workers of the Kurunegala Municipal Council, vide Sschedule

Demand No. 2.—Temporary workers to be made permanent

5. In explaining this demand, the Union has asked that all workers who have put in six months' continuous service be made permanent. We notice that the organisation of the labour force in the Council does not follow a well-organised plan. They have, on the one hand, got labourers whom they have called the regular gang and, on the other, another class whom they call substitute labour. Even with regard to the regular gang, witnesses on behalf of the Council were not consistent in calling them permanent but said that they enjoy privileges and conditions of service that are generally given only to permanent members of the staff. They are undoubtedly permanent workers. In general we order that all labourers who have served continuously for a period of not less than 12 months be considered as permanent workers. The Council must decide on what staff they require taking into account the gaps that may occur on account of absenteeism, and must do away with substitute labour which according to the evidence placed before us leaves room not only for discontinuance but for irregular practices. The Council cannot do better than follow the scheme for daily-paid labourers outlined in circular No. 19 of 1957 issued by the Local Government Department where they classify labour and casual labour. It should be noted that temporary labour is labour, the permanent necessity for which has not been established and which is employed for an undefined period; but the circular goes on to show why it is undesirable to treat temporary labour as the Council has done by extending their period of service for indefinite lengths of time. We order that the new system should come into operation within two months of the publication of this award.

Demand No. 3.—Gratuity and pension to be paid to workers who leave or retire

6. The demand here is for the payment of gratuity basing it on the principle of one month's pay for each year of service. The Union is aware of the fact that sooner or later the workers

of the Council will be covered by the Employees' Provident Fund, but it wants to make some provision for workers who have served for long periods of ten years and more who will not be benefited to any great extent by the Employees' Provident Fund. Two considerations weigh with us. Firstly, we cannot easily agree to the establishment of a provident fund which would create a liability for past years when that fund has not been foreseen and provided for in those years. Secondly, the matter of a provident fund to cover past services does not apply only to the Municipal Council of Nuwara Eliya but it has wider application. While, therefore, we are in sympathy with any provision that might be made in line with the Union's demand, we would refer this matter for decision by the Local Government Department.

Demand No. 4.—Uniforms to be provided to suit the climatic conditions

7. At present each of the labourers is issued with two bush shirts in khaki. Having examined the material produced in court we are convinced that the Council is not getting good value for money and suggest that the Council insist on better material for nearly the same price, but we do not propose to make any further award in relation to this demand particularly because the workers are in receipt of an 8 per cent. station allowance and because uniforms for these workers are not required for any ceremonial purpose or as a mark of distinction or as a badge of office.

Demand No. 5.—Reinstatement of all workers who were discontinued after 9.6.59

8. These discontinuances, the Council claims, were the result of a strike organised by the scavenging and conservancy labourers on June 10, 1959, and a strike of the Park and Works labourers on June the 12th. The position of the Union is that on June 10th there was no strike but a lockout. The scavenging and conservancy labourers had done overtime work during the racing period in March and April, 1959, and up to the date of June 10th had received no remuneration for the extra work that they had done, in spite of repeated requests. On the day in question the Union alleges that when the workers made a further request for the payment of their just dues, the authorities of the Council turned them out and refused them work. Having examined the evidence carefully we have come to the conclusion that the scavenging and conservancy labourers did strike on the 10th of June. They reported for work on that day, demanded extra wages for overtime work, and although the officer who took muser explained that their wages would be paid after the Council meeting of June, 15th and although the Mayor himself arrived on the scene and made the same explanation, the workers refused to answer the roll call at muster and to work on that day, claiming that overtime wages must be paid and must be paid on that very day. The sequel to this situation was a conference called on the 11th of June presided over by Mr. de Alwis, Labour Officer, Nuwara Eliya, where both parties were present. The occasion for this conference was a telegram received by the Labour Officer from the workers stated in the course of the conference that they were prepared to take back all the strikers. He had certain difficulties to which reference will be made later, and the Labour Officer noted that no settlement was reached. In his evidence the Labour Officer says, that the workers stated that they would somehow or other press for their payment. At the request of the President of the parent Union the Labour Officer fixed a conference for June 12th at 2 p.m. where the m

- 9. Several questions arise out of this situation:-
- (1) Is the strike legal? Can the strike be justified?
- (2) What prevented the Mayor from accepting the workers offer to return unconditionally to work?
- (3) Was the Mayor right in not coming to the conference fixed for June 15th?

On behalf of the Council it was argued that the strike was illegal because it was a strike by workers who belong to an essential service. According to section 32 (2) of the Industrial Disputes Act, no workman may take part in any strike in any essential industry unless written notice of intention to commence a strike is given at least 21 days before the date of the strike. In section 47 the phrase "essential industry" is defined as "any industry which is declared, by Order made by the Minister and published in the Gazette, to be an industry essential to the life of the community." The service rendered by the conservancy and scavenging labourers does not belong to this category of cssential industry as defined by the Act. Consequently the strike is not illegal. But on account of the nature of the work performed by these workers and the danger to human health by a sudden cessation of their functions, it is only proper that these workers should give adequate notice before they commence a strike, unless of course the reason for striking was a grave and urgent one.

10. When we examined the reasons for the strike we found that the reasons that the workers themselves gave is that they had been refused their legitimate payment for extra work undertaken during the racing period. The evidence shows that this was a during the racing period. The evidence shows that this was a wrong reason because at no time were these workers refused payment. There might have been delay, but never a refusal. Apart from the other evidence we have for this view, the evidence of Mr. Wijeratnasingham, a former Mayor of the Council and now a Member, clearly shows that there was no refusal to pay and, although he himself gave evidence as a witness for the Union and was interested in the workers, he went on to say that the Council made every endeavour to pay as soon as possible although there might have been some neglect on the part of the executive officers. Regarding the delay, Counsel for the Union thought that like the monthly salaries or wages which must be paid as a statutory obligation on or before the 10th of the succeeding month, the extra payment for special pieces of work should also be paid in similar fashion. But it has to be realised that payments of that kind involve certain formalities and sanction from certain officers and such payments are liable to greater delays in the normal course of routine. While we are agreed that there has been greater delay than was necessary owing to the negligence both of the Commissioner, Mr. Shanmugam, who did not exercise the statutory functions vested in him regarding this matter and by the slinghod matheds edented by gam, who did not exercise the statutory functions vested in him regarding this matter and by the slipshod methods adopted by the clerical staff which led to the misplacement of important memoranda and suggestions made by the Medical Officer of Health, we do not consider that there was sufficient or adequate cause for the enactment of a strike and we regard the strike of the 10th June unjustifiable.

11. In regard to the Mayor's difficulty of re-employment on the 11th of June of the workers who went on strike on the 10th of June, we wish to comment that a serious situation had arisen June, we wish to comment that a serious situation had arisen by the sudden strike and the Mayor and his colleagues had taken all steps to find substitute labour to save the health of the City, and although the new staff actually employed on the 10th and 11th of June was not very big he had already enlisted the services of new workers who were coming from elsewhere. Besides, he had to take time to consider what disciplinary action should be taken against workers who had brought about a very difficult situation without previous notice. It is not possible to read into the notes of the Labour Officer of Nuwara Eliya and his evidence more than this evidence implies, viz. that no settlement was arrived at; and the very fact that his arrangement for further conferences on the 12th of June and the 15th of June implies that he did not consider negotiations had come to an end.

12. Regarding the absence of the Council's representatives at

12. Regarding the absence of the Council's representatives at the conference arranged on the 15th of June, it should first be realised that the Council was represented at the conference

arranged for the 12th of June but the conference had to be abandoned owing to neglect on the part of the Union to be represented. But between the 12th of June and the 15th of June represented. But between the 12th of June and the 15th of June many incidents of an unpleasant kind had occurred which had produced a condition in which a satisfactory conference could not be held on the 15th of June. We have only to mention the procession that passed through the town in which abusive language was indulged in and slogans were used derogatory to the dignity of the Members of the Council, and the speeches made at the end of the procession were also such that it implies that the workers were not in a satisfactory mode to autorize the that the workers were not in a satisfactory mood to enter into negotiations in the proper frame of mind. In the light of these circumstances, the Mayor can be exonerated from blame for not attending the conference of June the 15th or having the Council represented at that conference.

13. In our opinion the strike of the 10th of June was legal but unjustified and the strike of the 12th of June unjustified, and we hold that the Council has every right to dismiss the workers who have been proved guilty of misconduct.

who have been proved guilty of misconduct.

14. In view, however, of the fact that many of these workers have long periods of service and several of them have been misguided and misdirected by wrong leadership, we decide that the Council should pay them a gratuity in respect of past services. In calculating this gratuity we decide that each worker shall receive two weeks' basic wages in respect of each complete year of service, but the payment to any worker shall not exceed the equivalent of three months' basic wages. In making this computation, any period of service over six months may be reckoned as one complete year of service. We order that this gratuity be paid to the workers concerned within two months of the date of publication of this award in the Government Gazette.

The Council shall be free, however, to re-employ any of the workers it has dismissed at its absolute discretion. Any worker who is re-employed within the period of two months stipulated above shall, ipso facto, be not entitled to any gratuity as provided for in this awarw. Such workers who are re-employed shall also not be entitled for past wages from the date of dismissal to the date of re-employment.

THE AWARD

This is an award under section 24 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, Nos. 25 of 1956, 14 and 62 of 1957, the

parties to this award being the All-Ceylon Match Workers' Welfare Union, Biyagama Road, Siyambalagahawatte, Kelaniya (hereinafter referred to as "the Union") and The National Match Works, Red Mills, Kelaniya (hereinafter referred to as "the Employer").

- 2. By virtue of the powers vested in him by section 4 (2) of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, the Honourable the Minister of Labour, Housing and Social Services, by his Order dated 29th April, 1959, referred the Industrial Dispute between the said parties for settlement to an Industrial Court.
- 3. According to the statement bearing the same date, made by the Acting Deputy Commissioner of Labour, the matters in dispute between the said parties are as follows:—
 - (a) Non-employment of-

 - 1. S. Richard,
 2. A. Adwin Singho,
 3. P. Margaret,
 4. G. A. Somawathie,
 5. W. A. D. Violet, and
 6. K. A. Seelawathie.
 - (b) Non-implementation by the National Match Works of the decision given by the Labour Officer in regard to the dismissal of Mr. S. Nalliah in pursuance of clause 2 of the agreement between the said Union and the said National Match Works of 4.9.58.
- 4. Mr. Advocate P. K. Liyanage, instructed by Mr. R. Saravanabagahavan, appeared for the Union, while Mr. Advocate S. M. Mohamed instructed by Mr. M. L. M. Sally appeared for the Employer, except on the last date of the inquiry, viz., 14th June, 1960, when Mr. Sally appeared alone for the Employer. Employer.

- 5. The proceedings started on the 17th September, 1959 and concluded on 14th June, 1960, after four days of inquiry, while on two other dates the matter had to be put off—on the first occasion since the Union was not present and on the second, on an application made by Mr. Advocate Mohamed on behalf of his client. On the last date of inquiry, both barties undertook to send to the Registrar within three weeks of that date their written addresses—and they have done so accordingly.
- 6. Following the same order in which these two matters in dispute were dealt with, I think I shall take up for consideration the second matter first, viz., "non-implementation by the National Match Works of the decision given by the Labour Officer in regard to the dismissal of Mr. S. Nalliah in pursuance of clause 2 of the agreement between the said Union and the said National Match Works of 4.9.58."
- 7. The dispute could be traced back to the lock out that took place in 1958, as a result of some trouble between some of the employees and the management. The factory remained closed down from January 1958 to June 1958, when an agreement with a view to a settlement was arrived at by the parties with the help of the Labour Department. The terms of the agreement were that four workers, Richard and Edwin Singho—Nos. 1 and 2 in the list annexed to the statement prepared by the Acting Deputy Commissioner of Labour—and two female workers were to apologise to the Employer and that all the employees were to be taken back for work. The apology was duly tendered on 23rd of June in the presence of an Inspector of Labour; but S. Nalliah, the person mentioned in para. (b) of the aforesaid statement was not allowed to resume work, while Richard and Adwin were taken back but put on a lower grade. These two matters along with some other matters came grade. These two matters along with some other matters came up for consideration on 4th September, 1958, at a conference held at the Labour Office presided over by Mr. I. D. B. La's Broy, Assistant Commissioner of Labour—where both the Union and the Employer were represented. According to P 1 an agreement was reached with regard to both these matters. The agreement with regard to Nalliah's matter is as follows—"In regard to S. Nalliah it is agreed that a Labour Officer inquires into the matter and both parties agree to accept this decision. If the Inquiring Officer holds against Nalliah, the Union reserves the right to claim compensation for services rendered to the Company." Accordingly this was inquired into on 23.9.58 by a Labour Officer who held that the dismissal of Nalliah was unjustifiable and who in the circumstances made the following order as set out in P. 2 "(a) 3 months' wages to be paid to Nalliah as gratuity for each year of service; and (c) wages to be paid to Nalliah from the date of dismissal to the date of inquiry i.e., 23.9.58."
- 8. This order of the Labour Officer has not yet been implemented and it constitutes the second matter in dispute as set out in the Acting Commissioner's statement dated 24th April,
- 9. When the inquiry was taken up on 17.9.59, Mr. Advocate Mohamed on behalf of the Employer accepted as binding on his client that part of the Labour Officer's order which declared that Nalliah's dismissal was unjustifiable, but not the rest of the order directing certain payments to Nalliah. Hence no payments were made in terms of the order. According to Counsel the Labour Officer had no jurisdiction to order such payments—which, in his opinion, would be a matter for negotiations between the Union and the Employer. I find it rather difficult to agree with this contention, it is common ground that the parties concerned agreed to have the matter submitted to a Labour Officer for arbitration and to accept his decision as binding. I do not see how one party at this stage could go back Labour Officer for arbitration and to accept his decision as binding. I do not see how one party at this stage could go back on that agreement. The relevant sections seem to be section 2 and section 3 of the Industrial Disputes Act. I am inclined to the view that apart from coming to a decision on the question of justifiability or otherwise of Nalliah's dismissal, the Labour Offictr was within his rights in making an order of payment as he has done in this case, in the event of his finding that the dismissal of Nalliah was unjustifiable. If that were not no findity would ever be reached in these matters relating the dismissal of Nalliah was unjustifiable. If that were not so, no finality would ever be reached in these matters relating to industrial disputes where such finality would be so very desirable and necessary in the interests of all parties concerned. Further, one of the objects of the Industrial Disputes Act seems to be the speedy restoration of industrial peace and harmony and this would be very much impeded if this restricted view contended for by the Counsel for the Employer were accepted.
- 10. I hold that there has been a non-implementation by the National Match Works of the decision given by the Labour Officer in regard to the dismissal of Mr. S. Nalliah in pursuance of clause 2 of the agreement between the said union and the said National Match Works of 4.9.58, and that such non-implementation was wrongful. I therefore make award that the decision given by the Labour Officer be implemented.
- 11 What now remains to be considered is the non-employment of the six employees mentioned under (a) in the statement by the Acting Deputy Commissioner of Labour. They are as follows:—
 - 1. S. Richard

 - 1. S. Michard,
 2. A. Adwin Singho,
 3. P. Margaret,
 4. G. A. Somawathie,
 5. W. A. D. Violet, and
 6. K. A. Seelawathie,

- Richard and Adwin Singho are said to be the President and Secretary of the Branch Union respectively, whilst the other four, with the exception of Somawathie, were committee nour, which he exception of Somawaine, were committee, members, Somawathie, though not on the committee, was a very active member of the Union. The allegation against these six workers is that on the morning of 25th September, 1958, they assaulted Peter Perera, Supervisor of the Factory. The trouble first appears to have started between Somawathie and Peter Perera on a stair case, where Somawathie who was coming down the stairs is alleged to have assaulted with a club Peter Perera who was going up the stairs; and when he got off the stairs Somawathie and the other five had set upon Peter Perera, pushed him hither and thither, torn his coat and damaged his umbrella. The Police was sent for and the officer who-called at the Factory generally inquired into the matter, but later Peter Perera made a written complaint at the Police Station, a certified copy of which has been produced marked D. 1. On this complaint the Police filed case No. 11853/C in the Magistrate's Court of Colombo against Somawathie for assault and mischief; the case was however compounded and Somawathie was ordered to pay Rs. 10 to the Home for the Aged—certified copy of the proceedings marked D. 2. The Employer contends that for the above reasons there was no alternative but to dismiss the six workers with effect from 26.9.58. On that morning, after they were told that there was no further work for them, they the stairs is alleged to have assaulted with a club Peter Perera they were told that there was no further work for them, they collected opposite the factory and stones were said to have been thrown at the premises. Accordingly, a complaint was made to the Police by Mr. T. Sivapragasam, the Manager, but no further action appears to have been taken either by the Police or by the Manager.
- 12. On the other hand the case for the Union is that this was an attempt on the part of the Employer to get rid of these six workers of whom two, Richard and Adwin, were President and Secretary of the Union respectively, three were committee members, whilst Somawathie though not on the committee was a very active member. On 25th September when Somawathie turned up for work as usual, she was not given her ticket, but she proceeded upstairs where she usually worked. She was told to await the arrival of the proprietor. Later she was sent for and was coming down the steps when she met Peter Perera. There appears to have been an argument on the stairs which ended in an exchange of blows—Somawathie says she was assaulted by Peter Perera, whilst the latter says that he was assaulted by Somawathie with a club. The Union maintains this was all that happened—the fight, if any, was confined to the two of them—the other five workers, viz. S. Richard, A. Adwin Singho, P. Margaret, W. A. D. Violet and K. A. Seelawathie, were brought into this case since the Employer found it convenient to do so because of their union activities.
- venient to do so because of their union activities.

 13. In this connection D. 1—complaint made by Peter Perera to the Police on the morning of 25.9.58 is interesting. According to its contents, Peter Perera appears to have gone to the Police Station "with he Factory owner Mr. Sivapragasam" and made his complaint in the hearing of the latter. So that, it is not quite correct when Mr. Sivapragasam tries to make out in his evidence that apart from advising Peter Perera to make a complaint at the Police Station he did not do anything very much in the matter. Peter Perera's complaint was mainly directed against Somawathie, though the names of Seelawathie, Margaret, Violet and others were mentioned; the fact remains there is no specific reference to Richard and Adwin Singho. This omission is rather significant, because Sivaparagasam who, according to his evidence, was already informed by Peter Perera and Jayatissa that all six employers had joined in the assault did not think it worth while to refresh Peter Perera's memory with regard to the part alleged to have been played by the President and Secretary in this incident, even though he accompanied Peter Perera to the Police Station and was present there at the time when the statement was made. Another interesting feature about the statement is that the Jayatissa who was said to have been so very helpful in saving Peter Perera from further attack and who had already informed Sivaparagasam all about the assault has not been included amongst those who could give material evidence. None of those mentioned in the statement have given evidence in these proceedings.
- have given evidence in these proceedings.

 14. The Union has established this important fact with regard to Richard and Adwin Singho—after the dispute regarding the lock out was settled and when these two went back to work in terms of the settlement, they were taken back but allotted some other work which meant their down-grading and a certain reduction in their wages. This matter was made the subject matter of an arbitration; whilst it was pending action was taken to dismiss Richard and Adwin Singho with effect from 26.9.58. A certified copy of the award dated 14th December, 1958, where the arbitrator held that the down grading of these two employees was in the nature of a punishment and therefore irregular was produced marked P. 3. To my mind this act of dismissal whilst the other matter was pending is extremely suspicious and high handed. On the evidence adduced in this case I hold that the non-employment of Richard and Adwin Singho is unjustifiable.
- 15. There is however evidence to show that Somawathie was behaving on the morning of the 25th September, in an unruly manner, though it may not be correct that she actually used a club in the manner suggested by the employer. In view of that evidence, coupled with the subsequent evente—the complaint made by Peter Perera, and the criminal proceedings taken thereupon, later compounded, which resulted in her having to pay Rs. 10 as ordered in that case—I hold that her non-employment is justified.

16. But, in regard to the remaining three, viz.:—(3) P. Margaret, (5) W. A. D. Violet, (6) K. A. Seelawathie, I find there is no satisfactory evidence against them. On the other hand I am satisfied that these three workers along with Richard and Adwin, have been brought into the incident of the assault on Peter Perera for reasons other than those urged by the employer. In the circumstances, I hold that the non-employment of Margaret, Violet and Seelawathie is unjustifiable. I also find that the management has failed to give the five employees viz., Nos. 1, 2, 3, 5 and 6 proper notice before they were discontinued.

17. The Union is not asking for reinstatement and the employer is not keen on taking them back. In the circumstances, I think it would be just and equitable that each of the five employees be paid through the Labour Department who will kindly work out the figures, a month's gross wages in lieu of notice and another two months' gross wages to each of them by way of compensation for wrongful dismissal. The employer shall deposit with the Commissioner of Labour the amounts required to make the above payment within two weeks after the employer is notified to do so by the Labour Department.

THE FOOD CONTROL ACT, No. 25 OF 1950

Order No. 153

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 (1) (i) of the Food Control Act, No. 25 of 1950, I, Tikiri Bandara Hangaratne, Minister of Commerce, Trade, Food and Shipping, do by this Order prohibit the transport or removal of any quantity of any rice from any one place in Ceylon to any other place in Ceylon, except under the authority of a permit issued by or on behalf of the Food Controller or Deputy Food Controller or Assistant Food Controller of the area within which the first-mentioned place is situated or otherwise than in accordance with such conditions as may be attached to such permit.

Provided that nothing in the preceding provisions of this Order shall apply—

- (a) to the transport or removal of any quantity of locally grown rice;
- (b) to the transport or removal of any rice by any person on behalf of the Government of Ceylon;
- (c) to the transport or removal by any person carrying a ration book of the quantity of rice obtained on the surrender of any coupon from that ration book, from the place at which such rice was obtained to the place of residence of the holder of that book; or
- (d) to the transport or removal by any person carrying a receipt or permit issued by or on behalf of the Deputy Food Controller or a receipt issued by a Wholesale Dealer in rice, of the quantity of rice obtained on such receipt or permit, from the place at which delivery of such rice was taken to the store or place of business of the Wholesale Dealer, Co-operative Depot or Authorised Distributor specified in the receipt or permit.

"Wholesale Dealer" referred to at (d) above means the Co-operative Wholesale Establishmemnt, Co-operative Stores Unions, registered under Section 6 of the Co-operative Societies Ordinance No. 16 of 1936, as amended by Act No. 21 of 1949 or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy or Assistant Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III of Head E of the Food Controller Regulations 1952, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity to Co-operative Stores or Co-operative Depots or Authorised Distributors.

"Authorised Distributor" referred to at (d) above means a merchant or other fit and proper person authorised by the Deputy or Assistant Food Controller under Regulation 5 of Part III of Head E of the Food Control Regulations 1952, to be a distributor of supplies of any controlled commodity for specified areas, institutions or groups of people.
