GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE " CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"

- 1. Allowances-Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.
- 2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.
- (ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.
- (iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. New Entrant Officers

- New Entrant Officers—

 The period of probation/trial of "New Entrant Officers" appointed to pensionable posts/nonpensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.
 "New Entrant Officers" will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.
 (ii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.
 Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, inter alia, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

 Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/ trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

- (iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Fublic Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in
- Sinhala.

 The term "New Entrant Officers" in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of sub-paragraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.
- 5. Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.
- 6. War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.
- 7. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.
- (ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

Unesco Fellowship in Education for International Understanding

APPLICATIONS are invited from Principals, Lecturers and Training Masters and Training Mistresses of Government Training Colleges for the award of a UNESCO Fellowship in Education for International Understanding. Applicants may be of either sex. The country or countries of study will depend on a study of the qualifications of the candidate by experts of the UNESCO Secretariat who will work out details of a suitable study programme and make an assignment. The purpose of the Fellowship is to enable the selected candidate to visit schools in one or more countries associated with the scheme, in order to—

(a) observe the special activities being carried out by participating institutions in other countries, with particular attention to methods of teach-ing and evaluation, and to exchange knowledge and ideas with the teachers there;

- (b) make plans for the further development of the project, with particular attention to the question of liaison between schools in the host countries and schools represented by the visiting teachers:
- (c) take an active part in special programmes being carried out by participating schools in other countries.

Further, to the extent permitted by his study plan and itinerary the recipient of the Fellowship will be given the opportunity to visit the headquarters of the United Nations in New York and Geneva and the Headquarters of one or more of the Specialized Agencies of the United Nations in order to learn at first hand about the work of the United Nations. On these occasions, a special programme of study drawn up in consultation with the Secretariat concerned, will be carried out. It is expected that, on return to their own countries, recipients of Fellowships will make full and effective use of the experience and knowledge acquired during their study tour. study tour.

- 2. Tenure.—The duration of the Fellowship will be three months, during the first half of 1961.
- 3. Terms of Award.—The following benefits are covered by the award:—

 (d) Selected candidates will be required to comply with any rules made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provision of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.
