#### Posts — Vacant

#### GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

1. Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

#### 4. New Entrant Officers—

(i) The period of probation/trial of “New Entrant Officers” appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) “New Entrant Officers” will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note.—The term “New Entrant Officers” in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of sub-paragraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.

5. Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

(iv) Any statement in the application which is found to be incorrect will render the applicant liable to disqualification if the inaccuracy is discovered before the selection, and to dismissal if discovered after the selection.

(v) Applications not conforming in every respect with the requirements of this advertisement will be rejected.

## 2. A candidate must be—

- a citizen of Ceylon;
- not less than 18 years or more than 24 years of age on the date of this advertisement;
- Educational Standard.—(i) S. S. C. English Standard. Provided however that any candidate who has a special or technical knowledge or training may, at the discretion of the Commander of the Air Force, be enlisted notwithstanding that he does not possess the requisite age/academical qualifications.  
(ii) For trades in Group "B" preference will be given to candidates of S. S. C. Standard with a knowledge of Mathematics and Science.
- Medical Standard.—(i) R. Cy. A. F. Police and Gunners—Height 5 ft. 6 in., Chest 33 in., Weight 110 lb.  
(ii) Other Trades—Height 5 ft. 4 in., Chest 33 in., Weight 105 lb.
- Candidates may be required to undergo some form of trade and aptitude tests before they are allotted to the trade. The final choice of trades will depend on Air Force requirements.

3. Period of Enlistment.—A candidate on final selection will be enlisted in the Regular Air Force and shall be required to serve for TWELVE YEARS, of which FIVE YEARS will be regular service and SEVEN YEARS will be in the reserve, after which he will be discharged. Opportunities will be given to selected airmen to serve for pension subject to Air Force requirements and individual merit.

4. Conditions of Service, Rates of Pay and Allowances.—See *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 10,240 dated 27th April, 1951, which is available in all post offices, and at Air Force Headquarters (Unit), McCallum Road, Colombo 10.

5. The following rules govern applications for vacancies stated in paragraph 1 above :—

- Applications will be made in the form appearing at the end of this notification. No printed copies of the form of applications are available, and applicants are required to prepare their own forms.
- All applications are to be forwarded *in person* by the applicant either at 0900 hours or 1,400 hours, from 9th August, 1960, to 19th August, 1960, and at 0900 hours on 20th August, 1960, at Headquarters (Unit), McCallum Road, Colombo 10. Applicants possessing requisite qualifications will be interviewed and medically examined as soon as possible, on handing in their applications. NO expenses will be met in this connection.

(c) Under no circumstances will applications be considered unless the candidates possess the necessary qualifications.

(d) Applications are to be accompanied by a recommendation from the applicant's present employer. In a case where the applicant is unemployed a certificate from a responsible person of mature age, who has been personally acquainted with him for the past one year in private life, should be forwarded. In the case of students, two recent certificates of character, one from the Principal of the last school attended, and the other from a responsible person of mature age who has known the applicant for the last one year in private life, are to be forwarded.

(e) When applications are handed in, candidates are to be in possession of the ORIGINALS of the following certificates :—

- certificate of registration of birth. (Baptismal certificates or certificates issued for the purpose of the educational code will not be accepted);
- certificate of the highest academical qualification obtained;

CANDIDATES WILL BE ENLISTED IN THE RANK OF AIR-CRAFTSMAN, SECOND CLASS (RECRUIT), IN THE REGULAR CEYLON AIR FORCE; except in cases of exceptional suitability the Commander of the Air Force, at his discretion, has the right to authorize promotions to higher ranks in the trade if the candidate is found suitable by a Trade Test Board.
- Anyone who desires to recommend a candidate should do so by giving him a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will render such candidate liable to disqualification.

2. Terms of Engagement.—The posts are temporary. Contributions should be made to the Public Service Provident Fund if the posts are included in the Schedule to the P.S.P.F. Ordinance.

3. General Condition.—A candidate must—

- (a) be a Ceylonese. A "Ceylonese" is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration,  
 (b) is not less than 25 years and not more than 40 years of age on 22nd August, 1960. (These age limits will not apply to those who are already in the Public Service and who are otherwise qualified).  
 (c) is of excellent moral character and physically sound.

4. Special Qualifications.—In addition to the general qualifications stated above the applicants should have the requisite qualifications and experience stipulated against the posts specified hereunder : —

- (a) Saw Doctors Grade I .. Applicants should possess a specialized knowledge for over 10 years in the Skilled Grade II. They should in addition be familiar with the doctoring of wide band saws, saw chains, large diameter circular saws and in the grinding of planer knives. They should be able to perform the operations of tensioning, grinding and gulleting, swaging, side dressing, lap grinding and brazing, hammering and setting with the aid of inexperienced labour. Applicants should be able to give instructions on all phases of wide band saw doctoring and repair, circular saw doctoring and planer knife grinding; operate log band mills and band re-saws,

Roller feed circular saw benches, circular Rip and cross-cut saws and combined planing and thickening machine and doctor saws and knives according to the special requirements of the material being worked. The ability to effect minor repairs to doctoring equipment is essential.

(b) Saw Doctors Grade II (Circular Saws)

Applicants should possess at least 10 years experience in the respective trades or they should have successfully completed a recognised course of apprenticeship generally of 5 years duration. They should in addition be familiar with the doctoring of large diameter circular saws and the grinding of planer knives—i.e., hammering, grinding, gulleting and setting.

(c) Saw Doctors Grade II (Wide Band Saws)

Applicants should possess at least 10 years experience in the respective trades or they should have successfully completed a recognised course of apprenticeship generally of 5 years duration. They should in addition be familiar with the doctoring of Wide Band Saws and Circular Saws, that is tensioning, grinding and gulleting, swaging, side dressing, lap grinding and brazing.

(d) Sawyers Grade I

Applicants should possess a specialized knowledge for over 10 years in the Skilled Grade II. They should in addition have a sufficiently detailed knowledge of Log Band Mills, Band re-saws, Circular saws and edgers and should be able to operate them with the aid of inexperienced labour. The ability to effect minor repairs to the machines is essential. Applicants should be able to organise, instruct and supervise the operations in the Saw Mill, and have a knowledge of the variations in technique required in dealing with different types of timbers.

(e) Sawyers Grade II

Applicants should possess at least 10 years experience in the respective trades or they should have successfully completed a recognised course of apprenticeship generally of 5 years duration. They should in addition possess experience in the operation of Log Band Mills, Band re-saws, Circular saws and edgers.

(f) Wood Working Machinists Grade I

Applicants should possess a specialized knowledge for over 10 years in the Skilled Grade II. They should in addition have a sufficiently detailed knowledge of Roller Feed Circular saw benches, Circular rip and cross-cut saws, edgers, and combined planing and thickening machines and should be able to

operate them with the aid of inexperienced labour. The ability to effect minor repairs to these machines is essential. Applicants should be able to organise, instruct and supervise the operations in a mechanised wood workshop and have a knowledge of the variations in technique required in dealing with different types of timbers.

(g) Wood Working Machinists Grade II

Applicants should possess at least 10 years experience in the respective trades or they should have successfully completed a recognised course of apprenticeship generally of 5 years duration. They should in addition possess experience in the operation of Roller feed Circular Saw benches, circular rip and cross-cut saws, edgers and combined planing and thickening machines.

(h) Electricians

Applicants should possess at least 10 years experience in the respective trades or they should have successfully completed a recognised course of apprenticeship generally of 5 years duration. They should in addition possess a minimum of 3 years experience in the care and maintenance of starters and electric motors up to 50 H.P. They should have a detailed knowledge of the conduct of insulation tests on motor windings, starter coils, conductors, &c., earth resistance tests on all metal work including metal conductors (and their adequate earthing) the inspection and cleaning of motors, starters, &c., the oiling and greasing of bearings, the checking and adjusting of alignment, the inspection and proper bedding of brush gear, cleaning of slip rings, the satisfactory working of speed control gear, &c., also the inspection and maintenance in proper condition of supply and distribution lines and boxes. The ability to effect minor repairs to electrical equipment is essential.

(i) Generator Drivers

Applicants should possess at least 10 years experience in the respective trades or they should have successfully completed a recognised course of apprenticeship generally of 5 years duration. They should in addition possess a minimum of 5 years experience in the operation of turbo-charged oil engine generating sets of up to 150 K.W. They should be able to effect minor repairs to generating sets, and have a sufficiently detailed knowledge of the operation and maintenance of generators to perform their duties with only unskilled aid.

(j) Crane Operators .. Applicants should possess a specialized knowledge for over 10 years in the Skilled Grade II. They should in addition possess a minimum of 3 years experience in the handling of mobile cranes. A knowledge of the mechanism of these vehicles (diesel electric) and the ability to effect minor repairs are essential.

#### ORGANISATION AND METHODS OFFICER, TREASURY

APPLICATIONS are invited from members of the Public Service holding pensionable appointments for vacancy for Organisation and Methods Officer in the Organisation and Methods Division of the Treasury. Initially, the officer will be selected for trial for a period of six months and if he proves to be suitable, he will be retained on Organisation and Methods work for about three years. If not, he will be permitted to resume the duties of his previous post without suffering loss of seniority or any prospects in the Service to which he belongs. At the end of the period of three years, his position will be reviewed and he may continue to serve in the Division for a longer period. An Organisation and Methods Officer will be released at any time on reasonable notice.

2. The selected officer will be seconded for service in the Organisation and Methods Division. Initially, he will be expected to undergo training in Organisation and Methods work as well as in staff training. He will be required to do Organisation and Methods work or training work according to the exigencies of the Department.

3. Qualifications.—Applicants must—

- (a) be under 48 years of age on August 31, 1960 ;
- (b) have served Government for at least seven years in administrative or executive posts; or ten years in the Clerical Service or analogous grades ;
- (c) draw a salary of not less than Rs. 2,820 per annum on August 31, 1960.

4. Salary.—The Selected Officer, other than one in the General Clerical Service or an analogous grade and officer in Class IV of the Accountants' Service, will not be eligible for any additional emoluments, while under secondment. An Officer in the Clerical Service or an analogous grade will be paid, in addition to his substantive scale, an allowance of Rs. 480 per annum rising to Rs. 1,440 per annum, by increments of Rs. 240 per annum. An Officer in Class IV of the Accountants' Service will be paid a tapering allowance equivalent to the difference between—

- (a) his total remuneration in his substantive grade as Accountant, Class IV, and
- (b) the total remuneration which an officer on the corresponding step in Grade I of the E. C. C. of the G. C. S. will receive on secondment as an O. & M. Officer.

2. Salary Scale.—The salary scale attached to the post is Rs. 888—18 of 72—Rs. 2,184 per annum. (Efficiency Bar before Rs. 1,608).

3. Terms of Engagement.—(i) The posts are permanent and pensionable. Appointments will, in the first instance, be on probation for a period of 3 years.

(ii) The selected candidates will normally be required to serve in Colombo.

4. Qualifications required.—Every candidate must furnish proof that he—

- (a) is not less than 17 years of age and not more than 25 years of age on 26th August, 1960 ;
- (b) is of excellent moral character ;
- (c) has passed the Senior School Certificate Examination or equivalent or higher examination with a credit pass in Mathematics. Preference will however be given to candidates who have had experience in hydrological or meteorological analysis or in statistical work.
