GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

1. Allowances.—Unless otherwise stated. Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. Conditions of Service.—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. Terms of Engagement.—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute, at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. New Entrant Officers.—

(i) The period of probation/trial of “New Entrant Officers” appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) “New Entrant Officers” will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) These officers will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) Their confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on the passing of a proficiency test in Sinhala.

Those who fail to reach the prescribed standard of proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial are liable to be discontinued, but discontinuance may be deferred if the appointing authority is satisfied that a genuine attempt had been made to acquire proficiency in the Official Language. Loss of seniority may be waived at the discretion of the appropriate authority if the officer passes the test within a reasonable time after the due date.

(iv) New Entrant Officers who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempted from the Proficiency Test in Sinhala.

Note.—The term “New Entrant Officers” in this context means officers appointed to posts in the Public Service on or after September 24, 1956, who are not deemed to be old entrant officers in terms of sub-paragraphs 2 (ii) (b) and 2 (ii) (c) of Treasury Circular No. 379 of 23rd May, 1957.

5. Qualifications required.—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

6. War Service Concession.—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty’s Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. Other Requirements.—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. In the case of applications from officers holding permanent posts in the Public Service, the Heads of the Departments concerned should, in forwarding the applications, state whether or not they are prepared to release the applicants (if selected) in accordance with Administrative Regulation 109 of the Manual of Procedure.

(ii) Candidates may be required to present themselves for interview at an appointed time and place. No travelling or other expenses will be paid in this connection.

(iii) Anyone desiring to recommend a candidate should do so by giving a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

DEPARTMENT OF GOVERNMENT ELECTRICAL UNDERTAKINGS

Electrical Foremen Apprentices

APPLICATIONS are invited for posts of Electrical Foremen Apprentice in the Department of Government Electrical Undertakings. Applications which should be according to the specimen form given below, should reach me on or before September 12, 1960.

Selected candidates should be prepared to take up training in the Department at short notice.

2. *Training Allowance.*—Apprentices will be paid the following allowances, provided their progress and conduct are satisfactory :—

- (a) While in training Rs. 3 per diem ;
- (b) On satisfactory completion of training and on passing the Departmental Examination qualify-

ing for promotion to the Subordinate Technical Service, Grade III, the following rates of pay will apply pending appointment to Grade III of the Subordinate Technical Service :—

Rs. 3.40—1st year.

Rs. 3.80—2nd year.

(c) A subsistence allowance at the rate specified in F.R. 1553 (i), if they are on outstation work for a continuous period of less than one month.

3. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he—

- (i) is not less than 18 years or more than 25 years of age on September 12, 1960 ;
- (ii) is of good moral character and physically sound ;
- (iii) has passed the Junior Technical Officers' Course II of the Ceylon Technical College (Electrical and Mechanical Section).

4. *Conditions of Service.*—(a) *Initial Security.*—

Apprentices selected for training will be required to furnish an initial security of Rs. 50 and enter into a bond with two sureties in a sum of Rs. 3,000 for the due performance and fulfilment by them of the conditions set out in the Scheme of Recruitment and Training.

(b) *Progress and Conduct.*—An apprentice in training whose progress or conduct has been found unsatisfactory at any stage will be liable to be discontinued on the orders of the General Manager, whose decision will be final. An apprentice so discontinued will forfeit the initial security deposit of Rs. 50 furnished by him.

(c) *Indentures.*—Upon recruitment, apprentices will be required to sign an Indenture binding themselves to serve for the full period of their apprenticeship and during this period to devote themselves to duty, conform to rules and regulations and to obey promptly all orders.

(d) *Termination of Indentures.*—The General Manager reserves the right to terminate an Indenture without previous notice if an apprentice's conduct is not satisfactory, or if an apprentice does not make satisfactory progress in his training, or if for any cause he considers the continuance of an apprentice in training is not in the interests of the service. An apprentice so discontinued will forfeit the initial security deposit of Rs. 50 furnished by him. If the officer terminates his indenture by resignation he will forfeit the initial security of Rs. 50 and will be required to refund all cost of training up to the date of resignation, i.e., all allowances received by way of salary and cost of living and special living allowances.

(e) *Hours of Duty.*—The hours of duty during the period of practical training—Apprentices will conform to the duty hours in force in the various Engineering Sections to which they are posted in the Department of Government Electrical Undertakings.

(f) The selected apprentices will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island and will be liable to serve in any part of the Island.

(g) *Leave.*—The grant of leave and other conditions of service will be as laid down by the Government from time to time.

5. *Terms of Engagement.*—Programme of Training—Selected candidates will be required to undergo one year's training as follows :—

- (a) (1) *Generation Branch.*—The Departmental Power Stations in Colombo and Norton Bridge—3 months.
- (2) *Colombo Division.*—Substations, Mains and Testing—3 months.
- (3) *Construction Branch.*—Construction of Overhead Transmission Lines, Government Installations, Lighting Schemes—4 months.
- (4) *Drawing Office.*—Training in Plan Drawing and Tracing (Elementary)—2 months.

(b) *Keeping of Note Books.*—During their training in the Department apprentices will be required to keep note books which will be examined periodically by the Heads of various branches under whom they are posted for training.

(c) *Departmental Training.*—An apprentice must obtain a satisfactory certificate from the immediate superior under whom he is working before he can proceed from one stage of his training to the other. He will be judged by punctuality attendance, absence with leave, absence without leave, sick leave, disposition and willingness to work, general ability, conduct

and steadiness. An apprentice will be called upon to make up all time lost in training due to sickness, and absence with or without leave, before he proceeds to the next step in his course of training. Absence without leave will be treated as unsatisfactory conduct, unless promptly and satisfactorily explained.

(d) Subordinate Technical Service Examination.—Apprentices will be eligible to sit for the First Departmental Examination and qualify for appointment as Electrical Foreman, Grade III, in the Subordinate Technical Service.

NOTE.—Apprentices who have passed the Junior Technical Officers' Course II of the Ceylon Technical College (Electrical and Mechanical Section) will be exempted from the following subjects in the First Departmental Examination:—

- Part I—(i) Applied Electricity ;
- (ii) Plan Drawing and Tracing.
- Part II—Workshop Practice.

(e) An apprentice who has passed the First Departmental Examination will be eligible for appointment as Electrical Foreman, Grade III, in the Subordinate Technical Service only on completion of the full period of training, subject to existence of vacancies.

(f) Promotion in the Subordinate Technical Service.—Promotion to higher grades in the Subordinate Technical Service will be as laid down in the Scheme of Recruitment and Promotion for the Subordinate Technical Service and subject to existence of vacancies in the particular grades.

(g) Decision of General Manager, Electrical Undertakings.—The decision of the General Manager, Department of Government Electrical Undertakings, in any matter pertaining to the apprentice training shall be final.
