Formal opposition should not be lodged until after reasonable notice has been given by letter to the Applicant for registration so as to afford him an opportunity of withdrawing his application before the expense of preparing the Notice of Opposition is incurred. Failure to give such notice will be taken into account in considering any application by an Opponent for an Order of Costs if the opposition is uncontested by the Applicant.

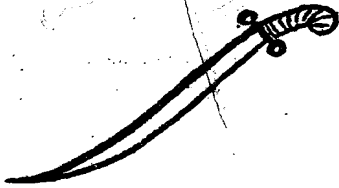

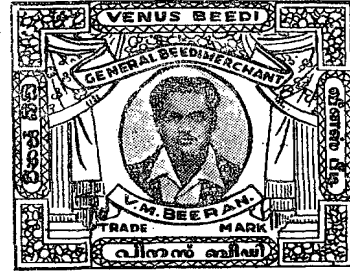

"SHELL" RESEARCH LIMITED.

"Improvements in or relating to burners and combustion apparatus"

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claim I which reads as follows:—

1. A vapourizing burner for use with petroleum distillate and similar fuels comprising a chamber having a flame opening at that end which is held uppermost in operation, a fuel supply conduit leading into and supported relative to the chamber, at least the outlet end part of the conduit being directed towards the flame opening, a shallow vapourizing cup mounted on and surrounding the outlet end of the supply conduit with its concave surface close to but within and directed towards the flame opening, one or more outlets from the supply conduit into vapourizing cup at or near the apex of its concave surface, a lip or flange surrounding the flame opening and slightly overlapping the periphery of the vapourizing cup, one or more openings into the chamber providing access for combustion air to that part lying on that side of the vapourizing cup, which is remote from the flame opening, and a flame deflector suitably spaced beyond the flame opening and supported from the vapourizing cup or the supply conduit by a metallic mounting.

"Asphaltic bitumen emulsions"

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claims 1 and 2 which reads as follows:—

1. An asphaltic bitumen emulsion of the oil-in-water type, the asphaltic bitumen having dispersed therein a minor proportion of oil-soluble alkali metal soaps of petroleum sulphonic acids and the water phase having dispersed there a minor proportion of a water-dispersible soap.

2. An asphaltic bitumen emulsion as claimed in claim 1, wherein the asphaltic bitumen phase has dispersed therein a minor proportion of alkali metal soaps of petroleum sulphonic acids having an average molecular weight above 350.

“Improved method for producing cellulose”.

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claim 1 which reads as follows:—

1. A process for the production of cellulose by digestion of cellulosic material such as wood, straw, bagasse, esparto and the like on the counterflow principle comprising the addition in one or more digester vessels of a cooking solution heating under pressure and drawing off of liquor during said heating, wherein for each 1000 kg. of raw material (calculated as dry) more than 12 cu.m. of cooking liquid are caused to react during the cooking under pressure.

“Method of polymerization of Olefins and the Linear High Molecular Weight Polymers produced thereby”.

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claim 1 which reads as follows:—

1. A method of polymerising an alpha olefin of the general formula  $R\text{CH}=\text{CH}_2$  (R being an alkyl, cycloalkyl, cycloalkenyl or aryl group) or a mixture of such alpha olefins, either alone or with ethylene and/or other hydrocarbon having at least one vinyl double bond, wherein there is used a catalyst formed by containing a halide (other than a fluoride) of a metal of Group IVa, Va or VIa of the Periodic Table as herein defined, with a metal Group Ia or II of the said table or aluminium, or with an alloy of metals of Group Ia and/or II and/or aluminium, or with a hydride or organo-metallic compound of a said metal of Group Ia or II and/or of aluminium, or with a complex hydride or a complex organo-metallic compound of boron and a said metal of Group Ia or II, the choice of the constituents of the catalyst and the conditions of polymerisation being such that at least a part of the said metal of Group IVa, Va or VIa is present in the catalyst in a valency state lower than the maximum and that in substantially anhydrous and oxygen free conditions polymerisation of the said olefin results.

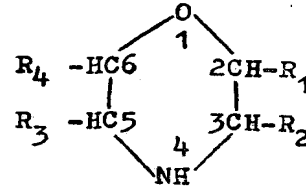

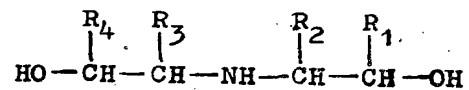

where  $R_1$  is a phenyl residue, which may be substituted by a hydroxyl group or an alkyl or alkoxy residue, having from 1-5 carbon atoms,  $R_2$  and  $R_3$  are hydrogen atoms or phenyl or alkyl residues and  $R_4$  is a hydrogen atom or a phenyl residue, in which substituted diethanolamines of the general formula



wherein  $R_1$ ,  $R_2$ ,  $R_3$  and  $R_4$  have the above stated meanings, are treated with acid.
