#### ORDER

1. The area delimited in the First Schedule hereto shall be a town for the purposes of the Town Councils Ordinance, No. 3 of 1946 (hereinafter referred to as "the Ordinance"), and the administrative limits of that town shall be the limits set out in that Schedule.

2. The name and designation of the Town Council to be constituted under the Ordinance for the aforesaid town shall be the following:—

"Piliyandala Town Council"

3. The number of members of whom the Piliyandala Town Council shall consist shall be five.

4. The town for which the Piliyandala Town Council is to be constituted shall be divided into five wards as defined in the Second Schedule hereto.

5. The date on which the term of office of the Piliyandala Town Council shall commence shall be February 1, 1961.

#### First Schedule

D. Simon Appuhamy, Wanigassoriyamahawatta claimed by Adeline Dissanayake and Mrs. D. C. Manatunga, Kahatagahawatta claimed by A. Jayasinghe, Delgahawatta claimed by P. Lenorahamy, across path through Millagahawatta claimed by A. Caldera and Nitolpitiyawatta claimed by P. D. Coranelis and others and crossing the Lunawa road to its northern boundary at culvert No. 14/2.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastwards through Nitolpitiyawatta claimed by Mrs. C. A. Abeyasekera, Delgahawatta, otherwise known as Alubogahawatta, claimed by Martin Singho and S. D. Velun Appuhamy, Kahatagahawatta claimed by P. D. Emis Singho and others and P. D. Mendis and others, across cart track leading to houses, Kahattagahawatta claimed by K. D. Kavanis Appuhamy, Gorakagahawatta claimed by M. Martha Perera and others and A. A. C. Dias, Davatagahawatta claimed by P. Don Heras, W. J. Perera and others and M. J. Appuhamy and crossing the Wewala-Piliyandala road to the western boundary of the Samarakone Avenue, thence by a line drawn northwards along the western boundary of the said road and across the Wewala Ferry road to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

Dias, Galakumbura claimed by W. M. K. Bowatta, Dawatagahakumbura claimed by H. D. John Singho, Pelawatta claimed by

U. D. Paulis Appuhamy, thence by a line drawn across Alubogahawatta claimed by P. D. Podisingho and others, U. D. Paulis Appuhamy, N. D. Alpinahamy and N. D. Leyas Singho to a point on the centre of the Colombo-Horana Public Works Department Road opposite the 12th milepost on the said road.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the centre line of the Colombo-Horana Public Works Department Road to the centre of the junction of the Wewala-Piliyandala Road and the Colombo-Horana Public Works Department Road.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre line of the Colombo-Horana Public Works Department Road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

##### Ward No. 3—Mampe South

North: By a line drawn from the meeting point of the western and southern boundaries of Ganewatta claimed by the Trustees of Mampe Temple eastwards, southwards and again eastwards along the northern limit of the Town Council area to its eastern extremity.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards, south-westwards and again southwards along the eastern limit of the Town Council area to its southern extremity.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the village limit between Mampe and Demaladuwa which runs along the northern boundary of Ridiwitagewatta claimed by D. A. Abeysinghe to the centre of culvert 13/4 on the Colombo-Horana Public Works Department Road, thence by a line drawn north-westwards along the centre of the said road to the junction of Diggala Ferry Road and the Colombo-Horana Public Works Department Road.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the centre line of the Colombo-Horana Public Works Department Road to the southern extremity of the eastern limit of Ward No. 2, thence by a line drawn northwards along the eastern limit of Ward No. 2 to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

##### Ward No. 4—Kolamuna

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the southern limit of the Town Council area to a point in line with the centre line of Sri Bimbarana Road.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre of Sri Bimbarana Road to the junction of the said road and Circular Road, thence by a line drawn eastwards along the centre of Circular Road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

##### Ward No. 5—Suwarapola

North: By a line drawn from the centre of the junction of the Piliyandala-Lunawa Road and the Circular Road north-eastwards to the centre of the junction of the Colombo-Horana Public Works Department Road and the Piliyandala-Lunawa Road, thence by a line drawn south-eastwards along the centre of the aforesaid Colombo-Horana Road to the junction of the said road and the Circular Road.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards and southwards along the western limit of Ward No. 4 to its southern extremity.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the southern limit of the Town Council area to its western extremity.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastwards along the southern limit of Ward No. 1 to the starting point of the northern limit of the Wards.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre of the Karadeliya foot-bridge and the footpath to the centre of the Wijetunga Lane, thence by a line drawn westwards along the centre of the said lane and the Kiralawella Road to the centre of the junction with the Lighthouse road.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre of the Lighthouse road to the centre of the junction with the Matara-Tangalla main road, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards along the centre of the said road to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

*Ward No. 3—Kiralawella, Hummane*

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastwards to the centre of the Sinhasana road, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards along the centre of the Sinhasana road and Ampitiya road and northwards along the centre of the Lighthouse road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

*Ward No. 5—Medaweediya, Sinhasanaweediya otherwise known as Paranakadeweediya*

North: By a line drawn from the centre of the junction of the Matara-Tangalla main road and Sri Vishnu Maha Dewala road eastwards along the centre of the said Main road to the western limit of Ward No. 2.

East: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the western limits of Wards Nos. 2, 3 and 4 as far as the centre of the junction of the Lighthouse road and Ampitiya road.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre of the Ampitiya road, to the centre of the junction with the Sinhasana road.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre of the Sinhasana road, Devale approach road and Sri Vishnu Maha Devale road to the starting point of the northern limit of the Ward.

*Electoral Division No. 6—Polhengoda, Nugegoda*

**GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE ADVERTISED IN PART IV OF THE "CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE"**

1. **Allowances.**—Unless otherwise stated Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Rates and Conditions.

2. **Conditions of Service.**—Appointments will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and the Regulation made thereunder, and other conditions of service as laid down by the Commission from time to time.

3. **Terms of engagement.**—The posts specified in the Schedule published in Part IV of the Ceylon Government Gazette No. 10,432 of August 8, 1952, and other posts added thereto from time to time while held by members of the Local Government Service other than females are pensionable under the Local Government Service Pension Scheme Regulations, 1952.

(a) The pension rights of officers serving under Government will be conserved if released under

section 21 of the Government Minutes on Pensions, and transferred to pensionable posts in the Local Government Service.

(b) In the case of employees of Local Authorities who hold pensionable posts under the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authorities, the Payment of their pension on ultimate retirement will be governed by the Pension By-laws or Rules of the Local Authority in whose employ they were on the date immediately preceding the date of their transfer to the Local Government Service in terms of section 48 of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Amendment) Act, No. 8 of 1949.

(c) All appointees to pensionable posts other than females, officers above the age of 55 and officers who were holding pensionable posts in Government Service on the date immediately prior to their appointment to the Local Government Service, are required to contribute 4 per cent. of their salary to the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund established under the Local Government Service Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund Regulations, 1952,

## By-laws

### AYURVEDIC DISPENSARY

1. The ayurvedic dispensary established by the Committee under section 43 (bb) of the Village Communities Ordinance at Kapuliyedda shall be maintained by the Committee, and shall be in the charge of an indigenous medical practitioner registered under the Indigenous Medicine Ordinance, No. 17 of 1941.

2. The Committee may appropriate annually from the Communal Fund, the funds required for the maintenance of the ayurvedic dispensary, and provision for such appropriation shall be made in the annual budget of the Committee or in supplementary estimates passed by the Committee from time to time.

3. The Committee may, in order to meet a part of the cost of the medicines and drugs supplied, charge a fee of twenty-five cents from each patient treated at the ayurvedic dispensary. The Chairman or an officer authorized by him in that behalf shall issue forthwith a receipt in respect of every such fee collected from a patient in a form approved by the Committee. Every such receipt shall have a carbon duplicate and shall be serially numbered.

4. The Chairman may, in his discretion, exempt on the ground of poverty, any patient from paying the fee prescribed in by-law 3.

5. Subject to the provisions of by-law 3, the treatment of patients at the ayurvedic dispensary shall be free.

6. At the end of each year ending on December 31, the Chairman shall cause to be prepared a statement showing the receipts and expenses of the ayurvedic dispensary for that year.

7. In these by-laws—

“ayurvedic dispensary” means the ayurvedic dispensary established and maintained by the Committee;  
“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee; and  
“Committee” means the Village Committee of the Gandahe South village area in Patha Hewaheta in the Kandy District.
