ORDER No. 132

1. The powers specified in Column I of the Schedule hereto are hereby delegated to the officer or officers of the Department of Government Electrical Undertakings specified in Column II of that Schedule, subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) Those powers shall be exercised according to such instructions as may be issued from time to time by the Public Service Commission;
- (b) Any person dissatisfied with the decision made by an officer other than the General Manager under any powers delegated to such officer under this Order may appeal therefrom to the General Manager;
- (c) In any case where the Public Service Commission decides that any power of punishment delegated to any officer shall be exercised by the Public Service Commission, such officer shall not exercise that power in that case.

2. This order shall have effect notwithstanding anything in the Order (No. 83) made under section 61 of the Ceylon (Constitution) Order in Council, 1946, and published in Gazette No. 10,847 of October 7, 1955.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed or construed to derogate from, or to affect in any other way, the right of appeal to the Public Service Commission conferred by section 61 of the Ceylon (Constitution) Order in Council, 1946.

4. The Order No. 112 published in Gazette No. 11,465 of August 1, 1958, is hereby amended in the Schedule thereto, by the omission of the item relating to the Department of Government Electrical Undertakings.

#### THE AWARD

This is an Award under section 24 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, No. 25 of 1956, No. 14 of 1957, and No. 62 of 1957. It relates to an industrial dispute between the Ceylon Mercantile Union of 22-1/3, Baillie Street, Colombo 1, (referred to hereinafter as "the Union") on the one part and Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited, of York Street, Colombo 1; Messrs. Millers Limited of York Street, Colombo 1; and the Colombo

#### THE WAGES BOARDS ORDINANCE

Apothecaries Company Limited of York Street, Colombo 1, (all three jointly referred to hereinafter as "the respondent Companies") on the other part.

2. The Honourable the Minister of Labour, Housing and Social Services by his Order dated 24th August, 1959, made by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 4 (2) of the aforesaid Act, referred the dispute to this Court for settlement.

According to the statement dated 20th August, 1959, furnished by the Deputy Commissioner of Labour and appended to the Minister's Order, the matters in dispute between the Union and the respondent Companies are:—

(1) The payment of the Special Living Allowance of Rs. 17.50 to those employees in receipt of salaries of less than Rs. 100 per month (with retrospective effect from 1st November, 1957).

(2) Payment to married women of the Special Living Allowance payable to married employees.

3. The Union in its statement dated 9th September, 1959, filed with the Registrar of this Court avers that a dispute has arisen between the Employers' Federation of Ceylon representing Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited, Millers Limited, the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited, and Whiteaway, Laidlaw and Company Limited, on the one part and the Ceylon Mercantile Union representing the various monthly paid categories of the subordinate staffs of these Companies on the other, in regard to (a) payment of an enhanced Special Living Allowance of Rs. 17.50, with effect from 1st November, 1957, to those employees drawing basic salaries of less than Rs. 100 per month, and (b) payment to women employees who are married of the same rates of Special Living Allowances as are paid to male employees who are married.

In regard to this second matter the Union, in concluding its statement, requests "that the Court be pleased to award that married women be paid the same rates of Dearness Allowance as those paid to married men, unless their husbands are employed in the same Company and that such payment be made retrospective from 1st April, 1956."

4. The joint statement of Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited, and of the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited, dated 8th September, 1959, filed with the Registrar of this Court sets out as follows:—

(i) This dispute is only in respect of those employees in receipt of a basic salary of less than Rs. 100 per month.

In October, 1958, the two above-named Companies agreed to pay to this category of employees an enhanced Special Living Allowance, viz., Rs. 12.50 per month, with retrospective effect from 1st November, 1957, resulting in an increase of Rs. 7.50 on the special living allowance of Rs. 5 per month which was being paid to them.

(ii) The Companies declined to increase the special living allowance to Rs. 17.50 as demanded by the Union owing to particular circumstances, the chief of which is that other establishments with which the respondent Companies have to compete (a) do not pay their employees the special living allowance being demanded by the Union from the respondent Companies, and (b) do not in general practice pay their employees as much by way of basic wages.

Moreover, shortly before the demand for the increase in the special living allowance was made the respondent Companies had introduced a higher scale of basic wages. The payment of the allowance demanded would have been most uneconomic.

(iii) The offer of the special living allowance of Rs. 12.50 per month was accepted by the Union with the full knowledge of all the circumstances relating to the respondent Companies and to the increasing competition from the Pettah shops and others paying substantially lower wages. The circumstances which prevailed at the time the said offer was made have not in any way changed.

(iv) The payment of the special living allowance to married women has always been at the single rate except in those cases where the individual concerned is a widow or a divorcee with a son under the age of eighteen or an unmarried dependent daughter.

5. The statement of Messrs. Millers Limited, which is undated but has been filed with the Registrar of this Court on 9th September, 1959, is on the same lines as the statement of Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited, and the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited.

6. When this matter came up for inquiry on 17th November, 1959, Mr. P. B. Tampoe, General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union, with Miss May Wickremasuriya, Assistant Secretary, appeared for the Union, while Mr. Lyn Wirasekera of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon appeared for Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited and the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited, and Dr. Sam de Vos appeared for Messrs. Millers Limited.

7. Mr. Tampoe stated that although Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Company Limited had originally been a party to this dispute, they subsequently closed down and in connection with their closing down the Union had come into an agreement with the Employers' Federation of Ceylon that if there was any

ultimate decision on this matter involving additional payment, such payment would be duly made. Mr. Wirasekera did not contest this position. Moreover, several of the documents (e.g. R1, R2, R3 and R4) produced by Mr. Wirasekera made it quite clear that Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Company Limited were indeed one of the respondent Companies concerned in the original dispute. R1, which is a copy of the notes of a Conference held at the Department of Labour, Colombo, on 19th September, 1958, between Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited, the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited, Messrs. Millers Limited, Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Company Limited and the Ceylon Mercantile Union, contains the following paragraph:—

"Mr. Astbury, speaking on behalf of the four Companies, stated that although in the Federation's letter of 6th March, 1958, the names of three member firms had been mentioned, i.e., Millers, Cargills and Apothecaries, he had subsequently requested Mr. Tampoe by telephone that Whiteaways too should be included in the field of discussions. Mr. Tampoe agreed with this statement of Mr. Astbury."

We accordingly acquiesced in the inclusion of Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Company Limited within the scope of our inquiry as being, by implication, a virtual respondent in the present dispute. In view, however, of the conclusions we have arrived at after consideration of all the facts placed before us and in view of the circumstance that we have indicated (vide paragraph 15) 1st September, 1959, as the date with effect from which the respondent Companies should make the payment sought in the Union's first demand, Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Company Limited will in no way be affected, for by that date they had already wound up their business activities in Ceylon.

Mr. Tampoe also drew our attention to the fact that Messrs. Millers Limited, who, like Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited, the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited, and Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Company Limited, had originally been a member of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon through its constituent group known as the General Importers' and Distributors' Association, had some time subsequent to the date of the conference held at the Department of Labour, Colombo, on 19th September, 1958, resigned from the Federation. The circumstance that Mr. Lyn Wirasekera of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon was appearing for Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited and the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited, and Dr. Sam de Vos for Messrs. Millers Limited confirmed this.

8. The parties did not seek to lead any oral evidence. In making their respective submissions, however, Mr. Tampoe and Mr. Wirasekera referred to certain documents relating to the demands made by the Union and the steps taken by the parties up to the time when the matters in dispute were referred to this Court.

*Demand No. 1.*—The payment of the Special Living Allowance of Rs. 17.50 to those employees in receipt of salaries of less than Rs. 100 per month (with retrospective effect from 1st November, 1957).

9. Before we deal with the submissions made on behalf of the parties it will be convenient to deal with the relevant documentary evidence in (as far as is practicable) chronological order:—

6th March, 1958.—The Secretary of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon, writing to the General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union, confirms that all employees concerned, who at present are in receipt of special living allowances of less than Rs. 17.50 per mensem will, with effect from 1st November, 1957, receive Rs. 17.50 per mensem. Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited, the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited and Messrs. Millers Limited, however, are unable to associate themselves with the above decision.

15th March, 1958.—On this date an agreement was entered into between the All-Ceylon Commercial and Industrial Workers' Union on the one part and the respondent Companies on the other part (i) to increase, with effect from 1st January, 1958, the special living allowance paid at present by a sum of Rs. 7.50 per mensem to the workmen referred to under clause 1 (a) of the Memorandum of Agreement, and (ii) to increase by a further sum of Rs. 5 per mensem the special living allowance paid to the workmen referred to in clause 1 (a) provided that the total increase of Rs. 12.50 resulting from this agreement is extended under section 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, to apply to all the shops employing in the aggregate not fewer than ten employees. The respondent Companies also agreed to pay the van drivers employed by them a special living allowance of Rs. 12.50 per mensem as from January, 1958.

17th January, 1958.—The General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union, writing to the Secretary of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon, refers to a discussion between the General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union and the representatives of the respondent Companies and Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Company Limited. It would appear that these Companies indicated their willingness (i) to pay their employees drawing basic salaries of less than Rs. 100 a special living allowance of Rs. 12.50 instead of Rs. 17.50; and (ii) to pay bachelors and married women drawing salaries of between Rs. 100 and Rs. 150 the special living allowance of Rs. 17.50.

The Ceylon Mercantile Union had agreed to consider this suggestion in view of the Companies' contention that they were unable to pay those drawing under Rs. 100 a special living allowance of Rs. 17.50 since, in granting increased basic salaries with arrears, they had already incurred an enhanced financial burden.

This letter categorically states that the Union has not been able, so far, to satisfy itself as to the current financial position of the Companies concerned, and adds that one of the Companies, viz., Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Company Limited has published its intention to close down.

A request is made that pending a final settlement all the Companies should pay their employees a special living allowance on the basis suggested, with arrears from 1st November, 1957.

29th July, 1958.—The Secretary of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon, writing to the General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union, informs him that the respondent Companies and Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Company Limited have agreed to pay the enhanced special living allowance in accordance with their offer as set out in the Union's letter of 17th July, 1958, referred to above. Such payment is to be made with retrospective effect from 1st January, 1958. These offers are made subject to their being accepted without reservation and in final settlement of the matters referred to in the Union's letter of 17th July, 1958. Payment of arrears is to be made within one month of the Union signifying its acceptance of the terms of this offer.

12th August, 1958.—The General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union, writing to the Secretary of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon, refuses to accept the agreement without reservation concerning the future. This letter explains that these Companies have merely pleaded incapacity to pay those drawing under Rs. 100 the full increase of Rs. 12.50 in their "present financial circumstances."

19th September, 1958.—On this date there was a conference (presided over by Mr. N. L. Abeywira, Deputy Commissioner of Labour) at the Department of Labour, Colombo, between the respondent Companies and Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Company Limited on the one side and the Ceylon Mercantile Union on the other. The notes of the conference prepared by the Chairman clarify the dispute between the Union and the Companies in question.

Mr. Astbury on behalf of the Companies has referred to the financial incapacity of the Companies to meet the demand for Rs. 17.50 and to the competition they have to meet from other firms doing similar business. Reference is made also to certain discussions held in the office of Sir Chittampalam Gardiner when an agreement appears to have been reached that if the Union was prepared to organise the staffs of the competitors of these Companies and ensure that such competitors were required to pay the Rs. 17.50, then the respondent Companies and Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Company Limited too would be prepared to pay the Rs. 17.50 with effect from 1st January, 1958.

Mr. Tampoe, who represented the Union at the conference concerned, is recorded as having stated that he had already begun to organise the staffs of some of the firms who were competitors of the four Companies in question but the Union was not willing that the implementation of the offer made by the Employers' Federation of Ceylon should be deferred until that was done.

2nd October, 1958.—The Secretary of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon, writing to the General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union, confirms the Federation's earlier offer as set out in the Union's letter dated 17th July, 1958.

22nd October, 1958.—The General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union, writing to the Secretary of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon, intimates that the offer made in the Federation's letter of 2nd October, 1958, is unacceptable to the Union.

5th November, 1958.—The General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union, writing to the Secretary of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon, states that the Union understands that the special living allowance in terms of the offer contained in the Federation's letter of 2nd October, 1958, has been paid. The Union confirms that the payment will be accepted without prejudice to the claims already made.

5th December, 1958.—The Secretary of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon, writing to the General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union, confirms that the arrears of the enhanced special living allowance will be paid for the period 1st November, 1957 to 30th September, 1958.

10. Mr. Wirasekera on behalf of Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited and the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited, made the following submissions on the first matter in dispute:—

(i) That the General Importers' and Distributors' Association, comprising Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited, Messrs. Millers Limited, the Colombo Apothecaries' Company Limited, and Messrs. Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Company Limited, had been expressly excluded from the Canekaratne Award; that the salary scales which were made applicable by that Award did not apply to the four aforementioned Companies; that the Court should not seek to compare the General Importers' and Distributors' Association either with the rest of the mercantile sector or with

the Government; that the General Importers' and Distributors' Association should be considered separately; and that the Union had accepted this position.

(ii) That at a conference held under the chairmanship of the Deputy Commissioner of Labour, Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited and the Colombo Apothecaries' Company Limited had agreed to an increase, in respect of employees receiving a basic salary of Rs. 100 and below, to Rs. 12.50 only owing to (a) the financial implications of such a payment and (b) the fact that their competitors were not paying anything like the basic wages these firms were paying.

It was submitted that the Union had accepted it at that time with a full knowledge and realisation of the circumstances under which these companies were unable to grant the increase demanded and that those circumstances had not in any way changed since 1958, when this offer was made by the Companies.

(iii) That Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited and the Colombo Apothecaries' Company Limited were willing to pay the special living allowance of Rs. 17.50 if the Union would satisfy them that comparable firms in the Pettah and elsewhere were paying this allowance.

(iv) That if this Court were to award the special living allowance of Rs. 17.50 demanded by the Union, the agreement contained in R5 between the All-Ceylon Commercial and Industrial Workers' Union and the respondent Companies would be negated as these Companies had agreed to pay a further sum of Rs. 5 per mensem over and above the increase of Rs. 7.50 provided that the total increase of Rs. 12.50 was extended, under the provisions of section 10 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, to apply to all shops employing in the aggregate not fewer than ten employees.

(v) That a survey conducted by the Department of Labour in 1953 revealed that out of two hundred and four Pettah shops only fifteen paid the cost of living allowance; and that the average salary of the clerical grade in the Pettah shops was Rs. 81.75 and of the sales grade Rs. 78.35.

(vi) That if this Court had first to be satisfied with the facts of the case before an award was made, the burden of satisfying the Court lay on the Union.

(vii) That the demanded increase in the special living allowance would cost approximately Rs. 36,000. The Companies would in consequence have to raise the prices of their articles by a few cents.

11. Dr. Sam de Vos, who appeared on behalf of Messrs. Millers Limited, had nothing to add to the statement already filed except to state that however desirous the Company was of paying the special living allowance of Rs. 17.50 asked for, the financial position did not warrant it. He stated that the shareholders had been paid a dividend of only 3 per cent. the previous year and that the Managing Director was working for nothing so as to give the employees a job. He also stated that he would abide by the decision of this Court.

12. Mr. Tampoe, who appeared for the Union, made the following submissions:—

(1) That with regard to the alleged financial incapacity, the Union had looked into the Balance Sheet of Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited and found that the Company had made a more or less handsome profit even by the standard of the shareholders; that Mr. Wirasekera on behalf of Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited and the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited had conceded that they were willing to pay the special living allowance of Rs. 17.50 if the comparable firms were paying this allowance.

(ii) That it was not the function of the Ceylon Mercantile Union to even out the competition which the respondent Companies were meeting from their rivals, but the Union had nevertheless made an attempt to organise the employees in the Pettah firms and had to some extent succeeded. For instance the Sindhi Merchants' Association had agreed to give, with arrears from November, 1957, an increase of Rs. 17.50 on whatever salaries their employees were drawing. They had also agreed to grant an annual bonus of an amount equivalent to one month's salary.

(iii) That the Government being the best employer in the country and the Government having recognised the need to increase the special living allowance to Rs. 17.50, employers in the private sector should follow suit unless they could satisfy the Court that granting the request for the full Rs. 17.50 would so seriously damage their financial position that their very business would be jeopardised.

(iv) That the mere fact that in relation to an adjustment of salaries in 1956 which had been brought about by the Canekaratne Award in other mercantile firms they had also adjusted salaries, should not by itself be accepted as justifying their refusal to grant this increase.

(v) That Mr. Wirasekera's submission that the Ceylon Mercantile Union had accepted the special living allowance at Rs. 12.50 with a full knowledge and realisation of the circumstances under



which the Companies were unable to grant the demanded increase was incorrect; and that the letter of the Ceylon Mercantile Union dated 17th July, 1958, showed that the Union had continued this dispute.

(vi) That the Ceylon Mercantile Union had not pressed the Companies in question to adopt the Canekaratne Award as they were department stores unlike the tea export and other like Companies; that after the Canekaratne Award however the Union had negotiated with the General Importers' and Distributors' Association and that the latter had agreed to give a proportionate increase on the existing wage scale; and that although the Union was not satisfied, it had left the matter open to be pursued further.

(vii) That the special living allowance must be paid in every establishment irrespective of the actual level of wages in that establishment.

(viii) That the class of employees in Messrs. Gargills (Ceylon) Limited, Messrs. Millers Limited, and the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited was not quite the same as the class of employees in the smaller Pettah firms to which they referred. The latter were of a lower social stratum maintaining a lower standard of living.

(ix) That the submission made by Mr. Wirasekera that the burden of paying an increased special living allowance should be shared by the competitors of the respondent Companies was untenable. An employer could not say: "Till society develops to the state where a number of others are also brought to my standard, I am not going to pay."

13. Mr. J. C. Hatch, who appeared for the Union on 20th February, 1960, submitted that it was not for the Employers' Federation of Ceylon to raise the question of the disparity of wages between their firms and the Pettah firms—something which had been in existence for so many years. In January, 1959, the Union had been able to obtain an increase of Rs. 17.50 on the salaries of practically 80 per cent. of the firms in the Pettah. The conditions asked for by Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited and the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited had thus been met.

14. The fact that the respondent Companies were excluded from the Canekaratne Award which made certain adjustments in the salary scales of those mercantile establishments which were members of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon, does not appear to us to be a sufficient reason *per se* for the exclusion of the respondent Companies from the payment of the increased special living allowance demanded by the Union.

Moreover, since the Canekaratne Award the salary scales of the respondent Companies have been stepped up. The fact that there is a difference in the basic salaries paid by the Companies which were parties to the Canekaratne Award on the one hand and the Companies which were excluded on the other, should not be a determining factor in considering the question of granting a living allowance to an employee. The Government has, after due deliberation, fixed the special living allowance at Rs. 17.50. In fixing this figure the cost of living prevalent in the country would have been the guiding factor. The Employers' Federation of Ceylon adopted this figure, as would appear from the Federation's letter dated 6th March, 1958, addressed to the Ceylon Mercantile Union. Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited, Messrs. Millers Limited and the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited were, however, unable to associate themselves with the decision of the Federation.

Mr. Wirasekera has submitted that Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited and the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited, for whom he appeared, would be willing to pay the Rs. 17.50 asked for by the Union if the competitor firms would pay this allowance. Dr. Sam de Vos has submitted that, however desirous Messrs. Millers Limited were of paying this allowance, their financial position does not warrant it.

No evidence has been led with regard to the financial position of the respondent Companies except Mr. Wirasekera's reference to the Award in I.D. 145 and 155, wherein reference is made to the financial position of Messrs. Millers Limited and Cargills (Ceylon) Limited in 1958.

We are of the opinion that the reference in that Award is not wholly relevant to the present dispute. For one thing, the respondents in I. D. 145 and I. D. 155 were Messrs. Millers Limited and Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited whereas in the present dispute the respondents are Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited, Messrs. Millers Limited and the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited. For another, the Award in I. D. 145 and 155, relating as it did to disputes referred to the Industrial Court early in 1959, very properly dealt with the financial position of the two Companies in question up to the end of 1958, whereas in the present dispute what would be even more material is information as to the financial position of each of the respondent Companies in 1959.

Mr. Wirasekera has argued that the burden of proving the financial position of the respondent Companies rests with the Union. His submission appears to be that the Union has averred the financial capacity of these Companies to make the payment demanded and therefore the Union has to establish

such averment. We are unable to agree. The defence of financial incapacity has been taken by the Companies. Besides, the precise financial position of the Companies is a matter well within their knowledge, and we are of the opinion that the onus of proving it rests on the Companies and that this onus they have failed to discharge.

The fact that the Employers' Federation of Ceylon stepped up the special living allowance to Rs. 17.50 shows that the private sector coming within the purview of the Federation accepted the Government rate as just and reasonable. The dissociation of Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited, Messrs. Millers Limited and the Colombo Apothecaries Company, Limited was due to the stand taken by them that their financial position did not permit such increase. In fact Dr. De Vos expressed this very tersely. In these circumstances, Mr. Wirasekera's submission that the Union has to discharge the burden of proving the financial capacity of these Companies is neither reasonable nor practicable.

Mr. Wirasekera's submission that the Companies' competitors, particularly in the Pettah, pay their employees very much less by way of basic wages needs consideration. It would appear from the correspondence before us that the Union appreciated this difference and agreed to organise the Staffs in the Pettah firms.

Both Mr. Tampoe and Mr. Hatch have submitted that the Union made every effort to do so and was successful in about 80% of the firms in that sector. In fact the Sindhi Merchants' Association not only granted an increase of Rs. 17.50 on the basic salaries but also granted an annual bonus.

It is our view that this comparison with the Pettah firms has been over-stressed. We can take judicial notice of the conditions in the Fort and in the Pettah and we entirely agree with Mr. Tampoe that the employees at Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited, Messrs. Millers Limited and the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited fall into a higher category than the employees in the Pettah firms in the standard of living they have to maintain.

Mr. Wirasekera has submitted that if the increase is allowed, the respondent Companies will be constrained to increase the price of articles by a few cents. He conceded that already their prices are about a rupee or fifty cents higher than in the Pettah. This concession is a clear admission that these Companies in the Fort cater for a type of customer who would not mind the extra rupee or fifty cents.

It strikes us as being far-fetched to plead that a few cents' increase in the price of an article specifically introduced for the purpose of supporting the payment of an increased special living allowance to the employees in these Companies will drive their customers to the Pettah. We are of opinion that it would be most uncharitable of this Court to pass such a verdict on the customers of these Companies. On the contrary when the employees of these Companies have the satisfaction of earning the same special living allowance as is drawn by the employees of the other members of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon, they will, we feel certain, give of their best to the customers served by them.

Mr. Wirasekera has stressed that the Union accepted the respondent Companies' offer of Rs. 12.50 and that the present demand is a negation of a "gentlemen's agreement." We have gone through the correspondence made available to us and we have come to the conclusion that the Union at no time accepted the offer of Rs. 12.50 unreservedly. The letters sent by the Union have been quite consistent on this point.

Mr. Wirasekera has drawn our attention to the Agreement of 15th March, 1958, between the All-Ceylon Commercial and Industrial Workers' Union and the respondent Companies. The Ceylon Mercantile Union has not been a party to this Agreement, so that we fail to see how it can bind that Union.

15. We have given our careful consideration to all the submissions *pro* and *contra* in respect of the Union's first demand and we have come to the conclusion that that demand should be granted with retrospective effect from 1st September, 1959.

Mr. Wirasekera's reference to the Award in I. D. 145 and 155, wherein the financial position in 1958 of two of the present respondent Companies is adverted to, has to a large extent been responsible for making us feel that it would not be fair to fix 1st November, 1957 (the date specified in the Union's demand) as the date with effect from which the full special living allowance of Rs. 17.50 per mensem should be paid. The Union would appear to have for the first time raised the issue of the special living allowance of Rs. 17.50 on 6th March, 1958, and this would have been a fair date from which to pay the enhanced special living allowance, but since, according to the Award in I. D. 145 and 155, the financial position of at least two of the three Companies now concerned was unfavourable, we have had to look for a later date. We find that the Honourable the Minister of Labour referred the present dispute to this Court on 24th August, 1959. Since no evidence of any kind has been placed before us about the financial position of the respondent Companies in 1959, we have thought it not unfair to fix as the effective date the first day of the month immediately following the month in which the Honourable the Minister of Labour referred the dispute to this Court for settlement.

*Demand No. 2—Payment to married women of the Special Living Allowance payable to married employees.*

16. The documentary evidence (arranged chronologically) relating to this demand is as follows:—

(i) The Notes (dated 24th September, 1958) of a conference held at the Department of Labour, Colombo, on 19th September, 1958 between Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited, Messrs. Millers Limited, the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited, and Whiteaway, Laidlaw & Company Limited, on the one side and the Ceylon Mercantile Union on the other, record—

- (a) Mr. Tampoe, for the Union, as having mentioned that “ a new issue had arisen concerning the married women in that the Union found that these shops had failed to pay married women the married allowance; ” and
- (b) Mr. Astbury, for the Employers' Federation of Ceylon, as having refused to discuss at that conference “ a new issue of which no notice had been given.”

Mr. Tampoe however gave notice at the conference of the demand the Union was making, viz.: “ that married women be paid the married rate of special living allowance, except where their husbands are also working in the same establishment, in which case, whichever of the two draws the higher salary be paid the special living allowance appropriate to the married rate of special living allowance to that salary ” (*sic*). Mr. Astbury requested the Union to write to the Federation giving full particulars of the demand. Mr. Tampoe, agreeing to do so, stated that if no settlement was possible with the Federation, the Union would wish to take up the demand and the earlier one for the special living allowance of Rs. 17.50 before one and the same Industrial Court.

(ii) The General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union, writing to the Secretary of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon on 22nd October, 1958, enquires whether the four companies concerned are prepared to pay married women the special living allowance payable to married employees except where husband and wife are employed by one and the same employer, in which case the Union requests that the special living allowance be paid at the married rate to the employee who is in receipt of the higher basic salary.

(iii) The General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union, writing to the Secretary of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon on 5th November, 1958, refers to the letter of 22nd October, 1958 and to a telephone conversation which Mr. Astbury had with him concerning that letter, and asks for an early reply to the request set out in paragraph 3 of that letter (*vide* (ii) above).

(iv) The Secretary of the Employers' Federation of Ceylon, writing to the General Secretary of the Ceylon Mercantile Union on 5th December, 1958, states that the four Companies concerned “ are not prepared to vary the basis upon which the special living allowance is calculated in favour of married women ” and confirms that “ this will continue to be paid at the single rate except in those cases where the individual concerned is a widow or divorcee with a son under the age of eighteen or an unmarried dependent daughter. ”

17. Mr. Tampoe, for the Union, made the following submissions relating to this demand:—

(i) That the Union had quite accidentally discovered that married women employees were not being paid the same rates of dearness allowance by these Companies as were being paid to married men. He cited an instance where the husband and the wife were both employed at Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited; the husband drawing a higher salary than the wife. In that instance the Company gave the wife the married allowance but not the husband. This they did because she was drawing the smaller salary. After negotiation by the Union, the Company paid the married allowance to the husband.

(ii) That in that connection it was found that the respondent Companies were paying married women the bachelor rate.

(iii) That in the Government service if the husband and the wife are both employed under the Government the married rate of dearness allowance is calculated according to the salary of whichever spouse is drawing the higher salary and the amount of allowance so calculated is divided equally between the spouses. If, however, one spouse is employed under the Government and the other is not, the one working under the Government receives the married rate irrespective of the question whether the other spouse is working somewhere else and is drawing the special living allowance or not. The principle would thus appear to be that if husband and wife are working under the same employer, then that employer legitimately considers it fair to pay at the married rate on the salary payable to the one drawing the higher salary and divide it equally.

(iv) That in the mercantile service the practice seems to be variable. In some of the Companies represented in the Employers' Federation of Ceylon married women are paid at the married rate if the husbands are not employed in the same Company.

(v) That the respondent Companies should follow the same practice because (a) the accepted principle in every modern country is “ equal pay for equal work ”; and (b) if a married

man receives the special living allowance at the married rate irrespective of whether his wife is employed elsewhere and is drawing an allowance, there is no reason why a married woman should not get the special living allowance at the married rate irrespective of whether her husband is employed elsewhere and gets an allowance at the married rate or not.

(vi) That if both spouses work in the same Company, the Government service principle should be followed.

(vii) That there are quite a number of married women whose husbands are not employed or, if employed, are not drawing the same rate of pay as the wife in some other establishment.

(viii) That married women in employment fall into two categories, viz. (a) women who, being married and finding it difficult to make ends meet, decide to take up employment; and (b) women who, being already employed, subsequently marry and continue in employment so as to support the family. In either case the married woman in employment should be treated on a par with the married male employee.

18. Mr. Hatch, who appeared for the Union on 20th February, 1960, submitted.

(i) That where both husband and wife are employed in the same establishment, the Union was willing to accept Mr. Wirasekera's submission to the Court [*vide* paragraph 19 (ii)] that the practice in the Government service should be adopted.

(ii) That where a married woman is employed in an establishment, she should be paid the married rate irrespective of whether her husband is employed elsewhere. He stated that in the Government service if there was a married woman and her husband was employed in the mercantile sector, they would both be enjoying the married rate. In the same way if some of the employees of Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited were married women they should be paid the married allowance irrespective of whether their husbands get married allowances elsewhere.

(iii) That there may be cases where the husband is unemployed, and yet the wife gets only the bachelors' rate of allowance notwithstanding her husband's being out of employment.

(iv) That women go out to earn for themselves and it is for the employer to grant them the allowances they are entitled to.

(v) That it is up to the employer Company concerned to investigate each case and, where husband and wife are both employed in the same establishment, pay them in accordance with the practice obtaining in the Government service.

19. Mr. Wirasekera, for Messrs. Cargills (Ceylon) Limited and the Colombo Apothecaries Company Limited, made the following submissions:—

(i) That the position has always been that the married allowance is only paid to a woman employee if she is a widow or divorcee with a son under the age of eighteen or an unmarried dependent daughter. He referred to Treasury Circular No. 47/1/51 (ET/DE) 461 of 28th November, 1950.

(ii) That if both husband and wife are employed in the Government service, only one is paid the special living allowance.

(iii) That in mercantile firms the married man gets the full married rate and the wife the single rate (a benefit which the wife in the Government service would not get).

(iv) That a change in the present practice of the respondent Companies is not justified.

(v) That the present practice in the private sector is more favourable than that obtaining in the Government service and that, on representations made by the Ceylon Mercantile Union and all other Unions in the private sector, private employers adopted it.

(vi) That if the Government service principle of payment is adopted, the Government service procedure too should be adopted.

(vii) That whereas in some of the mercantile establishments one would find only one or two ladies working as telephone operators or one or two as stenographers, in the establishments of the respondent Companies a large majority of the working staff comprise ladies employed as sales assistants and so forth. Thus the innovation asked for by the Union in regard to the special living allowance payable to married women employers would impose an additional financial burden on the respondent Companies.

(iii) That sometimes there may be a professional man who has his wife working under one of the respondent Companies and that, just because the husband does not get a special living allowance, the lady will have to be paid the special living allowance at the married rate irrespective of her husband's income.

20. Where a married woman and her husband are both employed in the same establishment, the respondent Companies' existing practice of paying the husband the special living allowance at the married rate and the wife the special living allowance at the bachelor rate would seem to be eminently reasonable and fair. Since, however, Mr. Hatch expressed

before us the Union's willingness to accept Mr. Wirasekera's submission that where both husband and wife are employed in one and the same Company they should be dealt with in the way the Government has prescribed in the Treasury Circular referred to above, it is open to the Union to take the matter up with the respondent Companies either direct or through the Employers' Federation of Ceylon and negotiate the adoption, *mutatis mutandis*, of the practice prescribed in paragraph 4 (a) of that Circular, viz.,

"In the case of married officers where both husband and wife would be eligible for the 'Special Living Allowance' only one allowance at the rate for married officers should be paid on the salary or pension which gives the higher special living allowance, and divided equally between the two officers and/or pensioner (*sic*)."

We do not think it necessary that we should issue a directive or recommendation on this matter.

Where a married woman employee is a widow or a divorcee with a son under the age of eighteen or an unmarried dependent daughter, the respondent Companies' prevailing practice of paying such married woman employee the special living allowance at the full married rate is entirely consonant with the practice prevailing in the Government service (vide paragraph 4 (b) of the Treasury Circular already referred to) and, being entirely just and equitable, is quite acceptable to the Union.

It is only where a married woman employee in any of the respondent Companies has a husband either employed elsewhere, whether in the Government service or in the private sector, or is unemployed, or (as Mr. Wirasekera pointed out) is a professional man and therefore is not in receipt of the special living allowance, that the Union urged that such married woman

employee should be paid the special living allowance at the full married rate. And it is just here that the Union and the respondent Companies diverged most sharply in their points of view.

Although, on a consideration of all the submissions made by the Union, we do feel that a married woman employee whose husband is not employed or, being employed, is not in receipt of the special living allowance at the married rate or is in receipt of a lower salary than his wife's or though a professional man, earns but a meagre income, deserves to be paid the special living allowance at the married rate, nevertheless we are satisfied that these are circumstances which in practice it is very difficult and irksome to check with the necessary degree of accuracy. Accordingly we have regretfully decided to make order refusing this demand.

21. In conclusion we direct that all arrears of the special living allowance, calculated at the rate of Rs. 17.50 per mensem with retrospective effect from 1st September, 1959, which became payable consequent on our award on the first matter in dispute, shall be paid to all the employees concerned, viz., those in receipt of salaries of less than Rs. 100 per mensem, within four weeks of the date of publication of this award in *The Ceylon Government Gazette*.
