The Award

This is an award under section 17 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, No. 25 of 1956, No. 14 of 1957, and No. 62 of 1957. It relates to a dispute between the Democratic Workers' Congress, 213/2, Main Street, Colombo 11 (hereinafter referred to as the "Union") and the Superintendent of Ambatenne Estate, Bandarawela (hereinafter referred to as " Employer ").

- 2. By virtue of the powers vested in him by section 3 (1) (d) of the aforesaid Act, the Deputy Commissioner of Labour, by his Order dated 30th January, 1960, referred to me for settlement by arbitration an industrial dispute between the said parties. The matter in dispute between the parties as set out in his statement of the same date is "whether the nonemployment of Karupannan and his wife Perumaie, by the Superintendent of Ambatenne Estate, Bandaraweia, is justified and to what relief they are enuitled ".
- 3. The matter was taken up for inquiry on 23.6.60—continued on 24.6.60 and concluded on 5.8.60.
- 4. Mr. Advocate S. P. Amerasingham instructed by Mr. M. P. Sunderam appeared for the Union and Mr. Advocate S. Sri Nandalochena instructed by Mr. C. G. Jayasuriya, appeared for the Employer.
- 5. According to the evidence of Karupannan, he was working elsewhere and in 1955 came over to Ambatenne Estate when his parents were away in India on a suggestion made by his brother who apparently wanted Karupannan to be somewhere. close to him. It would also appear that at the time he joined Ambatenne Estate there was no trouble whatever between him and Abraham the Clerk of the Estate. If at all, it was the other way about. Abraham was we'l disposed towards him and somewhat helpful in the matter of securing employment on the estate; but later towards the latter part of 1958, according to Karupannan, there was a definite misunderstanding between himself and the Clerk over some cheetu transaction, the latter refusing to pay him a fairly large sum of money due to him. When Karupannan threatened to bring this matter to the notice of the estate authorities, Abraham the Clerk-Conductor falsely and maliciously made this accusation against Karupannan that he had aimed a large stone at him on the 13th November, 1958, whilst the Clerk-Conductor was on his way to muster that morning. Karupannan denies all knowledge of this alleged incident and also states that no proper inquiry was held by the Superintendent. No doubt he was summoned by the Superintendent to the office on the following day—but he had no opportunity of cross-examining Abraham and his witnesses, and further he was given no chance of leading evidence, though he told the Superintendent that he was ready with his witnesses. The Superintendent found him guilty and ordered him to leave the estate. This shortly is the version of the story as related by Karupannan and his witness Suppiah.
- 6. On the other hand, on behalf of the employer, it was contended that Karupannan was an unsatisfactory and troublesome person who was inclined to be rather boisterous after a few drinks. He had ample opportunity of behaving in this manner because of the rivalry between two trade unions on the estate. It would appear that there were two separate unions functioning on the estate and there were frequent fights in the lines between the supporters of the two unions.—So much so that the Superintendent found it necessary to take some kind of action in the matter. On receiving representations from one of the Unions, the Superintendent sent for Karupannan on 12th November and in the presence of the Clerk-Conductor directed Karupannan to move into some other line room where he could live peaceably with his own union members, away from the members of the rival union. Karupannan, however, thought that this was the work of the Clerk-Conductor and turned very nasty and abusive to the latter. The Superintendent' did not, however, take immediate action against Karupannan for his

unseemly conduct in his presence—and this was followed by the stone-throwing incident on the 13th morning about 6.30 when Abraham the Clerk-Conductor was on his way to muster. This happened néar his house and the stone which was fairly large fell quite close to where he stood. Abraham was able to recognize the assailant; apart from that, Karupannan before he threw the stone addressed him and said that he was going to kill him. He was thoroughly frightened—turned back and rushed up the steps leading to his house he called for his nephew Anthony, also known as Nadarajah. On his being informed of what had happened, he started chasing Karupannan; but Abraham advised his nephew to proceed to Church as he intended to do, making him understand that Abraham would make his complaint to the Superintendent. Anthony thereupon proceeded to Church, whilst Abraham, after spending a few minutes at home, went to the office and then to the Superintendent's bungalow where he made his complaint to Mr. Herft-the Superintendent. He was advised to make an entry at the Police Station, Mr. Herft undertaking to look into the matter himself later. Abraham then proceeded to the muster . which was late by 10 or 15 minutes that morning. Karupannan himself was present at the muster that morning. Nothing very much happened on the complaint made by Abraham to the Police on the 13th morning, since there was no injury caused as a result of the stone being thrown. The police left the matter to be looked into by the Superintendent. The inquiry by the Superintendent took place on the 14th morning at the office, Karupannan having been informed of it at the muster. The Superintendent states in his evidence that Karupannan attended the inquiry with his Thalaivar, S. Suppiah, and that Karupannan was asked if he had any witnesses, to which he said he had none. The complainant made his statement followed by his witnesses Anthony, Palaniandy Kangany and Shanmugan Kangany. No questions were put to them by Karupannan. As a matter of fact he said he had no questions to ask. On the conclusion of the inquiry the Superintendent did not terminate the services of Karupannan then and there. He took a little time to think over it and decided on 17.11 to send him away. Karupannan was away at the Hospital on that day, and ultimately he was dismissed on 24.11. But Karupannan actually left the estate on 30.3.59 after the Superintendent obtained a writ of ejectment.

- 7. A point has been made of the somewhat unsatisfactory way in which the inquiry by the Superintendent was conducted. It would appear that the statements were first taken down by the Superintendent in pencil on different sheets of paper which were later passed on to the Clerk-Conductor who in this particular case happened to be the complainant to be copied down in ink in the Inquiry Book. In so copying down into the book the Clerk-Conductor had not fo'lowed the order in which the statements were made. He had also made a number of mistakes which the Superintendent stated he had corrected the same day after reference to the pencil notes made by him. The Superintendent in explanation stated that he had not much experience in conducting these inquiries, this being the first labour inquiry on the estate. But Karupannan himself admitted that he had no grouse against the Superintendent who according to him had a very high sense of duty and fair play.
- 8. It may be correct that there was room for improvement in the manner in which the inquiry was held, but it cannot be said that any real injustice resulted owing to the particular way in which it was held. That peculiarity was purely due to lack of experience and ignorance of the methods usually adopted in such inquiries, and nothing more.
- 9. I am satisfied on the evidence of Abraham, which evidence has been corroborated by Anthony, that on the 13th November, Karupannan did aim a stone at Abraham, though unsuccessfully, in the manner related by Abraham—the motive being the conclusion he came to after being present at the inquiry on 12th November that it was the Clerk-Conductor who was responsible for having him shifted from one line to another. I cannot accept as correct that the stone-throwing incident was a mere fabrication by Abraham who refused to pay Karupannan what was due to him on a cheetu transaction. No attempt was made by the Union to prove that there was this cheetu arrangement on which any money was due to Karupannan. In R. 1, a letter written by the Union to the Superintendent in this connection, it was stated that money was due from the Clerk to Karupannan as a loan. There is not a word about cheetu. Further, I was not at all impressed with the manner in which Karupannan gave evidence, particularly where he tried to make out that Mr. Herft could not speak or understand Tamil; ultimately he went back on this statement. And, on this point, we have Suppiah's evidence that he always speaks to the Superintendent in Tamil.

In my opinion no credence could be placed on Karupannan's evidence.

- 10. In the circumstances I hold that the non-employment of Karupannan by the Superintendent of Ambatenne Estate is justified and it therefore follows that the non-employment of his wife Perumaie, is also justified, and I further hold that they are not entitled to any relief.
- I make award accordingly which I think is just and equitable.

The Award

THIS is an award under section 17 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, No. 25 of 1956, No. 14 of 1957 and No. 62 of 1957.

- 2. This dispute was referred to me for settlement by the Honourable the Minister of Labour by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 4 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950. The matter in dispute, as specified by the Deputy Commissioner of Labour is—
- "Whether the non-employment of Jamis Singho, Bempi Singho and Martin Singho by the Superintendent of Mahalla Group, Waharaka, is justified and to what relief each of the said workers is entitled."
- 3. The Ceylon Workers' Congress (hereinafter referred to as "the Union") was represented by Mr. Advocate S. P. Amerasingham, instructed by Mr. M. P. Sunderam, Legal Secretary of the Union, and the Superintendent of Mahalla Group, Waharaka (hereinafter referred to as "the Superintendent"), was represented by Mr. S. Sharvandan instructed by Mr. K. Pethiyagoda.
- 4. The Superintendent in his statement dated 28th November, 1958, and submitted as required by Regulation 21 (i) of the Industrial Disputes Regulations of 1950, gave the following reasons for the non-employment of the three workers concerned:—
 - (i) Jamis Singho—(a) "He was tapping from time to time. He does not turn up for work (1) regularly."; (b) "(2) His tapping was unsatisfactory and a lot of trees were damaged," and (c) "(3) He was offered sundry work, and has not turned up for work."
- (ii) Bempi Singho—" Not fit for work owing to very old age."
- (iii) Martin Singho—(a) "Was given sundry work on the estate and left of his own accord to better his prospects;" (b) "He is also an I. R. C., if we are not mistaken."
- 5. The Union in its statement dated 28th November, 1959, maintained that these dismissals were wrongful and unjustified, and asked for "the reinstatement of these three workers and payment of back wages."
- 6. Mr. Amerasingham opened the case for the Union and made his submissions, the gist of which is as follows:—

Mahalla Group became the property of the present proprietors in about 1952. Jamis Singho is the son-in-law of Bempi Singho, and Martin Singho is the latter's son. (Later, in the course of the inquiry it was admitted by both parties to this dispute that Jamis Singho was the son-in-law not of Bempi Singho, but of a brother of his). In February, 1958, the Union wrote to the Superintendent informing him that there were members of it who were workers in his estate and asked for his permission to hold a meeting in the estate for the purpose of electing office-bearers, but permission was not granted. (The Superintendent denied that he received such a letter). Nevertheless, the branch Union of this estate held a meeting and elected its office-bearers of whom Jamis Singho was the Vice-President. Bempi Singho

took an active part in the formation of the branch Union. Subsequently, the branch Union addressed the Superintendent on certain matters of discontent among the workers on the estate and followed its representations with a deputation composed of Jamis Singho and a few other workers to the Superintendent on two specific matters namely, a name-board and the rice ration books of the Sinhalese workers who were not resident in the estate. The name-board was meant to tell the workers the quantity of latex collected and brought in daily by each of the tappers and entered agains, his or her name in the book maintained by the estate for the purpose. Bempi Singho was discontinued with effect from 16th September, 1958, and both Jamis Singho and Martin Singho were discontinued two days later with effect from 18th September, 1958. These three workers were picked out for discontinuance in order to be victimised although the Union would not put forward victimisation as a plea in this instance. Written notices of discontinuance were not served on these workers and no inquiry was held prior to their discontinuance. They were thus denied the opportunity to submit their explanations in regard to the charges preferred against them. The Superintendent took up the position that Jamis Singho and Bempi Singho were not members of the Union, but yet he gave three reasons for their discontinuance, to the Ceylon Workers' Congress. The matter was then referred to the Labour Officer at Avissawella, and after some protracted correspondence an inquiry was fixed for 1.2.59, by the Labour Department, but the Superintendent did not turn up for this inquiry although the Union representative and the Labour Officer were present. Consequently a second inquiry was fixed for 21.4.59. As the Superintendent then took up the position that he had nothing to do with the matter, an ex parte inquiry was held by the Labour Officer. The Superintendent had given different reasons at different times for the discontinuance of these three workers. The Union prayed for the reinstatement of all three workers and also payment of full wages due to them for the period of their non-employment.

The Democratic Workers' Union, another union of workers on plantations, had two separate disputes with the same proprietor (I. D. 198 and W 105/1004) concerning the dismissal of some workers and the finding was that those dismissals were acts of victimisation and the order was made that the workers concerned be reinstated and paid full back wages.

- 7. Mr. Sharvanandan, on behalf of the Superintendent added the further reason of insubordination for the discontinuance of Bempi Singho, the main reason as he described it, "that he abused the Superintendent of the estate in the presence of workers because he was pulled up for bad tapping and wounding rubber trees". In the case of Jamis Singho, Mr. Sharvanandan maintained that he was not discontinued but was offered sundry work on 18th September, 1958, without loss of pay, which offer he refused to accept and left of his own accord. Mr. Sharvanandan also added two further reasons, namely, (1) "Sending his cattle and causing damage to the plantation in spite of being warned not to do so "; and (2) "Jamis is a bad-tempered person and he is also guilty of abusing the Superintendent ''. Subsequently, Mr. Sharvanandan also stated that Jamis Singho was suspended for three days for being "drunk and disorderly, and that after suspension he did not turn up for work."
- 8. Mr. Amerasingham cited: (i) Mr. W. Arthur Silva the Labour Officer who dealt with this case until it was referred to this Court, and (ii) Jamis Singho, (iii) Bempi Singho and (iv) Martin Singho, the three discontinued workers. Mr. Sharvanandan cited two workers from the estate, namely, (i) Velloo and (ii) Manuel Gopal, and also (iii) the Superintendent Mr. S. Wijesuriya, and (iv) the Conductor of the estate Mr. S. M. Thangavelu (hereinafter referred to as "the conductor").
- 9. The non-employment of Bempi Singho who was discontinued first, i.e., on 16th September, 1958, two days before the other two workers were discontinued, will be considered first. The only reason given by the Superintendent for the nonemployment of this worker, in his statement submitted as required by Regulation 21 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Regulations of 1958, was that he was not fit for work owing to very old age. The manifestation of the weakness of this worker consequent on 'very old age' was alleged to have taken two forms. One was wounding of trees while tapping them, and the other was collecting latex daily below normal. The conductor suggested in his evidence that this worker Bempi Singho might have wounded rubber trees because his brother's son-in-law, Jamis Singho, had been stopped from meter-reading work. This is in conflict with the Superintendent's standpoint that wounding of rubber trees by Bempi Singho was due to his old age, to his unsteady hand and bad eyesight.

In the first place, according to Bempi Singho, his age was 57 years at the time of his discontinuance, and this was not disputed; nor did he appear to be more than 60 years of age, two years afterwards, at the time of this inquiry. He looked physically fit for work and there was nothing apparently wrong with his hands which seem to be quite steady, nor with his eyesight and colour discrimination.

As regards the allegation of wounding of rubber trees, the evidence of the conductor was untrustworthy, and that of the Superintendent unconvincing. The following table shows (i) the daily average of latex brought in during the 12 mon hs from October, 1957 to September, 1958, by thirteen of the labourers,

ten of whom were picked out at random, the other three being the discontinued workers; and (ii) the corresponding average for Eempi Singho; and (iii) the difference between (i) and (ii):—

It is clear from these figures that the daily output of Bempi Singho's work has been below what may be taken as normal during the 12 months just preceding his discontinuance, although on the average it was only alb. below what may be taken as normal, and never more than 1 b. below. but there were other labourers among the ten selected at random for the purpose of these averages, whose output of work too was below normal like that of Lempi Singho. In.s is inherent in the concept of an average or normal, but there were one or two other workers whose output was much worse than Bempi Singho's. As a matter of fact the unusually high daily average of Jamis Singho and another worker, which often exceeded 11 lbs. a day, had inflated the average for the whole group. Further the Superintendent stated in his evidence that if a labourer brought in 7 lbs. instead of 8 lbs. from a normal tapping block, he would consider it fair tapping. by this standard, Bempi Singho's tapping has to be considered fair. If the decline in Lempi Singho's output of work was due to old age, it would have been progressive, but the figures in the column of differences in the foregoing table does not show any such progressive deterioration.

The alleged abusing of the Superintendent could not have been a reason for the discontinuance, for it took place after the discontinuance as plainly admitted by the Superintendent.

I therefore conclude that the non-employment of Bempi Singho with effect from 16.9.58 was unjustified although it has to be granted that he was approaching retiring age.

10. The non-employment of Jamis Singho will now be considered. The first reason given by the Superintendent in terms of Regulation 21 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Regulations for the discontinuance of Jamis Singho was that he was tapping from time to time and did no, turn up for work regularly. According to the crop book, his attendance has been what may be described as relatively good, and the Superintendent plainly admitted in his evidence that he had not received any complaints about irregular attendance of Jamis Singho. Yet strangely this is the first charge framed against him by the Superintendent. The second charge was that 'his tapping has been unsatisfactory and a lot of trees were damaged. 'The conductor and the Superintendent gave evidence as regards this charge and, as they had done in regard to the same charge against Lempi Singho whose case has been discussed above, they harped on the same formula that the conductor had warned Jamis Sinhgo three times and finally reported the matter to the Superintendent who inspected the wounded trees along with the conductor on the following day. Neither the Superintendent nor the conductor gave convincing evidence not only with regard to this charge but also in other respects. The latter conveniently failed to recall facts and events, however much they were relevant and important, if his answers were likely to be in conflict with the rest of his evidence. Further Jamis Singho was never confronted with the trees he was alleged to have damaged nor was he ever given the opportunity of giving an explanation or defend himself. On the evidence placed against me, I cannot hold that this charge has been proved.

There is a third charge added in the course of this inquiry which did not find a place in the original statement to the Labour Commissioner submitted by the Superintendent. It is that Jamis Singho had allowed his cow to stray into the estate and caused damage to the plantation a second time after he had been warned the first time on 9.9.58. As regard the second date, the conductor who said that he had caught the cow himself and brought him from a distance of about half a mile to the store, was, at one stage of the inquiry, characteristically uncertain as no whether it was the 15th, 16th or the 17th of September, 1958, the last of these dates, the 17th being the day preceding the discontinuance of Jamis Singho. But subsequently the conductor stated that he had reported the incident, which had occurred, according to him, at about noon, to the Superintendent at about 4 p.m., and that on the instructions of the Superintendent he had on the following morning, i.e., the morning of 18th September, 1958, the date of discontinuance, asked Jamis Singho to surrender his bucket and knife, an acknowledged indication of stoppage of his tapping work, and to see the Superinten ent. According to Manuel Gopal, a worker on the estate and a witness cited

by the Superintendent to give evidence regarding this incident, it occurred about 4 or 5 days before Jamis Singho was stopped from work. An incident of this nature, to which the following log entry by the Superintendent dated 18.9.59 refers, does seem to have occurred just prior to the discontinuance, but it is as admitted by the conductor not such a serious offence to justify discontinuance:—

Log Entry P5A:—"18.9.58—W. M. Jamis Singho, a non-resident tapper was given the last warning on 9.9.58 for allowing his cattle to enter the estate and cause damage to plantation, but he has again committed the same offence and when questioned he turned offensive. I have suspended him from work for one week from—— and given him the final warning that he will be discontinued for any further offence of any kind." The blank space in this entry had not been filled.

In a statement submitted to the Commissioner of Labour, the Superintendent also stated: "We changed him over to sundry work as the tapping blocks on the estate have been reduced owing to large-scale up-rooting and replanting progress undertaken on the estate. He was offered sundry work and he has not turned up for work." This is in conflict with the above quoted log entry of 18.9.58, according to which Jamis Singho was only suspended from work for a week. Both these again are in conflict with the Superintendent's letter of 24.9.58 (P4) to the District Representative of the Ceylon Workers' Congress wherein he had stated that "his services were terminated for putting his cattle inside the estate and causing damage to plantation in spite of several warnings and later being offensive to the Superintendent and wounding rubber trees. " An attempt was made in the course of the inquiry to interpret the word 'terminated' to mean that the Superintenden, used it in the sense that Jamis Singho had himself terminated his services. In view of the Superintenden,'s ability to express himself in English as clearly shown in the course of the inquiry and also his education which was, according to him, equivalent in standard to the London Matriculation, it cannot be conceded that the word 'terminated' was used incorrectly by him in the letter under reference. The Conductor's evidence in this context was that soon after Jamis Singho's discontinuance on 18.9.58, he had met the Superintendent and pleaded with him against the discontinuance; the Superintendent had requested him (the conductor) to give sundry work to Jamis Singho, that, at about 10 a.m. on the same day, he sent the watcher to convey the offer of sundry work to Jamis Singho, and that he did not turn up for work. It is strange and sign ficant indeed that the Superintendent did not summon this watcher to give evidence. In view of the conflicting and undependable evidence placed before me, I am unable to hold that the unemployment of Jamis Singho, one of the best tappers in the whole estate, if not the best, was justified.

11. The non-employment of Martin Singho, the third and last of the three discontinued workers will now be considered. The Superintendent in his statement submitted to the Commissioner of Labour under Regulation 21 (1) of the Industrial D sputes Regulations of 1958, maintained that Martin Singho, a son of the first discontinued worker Bempi Singho, was not discontinued by him but "was given sundry work on the estate and he left of his own accord to better his prospecis" and that "his dues too have been paid. Two receipts-one a stamped one (R2) for Rs. 34.23 as wages for the month of September, 1958, up to the 18th and the other (R3) for Rs. 9.07 in payment of holiday wages for the year 1958, bearing the signature of Martin were produced by the Superintendent, but Martin denied that he had signed these receipts; and further the receipts do not bear the full name of Martin Singho, and in R2, the sum of Rs. 39.23 has been altered to Rs. 34.23 without authentication of the alteration. R2 bears a subscript to the fact that Martin had received all dues and he had no further claims on the estate, but the hand-writing of this subscript and the signature do not seem to be that of the same person. The Superintendent also mentioned in his statement that Martin was an I. R. C. At my inquiry, however, the position taken up by the Superintendens had changed. It was that Martin Singho was drunk and had attempted to assault some labourers and was therefore suspended for 3 days, but did not turn up for work after suspension, while his original position that he left of his own accord when he was transferred from tapping work to sundry work was not given up but was maintained concurrently. The following entry of 16.9.58, made by the Superintendent in the estate log book concerning this worker tells a still another story: ____

"16.9.58—7 a.m. Velloo father of Arumugan came and complained to me that L. A. Martin, a non-resident tapper came in front of his line room, raised his finger and threatened that he will break the bones of my son Arumugan and teach a lesson as he carries others' tales to the Superintendent and also pandan at the Superintendent's bungalow. He has put an entry in the police station to this effect. This man is an I. R. C. and bears a bad conduct and I have stopped him from work as from the 18th instant and wanted him to return the tapping bucket and knife. He has refused to do so and used offensive language."

(Sgd.) S. WIJESURIYA,
Superintendent. "

The conductor without any apparent hesitation or reservation stated in his evidence that the attempted assault by Martin Singho of a labourer occurred on the 17th of September, 1958, the day prior to his discontinuance at about 8 a.m. This is a flagrant contradiction to the Superintendent's log book entry

(5C) quoted above. This is either an anti-dated entry for some obscure reason or the decision to slop Martin Singho from work, not merely from tapping work, was taken not on 17.9.58 but on 16.9.58. Velloo, a worker on this estate who was a victim of the alleged assault stated at the commencement of his evidence that Martin Singho had knocked him on the face and later retracted and said that Martin Singho attempted to assault him and that when he raised his hand to strike, he (Velloo) ran to the Superincendent. The conductor supported the second version in his evidence. Velloo is said to have reported this attempted assault on him to the police and the police is said to have come to the estate and inquired into the matter, but no corroborative evidence to establish this was led by the Superintendent. However, it may be accepted that there is some truth in this. The subsequent conduct of Martin Singho on 22.9.58, supported by a certified copy (R1) of the Police Magistrate, Avissawella, in case No. 35810, instituted by the police against Martin Singho for (1) insulting S. Arunasalam, a worker in this estate with the intention of provoking him to break the peace and thereby committing an offence punishable under section 484 of the Penal Code, and for (2) threatening Arunasalam with injury to his person with intent to cause alarm to him and thereby committing an offence punishable under section 486 of the Penal Code.

The Magistrate's Order in this case was:--" The accused gives solemn undertaking in Court not to interfere with the complaint in any manner in the future and agrees to pay Rs. 15 to the Boys' Town Fund as charity. Complainant and the Police desire to compound case. Facts heard allowed. Case compounded. "

(Sgd. I. M. Ismail, Magistrate.)

Though this is a reference to what happened in December, 1958, about 3 months after Martin Singho's discontinuance, it is an indication of his conduct and has a bearing on the question of his reinstatement. Here again I hold that the discontinuance of Martin Singho was not justified.

12. The award I make is that each of the three discontinued workers, Bempi Singho, Jamis Singho and Martin Singho should be compensated for the loss of his earnings from the date of his unjustified discontinuance, that is, 16th September, 1958, in the case of Bempi Singho, and 1st September, 1958, in the case of Jamis Singho and Martin Singho until the day following the date of publication of this award in the Gazette (both days inclusive) by the payment of minimum wages for the full period of unemployment as specified herein above. The compensation which will thus become due to each of these three workers will be calculated by the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Avissawella, for the number of days on which tapping work was Colombo, 1.9.1960. actually done in the estate during the period beginning from the day of discontinuance and ending on the day following the date of publication of this award in the Gazette, and his calculation which will be made on the basis of the minimum wages prescribed monthly by the Wages Board as payable to workers in the Rubber Growing and Manufacturing Trade, shall be binding and final. Payment on this basis should be made by the Superintendent to each of these three workers through the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Avissawella, within one month of the notification of the amount of compensation calculated in respect of each of the three workers.

I do not order the re-instatement of any of these three workers. Bempi Singho is old and I hold that there is some truth in the allegation of his subsequent defiant attitude to the Superintendent. Jamis Singho and Martin Singho too have not, subsequent to their discontinuance, conducted themselves as they should have, if they were asking for re-instatement.

The Conduct of the Superintendent in regard to his relations with the workers in the estate, and his attitude towards the Union and the Labour Department, as revealed by this inquiry cannot be passed over without comments. In the first place, he has dismissed these workers on the spot without notice and. without an inquiry. The dismissals came first for reasons of his own or, perhaps, those of his father who was his adviser as admitted by him. The reasons given by him later to the Union, the Labour Department and the Industrial Court significantly differed among themselves by additions, mutations and even contradictions. In other words, he has been inconsistent and shifting ground from time to time. It is also sign ficant in this context that these three dismissals immediately followed the deputation of the Branch Union concerning the provision of a name-board, at which Bempi Singho and Jamis Singho at least were present and the part Jamis Singho took was not insignificant. It is clear from the Superintendent's correspondence with the Union and the Labour Department that he has all along displayed a non-co-operative and defiant attitude towards the Trade Union movement and its place today in the economic development of the country. This has to be attributed either to his inexperience or wilful adherence to out-of-date, traditional attitudes, methods and practices. In reply to the Labour Officer's notice of an inquiry into these dismissals, fixed for 9th February, 1959, he had said that he would not be free till the last week of March, that is, for a period of nearly a month and a half. It is unbelieveable that the Superintendent of such a relatively small estate as this could not find it possible to suggest a date sunable to him for the inquiry, not later than a fortnight. Prior to this, he had told the Labour Department that he was not prepared to attend a conference on the same subject. When, finally, an inquiry was fixed for 21.4.59, and a directive under of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950,

was issued to him, he defied it by failing to conform to it. Consequently, an ex parte inquiry was held on the appointed date. According to the Labour Officer, who dealt with this case and held this ex parte inquiry, no action was taken against the Superintendent for this defiance of the Labour Commissioner's lawful directive as it was decided to refer the matter to the Industrial Court. The Labour Officer in his evidence at this inquiry, told the Court that the Superintendent had been resorting to delaying tactics not only in this dispute but also in others in a manner without a parallel in his experience. Unless the Superintendent learns to appreciate the spirit of Trade Unionism, recognizes the modern trends in the employeremployee relation, realizes that employers should co-cperate with the Unions and the Labour Department in the settlement of disputes, and assumes full responsibility for all his duties and functions as Superintendent, without depending on others for advice and guidance, the existing unhealthy state of affairs in this estate is likely to continue and even deteriorate.

THE AWARD

This is an award under section 24 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950. It relates to an industrial dispute between the Nidahas Karmika Saha Velanda Sevaka Vurthiya Samithiya (hereinafter referred to as the "Union") and Bake House Limited (hereinafter referred to as the "Company".).

- 2. The Honourable the Minister of Labour, by his Order dated 29th June, 1959, made under section 4 (2) of this Act referred the dispute to this Court for settlement. The statement of the Acting Deputy Commissioner of Labour dated 25th June, 1959, sets out the following demands made by the Union:—
 - (1) The commencement basic salary of a worker to be increased to Rs. 55.
 - (2) Regular annual increments to be granted to workers.
 - (3) The wages must be paid in full to the Bakery Section workers without deducting Rs. 45 for mea's.
 - (4) The Special Allowance of Rs. 17.50 should be paid to all workers with effect from 1.1.58.
 - (5) The gratuity paid to workers should be calculated inc'usive of the meal allowance.
 - 3. At the enquiry before us the Union was represented by Mr. Pujitha Gunawardena and Mr. Lionel Fernando and the Company by Mr. Advocate R. A. Kannangara with Mr. Advocate W. T. P. Goonetileke instructed by Mr. R. G. de Silva and Mr. Pettiyagoda.
 - 4. A member of this Court, Mr. S. B. Udurawana, ceased to be a member of the panel of the Industrial Court after the commencement of this inquiry and was absent as from 17.12.59. We have, notwithstanding such vacancy, acted under section 31 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended.
 - 5. Counsel for the Company in his opening address and subsequently questioned the right of the Union to represent the workers of Bake House. While this Court was examining the demands presented by the Union a meeting of the Thrift -Society of the Company was held. It was convened to discuss these demands and a document signed by about 125 members was presented to this Court. This document stated that the members who signed it were against these demands. We wish to place on record that we do not favour the introduction of trade union matters into a Thrift Society. However, while giving due weightage to the contents of this document, we wish to refer to P. 14, being the notes of a conference held under the chairmanship of the Labour Officer and attended by representatives of both the Company and the Union wherein "both parties agreed that the matter should be referred to an Industrial Court for arbitration. "
 - 6. The first demand is that the commencement basic salary of a worker be increased to Rs. 55. Bake House Limited was established in 1952 and there are approximately 213 workers. There are two sections to it, the Bakery and the Hotel. The workers in the Bakery are covered by the decisions of the Wages Board for the Baking Trade as contained in Gazette No. 11,605 of 29th November, 1958. The first demand therefore would apply in respect of the workers in the Hotel Section only.
 - 7. The workers in the Hotel Section are paid wages from a minimum of Rs. 40 to a maximum of Rs. 100 per mensem. They are not paid any allowances but are provided with free meals and accommodation for lodging in a big hall standing on 13 perches. A value of Rs. 45 per mensem has been placed on these meals provided free, and this has been taken into account in fixing the contributions for the Employees Provident Fund. As the meal is provided free the wage is not increased if the mea's are not taken. The present position is not satisfactory. The demand before this Court however is for a commencement basic salary of Rs. 55. We have been informed by both the Counsel for the Union and the Counsel for the Company that a Remuneration Tribunal for Hote! Employees has already been appointed. At a certain stage in the inquiry both parties stated that they were prepared to await the decision of this Tribunal. We accept this position Our chief reason for accepting this position is that such a Tribunal could consider basic wages of hotel workers from all aspects and that its award will be binding not on one but on all hote's coming under this decision. There is at present a Remuneration

Tribunal appointed under the Shop and Office Employees Act, No. 19 of 1954, considering the wages of employees of the following hotels:—Lord Nelson, White Horse Inn. New Colonial, Maliban Bar, Maliban Hotel. Victoria Bakery and Tea Rooms, Princes Restaurant, Brown's Hotel, Mansion Hotel, Victoria Restaurant, Nippon Hotel, City Bakery Ltd. (Hotel Section), New Grand Hotels. Buhari Restaurant, New Bombay Buhari Hotel and Bakery (Hotel Section), Gloucester Hotel, British India Hotel, Dominion Hotel and Victoria Hole!—as published on pages 1450-1452 of the Cegion Groeen. ment Gazette No. 12,182 of August 12, 1960. We award that the wages of employees of the Hotel Section of Bake House Limited be governed by the final determination of this Tribunal, and that it should be operative as from the date set by the said Tribunal. The wages of those employed at present, if higher than the minimum fixed by the Tribunal, should not however be reduced.

- 8. The second demand is that regular annual increments be granted to workers. From the evidence placed before us it is clear that the Company has in fact given increments fairly regularly, but, of course, the Company is under no obligation to grant such increments regularly and to all workers. We regard the granting of regular annual increments a very desirable practice, from the point of view of both employer and employee. Counsel for the Company has produced evidence to show that the financial position of the Company as it stands at present would not permit it to commit itself to an incremental scale for all workers. We accept this point of view, and also the assurance that no discrimination has been made in the past or will be made in the future in the granting of increments to employees.
- 9. The third demand is that wages must be paid in full to the Bakery Section workers without deducting Rs. 45 for meals. The wages of the employees of the Bakery Section are covered by the Wages Board decision for the Baking Trade. It has been the practice however to deduct Rs. 45 from their total wage every month for the meals supplied. For the sum of Rs. 45 per mensem the employee is given his four meals every day, and there is evidence that employees have even been permitted to take a meal home. However, the general practice appears to be that those who go home during the week when they are off duty or during the week ends or while on holiday forgo their meals and yet have the full sum of Rs. 45 deducted. This procedure has been made regular by a signed document from each employee authorizing the deduction and permission from the Department of Labour to do so with the consent of the employees. About a third of the employees in the Bakery Section have authorized the deduction pending the award of this Court. However, there are unsatisfactory features of this arrangement. Firstly an employee living close to Bake House may find it more profitable to keep the Rs. 45 so that it may contribute towards the food bill of the whole family. Secondly it discourages employees from going home during "off" days and holidays. Thirdly the deduction for meals not taken cannot be considered just, even though it is done with the consent of the employee. The Company on the other hand maintains that the meals provided are worth much more than Rs. 45 per month and that accommodation for ledging is available free of charge. In their opinion it would be impossible to run the establishment if an eye has to be kept on the eating of food by employees throughout their hours of work.
- 10. Evidence has been placed before us showing that the employees are in a position to choose from a number and a variety of dishes that are cooked for the day, though in the more expensive foods their choice may be restricted. We therefore accept the value of the meals provided being placed at Rs. 45 a month, or Rs. 1.50 a day. In certain circumstances the Company has been good enough to permit employees to take their dinner packet home. From the evidence placed before us we were very pleased to find that there is cordiality and understanding between the Company and its employees and we do not wish to do or say anything that will mar this relationship.

Our award in respect of this demand is that with the written consent of the employee and the approval of the Department of Labour the Company may deduct Rs. 1.50 per day and not exceeding Rs. 45 per month from the employee for the meals supplied on the days of the month on which the employee works: this deduction would entitle the employee to have all his meals for the day at Bake House as at present.

- of Rs. 17.50. It has been stated earlier that the workers in the Bakery Section are already covered by the Wages Board decision for Bakeries. With regard to the hotel workers their wages are at present under consideration by the Remuneration Tribunal referred to above, and Counsel for both the Company and the Union have expressed their willingness to await the determination of the Remuneration Tribunal. Our award in respect of this demand is therefore that the Bakery Section be governed by the decisions of the Wages Board for the Brking Trade, and the Hotel Section by the determination of the Remuneration Tribunal already referred to.
- 12. The fifth demand is that the gratuity paid to workers should be calculated inclusive of the meal allowance. The gratuity refers to a payment made to all employees in recognition of their past services at the commencement of the operation

of the Employees' Provident Fund in this Company. The calculation for the emp oyees of the Hotel Section was on the basis of their wage (without the addition of Rs. 45, which is the value of the meals, as these are regarded as free meals); for the employees of the Bakery Section the basis of calculation was their wages less the deduction for meals. The Union contends that the gross wage with the addition of the cost of meals supplied should be taken as the basis of this calculation.

13. When it is realised that an employee, after the introduction of the Emp'oyees' Provident Fund, may not be in a position ordinarily to receive any special benefit from the Company for the years of service to the Company prior to the introduction of the Employees' Provident Fund, it becomes clear that a proper assessment of these services must be made. If a payment of gratuity has been made to any employee on account of his past service and accepted no further payment can be expected as gratuity for this period of service at a later date. Therefore it is necessary to see if the first payment,

though voluntarily given by the employer is sufficient. It is generally recognized that the gratuity shou'd be two weeks' pay for every year of service. This rate has been accepted by the Company as the basis of calculation. Our award is that the value of meals supplied shou'd be added to the wage in the case of hotel employees, and no deduction should be made from the wage in the case of bakery employees in calculating the gratuity. The sum still due to them on the basis of this award in respect of the fifth demand should be paid to each employee within three months of the date of this award.


