The Award

This is an award under section 17 (1) of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended by Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, Nos. 25 of 1956, 14 and 62 of 1957. It concerns an industrial dispute between The Ceylon National Union of Workers and Kalutara Co-operative Distilleries' Society Limited, Paiyagala (referred to hereinafter as "the Union" and "the Society" respectively).

- 2. By Order made under the powers vested in him by section 3 (1) (d) of the Act, the Deputy Commissioner of Labour on 12.7.60 referred to me for settlement by arbitration the following matter in dispute between the parties:—Whether the non-employment of Messrs. W. B. B. Fernando, P. N. P. Seneviratne and M. J. H. Fernando is justified and to what relief they are entitled.
- 3. The inquiry was called on 14.9.60. Mr. W. K. Wijemanne, President of the Union, appeared on its behalf, and Mr. A. M. Markar, Proctor S. C., represented the Society.
- 4. The parties consulted with each other and the following settlement was reached:—

The Society agrees to pay-

(i) Mr. P. N. P. Seneviratne a sum of Rs. 525 by way of compensation, a further sum of Rs. 98, being salary for August 1958, and a further sum of Rs. 98, being salary in lieu of a

month's notice. Mr. Seneviratne will also be entitled to the receipt of whatever amount that has been deposited by him as security, and any sums lying to his credit in the Provident Fund.

- (ii) Mr. W. B. B. Fernando a sum of Rs. 475 by way of compensation, and a month's salary, being the salary for August, 1958, namely, Rs. 86, and another month's salary (Rs. 86), being a month's salary in lieu of notice. He will also be entitled to whatever sum lies to his credit in the Provident Fund.
- (iii) Mr. M. J. H. Fernando a sum of Rs. 450 by way of compensation, and any money which had been deposited by him by way of security, further, whatever sums lying to his credit in the Provident Fund will also be given to him. In addition to this, he is at liberty to withdraw the money lying to his credit with the Assistant Commissioner of Labour, Kalutara.
- It is admitted that all other payments have been duly made, and there are no further claims from the above-named against the Society.

The above payments will be paid on or before the 10th day of October, 1960, through the Labour Office, Kalutara.

5. I am of opinion that the above settlement is just and equitable. I direct that award be made in conformity with it.

The Award

This is an award under section 17 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950, as amended by the Industrial Disputes (Amendment) Acts, No. 25 of 1956, and 14 and 62 of 1957.

- 2. It relates to an industrial dispute between the Tea, Rubber, Coconut and General Produce Workers' Union of No. 123, Union Place, Colombo 2 (hereinafter referred to as "the Union") and M. S. Hebtulabhoy and Company, Limited, P. O. Box 105, Colombo 14 (hereinafter referred to as "the Company").
- 3. By virtue of the powers vested in him by section 3 (1) (d) of the aforesaid Act, the Deputy Commissioner of Labour, by his Order dated May 18, 1960, referred to me an industrial dispute between the above-named parties for settlement by arbitration. The matters in dispute between the parties referred to are (1) whether or not the continuance of the contract system in respect of 34 women workers engaged in the stitching of bales, bags and cases for export cargo at Hebtulabhoy and Company is justified, (2) if not justified, whether all or part of the 34 workers should be absorbed into the permanent labour force of the Company, and (3) if only a part of them are to be absorbed into the permanent labour force what relief the rest are entitled to.
- 4. At my inquiry Mr. Advocate W. T. P. Goonetilleke instructed by Mr. Davoodbhoy, appeared for the Company and the Union was represented by Messrs. N. Sanmugathasan and K. Kulavirasingham (representatives of the Union).
- 5. After preliminary inquiry and evidence, parties informed me on the third day of inquiry that they had arrived at a settlement among themselves, the terms of which are as follows:---
- (1) The Union agrees to the employment on a permanent basis by the Company of 14 of the 34 women workers concerned, the selection of the 14 workers to be made by the Company whose decision shall be final.
- (2) The Company agrees to employ the said 14 workers on a permanent basis with effect from October 1, 1960.

(3) Parties agree that the employment of the remaining 20 women workers on the basis of piece-rate contract should cease with effect from September 30, 1960.

Should the Company find that during certain periods they require the services of more than 14 workers to cope with their work they undertake to give preference to some or all of the 20 workers referred to in (3) above and offer them employment through the agency of the woman who has hitherto acted as their contractor.

- (4) In regard to any relief that each of the 20 women workers whose services would be dispensed with as on September 30, 1960, the Company takes up the position that these women being workers who have not been in their permanent employment, are not entitled to any relief.
- Mr. Kulavirasingham states that he is prepared to negotiate with the Company with regard to this matter. He also states that whatever may be the outcome of his negotiations he will not press this demand and would withdraw it.
- 6. I make my award on items (1) and (2) referred to me in terms of paragraph 5 (1), (2) and (3) above which I consider just and equitable. In regard to item (3) referred to me, I make no award.

THE AWARD

This is an award under section 24 of the Industrial Disputes Act, No. 43 of 1950 (as amended). It relates to an industrial dispute between the Tea, Rubber, Coconut and General Produce Workers' Union of 123, Union Place, Colombo 2, and Messrs. Carson Cumberbatch and Company Limited, Chartered Bank Building, Queen Street, Colombo 1, referred to hereinafter as "the Union" and "the Company" respectively.

- 2. By virtue of the powers vested in him by section 4 (2) of the aforesaid Act the Hon. Minister of Labour referred to me on February 2, 1960, an industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties for settlement. The statement of the Deputy Commissioner of Labour dated January 27, 1960, which accompanied the Minister's Order specified the matter in dispute between the parties as "Bonus for the year 1959".
- 3. When the inquiry was taken up on June 7, 1960, the Union was represented by Mr. N. Shanmugathasan, General Secretary of the Ceylon Trade Union Federation of which the Union is an affiliated member. The Company was represented by Mr. J. C. Byrnell of Messrs. Julius and Creasy, Solicitors and Proctors. Mr. Lyn Wirasekera of the Employers' Federation was also present.

When the inquiry was continued on September 15, 1960, Mr. K. Kulavirasingham, Secretary of the Union, appeared for the Union, while the Company was represented by Mr. Lyn Wirasekera.

Messrs. Kulavirasingham and Wirasekera informed mejon September 15, 1960, that the dispute between the parties had been settled out of court and that in view of that settlement Mr. Kulavirasingham was withdrawing the demand made on behalf of the Union. In view of the fact that the parties have arrived at an amicable settlement and in view of the fact that the demand made by the Union is now withdrawn. I make formal award dismissing the demand.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 18A (3) OF THE FISHERIES (AMENDMENT) ACT, No. 25 OF 1952, AS AMENDED BY THE FISHERIES (AMENDMENT) ACT, No. 30 OF 1956

IN terms of section 18A (1) of the Fisheries Ordinance, No. 24 of 1940, as amended by the Fisheries (Amendment) Acts, Nos. 25 of 1952 and 30 of 1956, the Honourable J. D. Weerasekara, Minister of Industries and Fisheries, has referred a dispute that has arisen between the fishermen permanently resident at Talawila and Palakudah in the Puttalam District on the one hand and the migrant fishermen from Negombo, Mattakotuwa, Chilaw, Wennappuwa, Ulhetiyawa, Talahena, Duwa, Kudapaduwa, Thoduwawa, Weligam-pitiya, Katuneriya, Nainamadama, Kammalturai, Porutota, Kollinjadi, Marawila, Wadduwa, Kammala, Mudukatuwa, etc., on the other with regard to their respective fishing rights in the Ceylon waters adjoining the area extending from the Southern limits of Erumbukudel Padu in the South to the Southern limit of Thalayadi Padu in the North to me for public inquiry and report.

2. The subject matter of the dispute is as follows:

The fishermen permanently resident at Talawila and Palakudah complain that increasing numbers of fishermen from Negombo, Mattakotuwa, Chilaw, Wennappuwa, Ulhetiyawa, Kudapaduwa, Nainamadama, Kammalthurai, Porutota, Thoduwawa, Talahena, Duwa, Weligampitiya, Katuneriya, Kolinjadi, Marawila, Wadduwa, Kammala, Mudukatuwa, etc., migrate to Talawila and fish in the waters adjoining the area extending from the Southern limit of Erumbukudel Padu in the South to the Southern limit of Thalayadi Padu in the North. They object to these migrant fishermen fishing in the above mentioned waters as it adversely affects their means of livelihood.

- 3. Since all matters in dispute may not have been specified in the representations already made, I have been requested to inquire into any matters incidental or related to the dispute as outlined above and to make my report on all such matters.
- 4. I invite all persons concerned or interested in the dispute, who desire so to do, to make written representations relating to this dispute to the Director of Fisheries, to reach his office at Galle Face, Colombo, on or before 31st October, 1960.
- 5. I shall commence a public inquiry into the subject matter of the dispute at the Kalpitiya Rest House on 18th November, 1960, at 10 a.m. At the public inquiry, I will hear evidence, whether oral or documentary, upon oath. All persons entitled to be present and to tender evidence in support of their representations may appear either in person or by counsel or other friend or pleader.
