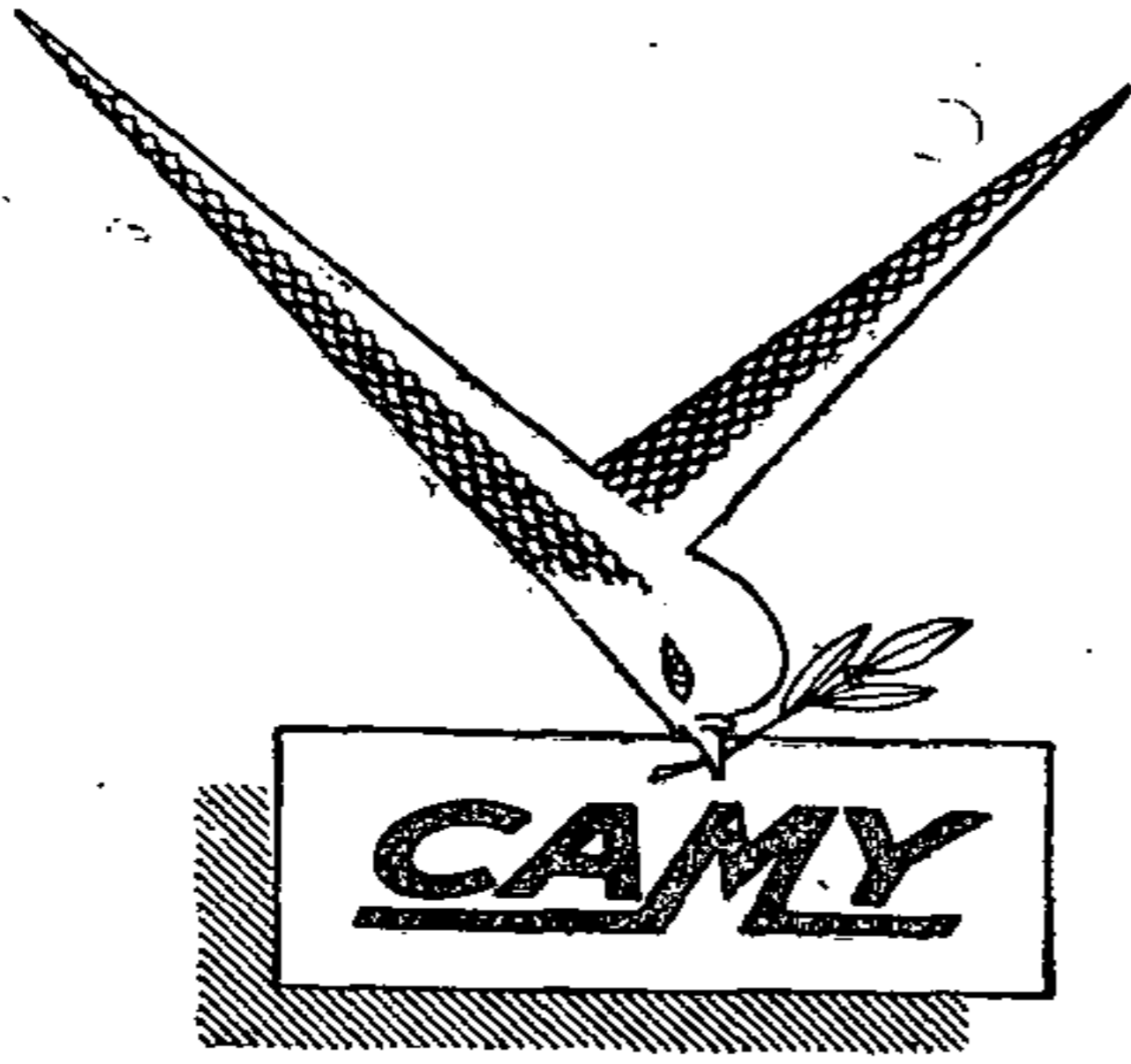
NOTICE is hereby given that any person who has grounds of objection to the registration of the following trade marks may, within two months from the date of this Gazette, lodge notice of Opposition on form T. M. No. 7 bearing an uncanceled or impressed stamp of Rs. 25. The period of lodging Notice of Opposition may be enlarged by the Registrar if he thinks fit and upon such terms as he may direct.

Formal opposition should not be lodged until after reasonable notice has been given by letter to the Applicant for registration so as to afford him an opportunity of withdrawing his application before the expense of preparing the Notice of Opposition is incurred. Failure to give such notice will be taken into account in considering any application by an Opponent for an Order of Costs if the opposition is uncontested by the Applicant.

No. 4,773 of 9th March, 1960. (Registration of U. K. Patent No. 760,591 of 27.10.54 under Sec. 46 of the Ordinance)

JANE BARR CLARK.

"Improvements in Centrifugal Pumps".

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claims 1, 2 and 3 which read as follows:—

1. A pump of the kind set forth wherein the impeller is fast on the shaft of an electric motor enclosed in a cylindrical casing constituting the pump body, said casings having fixed spiral ducts and communicating therewith an annular axial passage which delivers the liquid received from the impeller to the pump discharge outlet.

2. A pump as claimed in claim 1 wherein the motor and its shaft are sealed against contact with water following through the pump.

3. A pump as claimed in either of the preceding claims provided with a flanged impeller cover secured to the cylindrical pump body, an inlet branch secured to the said cover and a non-rotatable floating sealing ring located between said cover and inlet branch and arranged to bear on an external flange of the impeller and an annular bearing face of the inlet branch, the construction being such that the ring is held to bear on the said flange and bearing face by the pressure of liquid which may leak thereto or by the minus pressure which may exist in the inlet branch.

"Fungicidal compositions".

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claims 1, 2 and 3 which read as follows:—

1. New fungicidal compositions which comprise griseofulvin and a bland high-boiling fluid as hereinbefore defined.

2. Composition as claimed in claim 1 wherein the griseofulvin is present in such proportion by weight that the proportion by weight of griseofulvin in the composition lies between 0.1% and 50%.

3. Compositions as claimed in claims 1 and 2 wherein the fluid has a boiling point above 150°C.

"Fungicidal Compositions".

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claims 1, 2 and 3 which read as follows:—

1. Compositions suitable for the treatment of fungus diseases of man and animals which comprise griseofulvin as active fungicidal ingredient and pharmaceutical excipients known for the production of formulations suitable for oral or parenteral administration.

2. Compositions as claimed in claim 1 wherein the griseofulvin is present in such proportion by weight that the proportion by weight of griseofulvin in the formulation to be administered lies between 0.1% and 90%.

3. Compositions as claimed in claims 1 and 2 which are suitable for oral administration and are in the form of tablets, pills, syrups or aqueous or oily suspensions.

THE DOW CHEMICAL COMPANY.

"Composition for the control of undesired vegetation".

Abstract.—The nature of the invention can be ascertained from claims 1, 2, 3 and 4 which read as follows:—

1. A herbicide composition which comprises 2, 2-dichlorobutyric acid or a salt thereof in admixture with a petroleum distillate, aqueous emulsion, surface active dispersing agent or a finely divided solid.

2. A composition according to claim 1 containing the active agent in a concentration of at least 0.001 per cent. by weight.

3. A composition according to claim 1 comprising from 5 to 95 per cent. by weight of 2, 2-dichlorobutyric acid or a salt thereof in a surface active dispersing agent.

4. A composition according to any of claims 1 to 3, containing a water soluble salt of 2, 2-dichlorobutyric acid as the active toxic ingredient.
