PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the

Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof for each of the Circuits into which this Island is divided for the purposes of the administration of justice, for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence---

For the Midland Circuit three times at least at Kandy and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Session commencing at Kandy on the Tenth day of March, on the First day of August, and on the First day of December in every year:

And whereas it is further provided by the said Ordinance that it shall be competent for the Governor, for sufficient reasons to him appearing, after previous consultation with the Judges, to alter the dates fixed by the said Ordinance for holding Criminal Sessions of the said Court at any of the places therein mentioned and to fix any other date for the commencement thereof:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to alter the date fixed by the said Ordinance for the commencement of the First Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court at Kandy and to fix another date instead thereof :

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, for sufficient reason to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby direct and appeint that the First Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court for the Midland Circuit shall commence to be holden at Kandy this year on Tuesday, the Seventh day of March, instead of Friday, the Tenth day of March.

Given at Hambantota, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Seventh day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-nine.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things provided that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the purposes of the administration of justice, for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Northern Circuit twice at least at Jaffna and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint; such Sessions commencing at Jaffna in the month of February and in the month of July in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court should be holden at Trincomalee and at Batticaloa, two of the places included in the Northern Circuit, on the dates hereinafter mentioned :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby direct and appoint that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Trincomalee on or about Saturday, the Fourth day of March, and at Batticaloa on or about Monday, the Sixth day of March, 1899.

Given at Hambantota, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Seventh day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-nine.

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir J. WEST RIDGEWAY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WEST RIDGEWAY.

WHEREAS by sections 4 and 5 of "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be by him for that purpose issued, to declare from time to time, as he may think desirable, that any chief headman's division or part thereof shall be brought, from a time named therein, within the operation of the said Ordinance, and to subdivide the same into villages or convenient groups of villages in such manner as the said Governor, with the like advice of the Executive Council, shall appoint:

And whereas it is expedient to bring certain chief headmen's divisions in the Jaffna, Mannar, and Mullaittivu Districts of the Northern Province within the operation of the said Ordinance, and to subdivide the same : Now know Ye that the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council do hereby declare and appoint that the divisions of Karachchi, Punakari, and Tunukkai, including Karunavalpattu south, in the Jaffna District; Vavuniya north, Vavuniya south, and the maritime pattus consisting of Karikkaddumulai north, Karikkaddumulai south, Puthukudyiruppu, and Mulliyavalai, in the Mullaittivu District; and Muchali, Mantai, and Mannar island, in the Mannar District of the Northern Province, shall, from and after the First day of March, 1899, be brought within the operation of the said Ordinance, and that the said subdivisions shall consist of the villages or groups of villages specified in the schedule hereto.

Given at Polluvilla, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Tenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-nine.
