PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Honourable Sir EDWARD NOEL WALKER, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

#### E. NOEL WALKER.

WHEREAS by section 4 of "The Toll Ordinance, 1896," it is enacted that, subject to the provisions and limitations in the said Ordinance contained, tolls shall be levied upon all horses, elephants, oxen, vehicles, and boats in respect of the roads, bridges, ferries, and canals specified in the Schedules B, C, D, and E respectively to the said Ordinance annexed, at such rates as the Governor, from time to time by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, shall be pleased to appoint, provided that the same shall in no case exceed the rates thereinafter specified:

An whereas a toll was established under the provisions of Ordinance No. 3 of 1896 over the Victoria Bridge at Grandpass, in the District of Colombo, Western Province:

And whereas it is expedient to appoint the rates at which the said toll so established in respect of the said Victoria Bridge shall be levied:

Now know Ye that We, the Lieutenant-Governor, under and by virtue of the powers in that behalf on Us conferred as aforesaid, do hereby appoint that the rates at which the toll so established in respect of the Victoria Bridge at Grandpass, in the District of Colombo, Western Province aforesaid, shall not exceed the rates set out in the schedule hereto.
