It is also hereby notified that the examination under the Minute of 12th December, 1898, and the vivá voce examination in the native languages for officers in the Public Works Department will be held at the same time and place.

Only the Police Magistrates who are not members of the Bar or of the Civil Service and those candidates who have been specially nominated by the Governor will be admitted to the former examination.

THE following additions and amendments to the general rules for all Prisons made by the Lieut.-Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, on 16th March, 1899, under section 76 of "The Prisons Ordinance, 1877," are published for general information, and shall have effect from the date above-mentioned.

Additions and Amendments referred to.

For rule 41 substitute:-

The Superintendent shall submit to the Inspector-General of Prisons for the consideration of his Excellency the Governor in Executive Council—

(a) The name of every prisoner who has actually served fifteen years in prison.

(b) The name of every prisoner who, having been ten years in prison, has attained, or is believed in the absence of positive evidence to have attained, the age of sixty years.

For rule 81 substitute:-

If the Medical Officer in charge of the prison is of opinion that the further detention of a prisoner is dangerous to his life, he shall, without delay, transmit a full medical statement of the case, together with the usual prison particulars of the prisoner, which shall be furnished to him by the Superintendent on Prison Form 26 to the Principal Civil Medical Officer, who shall appoint a Medical Board to report on the case. The report of the Board, together with his opinion on the case, and the above-mentioned prison particulars shall be at once forwarded as urgent by the Principal Civil Medical Officer to Government.

After rule 137 add :-

137 a. No prison officer shall be at liberty to resign his office or withdraw himself from the duties thereof unless expressly allowed to do so in writing by the Superintendent of the Prison, or unless he shall have given to the Superintendent one month's notice in writing of his intention to resign.

In rule 156 :-

(24) Leaving the prison service without giving one month's notice to the Superintendent.

(24) in the present schedule will become (25).

For rule 242 substitute:—

No prisoner shall be kept in irons except when it is necessary for his safe keeping either during his transfer from one place to another, or owing to the insecurity either of his place of confinement or employment.

Rule 283 delete:—

"The prisoners sentenced to five years and upwards shall, unless detained under the provision of rules 252 or 299, remain only for one month in the penal stage."

Rule 284 delete:—

"Prisoners sentenced to five years and upwards shall not be promoted to Class III. until they have served eleven months in Class IV."

By-Laws referred to.

By-Laws regarding Bakeries under sub-section 5 of section 56 of "The Local Boards Ordinance, No. 13 of 1898," to apply to all backeries where wheaten bread is made:—

1. Every bakery shall be well ventilated and well lighted, and the walls thereof plastered with lime mortar and whitewashed, the floor cemented, and drainage

sufficiently provided.

2. No bakery shall be within 30 feet of any cesspit, latrine, or sewer, nor in a position

where bad odours wafted therefrom shall reach it.

3. No place used as a bakery shall be used as a dwelling-place or for any other purpose whatsoever.

4. All utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to a bakery shall

be kept clean.
5. The flour, water, and other materials used in the manufacture of bread shall be good and wholesome.

6. All refuse and dirt in and about the premises of a bakery shall be removed

without delay and the drains well flushed.

7. Nor person suffering from any loathsome, contagious, or infectious disease, or who has recently been in attendance on any such person, or who is unwashed or otherwise

unclean, shall be employed in a bakery.

8. Every bakery and the management and conduct of the business shall be always open and subject to examination by the Chairman and Members of the Local Board, and all persons acting under the authority of the said Chairman.
