SIR,—WITH reference to my Circular Despatch of the 13th April, 1898, respecting the termination of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce and Navigation between Her Majesty and the Republic of Ecuador, signed at Quito on the 18th October, 1880, I have the honour to inform you that the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs has received a telegram, dated the 23rd April, 1899, from Her Majesty's Minister at Lima, reporting that the expiration of the Treaty on April 1st has been notified by the Minister for Foreign Affairs to the Ecuadorean Government, who trusts that a new treaty may shortly be made.

THE following rules framed by the Village Committees of Eraur, Rukam, and Koralai divisions of the District of Batticaloa, in the Eastern Province, under the provisions of Ordinance No. 24 of 1889, and approved by the Lieut.-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, are published for general information :-

All burials and cremations shall take place within a defined space or spaces set apart for the purpose by the Government Agent for each village.
 It shall be unlawful for any person to use for any other purpose the ground so

set apart.

3. The Chairman of the Village Community will, if necessary, allot portions in each burial ground for the different communities in each village or group of villages, and it will be incumbent on each community to confine its burials and cremations to each portion so allotted.

HEREAS by section 6 of "The Medical Wants Ordinance, 1880," it is enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, group together estates into districts, and may in the same and in like manner from time to time amend the grouping of any district or districts, or abolish any district or create a new district or new districts:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the Twenty-third day of April, 1898, the several estates mentioned in the schedule thereto were grouped together into districts for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the several districts in the said Proclamation mentioned and to create new districts in lieu thereof:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation abolish the several districts set forth in the schedule to the said Proclamation of the Twenty-third day April, 1898, as from and after the Thirty-first day of May, 1899, and do further by these presents, as from and after the date last aforewritten, group together, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, the estates appearing in the schedule hereto into the districts therein set forth.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir EDWARD NOEL WALKER, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

#### E. NOEL WALKER.

WHEREAS by section 11 of "The Irrigation and Paddy Cultivation Ordinance, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, upon the application of a reasonable number of the proprietors in any District, or if without such application it shall appear expedient, by Proclamation for that purpose to be published in the Government Gazette, to declare such District an Irrigation District for the encouragement and extension of paddy cultivation therein and for the better enforcement of the ancient customs of such District in regard to the irrigation and cultivation of paddy lands and the maintenance of the water-rights of such proprietors:

And whereas it appears expedient to declare the Districts specified in the annexed schedule, Irrigation Districts for the purposes of the said Ordinance.

Now know Ye that We, the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation declare the several Districts specified in the annexed schedule to be Irrigation Districts, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, as from and after the Ninth day of June, 1899.

Given at Kandy, in the Island of Ceylon, this Second day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-nine.
