*New Light at Kovilam on the Island of Karativu,
North Coast of Ceylon.*

Notice is hereby given that on and after March 1, 1899, a bright light will be shown from sunset to sunrise from a steel mast painted white at Kovilam, on the island of Karativu, north coast of Ceylon, in latitude about 9° 46' north, and longitude about 79° 50' 20" east.

The light is a fifth order dioptric lantern, and will be hoisted to an elevation of 60 ft. above sea-level, and should be visible from all directions seaward at a distance of about 10 miles in clear weather.
