(1) *Marion Reef—Beacon erected.*

The British Admiralty has given notice (No. 34 of 1899) that during the first week in January, 1899, a

black tripod beacon with a circular head 21 ft. above high water would be erected on the eastern edge of Marion reef, Macdonnell sound approach.

It has been placed on the Chart with Troubridge shoals lighthouse bearing N. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., distant $2\frac{1}{4}$ miles, and north extreme of Hungry point N. W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.

Approximate position: lat. $35^{\circ} 9' 45''$ S., long. $137^{\circ} 49' 20''$ E.

(2) *Troubridge Lighthouse—Additional Light exhibited.*

Also that a red fixed light, visible in clear weather from a distance of 5 miles between the bearings of N. 45° W., through north, and N. 45° E. over the Marion reef, would be exhibited at the base of Troubridge shoals lighthouse.

Variation, 5° easterly in 1899.
