GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

1. *Allowance.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. *New Entrants to the Public Service.*—(i) The period of probation/trial of New Entrants appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) New Entrants will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) They will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) The confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on their passing within specified periods of time graded proficiency tests in Sinhala, leading up to the level of the J. S. C. Standard. Failure to pass these proficiency tests within the prescribed periods will result in the non-payment of the increments falling due, until the passing of same. Any officer who does not pass the proficiency test of the Junior School Certificate standard by the end of his period of probation/trial will be liable to have his services terminated.

Note.—Those who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempt from passing the proficiency tests in Sinhala as a prerequisite for confirmation.

(iv) They will also be required to pass an Efficiency Bar test in the Sinhala language of the Senior School Certificate standard within two years from the date of confirmation in appointment.

5. *Qualifications required.*—(i) Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

(ii) A candidate for any post for which the minimum educational qualification prescribed is a pass in the Senior School Certificate examination or equivalent or higher examination shall have a pass in the Sinhala language or its equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate examination or its equivalent if he is a Sinhalese, educated in the Sinhala medium. (This requirement will not apply to those officers who are in the Public Service from a date prior to January 1, 1961, and who seek appointments to other posts in the Public Service.)

6. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to

deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest, from their ages for purposes of eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

The fee for such examination as well as the cost of their passage expenses to Ceylon shall be paid by the officers themselves.

2. *Salary.*—The salary scale attached to the post is Rs. 5,160—9 of 360—Rs. 8,400 per annum.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—The post is permanent and pensionable under the School Teachers' Pension Rules. In the case of an appointee who holds a pensionable post as teacher under the Minutes on Pensions prior to his selection, the post will be declared pensionable while held by him.

4. *Education and Other Qualifications Required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he—

- (a) is not less than 28 years of age and not more than 50 on February 14, 1964. The upper age limit is not applicable in the case of officers who are in Government Service;

CADETSHIPS IN THE CEYLON ARMY

APPLICATIONS are invited for cadetships in the Ceylon Army. Upon selection the cadets will be sent to the Pakistan Military Academy at Kakul for training.

2. After successful completion of the period of training at Kakul, cadets will return to Ceylon and will be commissioned as officers in the commencing rank of Second-Lieutenant in an Arm or Service of the Army suited to their aptitude as well as the needs of the Army. Officers will be expected to serve in the Army for a minimum period of ten years after commissioning. The prospects and conditions of pay and service for officers of the Army are as published in the *Government Gazette* and reproduced in the Press.

3. Applications for cadetship must fulfil the following conditions :—

(a) *Nationality.*—Candidates must be citizens of Ceylon.

(b) *Age.*—Candidates must be not less than 19 years and not more than 21 years of age on 13.2.64.

(c) *Education.*—Candidates should possess either the Senior School Certificate with the following subjects entered in the Certificates or passed separately at a Ceylon G. C. E. (Ordinary Level) Examination :—

English Language (Syllabus 'A') or a credit pass in English Language (Syllabus 'B').

OR

passed the Ceylon G. C. E. (Ordinary Level) Examination in six subjects obtained on not more than two occasions with the following subjects :—

(i) Sinhala or Tamil Language.

(ii) English Language (Syllabus 'A') or a credit pass in English Language (Syllabus 'B').

(iii) Arithmetic or Mathematics.

(Subject to general suitability preference will be given to candidates with credit passes in Physics and Mathematics.)

(d) *Status.*—A candidate must be unmarried. No cadet will be permitted to marry while at the Pakistan Military Academy.

(e) *Medical standard.*—A candidate must conform to the required medical standard. All candidates selected for final interview by the selection board will be medically examined under Ceylon Army arrangements at the time of the interview.

4. Application for cadetships should be submitted in writing in terms of the form given in paragraph 9 below and should be forwarded to Army Headquarters, P. O. Box 553, Colombo, so as to reach there not later than 13.2.64. The envelope enclosing the application should be marked "APPLICATION FOR ARMY CADETS".

5. Applications should be accompanied by two certificates of character, one of which should be from a responsible person of mature age who has known the applicant for the previous one year in private life. The other should be from the Principal of the last school attended by the applicant.

6. All applicants who fulfil the above conditions will be required to answer a written test in the following subjects :—Composition, General Knowledge, and Mathematics/Arithmetic. A preliminary selection will then be made from amongst those candidates who qualify at the written examination and a final selection will be made after interview of these selected candidates by a selection board appointed by the Minister of Defence. Candidates selected for interview by the selection board will be informed in writing of the place, time and date of such interview. The interviews will take place in Colombo. No travelling or other expenses will be paid by the Ceylon Government in this respect. Candidates not selected for interview by the selection board will be so informed. The written examination may be answered in Sinhala, Tamil or English according to the applicant's medium.

7. The following procedure and rules will apply in respect of candidates selected for vacancies :—

(a) Candidates will be enlisted as Army Cadets on a normal regular engagement for a period of five years with the Colours and seven years with the Reserve.

- (b) On enlistment candidates will be required to undergo such training in Ceylon as may be prescribed by the Commander of the Army.
- (c) On successful completion of the training in Ceylon, cadets will be sent at Government expense to Pakistan, and be admitted to the Pakistan Military Academy, Kakul, for a course of training lasting 30 months.
- (d) During the period of training at Kakul, all tuition and maintenance fees will be paid by the Ceylon Government. The status of cadets during this period will be that of other ranks and cadets will be subject to Military Law.
- (e) The pay of a cadet while under training in Pakistan will be Rs. 2,700 per annum. He will not be entitled to any increments of pay during the period of service as a cadet. A cadet will also be entitled to the following overseas allowance whilst under training in Pakistan :—
- (i) Rs. 100 per month while attached to a Mess.
- (ii) Rs. 15 per day while NOT attached to a Mess.
- (f) (i) In the event of a cadet voluntarily terminating his candidature for a commission during his course at Kakul, the parent or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred up to that time by the Ceylon Government on the cadet's account. The cadet will also be required to return to Ceylon at his own expense.
- (ii) If at any time during his course, a cadet is reported by the authorities at Kakul to be unsuitable for reasons of misconduct or for causes within his own control, for the issue of a commission, his parents or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred on his account by the Ceylon Government.
- (g) Parents or guardians will be required to sign declaration as shown in paragraph 10 below in respect of sub-paragraphs (b) and (c) above and these should be forwarded with the application. Parents or guardians of selected candidates will be required to enter into a bond substantially in the form of the declaration with the Ceylon Government prior to the appointment of these candidates.
- (h) Upon successful completion of the period of training at Kakul, Cadets will return to Ceylon at the expense of the Ceylon Government. On their appointment to commissions, cadets will be discharged from the Regular Army engagement they entered into as Other Ranks.
