## MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Saturday, February 18, 1899, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with notice dated January 13.

*Present*:—Hon. Mr. A. Bailey, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; R. W. Jonklaas, Esq.; A. Philip, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on January 21 were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were laid on the table:—Statements of Receipts and Disbursements from close of 1897 to December 31, 1898, on account of the General Revenue, Police Assessment, and Water-rate Accounts; Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from close of 1898 to January 31, 1899, on account of the Municipal Fund; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Return of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of January; and Health Officer's Report.

Resolved,—That the several statements, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, be forwarded, as required by section 90 of the Municipal Councils' Ordinance, No. 7 of 1887, to the Colonial Secretary for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following correspondence was submitted and read:—

*Electric Lighting, Government Buildings.*

(a) Letter No. 3, dated January 26, from the Colonial Secretary, respecting electric lighting of Government buildings.

*Alleys.*

(b) Letter No. 4, dated January 27, from the Colonial Secretary, respecting the improvement of alleys, with Chairman's reply.

*Plague Regulations.*

(c) Letter No. 5, dated January 27, from Colonial Secretary, forwarding additional copies of plague regulations.

*Cost of Plague Precautions.*

(d) Letter No. 6, dated January 27, from Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of Circular No. 250 of December 21, containing terms of payment of cost of plague precautions.

Resolved,—That the following Members be appointed a Special Committee to make arrangements for the erection of the hospitals and plague camps necessary in case of any outbreak of plague:—The Chairman, Mr. Creasy, and Dr. J. Craib.

*By-Laws confirmed.*

(e) Letter No. 7, dated January 31, from Colonial Secretary, intimating the confirmation of by-law respecting private sheds and galas.

*Health Officer.*

(f) Letter dated January 25, from Dr. F. Keyt, reporting that he had taken up duties as Health Officer from January 13.

*Vote of Thanks.*

- (g) Letter dated February 1 from Dr. Keyt acknowledging the receipt of Secretary's letter No. 99 of January 27, and conveying his thanks for the resolution passed at the last Meeting.

*Acquisition of Land.*

- (h) Memorandum dated February 7, from Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of letter to the Government Agent, directing him to take order for the acquisition of lands required for depositing town rubbish and night soil.

*Police for Municipal purposes.*

4. Letter No. 63, dated December 13, 1898, from the Colonial Secretary, in reply to the application of the Municipal Council for a reduction of the Police Force in Kandy, was laid on the table.

In accordance with notice, Mr. A. Philip asked why the letter from Government on the subject of the Municipal Police Force was not placed on the Agenda, as desired and determined, for the first meeting in the new year (January), and moved that a Special Committee be appointed to make further representations to Government with a view to having effect given to the recommendation made by the Municipal Council in connection with the Administration Report for 1897.

The Chairman replied that the letter had been inadvertently omitted from the Agenda Paper of last Meeting. Mr. Philip's motion was seconded by Mr. J. H. Sproule, and on being put to the Meeting was carried.

The Chairman, Messrs. Sproule, Creasy, Vanderwall, and Philip were nominated Members of the Special Committee.

5. In accordance with notice, Mr. Sproule moved "that such steps as the Council may deem requisite be taken to build a protecting parapet wall below the land No. 79, Peradeniya road, to protect the house No. 80, the foundations of which are being undermined by the flow of water in the large drain running to the west of land No. 79, and with permission of the Council added the following words:—'And that the matter be referred, in the first instance, to the Superintendent of Works for further report.'"

The motion was seconded by Mr. Vanderwall.

Mr. Philip pointed out that on a complaint made early last year the Chairman and himself had reported on the matter of the drain complained of. He read the report dated March 24.

The motion on being put to the Meeting, with the addition allowed, was carried.

6. In pursuance of notice, Mr. Vanderwall moved "that the Council do allow Mr. Poulter's application for three months' leave of absence on full pay before retirement."

This was seconded by Mr. Jonklaas, and on being put to the Meeting was carried.

7. In accordance with notice, Mr. Beven moved "that as the newspapers do not publish the Minutes of the Proceedings of the Council sent to them by the Council, no Proceedings in future be forwarded for publication."

This was seconded by Mr. Jonklaas.

On being put to the Meeting there were two votes in favour of the motion and five against. The Chairman declared the motion lost.

8. In accordance with notice, Mr. Beven moved "that a statement be laid on the table showing the amount collected during January by the Council as toll rents at the several stations the toll rent of which has not been sold."

This was seconded by Mr. Sproule, and on being put to the Meeting carried.

It was resolved that the statement be circulated, and that similar statements be laid on the table monthly.

9. Mr. Philip, in accordance with notice, inquired what steps have been taken in the matter of making arrangements for the removal of night soil to the depot, and moved for papers.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Beven.

Papers were submitted. The Chairman read his letter No. 111 of November 26 to the Colonial Secretary, forwarding a copy of the Council's resolution, and the report of the General Manager, Ceylon Government Railway, and the Acting Engineer of Ways and Works. The papers had been referred back to the Chairman for information as to the probable quantity of rubbish, &c., which would require to be removed.

It was ordered that the information required be furnished, and that the Government be asked to consider the question in a broad and liberal spirit, not so much in its financial aspect, as with the view of assisting the Council to effect an important sanitary reform.

10. Mr. Philip, in pursuance of notice, asked why the letters from Government submitted at last Meeting of the Municipal Council have not been circulated by type-written copies, as desired and determined by the Municipal Council, and moved for papers.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Beven.

*Reply.*—The resolution referred to was understood to apply to important letters to be received from Government in the future. The letters submitted on January 21 were all dealt with at the time. There were no papers.

11. In accordance with notice, Mr. Philip drew attention to the fact that on the early morning of January 23, 1899, no lights were visible on any of the lamp posts throughout the town and that no constable was to be seen between the 1st milepost on the Katugastota road to the Railway Terminus, and moved that the attention of those responsible be drawn to the circumstance and an explanation called for.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Sproule, and on being put to the Meeting carried.

12. Mr. Jonklaas, with permission of the Council, withdrew the motion of which he had given notice.

13. The report of the Special Committee appointed on January 9 to define the duties of the Health Officer was submitted.

Resolved,—That the report be circulated.

14. Read report, which had been previously circulated, of the Special Committee appointed on October 15 to consider the correspondence regarding the drains in Malabar street.

15. Read report by the Special Committee appointed on August 6 to frame certain regulations in respect of laundries.

Proposed by Mr. Philip, and seconded by Mr. Sproule, that the report be adopted, and a copy thereof appended to the Minutes for future reference, together with the form annexed (Appendix A).

APPENDIX A.

*Report of the Special Committee appointed by the Municipal Council on August 6, 1898, to frame certain By-laws, and to consider suggestions to build Houses for Laundrymen and Laundries.*

This committee have had the advantage of a perusal of the report dated October 28, 1898, of the Special Committee appointed on May 14, 1898, to consider the subject of "Laundries and Dairies."

The Special Committee are of opinion that the by-laws for the regulation of laundries contained in chapter III. of Ordinance No. 1 of 1896 are fairly full and sufficient. They venture to suggest the following additional regulations:—

(1) That the "register" referred to in section 36 of the said Ordinance be submitted at every General Meeting of the Council.

(2) That the "register" referred to in section 50 of the said Ordinance be submitted at every General Meeting of the Municipal Council.

(3) That all laundry premises be inspected monthly by the District Inspector, and that a report be furnished by him in the Form B hereto annexed.

(4) That every laundryman be required, immediately upon being registered as such, and whilst his license continues in force, to have fixed in some conspicuous place, written or painted, in legible characters, his name and the words "Registered Laundryman" upon any laundry premises in respect of which he is so registered.

(5) It shall be lawful for the Municipal Council to levy a fee of "fifty cents" upon the registration of each laundryman.

The Special Committee recommend also that a rent of Rs. 2 per month be levied for each tank used by a dhoby or laundryman; and that six new washing tanks, with drying grounds, be built and prepared on the land lying to the west of the lake spill and behind the Club premises, in continuation of the existing tanks.

The Special Committee would suggest that when structural alterations or new buildings in connection with laundry premises are required, a plan showing the proposed site and a specification should in all cases be prepared by the Health Officer, or under his immediate directions, for the consideration of the Municipal Council.

Lastly, this Committee recommend that the special attention of the District Inspectors be called to the provisions of chapter III. of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896 with a view to their rigorously prosecuting laundrymen for violating any of the provisions contained in chapter III. of the said Ordinance, and of such further regulations as may hereafter be embodied in by-laws for the observance of laundrymen.

## Health Officer's Report for the Month of January, 1899.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to forward my report for the month of January.

To begin with, I may mention that I was appointed to the post of Health Officer on January 12, and that I assumed duties at once, owing to the exigencies of the occasion caused by the arrival of a large number of Burmese pilgrims into Kandy, and the necessity that arose in consequence of keeping the town in a safe and sanitary condition.

*Scavenging.*—Extra carts and men were employed to keep the houses and places occupied by the Burmese clean and in a satisfactory condition. This was done by constant and close supervision on the part of the Inspectors of the sites occupied by the pilgrims.

Although this particular work was properly carried out, yet I regret to state that the scavenging of the town, on the whole, was most unsatisfactorily performed by the contractor, who was repeatedly reported to the Chairman.

*Water Supply.*—The water supply of Kandy has been ample, and, so far as I have been able to judge, good in quality. In order, however, to be able to give a correct opinion of the quality of the water in use in the town, it is necessary that it should be analysed frequently, say at least every second or third month. To attain this purpose I should be supplied with the necessary apparatus, or the water should be sent to the Government Analyst, Colombo, whose fee for his analysis and report will have to be met by the Council. I beg the Chairman will be pleased to give this matter of water analysis his immediate and serious consideration.

*Drainage.*—The general condition of the drainage of the town is most unsatisfactory, and in some places positively dangerous to the public health. I would strongly urge on the Council the immediate necessity of having all open roadside drains cemented with as little delay as possible, a commencement being made from the railway approach road as far as the Botanical Gardens at Peradeniya, and after that has been completed the other drains should be taken in hand, so as by degrees to have all the drains in the town cemented.

*Alleys.*—The alleys in Kandy are in an extremely unsatisfactory condition, in spite of every effort on the part of the Inspectors to keep them clean. They are overcrowded, ill-ventilated, and so filthy as to be unfit for human occupation. In their present condition they are a standing menace to the public health of this town. As it appears to me that it would be impossible, despite all our efforts, to render them safe for occupation, I would urge that immediate action be taken to acquire them, one by one, as proposed by the Council and approved by Government, and to have them razed to the ground and rebuilt on approved sanitary principles. Till this is done they will remain a source of constant danger to the town.

*Dairies.*—At present there are only two dairies within the Municipal limits. Both of them are clean and well kept.

*Bakeries.*—I inspected all the bakeries, nine in number. Of these, six in my opinion were in good condition; of the others, two were not quite up to the mark, and one was badly kept. The owners of the former were warned, and that of the latter prosecuted.

*Cooly Lines.*—The cooly lines are in an insanitary condition. The set of lines on the Jail road should be removed, as the work which the coolies occupying these lines had to perform in connection with the lake no longer exists, and also as these lines are likely to prove injurious to the health of the Bogambara jail from its proximity to it. I would also suggest that the Municipal and Public Works Department lines on the railway approach road be removed to some other site further away, owing to their unpleasant proximity to such buildings as the Railway station and the new Stations Hotel. There is yet another set of cooly lines, the one near the Police station on the Hantane road, which I think had better be removed for sanitary reasons. The set of lines at Mahaiyawa and on Castle Hill are in a fair condition as regards structure and sanitation.

*Latrines.*—Such of them as I have inspected up to date have been in a fairly satisfactory condition. I find that the dry-earth used in most latrines is insufficient, and to make up for this shortcoming there appears to be an unnecessary and wasteful application of costly disinfectants. I would suggest that each latrine be provided with side accommodation for storing up large quantities of properly prepared dry-earth, not only because dry-earth is the best deodorizer, but on the ground of economy.

The private latrines or cesspits inspected by me so far were found to be foul and offensive. I shall make every reasonable effort to have these cesspits converted into dry-earth latrines.

*Public Market.*—I was shocked at the filthy condition of this market when I inspected it for the first time. The walls were bespattered with betel juice and the iron posts daubed with *chunam*; nor was this all, the occupiers of the vegetable stalls struck me as vying with each other to make their compartments as unsightly as possible by putting up partitions consisting of pieces of packing cases, old boards, gunny bags, pieces of kerosine oil tins, &c., which arrangement makes the vegetable division of the market most forbidding in appearance. This is a matter which calls for immediate attention. I would suggest that the vegetable stalls be properly separated from each other by means of boards, after the fashion of the meat and mutton stalls. As a large number of the vegetable stalls are vacant owing to the prohibitive rate of rent demanded for them, would it not be to the interests of the Council to reduce the rates, so as to induce those who now occupy open spaces to rent out the stalls? This would be an additional source of income to the Council, and would improve the general appearance of the market.

*Exposing Shed and Slaughter House.*—Both these buildings were in good order and very well kept.

*Laundries.*—I regret that I have had no time as yet to make an inspection of the laundries.

*Night Soil Depot.*—I inspected this depot on one occasion and found it in good order.

*Dry Fish Boutiques.*—I inspected all the dry fish boutiques in company with two of the Inspectors, and was pleased to find the fish in all boutiques to be of good quality.

*Infectious Diseases.*—None reported.
