### PART I: SECTION (I)—GENERAL

#### Price Orders

Food Price Order No. C. 383

SUBSIDIARY FOODSTUFFS

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 OF 1950

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices (Food), by section 4 of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Pinnaduwa Arthur Silva, Controller of Prices (Food), do by this Order—

- (i) revoke with immediate effect Food Price Order No. C. 382 dated 4th December, 1963, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 13,845 of 5th December, 1963;
- (ii) fix with immediate effect the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be an importer's maximum wholesale price per cwt. gross, a wholesale dealer's maximum wholesale price per hundredweight gross and a retail dealer's maximum retail price per pound nett to a consumer, respectively, above which the articles specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule shall not be sold within the Municipal Limits of the town of Colombo;
- (iii) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of an article specified in column 1 of the Schedule for the purpose of re-sale, or any sale of an article specified in column 1 of the Schedule in a quantity of one hundredweight gross or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of an article specified in column 1 of the Schedule, less than one hundredweight gross for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (iv) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, no person shall sell any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule which is adulterated with any other article;
- (v) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader, who has any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule in his possession or under his control at any place or in any vehicle, shall exhibit, conspicuously at that place or on that vehicle a quantity of such article in a suitable container, with the maximum prices for such article fixed by this Order displayed in figures not less than one inch in height on price tags or boards attached to such container in such a manner that the article and the maximum prices could be clearly seen by any customer;
- (vi) direct that for the purpose of this Order, "pound" or "lb." shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight;
- (vii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every person who sells any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule by wholesale shall, and every person who sells any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the date of the sale;
  - (b) the quantity of such article sold (by weight);
  - (c) the price paid for the quantity sold; and
  - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail;
- (viii) direct that when any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule is sold, the maximum prices referred to in columns 2, 3 and 4 of that Schedule shall include the price of wrapper or container, if any, in which such article is sold.

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Food Price Order No. G 1 of 1964.

MUTTON

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ACT, No. 29 of 1950

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4, read with section 3 (2) of the Control of Prices Act, No. 29 of 1950, I, Piyasena Munidasa Gamalath Seneviratne, Assistant Controller of Prices (Food) for the Administrative District of Galle, do by this Order revoke with effect from this date my Food Price Order No. G 4 of 1962 dated 5th March 1962, published in *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 12,983 of March 12, 1962—

- (i) fix with immediate effect the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto, to be the maximum prices per pound above which Mutton of the description and grade specified at the head of these columns shall not be sold within the areas specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule;
- (ii) direct that for the purpose of this Order "Mutton" shall mean the flesh of a sheep or goat but shall exclude all forms of offal, head, entrails, hooves, and such other parts as are customarily excluded in the preparation of the carcass of any animal at the slaughter house;
- (iii) direct that when Mutton is sold with bones the weight of the bones sold therewith shall not exceed 25 per cent. of the total weight sold;
- (iv) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader, who has any Mutton of the description and grade specified in the Schedule hereto in his possession or under his control at any place or in any vehicle, or any vessel, shall exhibit conspicuously at that place or on that vehicle or that vessel, a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices for Mutton of the description and grade specified in the Schedule fixed by this Order in that area;
- (v) direct that when Mutton is sold together with offal in the course of one transaction the Mutton shall be weighed and sold separately from the offal;
- (vi) direct that every trader when selling Mutton shall so place his weighing scale or scales that the purchaser of the Mutton shall be able to ascertain easily the true weight of the Mutton he purchases;

(vii) direct that every trader who sells Mutton of the description and grade mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall give the purchaser of the Mutton on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- (a) the date of the sale;
- (b) the quantity of Mutton sold (by weight);
- (c) the description of the Mutton sold; and
- (d) the price paid for the quantity of Mutton sold;

(viii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, no person shall sell Mutton which is adulterated with any other meat or flesh;

(ix) direct that when Mutton is sold the maximum prices referred to in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto, shall include the price of the wrapper or container, if any, in which such Mutton is sold;

(x) direct that for the purpose of this Order "pound" or "lb." shall be deemed to be the standard pound avoirdupois weight.
