MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, March 10, 1899.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated March 4, 1899.

Present.—Mr. F. H. Price, Chairman; Mr. H. van Cuylenburg; Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten; Mr. Allan Perry; Mr. Stanley Bois; Major L. F. Knollys, C.M.G.; Mr. F. H. Grinlinton; the Hon. Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna; Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. P. Coomaraswamy; Mr. Chas. P. Dias; Mr. Arthur Alvis; and Mr. James Peiris.

The Minutes of February 10, 1899, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,—That the Minutes of February 10, 1899, be confirmed.

1 & 2. Pursuant to notice, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy called attention to the bad state of Seabeach road and Sea street, and asked if (and when) money was voted for the repairs of these roads, and when the work will be undertaken, and moved for papers.

Mr. C. Perera seconded.

The Chairman laid the papers on the table, and stated that the necessary repairs would be undertaken immediately.

3. The following recommendation of the Standing Committee of February 24, 1899, was laid before the Council:—

Friday, February 24, 1899.

(9) Application from Mr. J. B. Rodrigo, Clerk, Assessment Department, to retire owing to ill-health.

Resolved that the Council be recommended to allow Mr. J. B. Rodrigo to retire on a pension of Rs. 435 per annum.

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted."

Mr. James Peiris seconded.—Carried unanimously.

4. A report of the Special Committee dated March 3, 1899, on the question of lighting, was laid before Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved the adoption of the report.

Mr. F. H. Grinlinton seconded.—Carried unanimously.

5. A letter No. 22 dated March 9, 1899, from the Colonial Secretary, with reference to the cost of the deviation of the road from Alutmawata to Fishers' Hill, was read.

Mr. P. Coomaraswamy moved "that the work be undertaken in pursuance of the Colonial Secretary's letter No. 16 of February 24, 1899, and subject to the explanation contained in the Chairman's letter No. 25 of March 1, 1899."

Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa seconded.—Carried unanimously.

6. A letter No. 14 of February 18, 1899, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding by-laws drafted by the Attorney-General with a view to prevent burials taking place in any other place than a general cemetery, was laid before the Council.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved "that the proposed by-laws be referred to the Special Committee appointed to revise the by-laws."

Mr. A. Alvis seconded.—Carried unanimously.

7. Papers relating to a site for the latrine proposed to be built at Slave Island were laid before Council.

Mr. J. Peiris moved "that a Horbury latrine be erected on the site selected by the Chairman and the Member for the Ward."

The Hon. Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna seconded.—Carried unanimously.

8. An application from Mr. C. A. Gunetilleke, Relieving Clerk, for a further extension of his leave for two weeks was allowed.

9. A Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to February 28, 1899, and Progress Report of Work done for February, 1899, were laid on the table.

10. Summary of the receipts and expenditure of the Health Department during 1898 was laid on the table.

11. The Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for September and October, 1898, were laid on the table.

12. The City Analyst's report on the town water for February, 1899, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.

13. Reports of Inspectors on licensed carriages, and on shops used for the sale of kerosine, poison, and gunpowder for February, 1899, were laid on the table.
