MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

MUNICIPALITY OF COLOMBO.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Colombo held in the Town Hall on Friday, April 28, 1899.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice dated April 22, 1899.

Present:—Mr. F. H. Price, Chairman; Mr. H. van Cuylenburg; the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper: Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa; Mr. Chas. Perera; Mr. Chas. P. Dias; Mr. Walter Periera; Mr. R. H. Morgan; Mr. Arthur Alvis; and Mr. James Peiris.

The Minutes of March 10, 1899, having been printed, and a copy thereof having been sent to each Member of

the Council, were taken as read.

Resolved,-That the Minutes of March 10, 1899, be confirmed.

1. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. Perera moved "that a Special Committee be appointed to consider and report upon the advisability of acquiring the land on the western side of the Maradana road, between Symond's road and Dean's road, for the purpose of widening the Maradana road at that place, and also for utilizing a portion of it for the extension of the Dean's road. extension of the Dean's road market."
Mr. C. P. Dias seconded.

The motion was carried unanimously and a Special Committee was accordingly appointed, consisting of the Chairman, Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten, Mr. F. H. Grinlinton, the Hon. Mr A. de A. Seneviratna, Mr. Chas. Perera, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy, and Mr. R. H. Morgan—three Members to form a quorum.

2. The following recommendations from the Standing Committee of March 24 and April 17, 1899, were laid before the Council :--March 24, 1899.

The Standing Committee is of opinion that the Chairman should be authorized by the Counci to (33) Re-assessment of properties. incur the expenses of a fresh valuation of all property within the Municipality in terms of section 133 of Ordinance No. 7 of 1887. E 1

April 17, 1899.

(2) Papers with reference to additional assistance to Superintendent of Works. The Committee is agreed that the staff of the Superintendent of Works ought to be increased, but is not agreed as to the nature and extent of the assistance to be granted. The Council should be advised to appoint a Special Committee to consider the matter.

Mr. James Peiris moved "that the recommendation contained in the foregoing Minutes of the Standing

Committee of March 24, 1899, be adopted.

The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper seconded.—Carried unanimously.

Mr. C. P. Dias moved "that the recommendation contained in the foregoing Minutes of the Standing Committee of April 17, 1899, be adopted, and that a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, the Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper, Mr. F. H. Grinlinton, the Hon. Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna, Mr. Chas. Perera, Mr. P. Coomaraswamy, Mr. R. H. Morgan, and Mr. James Peiris—three Members to form a quorum—be appointed to consider the matter.

The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper seconded.—Carried unanimously.

3. The Supplemental Budget No. 1 for 1899, approved by the Standing Committee on March 24, 1899, was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.

Mr. A. Alvis moved "that the Supplemental Budget No. 1 for 1899 be sanctioned."

The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper seconded.—Carried unanimously.

- 4. A letter No. 26/04747 of March 20, 1899, from the Colonial Secretary, with reference to the cost of the deviation of the road from Alutmawata to Fishers' Hill, was read.
- 5. The Chairman's Administration Report for 1898 was laid before the Council, having been previously printed and circulated.
- Mr. C. P. Dias moved "that the report be referred to a Special Committee consisting of Dr. J. L. Vanderstraaten, Major L. F. Knollys, Mr. F. H. Grinlinton, the Hon. Mr. A. de A. Seneviratna, Mr. Chas. Perera, Mr. Arthur Alvis, and M. James Peiris—three Members to form a quorum.

The Hon. Mr. F. A. Cooper seconded.—Carried unanimously.

6. With reference to the question of gratuity to P. R. Sathyanaden, Assistant Shroff, Mr. C. Perera moved "that a gratuity of Rs. 240 be paid to Mr. Sathyanaden."
Mr. M. I. M. Haniffa seconded.—Carried unanimously.

- 7. A Statement of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to March 31, 1899, and a Progress Report of of Work done for March, 1899, were laid on the table.
 - 8. The Auditor-General's remarks on the accounts for November, 1898, were laid on the table.
- 9. The City Analyst's report on the town water for March, 1899, was laid on the table, having been previously printed and circulated.
- 10. Reports of Inspectors on licensed carriages, and on shops used for the sale of kerosine, poison, and gunpowder for March, 1899, were laid on the table.
- 11. A letter dated April 19, 1899, from the Honorary Secretary, Colombo Lawn Club, requesting permission to build a small pavilion in the club grounds at the Victoria park, was laid before the Council.

Mr. C. Perera moved "that the permission applied for be granted."

MUNICIPALITY OF KANDY.

Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall on Saturday, March 18, 1899, at 8.30 o'clock a.m., in accordance with Notice dated March 13.

Present:-Hon, Mr. Allanson Bailey, Chairman; J. H. Sproule, Esq.; E. Beven, Esq.; C. Vanderwall, Esq.; A. Philip, Esq.; L. Creasy, Esq.; Dr. J. Craib.

The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on February 18 were read and confirmed.

2. The following documents were submitted:—Statements of Receipts and Disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund, and Water-rate Account from close of 1898 to February 28, 1899; Progress Report of Work done brought up to the same date; Returns of Cases instituted by the several Inspectors during the month of February; and Health Officer's Report for same month.

Resolved,—That the several statements be forwarded, together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 90 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, to the Colonial Secretary, for publication in the

Government Gazette, as also the Health Officer's report.

- 3. A statement of tolls collected by the several collectors on behalf of the Municipal Council up to the end of February was laid on the table, also return showing duties of Police during February,
 - 4. The following correspondence was submitted and read:-

Registration of Deaths in Town.

(a) Letter No. 10, dated February 18, from Colonial Secretary, forwarding draft of by-laws to prevent burials taking place in any other place than a general cemetery.

Mr. Sproule pointed out that by-law No. 1 under chapter XVIII., Ordinance No. 19 of 1896, was similar

to the proposed by law (a).

Proposed by Mr. J. H. Sproule, seconded by Mr. A. Philip, that the letter and connected papers be referred to a Special Committee consisting of Messrs. Beven, Vanderwall, and Sproule; that Mr. Sproule be authorized Improvement of Alleys.

> (b) Letter No. 11, dated February 20, from the Colonial Secretary, stating that the report of the new Committee appointed to deal with alleys is awaited.

The Chairman stated that a meeting of the Committee had been fixed for the 25th instant to consider the information collected as to the value of the alleys proposed to be taken.

Auditor.

(c) Letter No. 12, dated February 22, from the Colonial Secretary, stating that Mr. John Guthrie had been appointed as Auditor of the accounts of the Municipality for 1899.

Minutes of Proceedings.

(d) Letter No. 13, dated March 2, from Colonial Secretary, acknowleding receipt of Minutes of Proceedings of Meeting of January 21 and connected papers.

Exemption of School Buildings from Municipal Rates.

(e) Letter No. 14, dated March 2, from Colonial Secretary, forwarding memorial from the Standing Committee, Educational Association, requesting that Municipalities may have power to exempt from payment of rates all buildings appropriated to educational purposes.

Proposed by Mr. E. Beven, seconded by Mr. A. Philip, that the Colonial Secretary be informed in reply that the Municipal Council of Kandy approves of the proposal that all buildings appropriated to educational purposes be exempted. Dharma Lines, Deyannewella.

- (f) Memorandum dated March 17, from the Colonial Secretary, forwarding copy of letter No. 145, dated March 16, to the Government Agent, conveying the sanction of the Governor to the dharma lines at Deyannewella being utilized as a house of shelter for destitute people within the Municipality of Kandy, and requesting him to hand over the buildings.
- 5. Read report by Mr. L. Creasy, Provincial Engineer, dated March 3, on the report on, and survey of, by the Superintendent of Works, Lady Anderson's road.

 Proposed by Mr. Philip, seconded by Mr. Sproule, that Rs. 250 be paid to the Superintendent of Works,

but it is not to form a precedent.

On being put to the Meeting the motion was carried.

- 6. Resolved,—That the question of additional roads, as suggested by Mr Creasy, within the Municipality be referred to a Special Committee consisting of the Chairman, Messrs. Vanderwall, Philip, and Creasy.
- 7. Read letter dated March 2 from the Health Officer, forwarding a report by the Chief Inspector on premises along Peradeniya road, where cesspits exist, and recommending, on sanitary grounds, that the cesspits be closed and dry-earth closets substituted.

The following is the list of premises:-

Peradeniya Road.

Nos. 114 to 117, 118 to 121, 123, 124, 126, 127, 128, 129, 132, 133, 135 to 137, 140, 141 to 143, 145, 146, 147, 149, 150, 151, 152, 153, 154, 155, 156, 167 to 171, 172 to 175, 176, 177, 179, 181 to 184, 185, and 186.

No privies on premises Nos. 118, 121, 125, 148, 187, 188, 189.

Proposed by Mr. Vanderwall, seconded by Mr. Sproule, that special authority be granted to the Chairman, in accordance with section 209 of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887, as amended by section 33 of the Ordinance No. 1 of 1896, to require the owners or occupiers of the said premises to close the cesspits and to substitute dry-earth closets therefor.

The motion was carried.

8. Read the following recommendation by the Standing Committee:—That the salaries of the Inspectors, subordinate to the Chief Inspector, be fixed at Rs. 70 per mensem.

Proposed by Mr. Vanderwall, seconded by Mr. Philip, that the recommendation be adopted.

On being put to the Meeting the motion was carried nem. con.

In accordance with notice, Dr. Craib asked—(1) Why the drain on the station approach road from post box at Katukele down to the cemented portion of same drain is permitted to remain in such a dangerous and insanitary condition as to be positively dangerous to the public health?

Reply,—The drains cannot be kept in a sanitary condition until they are paved. Council has no funds to pave them. A loan has been asked for and promised by the Government. The work is postponed until a scheme has been settled by the Director of the Public Works Department for the re-sewering of Kandy.

Surveys have been made with this object under the instructions of the Director.

The Chairman added that at a Meeting of the Standing Committee to day the Superintendent of Works was instructed to make an estimate of cost of building drains where urgently required, as pointed out by the Health Officer.

Dr. Craib asked-(2) Why the same condition obtains in other drains which he has noticed near the exposing cattle shed and in some other portions of the Peradeniya road?

The Chairman stated that the reply was the same as to the last question.

The Chairman ruled the latter portion of the next question, of which Dr. Craib had given notice, to be out of order, because an opinion was expressed. That portion of the question was therefore omitted, and Dr. Craib asked why the cooly lines at Bogambara, near the jail, and those close to the Grand Hotel and the railway, belonging, which he believed, to the Public Works Department and Municipality, are permitted to remain there.

Reply.—The lines near the jail are only temporary, allowed to be erected for coolies engaged on the lake improvement, and will be removed as soon as possible after the work is completed. The lines near the Grand Hotel have been in existence—the Municipal ones for nearly thirty years and the Public Works Department for about

fifteen years, and there had been no complaint of ill effects.

11. Dr. Craib, in accordance with notice, asked—Why the drain passing behind the Grand Hotel and onwards to and under the railway ground has not been kept clean and clear of accumulations of dead vegetable matter, which is to be seen scattered along its bed?

Reply.—The Superintendent of Works reports that the side drain has been recently cleared of all brushwood

and accumulations of vegetable matter burned.

12. Mr. Philip, in pursuance of notice, asked—Which Municipal Inspector is responsible for the sanitary condition of King street? what were the numbers of the police constables in charge of the beat, which includes King street, during February and to date? and moved that the scavenging contractor be called for an explanation as to why the scavenging carts have not been properly supervised for the past month or two.

Reply—Inspector of the eastern end of King street (from Castle Hill street to Old Palace) Mr. Senanayeke;

Inspector of western end of King street (from Castle Hill street to Brownrigg street) Mr. Abeyratne.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Vanderwall and carried.

The Chairman stated that a letter had been written to the Superintendent of Police on 15th instant asking for the information. Reply not received yet.

Letter dated 17th instant from the scavenging contractor giving explanation was submitted and read.

13. In accordance with notice, Mr. Philip asked—What reply has been received in respect to the absence of constables in the town as indicated on the early morning of January 23, and moved for papers.

Motion seconded by Mr. Beven.

Reply.—A letter was written to the Superintendent of Police, who had asked, in reply, for further information as to the route taken on January 23.

Mr. Philip has been written to for information required.

The motion was carried, and the letters were laid on the table.

14. Mr. Philip, pursuant to notice, asked-What explanation had been obtained regarding the want of lights on the lamp-posts in the town on the early morning of January 23, 1899.

The motion was seconded by Dr. Craib.

Reply.—The explanation by Mr. Dehigama, who supervises the street lamps, is as follows:—

- "As directed lamps are not lighted four nights before the full moon. The full moon being on January 27, the 23rd was the fourth night before full moon.'
- 15. Mr. Philip, in accordance with notice, inquired what is being done with reference to Fairieland bungalow acquired some time ago in connection with the water supply, and moved for papers. This was seconded by Mr. Beven.

Reply.—The transfer of the Fairieland bungalow has not yet been signed. Mr. Shelton Agar, the owner, applied for permission to remain in the bungalow for a time owing to the ill-health of his son. He has now stated he will leave at the end of this month.

The motion was carried, and the papers were laid on the table.

16. Mr. Philip, in pursuance of notice, inquired, with reference to minute 13 of the Proceedings of the Municipal Council held on November 19, why there still remain considerable patches of land covered with sunflower and other noisome vegetation, and moved that steps be persistently taken to render permanent the immense improvement that has taken place on the lines already indicated on sanitary grounds.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Beven and carried.

The Chairman stated that notices were issued on owners of properties concerned. When not attended to prosecutions have been entered.

Proposed by Mr. Philip, seconded by Mr. Vanderwall, that the attention of Government be drawn to the resolution forwarded on January 8, 1898, on the subject of the Kandy General Post Office, and that a reply be

The Chairman submitted letter dated March 26, 1898, acknowledging the receipt of his letter inviting attention to the previous letter forwarding copy of the resolution referred to.

The motion on being put to the Meeting was carried.

18. Mr. Philip, with reference to minute 6 of the Proceedings of the Meeting of the Municipal Council held on December 19, 1898, moved "that the plans prepared by the Provincial Engineer, referred to in the Chairman's reply, be laid on the table, together with estimate of cost, and an interim account giving details of the expenditure of Rs. 32,842.82 for improving and widening Victoria Drive, and the removal of silt."

The motion was seconded by Dr. Craib and carried.

The Chairman stated that no plans have been received from the Provincial Engineer, who reports that for want of a draughtsman the plans and estimates had not been completed. The accounts received were laid on the table, with a summary showing total amount expended (1) on clearing silt; and (2) on the improvement of the road round the lake.

Mr. Creasy added that the widening of the bridges had not been provided for in the original estimates, but he

had collected data for framing estimates.

19. In accordance with notice, Mr. Philip inquired whether the balance at credit of the consolidated rate for police and lighting as at December 31, 1898, has now been placed in fixed deposit with a bank at highest rate of interest obtainable, as desired and determined by the Municipal Council, and moved for papers.

Reply.—The balance has not been placed in fixed deposit, as it had to be drawn upon to meet the overdraft on the General Revenue Account. The balance at present at the credit of the Municipal Fund is Rs. 2,897.93. The

overdraft was caused by expenditure on drains, for which a loan is to be obtained from Government.

20. Report of the Special Committee appointed on February 18 to make arrangements for the erection of the hospitals and camps necessary in case of any outbreak of plague was submitted and read.

Proposed by Mr. Philip, seconded by Mr. Beven, that the report be adopted.

The motion was carried.

21. Read report by the Special Committee appointed to define the duties of the Health Officer. Resolved,-That the report stand over for consideration at the next Meeting.

22. The Chairman stated that his Administration Report had been prepared and forwarded to be printed. Proposed by Mr. Philip, seconded by Mr. Beven, that the report be referred to a Special Committee, with instructions to suggest observations to be appended thereto in terms of section 80 (c) of the Ordinance No. 7 of 1887. and that the following Members be requested to serve (two to form a quorum):—Messrs. E. Beven, Chas. Vanderwall, W. D. Gibbon, J. H. Sproule, and A. Philip.

The motion on being put to the Meeting was carried. Mr. Sproule to convene the meetings.

Health Officer's Report for the Month of February, 1899.

SIR,—I HAVE the honour to forward my report for the month of February.

Scavenging.—The scavenging of the town, as compared with the preceding month, was satisfactorily carried out, as will appear from statements made by some of the Inspectors. The Chief Inspector writes in his monthly report to me "that the scavenging was carried out more efficiently during February," and Messrs Ferdinands and Abeyratne write to the same effect. Mr. Ferdinands states, "that the scavenging of his district has been done fairly well, and that better carts and bulls are being used for the work." Mr. Abeyratne writes, "that the scavenging of his district was satisfactory during the month, and that no occasion was given for complaint." I can support these statements from daily personal observation.

Water Supply.—The water supply has been ample, notwithstanding the severe drought we are now experiencing. I have written to the Chairman for authority to purchase a Burrough's and Wellcome's analyzing apparatus, in case it is in the market, at a reasonable price. I hope to be able to make a monthly analysis of the Kandy water, if the

Chairman will be pleased to purchase this apparatus for the benefit of the Municipality.

Drainage.—The condition of the drains, more especially those that are uncemented, remains as unsatisfactory as when I reported upon it last month. I had most of the worst ones cleared out and disinfected two or three times a week by the scavenging contractor under the immediate supervision of the Chief Inspector, from whose monthly report I beg to be allowed to make an extract for the information of the Council. He writes: "Most of the unbuilt drains that required immediate attention were cleared by the scavenging contractor, although this was not a portion of his contract. They were also disinfected by him, the Council supplying the disinfectants. The following portions of the roadside drains should be taken in hand at once and built, as most of them are near standposts, and therefore, unless built, will always remain a source of annoyance in cleanliness and a positive source of danger." The Chief Inspector measured out the following drains which require immediate attention :-

No. 1.—Drain behind the Public Works Department lines in railway approach road leading to the stream; this drain is about 330 ft. long.

No. 2.—Railway approach drain leading to the stream near railway workshop, about 81 ft. long.

No. 3.—Drain from junction of railway approach road and Peradeniya road as far as the back of Church

Missionary Society's School and further on up to the cooly lines at Deyannewella, about 300 ft. long. No. 4.—Drain at junction of Halloluwa road and Peradeniya road as far down as Wesleyan Girls' Industrial

School, 692 ft. long.

No. 5.—Drain from standpost near exposing shed onwards to the length of about 619 ft.

No. 6.—Drain from near Mrs. De Soysa's house towards Kandy, about 277 ft. in length.

No. 7.—Drain from house lately occupied by Jacobsamy Pasha in the Kandy direction, about 298 ft. in length.

No. 8.—Drain by Military Hospital and Victoria Drive, of about 300 ft. in length.

I had the above drains selected and measured out for the information of the Chairman, so that steps may be taken to have them built up and cemented by degrees and as early as possible.

Alleys.—These continue much in the same unsatisfactory condition as when I last reported upon them.

I beg that in view of the prevalence of plague so close to us in India no time be lost in having the drains and alleys of this town rebuilt on approved sanitary principles, for until this is done the town of Kandy will remain insanitary. The Inspectors have done good work in having most of the alleys disinfected and limewashed during the month, which is about all we can do. I have issued instructions to the Inspectors to have this done as frequently as possible.

Houses and Gardens.-Most of the smaller houses and their gardens were limewashed and cleared of rubbish and undergrowth. To effect this 151 notices were served on the occupants of these houses, and I am glad to say the larger portion of them gave no trouble. Those who refused to comply with the notices served on them will be prosecuted.

Latrines.—The public latrines were well kept. In this connection I may mention that I have written to the Council for sanction to close up a number of cesspits and to have dry-earth latrines substituted for them.

Dairies.—Only two in Kandy. Both are in a fairly satisfactory condition.

Bakeries.—Nine in number. All in good working order now.

Cooly Lines.—Those within the Municipality are still in an insanitary condition, with the exception of the one in Mahaiyawa and the set of lines by the railway approach road, belonging to the Municipality. With one or two exceptions the cooly lines within Municipal limits should be removed, as I look upon them with suspicion on sanitary

Public Market.—I am glad to see the market being painted and cleaned up. I hope that as soon as this work has been completed the vegetable stalls will receive the attention I called for with regard to them in my last report.

Exposing Shed and Slaughter House.—Well kept, and in a good and sanitary condition.

Laundries .- In fairly good order.

Dry Fish Boutiques.—Well kept, and the dry fish exposed for sale was sound and fit for food.

Health of the Town.—This has been exceptionally good. Beyond a few cases of measles and chickenpox I have not heard of any sickness worth mentioning.
