WANTED BY THE POLICE.

GORAKADUWEGE AGORIS; charged with robbery and hurt at Ihalakimbiya on January 8, 1899; is a Sinhalese of the Goigama caste; religion, Buddhist; occupation, cultivator; age, about 20 years; height, about 5 ft. 6 in.; make, thin; complexion, dark; nose, short; mouth, broad; teeth, regular; eyes, large, dark, round; hair, black, tied with a piece of cloth; head, round; face, broad; hands, long, rather lean; birthplace and general residence, Ihalakimbiya in Gangaboda patty, Galle District; is unmarried; has five members in the family; mother, Tuduwege Lokuhamy; sister, Gorakaduvege Babahamy; brother, Gorakaduvege Kalu Appu; is well known to the Vidane Arachchi of Kimbiya, C. W. Porolis, shoolmaster, and to the Police Officer of Ihalakimbiya. The Police Magistrate of Galle has issued warrant No. 3,267 for his arrest.

Babunhamy alias Malhamy; charged with voluntarily causing hurt with a club to one Abdul Rahaman alias Kirihamy on January 23, 1899 at Nilambe; is a Sinhalese of the Goigama caste; religion, Buddhist; occupation, carter; age, about 27 years; height, 5 ft. 3 in.; make, stout; complexion, dark brown; eyes, black and oval; hair, long, tied in a knot; wears slight moustaches and beard; has a black scar on the right side of the nose; birthplace, said to be at Udispattu; haunts Hindagalla, Kandy, Talawakele, Hatton, and Padiapelle; is well known to Kimal Baas and Abdul Rahaman alias Kirihamy, both of Hindagalla, and to P. C. 956 A. Carrim of Getambe. The Police Magistrate of Kandy has issued warrant No. 10,810 for his arrest.
