President Ranil Wickremesinghe presenting the Government's policy statement in Parliament yesterday (3) stated that he would take measures to establish a People's Assembly in order to decide which social and political reforms should

be implemented. President Wickremesinghe said that a mechanism to obtain views of all interested parties is being prepared through the People's Assembly through the consultation of political parties, various organizations etc.

"I specially invite the youth engaged in activism and youth who

are not to provide their views," he added.

"People's Assembly is a fully independent body with the Government only providing the necessary resources. The Government has no influence on its functions or decisions. We decide in consultation with various parties, regarding the

composition of the People's Assembly." the President said.

President Wickremesinghe also said that he is willing to establish a National Assembly consisting of political party leaders. "For the next steps, we will be able to arrange a programme with a common minimum programme

with the consent of all, through the National Assembly." He also observed that measures are being taken to establish the Parliamentary Sectoral Oversight Committees immediately where all the political parties will have the opportunity to work together.

President Wickremesinghe reiter-

ated the importance of an All-Party Government be formed with the support of all the parties.President Wickremesinghe also said that he would implement a national policy to combat bribery and corruption. SLPP PS member's murder: Planned in Dubai

There has been suspicion that the murder of SLPP Kotikawatte - Mulleriyawa PS member Sumudu Rukshan, was a plan of the powerful underworld gangsters operating from Dubai.

It is based on the information revealed during the investigation regarding a house raid in Angoda Delgahawatte on October 26, 2021 and shooting at two people who were sleeping in that house.

Police information revealed that a special police team had informed the member that there was a threat to his life from the underworld criminal named

Although the police managed to arrest several people involved in the murder, they have not been able to arrest the main criminal named Jile.

Police investigations had revealed that

Jile was a close associate of the criminal named Harak Kata and he had fled to Dubai after the shooting in Delgahawatte. Jila had shot and killed an associate of Angoda Lokka in Delgahawatte. Police information revealed that after Angoda Lokka was killed in India, there is a competition between several underworld gangsters to grab power in the Angoda and the surrounding areas Jila was reportedly involved in demanding money from businessmen in the area by intimidating them.

Investigation teams have received information that this criminal had an argument with the victim while he was staying in this country. Later the victim (Councillor) had attacked him. The incident happened in front of the house where the councillor resided at Ambatale Junction.

SJB National Organizer Tissa Attanayaka said the objective of this meeting is to discuss important matters pertaining to the country's main issue of solving the existing economic crisis to bring a solutions to the escalating price increase of essential food and commodity

"There was a decrease in the amount of money sent in the past, but there is an increase in July. We were able to buy oil, gas and medicine because of this money. That is why we made a request to give them the support you can to solve the problem in the country," he said. While some sent money through methods such as Undial Hawala, the people who love the country sent their Dollars, Yen and Dinars through banks themselves. The basic needs of the people of this country could be fulfilled with those dollar reserves. Therefore, with the full agreement of the Cabinet, our Ministry, the Finance Ministry and the Central Bank together

made a proposal to the Cabinet to increase the remittances.

A person who has been abroad for so long and stayed for less than 90 days was entitled to a duty relief of one hundred and eighty seven dollars and fifty cents upon his return to Sri Lanka. One year is six hundred and twenty five dollars. If more than one year, one thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars. This relief is available whether dollars are sent to Sri Lanka or not.

While this duty concession remains as it is, if at least two thousand four hundred dollars have been sent to the country in less than ninety days, the duty concession will be increased by six hundred dollars to seven hundred and

eighty seven dollars under the silver category. If it is one year, one thousand two hundred and twenty five and if it is more than two thousand three hundred and fifty dollars, the duty concession is enti-

"If four thousand eight hundred dollars have been sent, it will be 1,175, 1,585 and 2,710. If 7,200 have been sent, it will increase to 1,627, 2,065, 3,190. If at least 12,000 dollars have been sent, under the Gold Plus category, you will get a duty relief of 2,587, 3,025 and 4,150 dollars. If you send 24000 per year, it will increase by 20% and increase by 4,800 dollars. Accordingly, the duty relief will be at least 4,985, 5,425 and 6,550 dol-

lars. But the maximum ever found was only 1,750,"he added.

The second proposal is to send any foreign money to Sri Lanka through a bank and give a license to import vehicles to any Sri Lan-

With the current situation in the country, vehicles are not allowed to be imported to Sri Lanka in any way. That is why a vehicle import licence is introduced for foreign workers as the second proposal.

Here, if you have sent more than 3,000 dollars to your own or a relative's account through a bank, they can buy an electric motorcycle for half of the money sent. US\$ 3,000 is the lowest value. This permission is not available for three-

wheelers. Accordingly, electric vehicles are allowed to be imported from USD 20,000 to a maximum of USD 65,000. These imported vehicles should be in the running range of 300-500. It has to be charged by the solar power system and it has to be prepared or imported by oneself. These vehicles are not allowed

to be charged by the national system. This is expected to achieve the main objectives of increasing the import of dollars into the country and reducing the withdrawal of dollars abroad, without affecting the mainstream and protecting the environment. Army personnel together with the Road Development Authority officers were engaged in removing soil and branches of trees, which had fallen onto roads, to clear them for vehicular traffic from yesterday morning.

risk of more such incidents. A house in Hatton had been severely damaged as a mound of earth fell onto it around 2.30am yesterday. More such incidents had been reported near the Woodland area in the Hatton-Colombo road. Several estate houses in Hatton had also been damaged when a tree fell on them.

Two spill gates of the Upper

gates of the Polgolla Dam of the Mahaveli Reservoir had been opened and the people have been asked to be vigilant of the rising water levels. The volume of water in Ravana and Ella waterfalls have increased due to heavy rains, and the people, who travel on the roads in front of them, have also been asked to be vigilant.

According to the Disaster Management Centre (DMC) Situation Report yesterday morning, a total of 12,289 people belonging to 3,037 families in the Jaffna, Nuwara Eliya, Kandy, Matale, Galle and Hambantota Districts have been affected due to heavy rains, high winds, floods, and landslides from Monday, About 2,374 people belonging to 485 families have been evacuated to safe locations. Three people had died and another four people were still missing. About 326 houses had been partially damaged.

The Meteorology Department said the maximum rainfall of 212mm was reported in Canyon, Nuwara Eliya in the 24 hours ended last morning.

"Showery and windy conditions are expected to continue in the western and southern sea areas and in the southwest quarter of the island due to the active Southwest Monsoon," the Department said.

Its weather forecast for today predicted that showers or thundershowers would occur in the Western, Sabaragamuwa, Central, and North-Western provinces and in the Galle and Matara districts. "Heavy rainfalls above 100 mm can be expected at some places in Sabaragamuwa province and in Kandy, Nuwara-Eliva, Galle and Matara districts. Several spells of showers may occur in Northern and North-Central provinces. Very strong winds about 60 kmph can be expected at times along the western slopes of the Central hills

while strong winds about 50 kmph can be expected at times in the Northern, North-central, Western, North-western and Southern provinces," the weather bulletin said.

It also advised against venturing into fishing and naval activities in the sea areas off the coast extending from Mannar to Pottuvil via Puttalam, Colombo, Galle and Hambantota until further notice.

"The sea areas off the coast extending from Mannar to Pottuvil via Puttalam, Colombo, Galle and Hambantota will be very rough at times. The sea areas off the coast extending Puttalam to Batticaloa via Mannar, Kankasanthurai and Trincomalee will be rough at times. The other sea areas around the island will be moderate. There is a possibility to increase swell waves (about 2.5 - 3.5 m) in the sea areas off the coast extending from Mannar to Pottuvil via Puttalam, Colombo, Galle and Hambantota," the Department added.

Among the arrested were the driver of the fuel bowser and his assistant and they are employees of the relevant company. Two other individuals, who are sales managers of a reputed insurance and electronic items

company, have also been arrested for their involvement in the racket.

The fuel bowser had been released from the Muthurajawela Storage Complex documenting that it was to be sent to a factory in the Free Trade Zone in Katunayake. The raid was made following a tipoff received by the Police. The Police said the racket had been continuing for a long time and some corrupt officials of the CPC had also helped it.

The Ceylon Petroleum Corporation (CPC) has entered into a one year agreement for the supply of jet fuel to the country. Under this agreement the first jet fuel shipment will reach Colombo on August 12.

CPC sources added that moves are under way to bring more petrol and diesel ship loads soon. An advanced payment for both these shipments has already been made, CPC sources said.

CPC trade unions however claimed that there was no need of importing jet fuel as it can be produced locally with the recommencing of the operations at the crude oil refinery, which has been inactive for certain period due to non-availability of crude oil. The government should implement a mechanism to supply crude oil continuously to the refinery, Union representatives noted.

The first U.S. Capitol riot defendant convicted at trial was sentenced to more than seven years in prison Monday, the longest punishment handed down to date over the January 6, 2021, attack on Congress.

Guy Reffitt, a recruiter for the right-wing Three Percenters movement in Texas, was convicted March 8 of five felony offenses, including obstruction of Congress as it met to certify the 2020 election result, interfering with police and carrying a firearm to a riot, and threatening his teenage son, who turned him into the FBI. Prosecutors said Reffitt led a mob while armed at the Capitol and asked a judge to sentence him to 15 years after applying a terrorism sentencing penalty.

a press brief held in Colombo on President Ranil Wickremesinghe's policy statement presented to the House yesterday (3). Dissanayake said that inviting to be a part of Wickremesinghe - Rajapaksa camp is not the essence of an All-Party Government.

Dissanayake pointed out that President Ranil Wickremesinghe has not announced a time frame for the all-party government he is calling to form.

Dissanayake noted that in all the proposals presented by the Mahanayaka Theras and the Bar Association requested to establish an Interim Government only for a short period of time.

Dissanayake further stated that the President has not stated the responsibility assigned to this interim government, the role of that government and how long the interim government will be limited to and thus, he noted that the NPP would not support such an allparty government.

Meanwhile, Sri Lanka Freedom Party General Secretary MP Dayasiri Jayasekara said that the Throne Speech delivered by President Ranil Wickremesinghe yesterday is a moderate statement made by a President after a long time.

Jayasekara also stated that he believes that the contents included in it will not be limited to mere words.

"The President's speech included the issues faced by the public. I have known President Wickremesinghe over a long period and having been the Prime Minister of this country on several occasions, I believe that his policy statement included many ideas he had in his head for a long time that he would implement in the event he became President. However, it is easier said than done. Therefore, we sincerely hope as the SLFP, that the President would succeed in implementing the ideas that he has presented through his policy state-

With regard to the formation of an All-Party Government, Jayasekara said that the SLFP believes that it will happen very soon.

"This is something that we have been saying over a long time. As a party, our party Leader Maithripala Sirisena and the rest of the party will discuss this matter and we will take a collective decision on whether or not we could join the government," he said.

Leader of the Tamil Progressive Alli**ance Mano Ganesan** said in order to uplift the country, the national issue must be addressed first and foremost.

"What we need is to highlight our Sri Lankan nationality and not to highlight religion, race or divisions based on these divisions. This was highlighted in the President's speech and I am happy about it."

MP Ganesan said the speech highlighted the need to unite as Sri Lankans while the statement had nothing prompting divisions, which was a welcome sign.

However, MP Ganesan said that the most vital factor is that the contents of the policy statement should be implemented. He also said that as a party to the SJB led alliance, his party had the freedom to take decisions independently. However, he said that discussions were being continued with the SJB on supporting the President and his government. "We have urged the SJB leadership to look at this policy statement positively," he added.

SJB parliamentarian Dr. Rajith Senaratne said the Samagi Janabalawegaya will continue to discuss further on whether or not they would support President Ranil Wickremesinghe's government,

Speaking to the media subsequent to the parliamentary activities yesterday, he said that President Ranil Wickremesinghe had presented in his policy statement the same vision he had from the start of his political journey. He said that he had to face many obstacles as a result.

Senaratne noted that if the President can implement the policies that he presented in his policy statement, that would be an ideal situation.

SJB Parliamentarian Mujibur Rahuman said that most of the contents in the policy statement presented by President Ranil Wickremesinghe is in tune with the policies of the 2015 and 2019 'Good Governance' regime policies. "In his policy statement, President Ranil



"We have been blessed with an ancient legacy not only religiously, culturally and socially, but also economically. It has been nurtured by different cultures. That is how the concept of "Satharawaram Deviwais related to Buddhist culture. Today, we are entrusted with the responsibility of building the future based on these ancient legacies.'

"I took over a country that was in disaster. Severe economic crisis on one side, massive public opposition on the other. However, I decided to accept this critical challenge, on behalf of my people and the country, based on the premise that it is my duty to light even one lamp for the country

rather than cursing the darkness." "Today we are facing an unprecedented situation that our country had never faced in recent history. We are in great danger. The country could extricate and be secured from that danger, only if we all face this challenge together as one people. "Therefore, I once again request all parties representing the people in this Parliament to unite in the formation of an All-Party Government. I respectfully extend the hand of friendship to all of you. I confidently invite you to put aside the past and come together for the sake of the country. I have already initiated discussions with political parties in forming an All-Party Government."

"Certain parties had declared that they would consider my programme and give their consent to form the All-Party Government. I wish to make my observations in this regard. An All-Party Government is not a government that acts on the sole opinion of one party. It is a government that comprises the views of all parties

"We need to move towards longterm solutions in order to overcome these difficulties. A strong foundation needs be laid as not to repeat this kind of economic crisis in our country. The economy should be modernized. Economic stability should be established and transformed into a competitive export economy. In this context, we are now preparing the necessary reports, plans, rules and regulations, laws and programmes.

"I now seek to explain the planning framework which will be the basis for the country's future journey. Within this framework, detailed information about the programmes we are implementing will be presented through the Interim Budget and the 2023 Budget to be presented to the Parlia-

"As a preliminary step, we initiated negotiations with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) on a four year programme. We would continue those

From the ancient times, Sri Lanka was known worldwide as a major economic hub located on the Maritime Silk Road (MSR), and was identified as the 'Granary of the East'. Sri Lanka was the centre that distributed rice from the entire region across the world.'

'Our ultimate goal is to re-establish that past legacy to create a strong and developed green economy. It has been recognized that climate change is a monumental issue facing the future world. We need to create a strong economy that can address climate change. As King Parakramabahu said, we should ensure that we do not waste even a single drop of water that falls from the sky.'

"As a result of the economic crisis we are facing today, the income disparity in the society is widening. The middle class is shrinking. On the other hand, businesses and industries are facing serious challenges,

"The amount of remittances sent by migrant workers to Sri Lanka has dropped, for several reasons. With the Covid epidemic, much employment was terminated, and people's travel abroad for jobs became limited. "Our aim is to create a surplus in the primary budget by the year 2025. Our effort is to raise the economic growth rate to a stable stage, in order to establish a solid economic foundation by the year 2026. Currently, public debt is 140 percent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP). Our plan is to bring this down to less than 100 percent by the year 2032."

"If we build the country, the nation and the economy through the national economic policy, we would be able to become a fully developed country by the year 2048, when we celebrate the 100th anniversary of independence.

"When I draw long-term plans in this manner some ridicule me. Yes, I am not like other politicians. I have long-term plans. My planning in not for my own betterment, but for the young generation of today. I clearly know that I would not eat the fruit of the tree that I plant. But tomorrow, our children of the future generations will enjoy the fruit."

"I would also like to make special reference on the foreign policy of our country. Due to the instability of the foreign policy, we faced many disadvantages and setbacks in the international arena. I will change this situation. All countries of the world are our friends. We have no enemies. We do not belong to any group. I will ensure the adoption of a cordial and friendly foreign policy with all countries.'

"I have already emphasized that a number of social and political reforms should be made in parallel with the economic growth policies in order to build a prosperous Sri Lanka. The people of the country are looking forward to an extensive political reform

An office to protect peaceful protesters

"I do not allow violence and terrorism. However will protect non-violence and democracy.

"Peaceful struggle is a fundamental right. I accept those rights."

"Some groups are trying to spread a huge propaganda through social media that I am hunting down the protesters. But it is not true. I will not allow any kind of prejudice to the peaceful activists. I will establish an office to protect the peaceful protesters and support them."

"If any injustice occurs to a peaceful activist, that person can call the 24 hour dedicated line and file a complaint. A Committee headed by a retired judge will examine the complaints and take necessary measures, accordingly."

"If there are individuals who have participated in such illegal activities either unknowingly or due to the influence of others, a plan will be prepared to act sympathetically towards them."

"However, if there are individuals who intentionally violate the law and engage in violent and terrorist acts, legal action will be taken against them. I will not allow anyone to act outside the law. The law is the same for you, me and everyone.

"The law will be applied equally to the people who attacked the peaceful protesters on May 9 and those who are engaging in violence and terrorism under the guise of the struggle. I will ensure that there is no political intervention in this process.

"There are groups spreading violence near fuel stations. Complaints are being received about people breaking the queue by force, without allowing the people who have been in the queue for days to obtain fuel. Such unruly conduct cannot be allowed. The limited amount of fuel that we can provide must be fairly distributed. I have directed the Inspector General of Police to strictly enforce the law against people who interfere with queues."

"A number of major Buddhist and Hindu religious festivals are held in the month of August. These festivals are one of the reasons for increasing the tourist arrivals in this month. Although, some groups are trying to disrupt these festivals by creating a turbulent background in the country. The security forces are keeping an eye on such behaviour. I request everyone not to fall into such traps that contribute to destroying the future of the country.

"Currently, places have been allocated by the Colombo and Kandy Municipal Councils for peaceful protests. Municipal councils are also acting in order to provide the necessary facilities for the activists who are protesting in those places. So I kindly request the people not to stay in unauthorized places anymore, and therefore, request the peaceful strugglers to vacate the unauthorized places and assist to maintain law and order. We look forward to your support in building the Sri Lankan nation.'

"A protest was held in Batticaloa in concurrence with the Galle Face Struggle. A walk to the Gandhi Statue was organized daily. A statement made by Tashi Chodap, a Tibetan Thera who joined this struggle, was quoted in an article written by a female activist in our country. I would like to quote that statement.

'You re-confirm your participation by joining this walk. Protest in a different way. Through the participation express your opinion about what is happening today. You have chosen to be alert in this moment of crisis. Not that suffering alone. We know that one crisis cannot be solved by another. The crisis can only be resolved through unity."

"As stated by Tashi Chodap Thero, I re-emphasize to this House that we all should solve this crisis together and in unity. Let's get together. Let's make the social, economic and political changes needed for the 21st cen-

tury."
"I would like to draw attention to several factors therein. How should we proceed forward by solving these crises? What are the responsibilities of political parties in that journey? Can we go on this journey, trapped in our traditional political thinking?"

"We have to think anew about the political party system. The activities of the parties should be reorganized in a manner that suits the future. Should we continue to think of politics today, in the same way, political education should be seriously consid-

'More youth should be elected to Parliament'

"In the year 1977, we were able to create a new economy that accomplished a number by our expectations and hopes as youths. Now, absolute contribution of our youth should provide to create a new economy appropriate for the future. Their skills should not be limited to a protest

"From the past our country suffered disputes due to disunity. We were divided into ethnic groups. Divided into languages. Divided into religions. Divided into parties. Divided into classes. Divided geographically. Divided by castes.'

"Certain parties widened these divisions further. These divisions were used to gain power, and seek advantages from the distribution of power. They tried to maintain power by creating various divisions such as ethnic groups, religions, etc."

"Ever since I entered into politics, I wanted to create a society with a Sri Lankan identity without these divisions. To create a nation, where children of one mother can live in harmony. I suffered political defeats due to regular engagement in this exercise. It was criticized by extremists, because of my continued stand against racism and bigotry, some political parties slandered me as a racist."

"However, I did not deviate from my principle. I will not deviate from that

We could not achieve everything we want through the 22nd Amendment to the Constitution. It is fundamental to a series of reforms. It would be a constructive step if we adopt the reforms in one voice."

"As I mentioned earlier, measures are being taken to establish the Parliamentary Sectoral Oversight Committees immediately. All the political parties will have the opportunity to work together, through those Committees. I have already submitted to this House the report forwarded by the National Movement for Social Justice in this regard."

"Also, I am working to establish a National Assembly consisting of political party leaders. For the next steps, we will be able to arrange a programme with a common minimum programme with the consent of all, through the National Assembly."

"I am taking measures to establish a People's Assembly in order to decide which social and political reforms should be implemented. A mechanism to obtain views of all interested parties is being prepared through the People's Assembly through the consultation of political parties, various organizations, etc. I specially invite the youth engaged in activism and youth who are not to provide their views.'

"All matters such as 'Should we continue to maintain the presidential system in our country? Which system is most appropriate for the country? How should the government system be reformed?' should be discussed by the People's Assembly, and ideas requested. After reaching a national consensus on the system that suits the country, it may be legalized and implemented."

"It is essential to reach such a national consensus, on which I would explain. The major commitment presented during the Presidential Election campaign in our country is the abolition of the executive presidential system. However, no one who came

to power delivered on that commitment. On the other hand, even if someone abolishes the executive presidential system, the next party that comes to power has the ability to change it. That is the reason we require to reach a common national consensus through a body such as the People's Assembly."

"People's Assembly is a fully independent body with Government only providing the necessary resources. The Government has no influence on its functions or decisions. We decide in consultation with various parties, regarding the composition of the People's Assembly.'

"Views and proposals in this regard have already been made by the National Movement for Social Justice.

"The People's Assembly may seek from the nations in our neighbourhood and the wider Asian region together with the relevant international agencies their expertise in the respective areas.'

"The responsibility of preparing a National Plan for social, economic and political reforms is assigned to the People's Assembly, by taking the opinions and advice of all stakeholders and

STF nabs two suspects with over 2,500 litres of fuel



Two individuals were arrested with 2,574 litres of fuel by the Police Special Task Force on Tuesday night in two separate raids in Mount Lavinia and Ambalantota.

Third Session of the Ninth Parliament

OPENING CEREMONY HIGHLIGHTS

President Ranil Wickremesinghe ceremonially declared open the third session of the Ninth Parliament yesterday morning.

On his arrival at the Parliament, President Wickremesinghe and the First Lady were received by the Speaker Mahinda Yapa Abeywardena and the Secretary General of Parliament, Dhammika Dassanayake.

In accordance with the instructions of the President, arrangements were made to con-

duct the ceremony in a very simple manner without gun salutes or car parades.

Instead, the President was received in front of Parliament with a Tri-Force Guard of Honour. There was no President's flag being hoisted, only the National Flag was hoisted.

The arrival of the Members of Parliament took place prior to the arrival of the President, followed by the arrival of Speaker Mahinda Yapa Abeywardena, Prime Minister Dinesh Gunawardena and finally President Ranil Wickremesinghe. Following the ceremo-

nial opening at 10 a.m. the President presented the government's policy statement at 10:30 a.m. in accordance with powers vested in him through Article 33 of the Constitution.

After entering the Chamber, the President presided over the sittings and the President's seat was marked with the State Emblem instead of the President's official emblem. During the President's 'Throne Speech', the speaker sat with the secretaries in the lower seat, where the speaker sits during the committee stage.

In his speech the President Wickremesinghe said he is the President of all Sri Lankans and assured to protect the rights of all segments of the society.

President Wickremesinghe also reiterated his request to all political parties and groups to support the establishment of an all-party government to solve the issues faced by the people. He also asserted that while he accepts the right to engage in peaceful protests according to the law of the country, he will not allow any harm come to the peaceful

protesters. However, he said he would take stern action against those, who purposely violate the law and perpetrate violence.

Following the presentation of the Government Policy Statement by the President, the House was adjourned until August 9.

The ceremonial opening was followed by a tea party organized for the Members of Parliament and invited guests.

A Guard of Honour was also presented, when the President and First Lady left the Parliament.

Seven arrested in connection with Vavuniya - Achchipuram youth massacre

Guns and swords recovered

The police said yesterday (August 3), that 7 people, including 4 members of the same family, have been arrested in connection with the shooting and killing of a youth in Achchipuram area of Vavuniya.

A 30-year-old family man named Ranja N. Johnson, known as Ranja N, was shot dead with an Indian gun and cut with a sword last Sunday evening in Vavuniya, Achchipuram area, and the person's hand was cut off and taken away and dumped elsewhere.

Vavuniya Regional Crimes Squad Police along with the Chidambarapuram Police had conducted investigations in connection with the incident. After investigations, the Indian gun used in the attack was recovered by the Chidambarapuram

Subsequent investigations by the Vavuniya Regional Crimes Squad have recovered 4 swords believed to have been used in the attack and



bloodstained clothes. Seven people, and further investigations have been including 4 members of the same family, have been arrested on suspicion of being involved in the incident. One of the 7 persons is being treated at Vavuniya Hospital due to injuries and the other 6 persons have between the two groups and the occabeen detained at the police station

The positives of an All Party Government

he repeated calls for the formation of an inclusive All-Party Government (APG) by the Maha Sangha, other religious leaders, the legal fraternity and civil society organisations if it comes to pass would be the best thing that has happened to this country since the dawn of Independence. What we have been witnessing down the decades is how power-hungry unprincipled politicians worked to their personal agendas through the use of political parties at a tremendous cost to the country.

Political parties were mainly used to sow division among the public and exploited by the rulers to enjoy power and privilege. In their quest for power they also identified their particular political parties with pseudo-nationalism, race and religions. As a result, we have a sharply divided nation which is the antithesis for progress.

President Ranil Wickremesinghe has been constantly inviting all political parties represented in Parliament to join in the formation of an APG. Yesterday in his address to Parliament, the President repeated his call in this regard. In fact the main thrust of his speech centred on the need to form an APG. The response so far has been positive with the SLPP, CWC and the National Congress already holding several rounds of talks to explore the possibility for an APG Government with the Samagi Jana Balawegaya (SJB), SLFP and TNA which initially rejected the proposal too now giving the green light. The stand of the JVP-led Jathika Jana Balawegaya is still being awaited with its leader Anura Kumara Dissanayake (AKD) sending mixed signals.

Needless to say, party politics has been the bane of this country retarding progress. The pattern all along had been for a new Government to halt all projects launched by its predecessor and start its own thing only for another incoming Government to repeat the process and the vicious cycle continued. The country became stagnant.

Hence the importance of forming an APG. This will not bring instant solutions to the country's burning problems or address its current economic woes, nor will it end the people's suffering instantly. But it will certainly lay the foundation for a fresh beginning sans the contentious and vituperative politics that the country has been witnessing down the decades that had sent the country careening downhill and ruined any chances of progress.

Besides, the country more than at any other time before, needs to show unity to the outside world which is a precursor for stability. Political stability will be a key factor for receiving economic assistance at this hour of dire need. Already, aid givers and lending agencies are watching the unfolding scenario and will decide on Sri Lanka only if there is a conducive climate in the country to manage our affairs competently. Political chaos and an anarchic state will certainly not help us win economic support from outside. President Wickremesinghe who has already sounded that there is light at the end of the tunnel and a positive response from the IMF is expected at the end of this month, is aware of the importance of political stability and unity at this crucial stage.

It is in this light that the comments made by Field Marshal Sarath Fonseka giving encouragement for mischief by the Aragalayites should be condemned by all patriotic citizens who put the country's interest before anything else. Fonseka is speaking in terms of another invasion of the Aragalaya crowds into the city on August 9 in line with the uprisings witnessed on the 9th of each month since May and that he would back such an invasion until the collapse of the regime

Such sentiments are unacceptable given that the Army which Fonseka once commanded has no room for indiscipline and unruliness. The Field Marshal is also enjoining the members of the Security Forces not to arrest or act against any of the Aragalaya members. Is this not encouraging lawlessness which is a sure recipe for aid givers turning their backs on this country? Thankfully the SJB of which Fonseka is a member has distanced itself from his sentiments as those entertained by him in his personal capacity and not as the views of the SJB. Its General Secretary Ranjith Madduma Bandara said the SJB itself had not organised any protest to be held on August

This is as it should be. The formation of an APG could also be an effective countervailing force against certain disruptive elements whose aim is to drag this country further into the mire. The Aragalaya, no doubt, was born out of the suffering and oppression of the people weighed down by the soaring Cost of Living and chronic shortage of essential items.

Effective Resolution of the sufferings of the people would certainly take the winds off the sails of the Aragalaya campaigners. This hopefully would be forthcoming in the welfare budget that was declared by President Wickremesinghe to be unveiled sometime in August, when he was Prime Minister cum Finance Minister. We are now into August and sooner the welfare measures are announced the easier it will be for the people.

PRESIDENT REITERATES NEED FOR ALL-PARTY GOVERNMENT

Hindsight

resident Ranil Wickremesinghe has spent the last week trying to consolidate his position at the apex of the Government where he will be relying on the support of a party which opposed him, the Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna (SLPP) which still commands a majority support in Parliament.

President Wickremesinghe's rapport with the SLPP is not recent. In the final days of former President Gotabaya Rajapaksa's Presidency, when protests were the order of the day and there was a clamour for an 'All-Party' or 'National' Government, the then President appointed him as the Prime Minister.

That was after former President Rajapaksa held talks with Opposition Leader and Samagi Jana Balawegaya (SJB) Leader Sajith Premadasa and the party's Chairman, Sarath Fonseka. Both were reluctant to take up the prime ministerial position, calling instead for Rajapaksa to step down.

The offer was then made to Wickremesinghe, who at the time was only the solitary MP from the United National Party (UNP) in Parliament. Having been the Prime Minister five times previously, Wickremesinghe accepted the position readily, without imposing any conditions or demands.

That decision stood President Wickremesinghe well because, within weeks, he was appointed Acting President when President Rajapaksa left the country on July 9. A few days later, when President Rajapaksa submitted his resignation, he became Acting President by virtue of being Prime Minister.

As Acting President, Ranil Wickremesinghe took early action to ensure that the chaos that ensued with former President Rajapaksa's resignation was quickly brought under control. He deployed the Armed Forces and Police to prevent a state of anarchy from developing in the days that followed.

Election of President

These actions and smart political negotiations with individual Parliamentarians ensured that, when a vote was held in Parliament to elect the next President, President Wickremesinghe won comfortably by 134 votes to 82 votes, a majority of 52, over his nearest rival, the SLPP's Dullas Alahapperuma.

This meant that a vast majority of SLPP MPs had voted for Wickremesinghe even though he was from a different political party instead of Alahapperuma who represented their own party. This even prompted an angry outburst from the Chairman of the SLPP, former Foreign Minister G. L. Peiris.

Since his appointment, President Wickremesinghe has appointed a Prime Minister from a constituent party of the SLPP, the Mahajana Eksath Peramuna (MEP). That is Dinesh Gunawardena, his former political rival and classmate from Royal College. The choice of Gunawardena has been welcomed.

President Wickremesinghe also swore in the new Cabinet of Ministers

which was the same Cabinet headed by former President Gotabaya Rajapaksa with one exception: former Foreign Minister G. L. Peiris was replaced by Ali Sabry, PC who had previously held the key portfolios of Justice and Finance.

However, in doing so, President Wickremesinghe had made it clear that this Cabinet will function only for a very brief period. The President and his close political advisors are currently busy carrying out a dialogue with all opposition political parties regarding forming an 'All-Party' Government soon.

This is important for several reasons. The President commands the support of only one MP from the UNP in Parliament who is now Vajira Abeywardena, who filled the National List vacancy created when the President assumed office. As such, an All-Party Government provides him more credibility.

Secondly, the past few months have seen many changes in ministerial portfolios as then President Gotabaya Rajapaksa attempted to respond to the public protests against the downturn in the economy. This led to the kind of political instability that this country has rarely witnessed previously.

Since then, as the Government has attempted to resurrect the economy, donor agencies such as the International Monetary Fund (IMF) have indicated to Colombo that any talks with them would necessarily require some degree of political stability before tangible progress can be achieved.

For these reasons, President Wickremesinghe is very keen to form a Government that has representatives from all parties represented in Parliament. He has been spending much time and effort negotiating with the parties in the Opposition, both personally and collectively to make this a reality.

Economic Stability

The President has written individually to all 225 Members of Parliament, seeking their co-operation. "Initial plans required to implement a systematic economic programme are being formulated while preliminary measures are also being undertaken for the creation of economic stability," he has said.

The President has already met with a delegation from the Sri Lanka Freedom Party (SLFP). At these talks, the SLFP team, led by former President Maithripala Sirisena, noted that it was their party which first mooted the concept of an 'All-Party' Government when Gotabaya Rajapaksa was President.

President Ranil Wickremesinghe is moving towards a consensus on the political and economic fronts,

though his party, the UNP has little support in Parliament. He has succeeded so far but he needs to sustain that in the months to come if Sri Lanka is to attain some degree of stability and growth.

General Secretary of the SLFP Dayasiri Jayasekera said the talks were a success. "We submitted a strategic plan that included holding a General Election when the country returns to normalcy, ending fuel and gas queues and ensuring a steady supply of food, drugs and other essentials," Jayasekara said.

Jayasekara was optimistic that a second round of talks between President Wickremesinghe and the SLFP could be held next week. That was after the return to the island of former President Sirisena who had left for South Korea to attend the 'World Summit for Peace 2022' in that country.

Jathika Hela Urumaya (JHU) Leader Patali Champika Ranawaka who recently opted to be independent from the SJB from which he was elected to Parliament, has also responded to President Ranil Wickremesinghe's initiative, requesting the President for clarifications regarding certain issues.

"We urge you to abolish the Cabinet which you have appointed, abolish some appointments of those involved in corruption, to reveal what you intend to follow when dealing with the IMF and what alternative steps are to be taken if Sri Lanka fails to strike a deal with the IMF," Ranawaka has said.

The President's request for an All-Party Government has drawn a mixed response from the main Opposition party, the SJB. It is now known that while SJB leader Sajith Premadasa remains steadfastly opposed to the idea of joining such a Government, some of his parliamentary colleagues disagree.

Some SJB stalwarts, known for their professional expertise in handling matters related to the economy have been approached by confidantes of President Wickremesinghe, urging them to disregard party politics and offer their services to the country in this time of crisis. Some are very likely to do so.

Former SJB frontliners, Harin Fernando and Manusha Nanayakkara are now members of President Wickremesinghe's Cabinet and have played a key role in trying to convince their former colleagues to join them. However, if they do, they may risk facing disciplinary action from the SJB leadership.

An initial challenge President Wickremesinghe was confronted with was obtaining approval from Parliament for the extension of the State of Emergency. There was a concerted effort from Opposition parties which held a series of talks among themselves, to defeat the vote on the State of Emergency.

However, the State of Emergency was approved by 120 votes to 63, a comfortable majority of 57 votes. In what is seen as a significant political development, the alliance of eleven political parties led by Wimal Weerawansa, Udaya Gammanpila and Vasudeva Nanayakkara voted with the Government.


It is worthwhile noting that this group voted for President Wickremesinghe's rival at the recent election in Parliament to elect a President, Dullas Alahapperuma. In fact, it was this alliance that took the lead in promoting Alahapperuma's candidature for President among the parties in Parliament.

Making a speech on their group's decision to support the extension of the State of Emergency, Wimal Weerawansa said that it was based on the belief that the country now required stability, not another series of protests that would lead to prolonged anarchy. This group is now likely to join the Cabinet





iving within one's means is the surest way to an individual's as well as a country's progress although loans are necessary to invest in productive ventures by an individual, business enterprise or a country as manifest in the present Sri Lankan context, the country being burdened with a heavy load of debt.

It would be appropriate to draw a parallel, mutatis mutandis, to the economic condition in pre-revolutionary France to that in Sri Lanka today though it has to be mentioned at the very outset that the concept of revolution is outdated today; the actors are entirely different and hardly match in sincerity their French counterparts and more because any fascistic tendency has to be stamped out root and branch.

Sir J.A.R. Marriott in his work *'The Evolution of Modern Europe 1453-1939'* says: "Born in 1638, Louis XIV came to the throne in 1643; he was declared to be of age in 1651: his personal rule began with the death of Mazarin in 1661; only his own death brought it to an end in 1715.

Richelieu and Louis XIV had completed the edifice of absolutism in France. The Crown had absorbed all the powers of the State, legislative and administrative. The States General was suppressed altogether; the Parliaments deprived of all power of remonstrance.

"Absolutism can be justified only by efficiency. Under Louis XV the monarchy ceased to be efficient. Of its failure to retain the preeminence of France among the nations, enough has been said. It was hopelessly inefficient also at home. During the Regency of Orleans (1715-23) there was a temporary reaction against the system of Louis XIV, but the period is chiefly remarkable for the efforts of John Law, a Scottish financier, to redeem France from the bankrupt condition to which it had been reduced by the extravagance of Louis XIV. Law was hardly judged by contem-

poraries: those who have witnessed the financial chaos of Europe may perhaps judge him more leniently. His principles were not entirely unsound: his application of them was disastrous. The condition of France was desperate. Crushed under a load of debt, committed to an annual expenditure double the annual revenue, the State was bankrupt; trade languished; people were reduced to dire poverty. Law proposed to redeem the debt, to balance the budget, and to restore prosperity to trade by a large issue of paper money, based not upon cash reserves but upon the credit of the State. He shared the belief of the day that money is wealth. Gold and silver are wealth. Paper may serve as money so long as people have faith in the credit of those responsible for putting it into circulation, but paper money is not in itself wealth, and may become worthless.'

Louis XIV the Sun King or the Grand Monarch of France lost lustre barely half way through his reign and Marriott has said: "After 1683 the sun of prosperity was declin-

ing fast and finally set amidst lowering clouds which boded ill for the happiness of France..."

President J.R. Jayewardene who called himself the monarch next in line after Elizabeth II of Britain who ceased to be the sovereign with the promulgation of the Constitution of the Republic of Sri Lanka of May 22, 1972 proved that absolutism can be justified only by efficiency which flows from honesty.

President J.R. Jayewardene came to power riding on the wave of unpopularity of the former 1970 United Front Government after the two leftist parties, the Lanka Sama Samaja Party and the Communist Party of Sri Lanka were forced to leave it in 1975 with Feudalism raising its ugly head again in the person of one who when trying to be too talkative in Parliament drew the comment from the Father of Socialism Philip Gunawardena: "You are the people whose ancestors exercised the jus primae noctis," which made him virtually fall back in his chair.

It is hoped that President Ranil Wickremes-

inghe who has so far performed admirably well as Prime Minister, Finance Minister and President in bringing much needed relief to the people managing the grave economic crisis will continue to do so with greater efficiency that was President J.R. Jayewardene's forte ably assisted by Prime Minister Dinesh Gunawardena the son of the Lion of Boralugoda.

Was Aragalaya Productive?

ri Lankan youths commenced an *'Aragalaya*' a mass protest against the Government in March 2022. The main theme behind the mass protest was to oust the incumbent President Gotabaya Rajapaksa from his position due to severe inflation and problems ranging from daily electricity outages, the non-availability of domestic gas and the skyrocketing prices of consumer goods and building materials. In other words, for mismanaging the country's economy. The current rate of inflation stands at over 60%, but it is expected to rise further according to the Central Bank.

The main demand of the protesters was the resignation of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and other members of the Rajapaksa family from the Government. When the 'Aragalaya' began, the protestors made use of a slogan called 'GotaGoHome'. Many protestors comprised the public who suffered, mainly the youths who supported Gotabaya Rajapaksa to come to power expecting a change in Sri Lankan politics. They were hopelessly let down by the ex-President.

The youths celebrated the new President's victory with over 6.9 million votes that helped him secure a

two-thirds majority in Parliament. Who would have thought that his popularity would turn into hatred

within two and a half years? The general public was let down hopelessly when the ex-President failed to deliver what the public expected. He was regarded as a 'mere soldier' but not as the former Defence Secretary when he took robust decisions and implemented them. He decided to go for a new group of advisors, superseding the *'Vivathmaga'* group whom the youth thought would help him to contribute to making the necessary changes and helping eradicate bribery and corruption. The protesters chose two places initially at the precincts of the Galle Face and the Presidential Secretariat to agitate holding placards such as 'GotaGoHome.

Initial Stages

Initially, the protest was composed of the general public who could not get petrol, gas, and milk powder and were fed up with the soaring food prices; breaking down the education system, health, and increasing unemployment. Later University Lecturers and the whole gamut of society joined with the protestors complaining because their lives became miserable during the past two years.

This 'Aragalaya' or the protest cannot be compared with the unrest Sri Lankans experienced in 1971 because at that time it was organised by the JVP and went down in the political history of Sri Lanka. Neither can it be compared with the 1988/89 uncertainty because it had a tinge of politics concerning the North and East of Sri Lanka, and JVP was under the impression that the Sri Lanka Government wanted to give in to the LTTE and India. The Government used military and police power to bring the unrest to a settlement. What happened on July 9, 2022 was different. Everyone congregated with the protestors that included the rich, middle class, entertainers, the university students, ordinary youths and everyone having to stand in long queues for petrol and gas. There were no drugs in pharmacies and hospitals which exacerbated the peoples' misery.

The Aragalaya

The protests consisted of two aspects. Firstly, the lack of Foreign Reserves in the Government Coffers, and secondly the printing of money made inflation go haywire. The lack of foreign exchange was due to restrictions on exports and with the COVID-19 pandemic where the whole world faced a decline in every aspect. With particular reference to Sri Lanka, her exports were far less than the imports. Meanwhile, the rupee depreciated against the dollar making foreign debts impossible to manage. The Sri Lankan Government had no choice but to print money excessively to pay the salaries of the public servants. One of the imprudent decisions the Gotabaya Rajapaksa Government made was to cut taxes, particularly on sugar imports and ban toxic fertiliser overnight rather than gradually.

The only escape route to resolve the present economic crisis would be for citizens to join hands for short-term, medium and long-term programmes. A recent IMF statement said unless Sri Lanka shows solidarity and a conclusive plan on debt sustainability the programme under consideration would be withheld. With this in mind, President Ranil Wickremesinghe wrote on July 29, 2022 to all Legislators in Parliament for an All-Party Government with the sole objective of creating social

and economic stability in the country, which will help the IMF to release the funds necessary to recov-

er the present crisis. It is debatable how the Opposition will react to the President's request for an All-Party Government because the Samagi Jana Balawegaya, the JVP and the Peratugami Party insist on removing Ranil Wickremesinghe from the Presidency and holding a General Election to get a fresh peoples' mandate. It shows how the Opposition behaves in a senseless fashion without paying any heed to Sri Lanka's Constitution. They claim the 'Aragalaya' was an agitation by the suffering masses, therefore a General Election is required to test the voter's pulse!

It was for the first time in Sri Lanka's political history that a President was elected by the MPs in Parliament. Ranil Wickremesinghe was elected the President of the Democratic Republic of Sri Lanka with a majority of votes. One observes that the attempts by all Opposition parties show their lack of concern and patriotism for their Motherland, but purely on a political agenda! The election Commissioner on TV, on July 29, stated, "this is not the correct environment to hold an election as the staff to supervise would have to go either to the Aragalaya crowd or visit the long queues for people to cast their votes!

Meanwhile COVID pandemic along with the latest 'Monkeypox' plague is raising its head again as stated by WHO Chief Tedros Ghebreyesus. The virus is supposed to spread from person to person and health authorities in Sri Lanka warn the public to wear masks again! One is inclined to think, amidst all problems that Sri Lanka faces, it is the last thing the country needs!

In the initial stages of 'Araga-laya', it displayed signs as an extension of Che Guevara's movement because there was a hidden agenda amidst some elements amongst the protestors to startle the public, chase the Executive President and grab power. This became clear when some of them occupied the official residence of the ex-President and the Presidential Secretariat and 'Temple Trees' (PM's official residence). Such manoeuvres created a completely volatile situation in the country. Protesters were

aware that once the 'President' left, then the Prime Minister should also resign and it would have created a condition where Cabinet decisions were impossible, thereby it would have led to an emergency situation where 'Emergency regulations and curfew' were warranted. South Korea's prices rise, inflation increases to near quarter-century high

SOUTH KOREA: South Korea's prices rose more than 6 percent in July compared with last year, the fastest jump in nearly a quarter century.

The East Asian economy's Consumer Price Index rose 6.3 percent last month, Statistics Korea data showed on Tuesday,

up from 6 percent in June. The gain, which was in line with market expectations, marks the highest rate of inflation since prices rose 6.8 percent in November 1998.

The heady inflation data comes as the Bank of Korea (BOK) mulls further interest rate hikes at its next policy meeting on August 25.

Rare White Elephant born in Myanmar **MYANMAR:** A rare white elephant



The white elephant born in Myanmar's

has been born in western Myanmar, state media said on Wednesday. Born last month in western Rakhine state, the baby weighs about 80 kilogrammes (180 pounds) and stands roughly 70 cm (two-and-a-half feet) tall, according to the Global New Light of Myanmar newspaper.

Footage released by state TV showed the tusker tot following his mother to a river and being washed by its keepers, and later feeding from her.

The mother - a 33-year-old called Zar Nan Hla -- is kept by the Myanma Timber Enterprise in Rakhine state, the Global New Light said, adding the baby possessed seven of the eight characteristics associated with rare white elephants.

"Pearl-coloured eyes, plantain branch-shaped back, white hair, a distinctive tail, auspicious plot signs on the skin, five claws on the front legs and four on the back legs and big ears," the newspaper reported.

Social media users first posted about the birth of the elephant - which has not been named yet -- late last month.

Historically, white elephants were considered extremely auspicious in Southeast Asian culture, and the region's ancient rulers acquired as many as they could to boost their fortunes. - NDTV

SLIC should look to increase local insurance penetration

Business community, politicians and others should all forget their differences and unite and try to help Sri Lanka to get out of this current 'mess', said President's Counsel Ronald Chithranjan Perera is after assuming office as the 26th Chairman of State-owned Sri Lanka Corporation (SLIC) yester-

He said that for the first time in the country's history Sri Lanka has a President (Ranil Wickremesinghe) whose political party has only one member and a Prime Minister who has only 3 members from his respective political party in Parliament. "However majority wants them to continue and others too should assist them to bring back economic stability to the country."

He said that this scenario of parliament is a classic example of 'modern day innovation' and this novel thinking pattern should be similarly grasphed by Sri Lanka insurance staff's mindset. "The staff should think in new ways to maintain SLIC's position as the number one insurer in Sri Lanka competing among 26 foreign and local players."

Sri Lanka Insurance staff should look to increase the local insurance penetration which is only around 2%, the new Chairman said. "Since it is compulsory all vehicle owners have insurance, however in contrast insurance in the rural market is vir-

Bulk of South Asian women exposed to informal employment

In South Asia, only 20 out of every hundred women actively participate in the labour market, while the labour force participation for men is 80 %, far below the participation rates in other regions.

Between 80-90 percent of the workforce is stuck in unproductive informal sectors that have notoriously limited access to credit and sales markets. And South Asia lags behind other regions across the world except for the Middle East and North Africa in female labor force participation, according to the World Bank latest report.

In South Asia, more than 80 percent of women in non-agricultural jobs are in informal employment, and this leaves women often without any protection of labor laws, social benefits such as pension, health insurance, or paid sick leave.



Big match blues and a firebrand Joe who lit up school cricket



The Battle of the Blues' big match ended in a tame draw at the SSC ground while Royal College registered a convincing win over S. Thomas' College in their one day encounter last week.

Thus, all key big matches were concluded, but with only the Battle of the Maroons between Ananda and Nalanda producing a result.

Royal made 219 for 8 declared in 70.4 overs with Uvindu Weerasekara making a top score of 66. Kavindu Dias bagged four Royal wickets for 65 runs. Ryan Fernando cracked a fluent 74 as S. Thomas' played for a meaningless draw scoring 142 for 6 at stumps. Gishan Balasooriya (3 for 56) and Sadisha Rajapakse (2 for 30) shared the bowling honours for Royal.

Last year's Most Popular Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year, Sadisha Raja-

pakse of Royal had an outstanding 1968 in Colombo, represented NCC game to win the Best Fielder's award and the Best Bowler's award went to Kavindu Dias of S. Thomas'. The Best Batsman award went to Uvindu Weerasekara of Royal while the Man of the Match title went to Thomian Rvan Fernando.

When we look at the past winners of the Observer Schoolboy Cricketer awards, we cannot forget Rohan Weerakkody, who is perhaps the only schoolboy cricketer to win five titles in a single Observer Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year. Yet, his 1987 glory was confined only to school cricket

> and failed to go beyond Sri Lanka youth level.

"It was an honour to win five titles including Observer Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year in a single event," he said in an interview from Laguna, Lusiana in the Philippines.

But he said he has no regrets and was honoured to win those awards. There is no point in talking about the past and what has been missed. But if I had held on to some more things would have been different," said Weerakkody, who played for NCC Ranjan under

Madugalle. Weerakkod born on April 30, and Arjuna Ranatunga.

Sri Lanka's medal hopes in

T20 cricket end in a whimper

and Air Force SC as a right-hand batsman and right-arm fast medium bowler. Prior to that, he led St. Joseph's College with distinction. But he could play only ten first class matches during the 1988/89 to 1994/95 seasons capturing 26 wickets with innings analysis of five wickets and above twice.

He made his debut for the Sri Lankan Young Cricketers side after captaining the side on seven occasions during the 1987/88 Youth World Cup, winning three matches. But his Sri Lanka Youth side failed to go beyond the qualifying round after losing four matches.

The Observer Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year in 1987 brought the climax of Weerakkody's school career, being called for the honours on five occasions, including the top most one. He brought tremendous honour for the Darley Road school winning awards for the Best Bowler, Best Allrounder and Best Captain. After winning the runner up award for the Best Batsman, he was ultimately adjudged the Observer Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year for 1987.

But his fight for a place in the Joes team was an easy one. In his first season for the school in 1984, he was on the reserve list for the big match, only playing a single match against St. Benedict's. But within two years, he rose to lead his school, winning five awards at the Observer Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year awards ceremony in 1987. That included the most important one.

The Observer-Mobitel School Cricketer of the Year, ever since its inception in 1979, has always been producing top Sri Lanka and international cricketers beginning with two great Sri Lanka captains Madugalle





Most Popular Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year 2021, Sadisha Rajapaksa of Royal won the best fielders award at Battle of the Blues 2022.

Madugalle who was the first-ever Observer-Mobitel School Cricketer of the Year in its inaugural year, went on to captain Sri Lanka and currently serves as the ICC's Chief Match Referee. Ranatunga who won the Observer-Mobitel School Cricketer of the Year twice in 1980 and 1982, became Sri Lanka's World Cup winning captain in 1996.

Former ICC Match Referee Roshan Mahanama, the Observer-Mobitel School Cricketer of the Year twice in 1983 and 1984, too went on to play for Sri Lanka and also lead the country in ODIs. Royal could make 165 in the second essay after the Joes enforced the follow-on. Once again, it was Weerakkody who troubled the Royal batsmen the most, with his vicious second innings spell being 19-8-41-4. It was his match bag of 9 for 73 that gave the Joes a well deserved win after 32 years. Prior to the 1984 win, their last win against Royal was in 1952 under Kenneth Serpanchy.

Even in the very next outing played in mid-February, Weerakkody's magic worked again, this time against Wesley. He produced a penetrative spell of 12.3-8-6-8 as Wesley were shot out for 48. St. Joseph's made 154 for 4 declared and restricted Wesley to 42 in the second innings to register a runaway innings and 64 runs victory. Weerakkody had figures of 8-5-12-2, thus completing a match bag of 10

wickets for only 18 runs. In his first two matches, he had 19 wickets for 91

Having represented St. Joseph's in 1985 under Jonathan Alles, 1986 under Rohitha Tillekeratne, Weerakkody was given the captaincy for the 1986-87 season as a fourth-year Coloursman. He became the first Joes player to win the Observer-Mobitel Schoolboy Cricketer of the Year. It took another 27 years to see another cricketer from St. Joseph's win this glory - Sadheera Samarawickrema in 2014.

Weerakkody was picked to lead the Sri Lanka Schools Cricket Association President's X1 in a two-day match against the visiting England Youth Cricket team. It was the first time that a Joe was selected to lead a school's XI against a foreign team since 1974.

Weerakoddy was also made vice captain of the Sri Lanka Youth team against the England Youth team. He was an architect of Sri Lanka's victory over England in the first youth ODI, with a highly economical spell of 2 for 14 in 9 overs and scored 27 not out which earned him the man of the match award.

Under Weerakkody's captaincy in 1987, St. Joseph's remained unbeaten, enjoying a rich harvest with five outright wins - four of those by an innings. St. Joseph's beat Carey by an innings and 133 runs, beat Mahinda College by an innings and seven runs (Weerakkody 6 for 30 in second innings), beat Prince of Wales College by an innings and 41runs (Weerakkody 4 for 25 and 5 for 31), beat St. Benedict's College by an innings and 30 runs and beat Isipatana by six wickets (Weerakkody 5 for 13 in the second innings).

In the 1987 Coca-Cola trophy limited over Knockouts, St. Joseph's College were declared as joint champs with DS Senanayake College after the final was washed out due to rain.







monwealth Games. Abeykoon running from lane seven clocked 10.20 seconds in the third semifinal to qualify for the blue riband event at the XXI Commonwealth Games in the Alexander Stadium

last night.

Kenya's Ferdinand Omanyala clocked the fastest time of 10.02 seconds to win the second semifinal while defending champion Akani Simbine of South Africa won the first semifinal in 10.07.

Abeykoon clocked the fastest time of 10.06 in the heats but booked his berth in the final as one of the fastest qualifiers after finishing fourth behind Jeremiah Azu (10.15) of Wales ad Benjamin Azamati (10.18) of Ghana, before being pipped at the post by Nigeria's Raymond Ekevwo. The 100m final was due to take place at 2 a.m., today local time.

Sri Lanka's leading woman pugilist was no match for Northern Ireland's Carly McNaul yesterday morning while 400 metre champion Kalinga Kumarage qualified to the semifinals of the 400 metres which takes place tomorrow (Friday) night.

"We lost good opportunity to host the Asia Cup in Sri Lanka but at the meantime we have to satisfied with hosting rights of this event belongs to us and finally awarded to the UAE", said Sri Lanka cricket Secretary Mohan de Silva yesterday at the press briefing held at the Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC) Board room.

The Secretary of the SLC further said we knew this is very unfortunate situation at the country. "We tried to host this event in Sri Lanka but most importantly at least we can get 2.5 million US dollars from Asian Cricket Council (ACC) as hosting fare while other revenue share with 2.5 USD million to altogether more than 6 million US dollars for the country at this hard period". ACC also plan to give money for each participating countries for this event and that countries are expecting full security. "However I am very happy we had finish very successful two series against Australia and Pakistan

President Shammi Silva made a good effort to get this chance and SLC was ready to conduct this event and all hopes are over now but we can satisfied as we can get more chance to host ICC and ACC tournaments in future".

"Actually until the last moment we had discussions with ACC officials as well as UAE board members to try hard to get this hosting rights to our country. However due to present country's situation and due to the postpone of the Lanka Premier League (LPL) third edition paved the way to miss this hosting opportunity," added Mohan de Silva the Secretary of SLC.

Actually now UAE cricket Board will conduct this event while broadcast right owned by ACC directly not happy to host this event due to security reasons. Our Present Government headed by President Ranil Wickramasinghe and Sports Minister Roshan Ranasinghe were given Silva pointed out from the Asia Cup

and gave good message to all. Our their best effort to get this chance but during the last discussion at the ICC meeting held at Bermingham in last July 28 ACC officials given their final decision to give this event to the UAE.

"we tried to do our best to get this event to our country and if we get that chance we could easily get more dollars at this stage. 


