A REWARD of Twenty-five rupees is offered for the re-capture of the escaped prisoner Maylvakanam Charawanamutru, advertised for in "Hue and Cry" No. 1,653 of June 27, 1899, as having escaped from the Jaffna jail on June 20, 1899.

WANTED BY THE POLICE.

SINNAVAL KANAPATY; charged with theft of money at Punkudutivu, on January 23, 1899; is a Tamil of the Mukkuwa caste; religion, Hindu; occupation, boatman; age, about 30 years; height, 5 ft. 2½ in.; make, slender; complexion, dark brown; mouth, large; teeth, fairly regular; eyes, hazel, round; hair, black, straight, short; moustaches and beard, shaved; has two scars on left arm and a third on left forearm; birthplace and general residence, Valanai east, in the Islands, Jaffna; haunts Viddataltivu and Varni; single; brothers, Arunasalem and Nagalingam; uncles, Naganatan and Murukesan, all of Valanai; is well known to Kanthapper Ampalavanar, Police Vidane of Valanai east. The Police Magistrate of Kayts has issued warrant No. 6,300 for his arrest.

Arnolis Appu alias Podi Sinho alias Karung Bass; charged with criminal breach of trust at Peacock estate, Pussellawa, on June 2, 1899; is a Sinhalese of the Chalia caste; religion, Buddhist; occupation, carpenter; age, 35 years; height, 5 ft. 5 in.; complexion, dark brown; mouth, large; teeth, regular; eyes, black; hair, black, tied in a knot; wears moustaches only; birthplace, Balapitiya, Galle District; general residence, Dolosbage; haunts Gampola; is well known to Andris Sinho Bass and Upparis Appu, both of Gampola, and Sinnaiyah Kangany, Peacock estate, Pussellawa. The Police Magistrate of Gampola has issued warrant No. 27,243. A reward of Rs. 10 is offered for the arrest of the accused.

Karandakankanamalage Endorin alias Odiris; charged with rape at Pohorabawa in Uda pattuwa, Kuruwiti Korale, on June 7, 1899; is a Sinhalese of the Goigama caste; religion, Buddhist; occupation, cultivator or cooly; age, about 36 years; height, about 5 ft. 3 in.; make, well built; complexion, dark brown; front tooth of the upper jaw broken; right eye blind; left eye, brown; hair, black, tied in a knot; wears moustaches and slight beard on chin; has a scar on one of the legs; birthplace, Dematagoda, Colombo; general residence, Pohorabawa, Ratnapura; haunts Pohorabawa, Ratnapura; keeps a mistress at Pohorabawa; is well known to the Gan-arachehis of Pohorabawa and Parakaduwa and the Peace Officer, Parakaduwa. The Police Magistrate of Ratnapura has issued warrant No. 17,169 for his arrest.

Siman Arachehige Andris Appu; charged with maintenance at Udawaka; is a Sinhalese of the Chalia caste; religion, Buddhist; occupation, cooly, especially in plumbago pits; age, about 30 years; height, about 5 ft. 6 in.; make, thin; complexion, brown; teeth, regular; eyes, oval, black; hair, black, curled, tied in a knot; wears moustaches; birthplace, Bussa in Ratgama; general residence, Bussa, Kapunumbegoda; haunts Ratgama and Galle; married to Ahangama Liyanage Kathirina; friend, Vidane Arachehige of Bussa; is well known to the Headmen of Ratgama and Bussa. The Police Magistrate of Matara has issued warrant No. 31,155 for his arrest.

STOLEN.

ON May 7, 1899, from the owner's cattle shed at Talapathpitiya in the Palle pattu of Salpiti korale: a red bull, age, about 4 years; branded on left side "G. D." Owner, Galbadage Don Abraham, Talapathpitiya.

On or about June 16, 1899, from the line at Wigton estate, Watawala: 1 wooden box, 2 silver tharday, 1 pair gold ear ornaments, 1 pair gold onappu, 1 gold ear ornament, 1 silver chain, 1 gold mukuttia, 2 silver rings, 1 silver bangle, 1 silver coppu, 4 gold beads, 1 red selay cloth, 1 pair white trousers, 2 vatty cloths, 4 handkerchiefs, in cash Rs. 18 and in copper 100 cents. On June 20, 1899, from the owner's house at Galle road, Bambilapitiya: a double-barrelled cap gun marked "W. Fletcher" on lock, bears license No. 155 on barrel, and some proof marks on lock. Owner, Sombuge Don Nicholas Fonseka, Galle road.

On June 22, 1899, from a table in the owner's dressing-room at Ward Place: an American hunting gold watch, number not known, monogram "F. T. C." on the top of the lid, and a gold chain with a gold bit at the end. Owner, Mr. Clarke, Ward Place.

On June 24, 1899, from the outer verandah at 1st Division, Maradana: a burner and a chimney of a kerosene oil hanging lamp. Owner, Mr. E. H. Prins, 1st Division, Maradana.

On June 24, 1899, from the owner's compound at Colonnava: a double bullock cart, license No. 4,240, for 1899; a black bull branded "W. A. D."; horns, short; tail, long and black; bears scars on its sides caused by beating on the hide; height, about 3 ft. 6 in.; age, 4½ years. A white coast bull, no. branded; horns long, bent forward; age, 5 years; height, about 3 ft. 6 in. Owner, Mr. John D. S. Kohombura.
