# **MADRAS HC RULES THAT A TEMPLE WAS A BUDDHIST SITE**

**INDIA:** In July, a single judge of the Madras High Court ordered that Thalaivetti Muniyappan temple in Salem district in Tamil Nadu be removed from the control of the Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowment Department and given to the state's archaeological department. An archaeological survey of the shrine ordered by the court in 2017 had concluded that an idol in the temple considered to be that of the Hindu god Thalaivetti Muniappan was actually a figure of the Buddha.

Maintaining that "the mistaken identity cannot be allowed to continue", the court ordered that the "original status" of the idol be restored. TO PAGE **O2**

Dr. Harsha de Silva stressed that honesty is vital when it comes to forming such a Government.

He pointed out that the House needs to form a solid team that could win the confidence of the national and international platforms.

Dr. Harsha de Silva made these observations joining the third day of the debate on President Ranil Wickremesinghe's Policy Statement.

"Some may say I am saying this to get a ministerial position. That is not so. My intention is to get the Government and the Opposition to agree to a common goal. What we need is an All-Party Government which will work towards resolving the current crisis. An All-Party Government or a programme is vital," Dr. de Silva noted. "I was in charge of a committee of the opposition MPs to prepare a program to revive the economy. It is the first time the opposition has come out with such a program to

revive the economy." he said. "I propose to set up an economic revival office in Parliament by amending standing orders and those in Opposition should be given a role in it.

Therefore, the role of the Opposition in a multi-party arrangement should not be just holding positions in Parliament Committees," Dr. de Silva added.

"We warned so many times at the beginning of the Gotabaya Rajapaksa Government. I said this plan is wrong. Nobody can deny it. Some people requested me not to use the word IMF for political reasons," Dr. de Silva noted.

"A Government that has no confidence cannot implement major economic reforms. I hope this information is wrong, but I have got to know that the Government is considering continuing with the Emergency Regulations during the period where the major economic reforms are carried out. This means, if people are not ready to accept the reforms, are you going to implement them by force using the Emergency Regulations? Do you think that you can implement economic reforms by forcing or terrorizing people?," Dr. de Silva questioned.

"There needs to be a plan to make Sri Lanka a centre which brings Indo/pacific regions together. Top foreign buying counters MELS LKR. 12.7 mn, ASIY LKR. 12.0 mn, EXPO LKR. 6.1 mn, HBS LKR. 5.1 mn, CIC LKR. 4.8 mn and LWL LKR. 3.3 mn whilst top foreign selling counters were JKH LKR. 66.7 mn, DIAL LKR. 23.5 mn, SPEN LKR. 8.4 mn, HHL LKR. 8.2 mn, BPPL LKR. 4.4 mn and ASCO LKR. 2.6 mn. Further, offboard transactions were witnessed in John Keells Holdings (Rs.280.1 mn), Melstacorp (Rs.27.0 mn) and Kahawatte Plantations (Rs.22.0 mn) yesterday.

Additionally, Balangoda Plantations, Lankem Developments, Hapugastenne Plantations, Industrial Asphalts and Udapussellawa Plantations were the top price gainers yesterday whilst Nation Lanka Finance, Myland Developments, Radiant Gems, Colombo Fort Land and Marawila Resorts were the top price losers. Further, Browns Investments, LOLC Finance, Asia Siyaka, Softlogic Capital and Lanka IOC were amongst the most actively traded stocks yesterday.

It said that permitting the Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowment Department to treat the idol as a Hindu god would go against the tenets of Buddhism.

The court also asked the archaeological department to put up a board inside the property saying that the statue is that of the Buddha. While the temple would still be open to everyone, the court asked that "no poojas or other ceremonies" be allowed to be performed at the figure of the Buddha. The case had been brought before the Madras High Court in 2011 by P Ranganathan, the Salem district organiser of the Buddhist Society of India. The elements of the statue in the Thalaivetti Muniyappan temple, such as its ear lobes and posture, indicated it was Buddha's statue. He claimed that the "statue had been converted into a Hindu deity, suppressing its real identity". The land records of the village showed that temple land had earlier belonged to a Buddha trust, he said.-reddit.com

However, the Supreme Court also ruled that an Interim Order preventing the implementation of those regulations will not be issued at this time.

The Attorney General was directed to inform the Court in two weeks before the next hearing about the matters contained in the relevant emergency legal regulations and the regulations to be revised.

Objections to the petitions were directed to be filed within six weeks and counter objections were directed to be filed within two weeks thereafter. The petitions were taken up before the Supreme Court Bench comprising Justices Vijith Malalgoda, Achala Wengappuli, Mahinda Samayawardhena.

Deputy Solicitor General Rajeev Gunathilaka appearing for the respondents made lengthy submission over the petition.

Attorney-at-Law Gihan Gunathilaka, Attorneys Pulasthi Hewamanna and Suren Fernando appearing for the petitioners also made their submissions before the Court.

After considering the submissions made by all parties, the Supreme Court bench led by Justice Vijith Malalgoda granted leave to proceed with the petitions. The petition will be taken up again on October 28. Three Fundamental Rights petitions were filed in the Supreme Court seeking a declaration that the fundamental rights of the people of this country are being violated by the imposition of emergency regulations by the President under the Public Security Ordinance.

This petition seeks an order quashing the two gazette notifications issued imposing the emergency regulations and an interim order restraining them from acting on the said Emergency Regulations bearing 2022/01.

The petition was filed by the Sri Lanka Human Rights Commission former Commissioner Ambiga Satkunanathan, Liberal Youth Movement Conveners, Attorney-at-Law Namini Panditha and Rusiru Egoda and the Alternative Policy Center and its executive director Pakyasothy Saravanauththu.

The Petitions have cited the Attorney General on behalf of the President, the Attorney General, Secretary to the President Gamini Senarath, Secretary to the President Saman Ekanayake and Defense Ministry Secretary Kamal Gunaratne as the respondents.

The petitions say that the President had acted on July 17 to impose emergency regulations under the Public Security Ordinance. It shows that gazette notices 2288/07 and 2289/07 have been issued announcing those regulations.

The petition seeks a ruling that the imposition of the regulations violates a number of fundamental rights, including the right to equal protection of the law, the right not to be subjected to cruel torture, the right to freedom of assembly and the right to freedom of expression. The petitioners point out that the imposition of those regulations is an unnecessary transfer of power to the armed forces and the police and undermines the power of the Parliament and the judiciary.

the closest example was the attack on unarmed protestors on July 22 and the hijacking of journalists' communication equipment and the deletion of data.

Therefore, the petitions have sought from Court to declare that the imposition of these regulations violates the fundamental rights guaranteed by provisions 10, 11, 12(1), 12(4), 13(1), 13(2), 13(3), 13(4), 13(5) and 14(1) of the Constitution. The petitioners seek an order suspending the operation of the said regulations. Also, the petitions have requested that an order be issued preventing the President or the authorized officers from imposing further emergency laws and regulations.

According to the sources of the Lady Ridgeway Hospital for Children in Colombo, the number of children who are currently receiving treatment for dengue virus has also increased.

Dengue has a seasonal transmission in Sri Lanka, with two peaks occurring with the monsoon rains in June-July and October-December respectively. The majority of cases occur during June-July, the summer monsoon.

At present almost all districts in the country are reporting cases. Colombo, Gampaha and Kalutara districts in the western province have recorded the highest case rate.

has been donated," the declaration on PMO website read. Modi held a residential plot with three

other ones, each having an equal share, purchased by him in October 2002 when he was the chief minister of Gujarat.

According to the declaration till March 31, 2022, the Prime Minister had Rs 35,250 cash in hand, Rs. 9,05,105 in National Savings Certificate with the post office and Rs 1,89,305 in life insurance policies.

PM Modi's movable assets rose by Rs 26.13 lakh from Rs 1,97,68,885 at the end of March 2021 to Rs 2,23,82,504 at the end of March 2022. He has no investment in any bonds, shares of mutual funds and does not own any vehicle. In jewellery, PM Modi has four gold rings valued at Rs 1.73 lakh, as per PMO declaration.

Of all 29 Cabinet Ministers, Dharmendra Pradhan, Jyotiraditya Scindia, R K Singh, Hardeep Singh Puri, Parshottam Rupala and G Kishan Reddy have declared their own assets as well as their dependents' for the last fiscal.

Mukhtar Abbas Naqvi, who was a Cabinet minister in the last fiscal and demitted office in July, has also declared his assets.

Raising a question under Standing Orders 27/2, the Opposition Leader said, "Grama Niladhari officials have pointed out that due to the rapidly rising fuel prices, the travel allowance given to the village officers in their field work is not sufficient at all. Does the government accept that the allowance is not enough in the current situation? If so, will there be an adequate allowance for that in the future?"

The Opposition Leader also requested the government to take swift measures to resolve the long standing problems suffered by the Grama Niladhari service. "Grama Niladhari is the closest village level government official to the public, and on two occasions I worked to draw the government's attention to the problems faced by them and their demands. One of their main demands was to establish a separate service constitution. In reply to that, the minister in charge at that time said that the Cabinet had approved a service constitution, and that it had been drafted and submitted to the Salary Commission for further work. However the process has no progress since then. I am kindly requesting the government to pay special attention to this matter and provide immediate solutions." Premadasa said.

"What is the current progress in drafting a new service constitution for the post of village officer? What are the reasons for spending so much time on this? How much more time will it take? Does the government accept that the officers who work in the office and in the field have been placed in an incompatible salary category in the establishment of the fixed salary according to the 06/2006 salary revision? So, what is the government's position regarding the establishment of the right salary category in future?" Premadasa questioned.

After a trial period of 13 years, this new rice variety has been cultivated by farmers in the Hambantota, Polonnaruwa, Anuradhapura, Matara, Galle, Ratnapura Districts and is suitable for cultivation in any region of the country.

As this type of paddy plant is strong and does not fall during natural calamities. Cooked rice is very tasty and rice-based products can also be prepared from this variety of rice.

# Cabinet nod to grant 180 day tourist visas under ETA

In view of rebuilding and promoting the tourism industry, the Cabinet has approved to grant tourist visas up to 180 days to tourists who obtain Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA) for the purpose of visiting Sri Lanka, a statement issued by the office of the Minister of Tourism and Lands said.

Furthermore, tourists who obtain single entry visas are now being permitted to stay up to 270 days in Sri Lanka, which period will be valid for only a single entry. Tourists who visit the country after obtaining visas under multiple entry categories for 90 days will now be issued

visas valid for one year at once, as the Cabinet of Ministers have approved such a proposal as well.

Upon discussing the Cabinet proposal presented by the Minister of Tourism on the suitability of issuing visas at once for a longer period, the President and Minister of Defence presented a Cabinet Paper to the same effect, which was approved by the Cabinet.

While making efforts to revive the tourism industry by providing facilities to tourists, world famous cricketer and former Sri Lanka cricket captain Sanath Jayasuriya has been appointed as the Brand Ambassador for Sri Lanka Tourism for the South

Asian region, in view of presenting the programme to attract tourists from around the world. Jayasuriya has been a flag bearer of the country's reputation for many years and because of his worldwide fan following and recognition.

# A double blow

hile COVID-19 has reared its head again after a lengthy hiatus, with daily cases topping over 200 and 50 deaths reported during the past 11 days, the dengue epidemic too is now speedily spreading throughout the country, which will aggravate the health risk for the public.

According to our front page story quoting National Dengue Control Unit Chief Consultant Dr. Sudath Samaraweera, more than 2,700 cases of dengue had been detected throughout the country during this month bringing to nearly 50,000 the overall figure of dengue patients so far this year.

The Western Province (WP) with the largest population in the country is the worst affected with health officials declaring that as much as 50 per cent of the cases are from the WP.

The Government Medical Officers' Association (GMOA) has forwarded a five-point plan to contain the epidemic amongst which is strengthening the mechanism to identify dengue red spots at regional and Grama Niladhari levels and for conducting dengue prevention programmes involving the public. It has also proposed to strengthen dengue-related laws and regulations.

Certainly the obsession with COVID-19 had made the public and the medical fraternity to overlook or ignore the dengue threat. Now we have both the pandemic and the dengue epidemic wreaking havoc in tandem. Yes, one can even get the two ailments at the same time.

The danger here is that dengue could be deadlier than COVID in terms of the lives claimed during a short span in comparison to the pandemic. It must be said that the new health infrastructure and the staff mobility put in place to combat COVID-19 is very much intact and is capable of successfully facing the latest health threat too.

But it is the public who have a larger role to play in ensuring the prevention and spread of dengue and towards this end, all precautions should be taken. Primary to this will be ensuring cleanliness in the environment and pollution prevention. However, it is doubtful whether these factors are uppermost in the minds of a much harried public engrossed in the battle for survival, weighed down by a multitude of economic woes.

- Hence, the relevant authorities should take the lead in this connection and galvanize all forces into action in identifying dengue breeding spots. With the halt in construction activity due to the economic crisis there are a large number of incomplete buildings and concrete structures that serve as havens for the dengue mosguito, harbouring billions of mosquito larvae.
- All such structures should be located and fumigated. Buildings belonging to Pradeshiya Sabhas and Local Government (LG) authorities are the worst culprits in

## Lakshman Kadirgamar's Death Anniversary

# **A PATRIOT WHO SACRIFICED** HIS LIFE FOR PEACE

eventeen years ago, on a day like yesterday (August 12), a suspected LTTE terrorist snuffed out the life of Sri Lanka's best known and globally admired Foreign Minister, Lakshman Kadirgamar, at his residence in Colombo.

A lawyer, scholar, Statesman, gentleman and patriot, Kadirgamar spearheaded the mission of cleaning the tarnished image of Sri Lanka by exposing the image of the LTTE which had been championing its cause in the West as 'freedom fighters'.

Between the 1983 anti-Tamil pogrom and the brutal crushing of a Southern insurgency, Sri Lanka ranked among the worst human rights violators of the world. Kadirgamar's strategy was not merely attempting to change the perceptions about the island through propaganda but to change realities on the ground. He led the campaign to ban the LTTE from several countries across the world by convincing them that by isolating terrorist activities in one country can lead it to become a global menace. He put a stop to many of the LTTE fund-raising activities. Amid war he focused on human rights and humanitarian law training for the military. He spoke about post-war peace with remarkable foresight and was aware that winning the peace of the minority communities would be a challenge.

The late Minister did much to establish the Foreign Office as a strong and professional institution. He recruited promising young talent and encouraged research and in-house training. He had a distinctive ability to seek, select and engage experienced seniors as well as talented juniors in developing and crafting concepts, projects, and policy postures on a wide range of difficult issues. His attempts to establish a Professional Diplomatic Corps paid off as youth were encouraged to hone their talents and serve the sector with their skills rather than through political patronage. His tenure of office saw one of the largest contingents of career diplomats serving as Sri Lanka's envoys.

A SLFS officer must today be fluent in the two national languages - Sinhala and Tamil - while being competent in English and at least one other international language. Each SLFS officer must obtain at least a master's degree in international relations or a related subject before he or she completes 10 years in the service. A modern day career diplomat must be able to negotiate, communicate and be equipped with inter-personal skills in addition to the basic requirements.

Lakshman Kadirgamar may be no longer among us but his presence, personality and policies permeate through periods, and remain relevant in Foreign Policy discourse in Sri Lanka, in South Asia and beyond. He will be remembered for his honesty, courage and his larger than life personality. He will be remembered and honoured as a man who sacrificed his life for peace. The determined and democratic struggle he waged against the LTTE may have cost him his life, but his unparalleled contribution to safeguarding the unity, sovereignty and the territorial integrity of the country has certainly gone down in the annals of Sri Lankan history.



this respect judging by the run-down state of most of their structures. Perhaps the paralysis of the LG institutions due to postponement of elections may have contributed to this. Hence, it is the duty of the District Secretary or Municipal Commissioners overseeing the functions of these LG bodies to act swiftly.

- A thorough inspection should also be done of all 'hotels' and eateries in Colombo, some of which are in horrendously unkempt states standing in the midst of broken drains and overflowing gullies. A health check should also be conducted on workers of these eateries. Most of the workers are seen bare bodied and sweating profusely, which is a health risk to customers. Some time ago, the Colombo Municipal Council (CMC) undertook a project to carry out such checks. What became of this project is not known.
- Colombo Mayor Rosy Senanayake who came in for much praise for her handling of COVID within Colombo should similarly enact precautions to face the dengue threat, to which the City is extremely vulnerable. This is because of its population density (there is a floating population in Colombo of one million people during the day) and the profusion of buildings and structures, most of which are in varying states of neglect - not to mention the large number of abandoned and unoccupied homes.
- Special attention should be paid to schools which too are for the most part underused these days due to intermittent school sessions as a result of the fuel crisis. All polluted canals and waterways in the City should also be cleaned together with slum dwellings and "Wattas" (tenements).
- The dengue threat should be treated with the seriousness it deserves, for its consequences could be more dire than those of COVID. It has already taken a heavy toll of lives, with children being the most vulnerable. Special attention should be given to ensure the prevention of the epidemic and/or the control of its spread. This is more so due to the acute shortage of medicines - even life saving ones - and hence allowing dengue to get out of hand now could prove to be fatal.

Perhaps the Public Health Inspectors' (PHI) Association headed by the energetic Upul Rohana who was a familiar face on television during the bad days of COVID should take the lead in this respect in ensuring a pollution free environment while promoting hygienic and healthy habits among the public as he and his team of PHIs strove to do during the height of the pandemic.

# **BENEFITS OF COST FREE**

he little black dots and white spaces, jumbled in a square grid, have become a treasure for every vehicle owner since last week, as they are the only hope for fuel when the tank runs dry. The "QR Code" has become a new household word in Sri Lanka, as pumping fuel at any shed is no longer possible without it.

Thanks to this technology, the lengthy fuel queues have eased, the black market for fuel has dwindled, and thuggery, other irregularities and altercations at pumping stations have subsided. For a country, which has already seen the deaths of about a score of people in fuel queues, this is a relief. Many people were heard saying it should have been introduced much earlier.

Under the fuel rationing system in place, amidst a very limited fuel supply across the country in the face of the current Foreign Exchange scarcity, a weekly quota has been assured for all users with the help of the QR Code.

Thanks to this technology, the lengthy fuel queues have eased, the black market for fuel has dwindled, and thuggery, other irregularities and altercations at pumping stations have subsided. For a country, which has already seen the deaths of about a score of people in fuel queues, this is a relief. Many people were heard saying it should have been introduced much earlier.

The success of the QR Code-based National Fuel Pass speaks that the Sri Lankan people, in general, are tech literate enough to use this system for many other purposes as well. As the QR Code has become a practical and effective way of managing the fuel crisis, the same technology can be applied in an innova-

tive way to deal with many other problems or to make everyday tasks more convenient for the people. What has been lacking is not the capacity, but the initiative coupled with the will.

#### Evolution

QR is an acronym for "Quick Response", and as the words themselves reflect, the QR Code allows the user to access encoded information instantly when scanned.

Though it is a square-shaped grid that looks simple, it can store a lot of data, but only a digital device can read them. Most of the smartphones, which are in use today, are able to read them as they have built-in QR scanners. If not, applications (Apps) to read them are readily available on the 'Apple App Store' and 'Google Play'. Opening the camera or the QR scanning application on the smartphone and pointing it at the QR Code will direct one to the information stored in it within a few seconds. The three black squares in the bottom left, top left, and top right corners of the QR Code, which are called 'Finder pattern', help the digital device to identify the code. QR Codes are considered the next generation of Barcodes. Unlike standard barcodes, which can only be read from top to bottom (one-dimensional), QR Codes are read from top to bottom as well as from right to left (two-dimensional), enabling them to store more data. A QR Code can hold 7,000 characters compared to 20 with the one-dimensional barcode.

The rest of the QR Code communicates the actual information encoded in it, such as a website address (a Uniform Resource Locator- URL), a phone number, or a message. The blank area on all sides of the QR Code allows readers to optically place where the QR Code begins and

ends.

QR check-ins during the pandemic to trace Coronavirus exposure and thereby slow its spread.


When it comes to the National Fuel Pass, everybody has to comply with the QR Code requirement as no other option has been made available, but that was the very reason which made it a success. The Fuel Pass took the national awareness of QR Codes to a whole new level.

"The whole system should be

under the QR Code, if it is to be a success, because that is the only way we can identify the vehicle number or the equipment, to which the fuel is given, and the owner, and thereby prevent people exploiting or excusing the system, which is the biggest challenge we had," ICTA Chairman Javantha De Silva told the Daily News. De Silva, who first floated the idea of a QR-based system for rationing fuel when he also served as the Technology Ministry Secretary, said it was adopted following a discussion with all stakeholders. "It is an easy system which can be used by shed owners and the public alike without any cost, whereas other technical solutions are expensive. The Government did not spend any money to develop the system. Though some were reluctant and sceptical at the beginning, I was confident that this would work well. When you are going for a national programme, challenges are many. We go ahead step by step," he commented. Responding to a question on the personal data it collects, the Chairman assured that all conditions in the Personal Data Protection Act, which was passed into law in March this year, have been adhered to during the entire process. "We are collecting only very simple information such as name, Identity Card number, vehicle number, chassis number and mobile phone number etc. In today's context, such information is available everywhere," he replied.

#### **Other uses**

However, QR Codes are not without certain security risks. Sometimes, the users can be directed on malicious URLs to extract data from a mobile phone or a phishing website to steal personal or financial information. To avoid these, mobile users have to be wary only to scan QR Codes coming from a trusted source.

The newspaper industry is using QR Codes lately to provide the readers with additional information such as video clips and new features such as that of listening to the articles via a voice assistant. When it comes to advertising in newspapers and magazines, the QR Code can attract more readers if used in an innovative way. For example, if it is a car that is being advertised, the QR Code can provide a short video of the car or its three-dimensional images, including the interior, so that the people can get the feel of it. Though not much used in Sri Lanka, QR Codes can be used in education to direct children through useful web-links for them to learn more about what is being taught, or allow them to easily copy or download relevant tutorials. In addition, QR Codes are frequently used to authenticate online accounts and verify login details and to access Wi-Fi by storing encryption details. Nowadays, QR Codes in restaurants take the customers directly to the menu, allowing them to instantly order without having to wait for a waiter to come to the table. QR Codes are often found in entertainment and gaming experiences. There are new uses for the QR Code such as determining objects' positions within 'Augmented Reality'. These are only a few ways QR Codes are being used in various domains. In some countries, QR Codes have gained high popularity to the extent of representing the dead on gravestones. The people visiting the graveyard can read online tributes of the dead, or more information about that deceased person's life and career by scanning the QR Code in a headstone.

Another wonder of the QR Code is that it can be read even if it is skewed or at an angle or even damaged. This has been possible with the help of two

> distinctive features called 'Alignment pattern', another smaller square or squares within the Code, and 'Timing pattern', an L-shaped line that

The QR Code is another proud invention by the Japanese. Its birth can be traced back to 1994, when a development team led by Engineer Masahiro Hara of the automotive company 'Denso Wave', a Toyota subsidiary, created an improved version of barcode that could easily track automobiles and automobile parts during manufacturing. Although 'Denso Wave' would retain the patent rights to the QR Code, it declared that it would not exercise them, thus making it publicly available for anybody to make and use QR Codes.

Hara, who is dubbed the 'father of the QR Code', may not have imagined then that his invention would redefine the digital world and people would soon be scanning QR Codes even on the streets. QR Codes gathered momentum in the world from around 2010 and today they are in common place usage.

#### National efforts

QR Codes have been in use for several years in Sri Lanka as well, but only in limited ways as only a handful of people understood and used that system until recently.

In 2020, the Government used QR Codes during the COVID-19 outbreak for contact tracing of the infected. QR check-ins to all workplaces and retail businesses were encouraged through the "Stay Safe" programme launched by the Information and Communication Technology Agency (ICTA) of Sri Lanka, but at the same time a guest registry was also maintained at those venues for those who were not familiar with the QR Code scanning. Other countries such as Australia, New Zealand, the United Kingdom, China and Russia also used

#### Cashless payments

Now that the public understanding on QR Codes has improved, it may be an opportune time to promote other uses of QR Codes, which will come in handy for the people in their day-to-day work and businesses.

In October 2020 and again in November last year, the Central Bank of Sri Lanka (CBSL) began a nationwide rollout of the 'LANKAQR' digital payments solution that enables consumers to make payments to merchants and service providers directly from their bank account by scanning a QR Code with their mobile phone.

It allows consumers to pay from a payments app provided by any LANKAQR-

certified bank or financial institution. A total of 24 payments apps provided by 21 financial institutions in Sri Lanka have been certified for the above purpose as at the end of last year.

Customers are not charged for using LANKAQR-based payments, but merchants have to pay a nominal fee to the relevant bank. The aim of the project is to push for a cashless economy in Sri Lanka. However, in a context where even the use of Automated Teller Machine (ATM) Cards for payments is not up to a satisfactory level in Sri Lanka and some people still use ATM Cards only to draw cash from the nearest machine, promotion of the QR Code-based payment system has been challenging. Also, many taxi drivers prefer cash payments as against payments by cards or QR Codes.

Even though the initial uptake of the idea has been slow in the country, QR Codes are increasingly being adopted for business purposes. QR Codes are frequently used to track information about products in a supply chain, and marketing and advertising as they are faster than entering information manually.

"Barcodes have been in use for a long time now in many places in Sri Lanka, but QR Codes are a better system. It can

be used for a variety of purposes because the QR Code can be configured according to one's requirements. Most of the companies go for very sophisticated methods, such as Radio Frequency Identification (RFID), which are expensive. The QR Code is a very simple and almost costless system. The people have now understood its

# House emphasizes on need for forming **All-Party Government**

The last day of the three-day debate on the Government's Policy Statement was held yesterday (12) where the House emphasized the need for an All-Party Government (APG). The blame game continued as the ruling party MPs accused the Opposition of not supporting an All-Party Government while the Opposition criticised the Government's failure to pronounce a time frame for the proposed Interim Government. SJB MP Dr. Harsha de Silva's speech stood out from the rest as he commended the President's Policy Statement while criticizing all political parties for not making genuine effort to form a shortterm Interim Government.

Chief Government Whip Prasanna Ranatunga joining the debate pointed out that Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna (SLPP) is ready to form an All-Party Government even if it still holds the 2/3 majority in Parliament. Ranatunga observed that the SLPP's commitment symbolizes its readiness to bow down to the public opinion.

"The JVP in 2014 called those who supported Rajapaksa Government 'Bayiyo'. They called 'Toyiyo' to the ones who support the UNP/SJB Government. Now they are saying the "Toyiyo and Bayiyo" are going to form a 'Toyi-Bayi Government'. So if we are 'Toyiyos' and 'Bayiyos', who are the ones that support the JVP? I would like to call them 'Gopayiyo'. 'Gopayiyo' is not a bad word. It means a creature that sucks the blood of humans," Minister Ranatunga quipped.

JVP Leader Anura Dissanayake joining the debate emphasized that an election is in order. If we are to form an Interim Government, all parties should be given fair representation in it, Dissanayake observed. Commenting on Minister Ranatunga's speech Dissanayake said it sounded as if the "Devils are chanting Pirith." Dissanayake questioned how the President promises a corrupt-free country while his Chief Government Whip has been found guilty by the High Court and imposed a Rs. 25 MN fine.

Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna MP Rohitha Abeygunawardena joining the debate questioned the Opposition Leader Sajith Premadasa as to why he did not accept the PM position when the then President Gotabaya Rajapaksa offered. "Why did you fail to put the toffee into your mouth? Had you put the toffee into your mouth, you would have been the President by now. Isn't it a toffee? It is a case of 'Asayi-Bayayi'. (You like something, but you are afraid to have it). The reality is that he wants to take up the post but is afraid to take on the responsibility. So what happened at the end? Ranil Wickremesinghe took up the challenge. As the SLPP we said we are fine with it. Politically, the decision had a serious negative impact on us. However, we agreed to it considering the importance," Abevgunawardena pointed out. Samagi Jana Balawegaya MP Hesha Vithanage in reply to MP Abeygunawardena pointed out that the Prime Minister post indeed was handled as if a 'toffee'. "Did people voted Sajith Premadasa to eat toffees? Did people voted Sajith Premadasa to eat Rajapaksa's toffees? No. People voted Premadasa to be responsible on their behalf. If the Opposition Leader did some gimmick and got hold of the Prime Minister post, what would have happened to the people's mandate? Where is parliamentary democracy? This is why people reject all the 225 MPs." MP Vithanage pointed out. Meanwhile a group of members of the Tamil National Alliance protested yesterday (12) in the morning of Parliament by displaying placards demanding justice for the families of those who disappeared in the north during the war.



According to a senior official of the Netball Federation, the names of the 12-member squad have been forwarded to the Sports Minister for approval and it is reliably learnt Tharjini Sivalingam, the 6"11 tall experienced goal shooter has been included in the team. . The National selection committee headed by Dhamayanthi Jayathilleka the former National player selected 15 players to focus on Asian Championship and got approval for this 15 member pool ..

However most of the players of the squad and especially the National coach Hyacinth Wijesinghe requested to get Tharjani for the team .In fact Thariani the former National skipper was not available for selection trials to pick the final team as she was away in Australia to play league Netball .The Selection Committee pointed out that without playing selection trials they cant include any player in the team .

Differences arose between selectors and some officials of the Federation about Tharjani's issue and finally National selection committee headed by Arjun Fernando solved this issue .In addition experienced Thilini Wattegedera also was omitted from the squad due to her performance and selectors were highly criticised by a section close to this this women's sport .

14 members of the squad are training at

Bandaragama Sports Complex and also the Torrighton grounds and the Gymnasium .

Meanwhile National squad are busy with their training and National Netball Federation is looking to get training facilities from the Sugathadasa Indoor Stadium and a sponsor for the Asian Netball Championship.

Two senior players Wing attacker Gayanjali Amarawansa and Centre player Dulangi Wannitilleka are likely to captain and vice captain the Sri Lanka's 12-member squad. Amarawansa the experienced player from HNB having previous experience of Asian and World Netball Championship will captain the National team for the first time at the Asian Championship while Dulangi Wannitilleka also from HNB one of the best players of the centre and occasionally she has ability to play as goal shooter

This will be the first time in three years the Sri Lankan lasses will play a competitive tournament after Global pandemic. They last played in the international arena in 2019 during the World Cup in England under the coaching of Thilak Jinadasa and this time under the guidance of Hyacinth Wijesin-

Sri Lankan Netball team will take the field as favourites to win the tournament based on their past record of having won this tournament most number of times (5) in 1989, 1997, 2001, 2009 and 2018. .Last time in 2018 Sri Lanka led by Chaturangi Jayasuriya clinchéd the Asian Championship defeating Singapore in the final at the same venue in Singapore.

The 11 teams will compete to take the Asian crown .The defending champs Sri Lanka, 2018 runner-up Singapore, Malaysia, Thailand, Brunei, Hong Kong, Chinese Taipei, Japan, India, Philippines and Maldives are set to play this time while top two teams will gain automatic qualification for the 2023 Netball World Cup. Meanwhile Netball Federation is expected to appoint National junior coach to focus on next junior International events like Asian Junior in Korea next year. The Federation already made arrangements to call applications for the Junior National coach and they will conduct interview very soon to appoint junior coach .In the meantime Netball Federation President Victoria Lakshmi is expected to meet National Sports

Council chairman Arjuna Ranatunga and his team to discuss the progress of the Netball Federation activities.


As a result, Isipathana are still on top of the points table with a tally of 32 from six matches while Royal will start the game trailing with a total of 28 points from the same number of outings.
