26. a All teachers appointed after January 1, [1900], must possess certificates. Existing teachers must obtain them before January 1, [1901].

30. Managers of schools may claim after the annual examination-

(a) For every scholar presented in Standards I. to VIII. a sum calculated on passes achieved according to Schedules F, G, H, and H 1.

(b) No grant will be allowed for any scholar who shall have received less than nine months' instruction during the twelve months immediately preceding the examination in the school in which such scholar is examined or in a school under the same management, [and] who shall have made [not] less than 100 attendances, except in C schools and night schools. [But no such] scholar may be presented for examination a second time within twelve months of the date of his last examination.

(a) A grant may be made for every such candidate presented in Standards VII, and VIII. who passes a satisfactory examination in not more than two of such subjects besides drawing and book-keeping. The grant for a pass in stage I. shall be rupees 2 for each subject; in stage II., rupees 4 for each subject; in stage III., rupees 6 for each subject.

By-laws regarding Bakeries under sub-section 5 of section 56 of "The Local Boards Ordinance, No. 13 of 1898," to apply to all Bakeries where Wheaten Bread is made.

- 1. The walls of every bakery shall be plastered with chunam and whitewashed, the
- floor cemented, and drainage sufficiently provided.

  2. No bakery shall be within 30 feet of any cesspit or latrine, nor in a position where bad odours shall reach it.
  - 3. No place used as a bakery shall be used for any other purpose whatsoever.
- 4. All utensils and other furniture shall be kept clean.
  5. The flour, water, and other materials used in the manufacture of bread shall be good and wholesome.
- 6. All refuse and dirt in and about the premises shall be swept off, and drains well flushed.
- 7. No person suffering from a contagious or loathsome disease, or who has recently been in attendance on such person, or who is unwashed or otherwise unclean, shall be
- employed in a bakery.

  8. It shall be lawful for any Local Board Inspector or other person authorized in writing by the Board at any time between sunrise and sunset to enter and inspect any bakerv.

THEREAS by sections 57 and 58 of "the Local Boards' Ordinance, 1898," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for every Board from time to time to make such by-laws as it may deem expedient for any of the purposes therein mentioned, provided that such by-laws shall not be of any force or effect until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, who is thereby empowered, with such advice, to confirm or dis-

It is hereby notified that the following by-laws made by the Local Board of Kalutara in pursuance of the said sections of the said Ordinance have been submitted to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor for the confirmation or disallowance of the same, and that His Excellency, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, has confirmed the same, and they are published for general information.

By-laws to be substituted for those appearing in Schedule D., Chapter V., of Ordinance No. 13 of 1898, Nos. 1, 2, and 3.

1. A tax of one rupee per annum, leviable half-yearly in two equal sums, shall be paid

upon each dog kept or used within the Local Board limits.

The tax shall be due on and after the 1st day of January and 1st day of July, and shall

be paid in advance before the 1st day of January and 1st day of July, and shall be paid in advance before the 1st day of February and 1st day of August for the half-year ending on the 30th day of June and 31st day of December, respectively.

2. To facilitate the recovery of the tax the occupier of every house within the town shall, on or before December 15 in each year, furnish an officer thereunto authorized by the Board with a list, in the form B annexed, of the dogs kept in such houses, and the same of the awayers thereof names of the owners thereof.

3. Each dog shall wear in any street, thoroughfare, or public place, a collar on which the Board shall stamp such letters, or numbers, or marks, as shall indicate that it has been licensed.

The collar may be furnished by the owner or shall at his request be provided by the Board on payment of a fee of 25 cents.

Board of Improvement to keep a register of all dairymen and milk vendors.—The Board of Improvement shall keep a register of the names and addresses of all dairymen and milk vendors selling or supplying milk to any person or persons resident within the limits of the Board, and of all dairy premises and milk stores used from time to time by each of them for the production, deposit, or distribution of such milk.
- 2. To strike off the register all who are disqualified.—The Board shall strike off such register the names and addresses of all persons who shall have ceased, or become disqualified as hereinafter provided, to carry on the business of dairymen or milk vendors.
- 3. To cause dairy premises to be inspected.—The Board shall cause to be inspected all such dairy premises and milk stores, and the cattle, appliances, and utensils therein used for the production or distribution of milk.
- 4. Powers of the Assistant Government Agent to enter dairy premises or milk stores.—The Assistant Government Agent shall be at liberty to enter or authorize the entry at all reasonable times into or upon any dairy premises or milk store, for the purpose of making any inspection, and to take away samples of the milk there found, and of the water of any well or other source of water supply therein or thereon, for the purposes of examination or analysis only.
- 5. Dairymen to keep dairy premises in a sanitary condition.—The Assistant Government Agent may require any dairyman or milk vendor, by notice in writing, to cleanse and maintain in a sanitary condition his dairy premises or milk store, and any utensils therein used as aforesaid.
- 6. Dairymen to close well, &c., if the water is unwholesome.—The Assistant Government Agent shall require any dairyman or milk vendor, by notice in writing, to close any well or other source of water supply in or on his dairy premises or milk store, or used in connection therewith, which is so polluted or unwholesome as to be unfit for human consumption, and to wholly discontinue the use of the water thereof for any purpose whatsoever, for such period as the Assistant Government Agent shall direct, or to fill up the said well or source of water supply, and keep the same so filled up.
- 7. Dairy premises, &c., in an insanitary condition will not be registered.—The Assistant Government Agent shall refuse or cancel the registration of any dairyman or milk vendor, in respect of any dairy premises or milk store which is in an insanitary condition, or in which the provisions for lighting, ventilation, drainage, lavatory and privy accommodation, or water supply are not such as are necessary for health, or for the cleanliness of the appliances and utensils used therein, or for the protection of any milk therein against infection or contamination.
- 8. Dairymen and others to apply for registration.—Every dairymen and milk vendor engaged or intending to engage in the sale or supply of milk to any person or persons within the limits of the Board of Improvement, shall apply to the Board to cause to be entered on the register his name and place of residence and the locality of every dairy premises and milk store used or to be used by him, and thenceforward from time to time any change of such residence, or discontinuance by him to use any former, or commencement by him to use any other dairy premises or milk store, and immediately upon such registration, and whilst the same continues in force, shall in some conspicuous place affix to and maintain in legible letters his name and the words "Registered Dairyman" or "Registered Milk Vendor" as the case may be, upon every dairy premises or milk store in respect of which he is so registered, and to and upon every cart or other vehicle used by him for the distribution of milk.
- 9. Unregistered persons forbidden to sell milk.—It shall not be lawful for any person to sell milk to any person or persons within the limits of the Board of Improvement, if his name and place of residence and dairy premises and milk store used for the purpose of the production, deposit, or distribution of any such milk are not entered upon the register of the Board.
- 10. Infectious disease in dairy premises, &c., to be reported immediately.—On the appearance of any case of infectious disease in man or beast in any dairy premises or milk store, the occupier and also the Medical Practitioner attending the case shall immediately report in writing such case to the Board of Improvement.
- 11. Dairymen to supply names and addresses of customers.—Whenever it shall appear to the Assistant Government Agent, or be certified to the Board by any Medical Practitioner, that the spread of infectious disease is in his opinion attributable to the milk supplied by any dairyman or milk vendor, the Assistant Government Agent may require such dairyman or milk vendor wholly to discontinue such supply, distribution, and sale of milk, and to furnish forthwith, upon 'demand, a full and complete list of the names and addresses of all his customers, and to give such assistance to discover the residence of all or any of them as the Assistant Government Agent may deem necessary.

- 12. Persons suffering from infectious diseases or having been recently exposed to infection not to take part in dairy operations.—No person following the trade of a dairy farmer, cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or being the occupier of a milk store or milk shop, shall knowingly allow any person suffering from any infectious disease, or having recently been exposed to infection from a person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk, or in any way to take part or to assist in the conduct of the trade or business of the dairy farmer, cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or occupier of any milk store or milk shop, as far as regards the production, distribution, or storage of milk, until he shall have shown to the satisfaction of the Assistant Government Agent that all danger of communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.
- 13. Sale or supply of unwholesome milk forbidden.—It shall not be lawful for any person selling milk to any person or persons resident within the limits of the Board to store, keep, or deposit any milk in any room used for sleeping or dwelling in, or in any other place or way calculated to render such milk unwholesome or injurious to health, or to sell any milk which shall have been produced from any deceased animal, or which shall have been in any place or way exposed to infection from any person suffering from any infectious disease, or which shall have been upon or in any dairy premises or milk store from which the sale of milk has been directed to be discontinued on account of infectious disease as provided in section 11.
