GENERAL CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO APPOINTMENTS TO POSTS IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE ADVERTISED IN THE “CEYLON GOVERNMENT GAZETTE”

1. *Allowance.*—Unless otherwise stated, Rent Allowance, temporary Cost of Living Allowance and temporary Special Living Allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

2. *Conditions of Service.*—Appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Regulations of the Manual of Procedure, Departmental Orders or Regulations, and any other orders or regulations issued from time to time by the Government.

3. *Terms of Engagement.*—(i) In the case of appointments to the non-pensionable establishment (excluding those on daily rates of pay) appointees will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of their salary to the Public Service Provident Fund, and they will be allowed to contribute at their option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution in either case will be equal to 7½ per cent. of the salary paid in at the close of each financial year.

(ii) Appointees may be required to furnish security in terms of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance, if so required by the Head of their Department.

(iii) Appointees other than those already in the Public Service will be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer as to their physical fitness to serve in any part of the Island.

4. *New Entrants to the Public Service.*—(i) The period of probation/trial of New Entrants appointed to pensionable posts/non-pensionable posts, as the case may be, shall be 3 years unless a longer period is prescribed in respect of any posts.

(ii) New Entrants will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the Language Policy of the Government and in particular for implementing the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

(iii) (a) They will be required to acquire proficiency in Sinhala during their period of probation/trial.

(b) The confirmation, at the expiry of the period of probation/trial, will depend, *inter alia*, on their passing within specified periods of time graded proficiency tests in Sinhala, leading up to the level of the

J. S. C. Standard. Failure to pass these proficiency tests within the prescribed periods will result in the non-payment of the increments falling due, until the passing of same. Any officer who does not pass the proficiency tests of the Junior School Certificate standard by the end of his period of probation/trial will be liable to have his services terminated.

Note.—Those who qualify for entry into the Public Service through the Sinhala medium will be exempt from passing the proficiency tests in Sinhala as a prerequisite for confirmation.

(iv) They will also be required to pass an Efficiency Bar test in the Sinhala language of the Senior School Certificate standard within two years from the date of confirmation in appointment.

5. *Qualifications required.*—(i) Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he is a Ceylonese. A “Ceylonese” is a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

(ii) A candidate for any post for which the minimum educational qualification prescribed is a pass in the Senior School Certificate examination or equivalent or higher examination shall have a pass in the Sinhala language or its equivalent obtained at the Senior School Certificate examination or its equivalent if he is a Sinhalese, educated in the Sinhala medium. (This requirement will not apply to those officers who are in the Public Service from a date prior to January 1, 1961, and who seek appointments to other posts in the Public Service.)

6. *War Service Concession.*—Provided they are qualified in all other respects, ex-Servicemen of Her Majesty’s Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these Services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct periods of such service commencing from September 3, 1939, at the earliest, and up to December 31, 1949, at the latest from their ages for purposes of

eligibility alone, provided that they joined the Forces before August 15, 1945, and that such service was satisfactory and continuous.

7. *Other requirements.*—(i) Applications from officers of the Public Service who are qualified must be forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. Posts of District Inspector of Physical Education

APPLICATIONS are invited for the posts of District Inspector of Physical Education in the Education Department. Applications, which should be on a printed form obtainable from this office, should reach me on or before the following dates :—

(iii) *Medical Examination and Passages.*—Ceylonese officers selected abroad for appointment under the Ceylon Government, will be required to present themselves for examination to approved medical practitioners with a view to it being ascertained whether they are physically fit for service. The fee for such examination as well as the cost of their passage expenses to Ceylon shall be paid by the officers themselves.

2. *Terms of Engagement and Conditions of Service.*—

(i) The posts are permanent and pensionable. The selected candidates will, if in the permanent and pensionable service under Government, be appointed on an acting basis for a period of three years, and, if not, on probation for a period of three years.

(ii) The selected candidates will be required to qualify in Sinhala by passing in Language and Literature at the General Certificate of Education (Ordinary Level) Sinhalese Medium Examination within a period of three years from the date of appointment unless they already possess a similar or higher qualification in Sinhala. No increments will be paid after three years until this qualification is obtained.

(iii) The selected candidates will also be required to qualify in Tamil by passing in Tamil at the examination in National Language for officers in Grade II of the Executive Clerical Class of the General Clerical Service, within a period of four years from the date of appointment. The period taken in excess of four years to qualify in Tamil will operate as a deferment of increment.

(iv) The selected candidates will be required to comply with any rules already made or that may hereafter be made for giving effect to the language policy of the Government and in particular for the implementation of the provisions of the Official Language Act, No. 33 of 1956.

3. *Salary.*—The salary scale attached to the post is Rs. 5,520 to Rs. 9,360 per annum rising by annual increments, 8 of Rs. 360 and 2 of Rs. 480.

4. *Qualifications required.*—Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he—

- (a) is not less than 25 years and not more than 40 years of age on 24th July, 1964, unless the applicant is already in Government Service;
- (b) is of excellent moral character and physically sound;
- (c) (i) Possesses a Diploma of a recognised College or Institution of Physical Education after at least one year's post-graduate residential course with a minimum of 3 years' teaching experience in Physical Education; or possesses a Diploma of a recognised College or Institution of Physical Education after at least two years' residential course in such an institution with a minimum of five years' teaching experience in Physical Education; or is an Inspector/Inspectress of Physical Education with a minimum of 10 years' satisfactory service after a one year's residential course of training in a recognised College or Institution of Physical Education; or
- (ii) High attainments both academically and in the field of Physical Education which are equivalent to the attainments set down in (i) of this sub-section.

Preference will be given to candidates who have distinguished themselves in sports and organised games. Practical experience in Physical Education will be an added qualification.

5. Candidates will be required to produce any or all of the following documents when called upon to do so :—

- (a) Certificates of registration of birth. (N.B.—Baptismal certificates or certificates issued for the purpose of the Code of Regulations for Assisted Schools will not be accepted.)
- (b) Certificates of highest academic qualifications obtained.

- (d) Two certificates of character; one of which should be from the Director of Studies, College Tutor or Professor.
- (e) Certificate of highest examination passed in Sinhala.

ASIAN-AFRICAN LEGAL CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE, SECRETARIAT, NEW DELHI

Posts of Assistant Secretary and Research Officer (Grade I)

THE Secretary of the Asian-African Legal Consultative Committee has informed the Government of Ceylon that two vacancies which are shortly due to arise in the Secretariat of the Committee are to be filled by the recruitment of suitable persons from countries which are members of the Committee, viz., Burma, Ceylon, Ghana, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Japan, Pakistan, and the United Arab Republic. One post is that of Assistant Secretary and the other is that of Research Officer (Grade I). Applications are hereby invited for these posts from Ceylonese candidates.

Applications which should be substantially in the form a specimen of which is given below should be addressed to the Secretary of the Asian-African Legal Consultative Committee, New Delhi, and forwarded to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Justice, Hulftsdorp, Colombo 12, to reach the latter on or before July 24, 1964.

The minimum qualification prescribed by the Asian-African Legal Consultative Committee for each of these posts is a Degree in Law of a recognized University of any of the participating countries. High academic qualifications and experience in research or teaching and service in the Legal Department of a Government will be treated as an additional qualification. Proficiency in English is essential as the documents of the Committee are prepared in English and the officers have to do research work in that language.

Both the Assistant Secretary and the Research Officer will be required to do research work in Public International Law and prepare studies for consideration of the Committee from time to time by the Governments of the participating countries. The Assistant Secretary may, in addition, be required to do a certain amount of supervisory work such as scrutiny of the work done by the Research Officers in the Secretariat.

Applications from officers in the Public Service who possess the necessary qualifications should be forwarded through the respective Heads of Departments.

Salary, Allowances and Conditions of Service.—

Scales of salaries.—(Likely to be tax free).

- (1) Assistant Secretary.—Rs. 900—50—1,100—E.B.—50—1,250 (Indian Rupees) per month.
- (2) Research Officer.—Rs. 600—40—800—E.B.—25—1,000 (Indian Rupees) per month.

Suitably qualified persons may be allowed up to 4 advance increments in the starting salary.

Allowances.—

Persons recruited from abroad will be paid a foreign allowance calculated at the rate of 20 to 30 per cent. to their salary as may be determined by the Secretary subject to a maximum of Rs. 300.

Medical Benefits.—

The officers of the Secretariat are entitled to free medical treatment subject to a maximum of Rs. 300 per annum.

Leave Rules.—

Officers will be entitled subject to exigencies of service to one month's earned leave on average pay for each completed year of service. In addition they will be entitled to 10 days' casual leave in a year.

Gratuity.—

There is provision for payment of gratuity to members of the Secretariat on relinquishment of service provided they serve the Committee for a minimum period of three years. In the case of persons already in the employment of the Governments of participating countries, the Committee may contribute towards their pension in lieu of payment of gratuity.

Training of a Dental Surgeon in the Teaching of Dental Nurses in New Zealand under the Colombo Plan

APPLICATIONS are invited from Dental Surgeons of this Department who are interested in teaching the basic science as well as Dental subjects to Dental Nurses in training for the award of fellowship under the Colombo Plan for a period of 6 months for undergoing a course of training in the teaching of Dental Nurses at the School for Dental Nurses, New Zealand.

2. The conditions of eligibility are as follows :—

- (a) Dental Surgeons under 45 years of age on closing date of applications.
- (b) Should possess the minimum qualification of L. D. S. (Ceylon or any approved British University).
